Indian Navy gets indigenous anti-sub 'Androth'

NEW DELHI: In a move likely to enhance the Indian Navy's underwater capabilities, it has received 'INS Androth', the second of the eight ASW SWCs (Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft), built by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE), Kolkata. It was delivered to the Indian Navy on September 13 at GRSE, Kolkata, marking yet another step towards self-reliance in defence manufacturing. According to a Naval spokesperson, the ASW SWC ships have been indigenously designed and constructed as per the Classification Rules of the Indian Register of Shipping (IRS) at GRSE, Kolkata, and it will strengthen the Navy's anti-submarine, coastal surveillance and minelaying capabilities.

Clinical India thrash Pakistan



DUBAI: In a clinical display that saw them outplay their opponent in every department of the game, India thrashed Pakistan by seven wickets in their 2025 T20 Asia Cup Group A showdown at Dubai International Stadium here on Sunday. Needing 128 for victory, after first restricting Pakistan to 127 for nine wickets in the stipulated 20 overs, India, led from the front by skipper Suryakumar Yadav (unbeaten 47 runs from 37 balls), pulled off convincing seven-wicket win in 15.5 overs. Earlier, Kuldeep Yadav's artistry (3/18) and Axar Patel's 2/18 stifled Pakistan to a lowly 127 for nine. The win marks India's third consecutive T20I triumph over Pakistan.

Lays stone for projects worth ₹6,300 cr in Assam

Guwahati

PRIME Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday launched a scathing attack on the Congress during a public meeting in Assam's Darrang district, alleging that the party has consistently sided with antinational forces and even terrorists groomed by Pakistan.

"Instead of standing with our brave soldiers, Congress has chosen to back infiltrators and those who threaten India's unity. This party has repeatedly provided cover to anti-national forces," PM Modi told the gathering at Mangaldoi, adding that the BJP would not allow infiltrators to grab land or alter the state's demography.

Signalling a major leap in Assam's healthcare sector, Modi unveiled projects worth Rs 6,300 crore in Darrang district. The projects include Darrang Medical College along with a nursing college and a GNM school in Mangaldai town. It also includes the 118.5 km-long Guwahati Ring Road project, connecting Kamrup and Darrang districts in Assam and Ri Bhoi in Meghalaya. The Prime Minister hailed the BJP government's work in Assam,

No complaints received against Rajgopal blabber, says PCC panel

HYDERABAD: The PCC disciplinary committee on Sunday clarified that the party was yet to initiate any MLA Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy, as no formal complaint was received against his 'dissident remarks'.

The committee, chaired by Mallu Ravi, dwelt in detail on various issues, including resolution of issues causing friction within the party primarily in Warangal and Gajwel.

Later briefing the media, Ravi clarified that the issue pertaining to Rajgopal Reddy did not come up for discussion as no complaint had been lodged against him.

"If a complaint is received, we will discuss the Rajagopal Reddy issue. It has not come to our attention, as yet," he said. However, he cautioned that disciplinary action would be taken against anyone who makes internal party matters public through the media. Ravi stressed the need for party members to maintain unity as local body elections were round the corner.

SCCL's delayed participation in coal block auction



Heavy rains disrupt normal life in Hyd

Huge traffic jams in HI-TEC City, Gachibowli, **Uppal**, Miyapur on Sunday night

SEVERAL parts of the city witnessed heavy rainfall on Sunday, disrupting normal life and resulting in huge traffic jams at many places. The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) Hyderabad issued an orange alert and predicted moderate to heavy rain for two days, with misty, cool mornings and nights.

City and its outskirts received heavy downpour, resulting in huge traffic gridlocks in Gachibowli, Hitec City, Miyapur, Sanathnagar, Kondapur and other places. and low-lying were inundated with flood water, leaving people stranded. Two people were reported to be missing in a nala in Asifnagar area in the city. Efforts were on to trace them.

Localised heavy rains were also reported in Uppal, Kapra, Marredpally, Alwal and Quthbullapur continuing intermittently during the night. Prashant Nagar, Malkajgiri recorded a downpour of 16 cm, the highest in the city.

According to data from the Telangana Development





Planning Society, Vivekanandapuram Community Hall (Neredmet) received 50 mm rainfall, Bandlaguda (Uppal) 47.5 mm, Mallpura ward office (Uppal) 42 mm, Kapra 37 mm, and Medpally 35 mm. Other areas, including Saroornagar, Musheerabad, Himayathnagar, of the city

saw rainfall. Meanwhile, Mayor Gadwal Vijayalakshmi along with officials inspected areas in Road 12, Banjara Hills, near ICCC and other rain-affected areas. She ordered that special attention be paid to waterlogging points to prevent traffic problems due to rain. Continued on Page 7



China hits back at Trump's 100% tariffs threat

BEIJING: China has hit back at the US over President Donald Trump's proposal that NATO impose 50-100% tariffs on Beijing over its purchase of Russian oil. Reiterating that Beijing

is committed to promoting peace talks for resolving hotspot issues, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi has said wars cannot solve problems and highlighted that sanctions would only complicate them. He made the remarks at a press conference in Ljubljana, after meeting Slovenia's Deputy PM and Minister of Foreign and European Affairs. "China does not participate in or pla wars, and what China does is to encourage peace talks and promote political settlement of hotspot issues through dialogue," Wang Yi said.

He also gave a call to promote multilateralism, strengthen multilateral mechanisms, and jointly safeguard the purposes and principles of the UN Charter. He highlighted that in the present times the international situation is characterised by intertwined chaos and continuous conflicts.

Earthquake jolts Assam

GUWAHATI: An earthquake of magnitude 5.8 struck Assam on Sunday evening, according to the National Center for Seismology. The earthquake occurred at 4.41pm and the epicentre was in Udalguri district. The depth of the earthquake was 5km, the officials said. Tremors were also felt in other northeastern states and neighbouring

Bhutan. Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa said there has been no report of any major damage or loss of life. "We are actively monitoring the situation," he wrote on X. Tremors were felt in Guwahati, where many residents rushed out of their homes in panic. "It felt like it would never stop," a Guwahati resident $tol\bar{d}~HT.$ Continued on Page 7
