Guwahati

PRIME Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday launched a scathing attack on the Congress during a public meeting in Assam's Darrang district, alleging that the party has consistently sided with antinational forces and even terrorists groomed by Pakistan. "Instead of standing with

our brave soldiers, Congress has chosen to back infiltrators and those who threaten India's unity. This party has repeatedly provided cover to anti-national forces," PM Modi told the gathering at Mangaldoi, adding that the BJP would not allow infiltrators to grab land or alter the state's demography.

Signalling a major leap in Assam's healthcare sector, Modi unveiled projects worth Rs 6,300 crore in Darrang district. The projects include Darrang Medical College along with a nursing college and a GNM school in Mangaldai town. It also includes the 118.5 km-long Guwahati Ring Road project, connecting Kamrup and Darrang districts in Assam and Ri Bhoi in Meghalaya. The Prime Minister hailed the BJP government's work in Assam,

No complaints received against Rajgopal blabber, says PCC panel

HYDERABAD: The PCC disciplinary committee on Sunday clarified that the party was yet to initiate any MLA Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy, as no formal complaint was received against his 'dissident remarks'.

The committee, chaired by Mallu Ravi, dwelt in detail on various issues, including resolution of issues causing friction within the party primarily in Warangal and Gaiwel.

Later briefing the media, Ravi clarified that the issue pertaining to Rajgopal Reddy did not come up for discussion as no complaint had been lodged against him.

"If a complaint is received, we will discuss the Rajagopal Reddy issue. It has not come to our attention, as yet," he said.

However, he cautioned that disciplinary action would be taken against anyone who makes internal party matters public through the media. Ravi stressed the need for party members to maintain unity as local body elections were round the corner.

UNION Minister for Coal and Mines G Kishan Reddy has called out the erstwhile Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) regime for its "policy blunder" that he says prevented Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) from participating in national coal block auctions in time. Speaking to 'The Hans India', he outlined the Centre's transparent coal allocation policy and its implications for Telangana's mining

Reddy explained that, following the Supreme Court's



landmark decision to cancel previous coal block allocations to both public and private entities, the Union government implemented a uniform auction-based policy. "Coal is national wealth. The Supreme Court mandated transparency, and since then, all coal blocks—new and previously allocatedhave been put up for auction," he amplified. While major public sec-

tor units like Coal India and Western Coalfields have actively participated in these auctions, Singareni Collieries remained absent due to the stance taken by the then BRS-led state government. "This non-participation delayed the auction of coal blocks in Telangana, which could have otherwise boosted the state's energy and employment prospects," Reddy remarked.

Heavy rains disrupt normal life in Hyd

Huge traffic jams in HI-TEC city, Gachibowli, Uppal, Miyapur on Sunday night

SEVERAL parts of the city witnessed heavy rainfall on Sunday, disrupting normal life and resulting in huge traffic jams at many places. The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) Hyderabad issued an orange alert and predicted moderate to heavy rain for two days, with misty, cool mornings and nights.

City and its outskirts received heavy downpour, resulting in huge traffic gridlocks in Gachibowli, Hitec City, Miyapur, Sanathnagar, Kondapur and other places. Roads and low-lying areas were inundated with flood water, leaving people stranded. Two people were reported to be missing in a nala in Asifnagar area in the city. Efforts were on to trace them.

Localised heavy rains were also reported in Uppal, Kapra, Marredpally, Alwal and Quthbullapur continuing intermittently during the night. Prashant Nagar, Malkajgiri recorded a downpour of 16

is committed to promoting peace talks for resolving hotspot issues, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi has said wars cannot solve problems and highlighted that sanctions would only complicate them. He made the remarks at a press conference in Ljubljana, after meeting Slovenia's Deputy PM and Minister of Foreign and European Affairs. "China does not participate in or plan wars, and what China does to encourage peace talks and promote political settlement of hotspot issues through dialogue," Wang Yi said.

He also gave a call to promote multilateralism, strengthen multilateral mechanisms, and jointly safeguard the purposes and principles of the UN Charter.

He highlighted that in the present times the international situation is characterised by intertwined chaos and continuous conflicts.

"China and Europe should be friends rather than rivals and should cooperate rather than confront each other. Making the right choices amid the greatest changes in a century demonstrates the responsibilities that both sides should fulfil towards history and the people," Wang Yi said. His veiled reference comes shortly after US President Donald Trump on Saturday proposed that NATO impose tariffs of 50 per cent to 100 per cent

OVER a dozen companies are gearing up to launch their IPOs over the next two to three weeks, aiming to raise nearly Rs 10,000 crore, buoyed by supportive policy measures, including GST 2.0 reforms, and the RBI's monetary policy easing through rate cuts.

Among the firms preparing to tap the primary markets are iValue Infosolutions, Saatvik Green Energy, JinKushal Industries, Atlanta Electricals, Park Medi World, SolarWorld

expected to announce their price bands in the week beginning September 15 and plan to launch their IPOs before September 30, they added. Merchant bankers further indicated that this will be followed by offerings from Anantam Highway InvIT (Alpha Alternatives), Epack Prefab Technologies, Pranav Construction, and TruAlt Bioenergy.

These firms are likely to announce their price bands during September 22-30, with launches slated for the end of September or early October. Together, these companies are aiming to

crore. All of them have already secured clearance from the markets regulator Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi).

The fundraising will help companies meet capital expenditure requirements, finance expansion plans, repay borrowings, and cover general corporate purposes. The pipeline adds to an already strong year for IPOs. So far, 55 companies have floated their maiden public offerings, raising nearly Rs 75,000 crore.
