The Minister said that presently administration is willing to store 74tmcft of water against its original storage capacity of 77tmcft in Somasila reservoir. He added that Somasila

reservoir is expected to receive more than 1 lakh cusecs of water due to heavy rains in upper land areas of Kadapa, Kurnool district. He directed the pan-

chayath Raj, Irrigation and RWS department officials to monitor the day to day situation to avoid inundation of surrounding villages.

The minister said that it is proposed to supply the water for 1 Lakh acres to drought hit mandals like Marripadu, Vinjamur, Duthakur mandals through Anam Sanjeevareddy and Hypower cannels for agriculture operations in coming days.
