

Farmers end 59-day hunger strike after govt hikes KLIP compensation

A 59-day hunger strike by farmers demanding fair compensation for the Kodangal Lift Irrigation Project (KLIP) came to a close on Sunday after Minister Vakiti Srihari served lemon juice to the protesting farmers and assured them of enhanced relief. The Minister announced that the government would provide Rs 20 lakh per acre to all landowners giving up their land for the project, calling the move a top priority for the Congress administration.

Speaking at a press meet at CVR Bhavan, Srihari affirmed that “providing fair compensation to farmers who lost their land is a key commitment of the government.” He was joined by former DCC president Kumbham Shivakumar Reddy.

The minister criticized previous governments for failing to implement GO 69 of the erstwhile united Andhra Pradesh, which, he said, left farmers facing heavy losses. Srihari highlighted that under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy’s leadership, the Narayanpet-Kodangal Lift Irrigation Scheme has been taken up as to resolve the district’s long-pending irrigation woes.

Mahabubnagar on high alert after 63% excess rainfall

DISTRICT AVERAGE STANDS AT 725.1 MM THAN THE NORMAL 444.3 MM AT THIS TIME OF YEAR

AN exceptional 63.2 per cent excess rainfall was recorded in Mahabubnagar district this season, with all 17 mandals reporting levels well above the normal average, according to the latest Integrated Rainfall Report. The district received 45.6 mm of rain on Saturday alone, taking the cumulative total to 12,326.5 mm against the normal cumulative of 7,553.3 mm. The overall district average now stands at 725.1 mm, far higher than the normal 444.3 mm for this time of year.

Jadcherla emerged as the wettest mandal, logging a cumulative 1,064.1 mm of rainfall, which is 134.1 per cent above the norm. Balanagar followed with 914.9 mm, showing a 121 per cent surplus, while Bhootpur recorded 875 mm, registering a 95.1 per cent rise. Mohammadabad received 827.1 mm, reflecting an 84.5 per cent excess,



and Musapet tallied 784.8 mm, up by 83 per cent.

Even areas with lighter showers on Saturday continued to maintain impressive seasonal totals. Midjil recorded only 0.1 mm and Jadcherla just 0.8 mm on the day, yet both remain in the excess category.

Hanwada, despite no rain on Saturday, has accu-

mulated 706.3 mm so far, 46.5 per cent higher than the seasonal norm. Officials confirmed that every mandal in the district now falls under the “Excess” category, with none in normal, deficit, or scanty range.

In response to the persistent heavy rains, District Collector Viziyendira Boyi

has placed all key departments on high alert. The revenue, police, municipal, agriculture and irrigation departments have been instructed to remain vigilant and ready to deal with any eventuality arising from continued rainfall.

The health department has also been directed to monitor the rising cases

of viral fevers in rural areas and to take proactive measures to provide timely healthcare. Orders have been issued to ensure that all Primary Health Centres, Community Health Centres, area hospitals and the district hospital are stocked with adequate medicines and staffed with sufficient personnel to handle seasonal diseases and emergencies.

Agriculture officials say the rains are a blessing for kharif crops, replenishing soil moisture and boosting groundwater levels.

Farmers across the district are hopeful of healthy crop growth and higher yields, even as the administration stands prepared to tackle any challenges brought on by this unusually wet season.

Singareni CMD plants 370 saplings in Bhupalpally

Lambadi self-respect rally held amid rising tensions

A Lambadi Self-Respect Rally was organised in Kothagudem on Sunday under the banner of the Joint Action Committee (JAC) of Lambadi associations. The rally aimed to counter what the leaders described as a malicious campaign by certain groups seeking to remove the Lambadi community from the Scheduled Tribes (ST) list.

The rally commenced from Lakshmidvipalli Market Yard and proceeded through key town areas, concluding at the Ambedkar statue, where a petition was submitted. Leaders laid floral tributes to Dr



BR Ambedkar and strongly condemned the attempts to divide tribal communities.

JAC leaders stated that the Lambadi community was lawfully included in the ST list as per the Indian Constitution, and the Telangana High Court had already dismissed the case challenging this status. They urged the Koya tribal leaders not to fall into the trap of political conspiracies and called for unity in fighting for the implementation of tribal rights and laws.

The rally also took aim at the Congress party’s silence and double standards on the issue. Leaders questioned why the state

government had not taken steps to withdraw the case, especially when ruling party MLAs like Tellam Venkata Rao could intervene. They accused him of backing the anti-Lambadi campaign and demanded the Congress clarify its stance.

Calling for the protection of tribal welfare funds and constitutional rights, the JAC warned that continued defamation would not be tolerated, and vowed to continue their struggle for dignity and recognition.

The event saw participation from several prominent Lambadi, tribal, and employee union leaders from across the state.

fordable prices, and to complete the project within a year,” said Rao.

The society aims to replicate the standards of upscale developments like iRised buildings in Hyderabad, with modern amenities and infrastructure. Officials said the initiative is open to a wide range of employees including those from state and central government services, public sector undertakings, and uniformed forces.

Describing the project as

a vision for integrated living, Rao urged employees from the erstwhile Khammam district to come together and contribute to the success of the project. The homes will cater to teachers, pensioners, gazetted and non-gazetted officers; staff from Revenue, Panchayat Raj, and Police departments; and Central government employees from LIC, Banking, Singareni, KTPS, GENCO, FCI, and Heavy Water Plant.

“This is a chance for the entire government employee community in Khammam to live in a unified and well-planned township. We want this to become a model not just for the district, but for all of Telangana,” he said. Speaking at the event, SBI Relationship Manager Ravindra assured the gathering that housing loans would be extended to all eligible employees, and offered clarifications on loan terms and eligibility. A total of 26 employees enrolled for the project during the event.

The launch event saw participation from several prominent leaders including Guntupalli Srinivas Rao, President, TNGOs Khammam; Konidena Srinivas, District Secretary, and others. The society is expected to soon announce further details regarding phase-wise development, allotment procedures, and timelines.
