Endowment Minister Anam Ramanarayana Reddy on Sunday said that in view of registering heavy to very rains in coming October and November months, there will be a possibility of reaching adequate water in Somasila Reservoir in coming days.

The Endowment Minister along with local TDP leaders released 20tmcft of water from Somasila reservoir by performing Jalaharathi at Somasila village of Ananthasaga-

garam mandal on Sunday. Speaking the occasion, he said that as a part of this water will be supplied to Kandelu reservoir, Telugu Ganga Canal, Kanupuru, Kaluvai canals for agriculture operations in the current season. The Minister said that presently administration is willing to store 74tmcft of water against its original storage capacity of 77tmcft in Somasila reservoir.

He added that Somasila reservoir is expected to receive more than 1 lakh cusecs of water due to heavy rains in upper land areas of Kadapa, Kurnool district.

He directed the panchay-

ath Raj, Irrigation and RWS department officials to monitor the day to day situation to avoid inundation of surrounding villages.

The minister said that it is proposed to supply the water for 1 Lakh acres to drought hit mandals like Marripadu, Vinjamur, Duthakur mandals through Anam Sanjeevareddy and Hypower cannels for agriculture operations in coming days.

Somasila Project Chairman Kesava Chowdari, Somasila SE Venkataramana Reddy, Atmakur RDO Pavani, representatives of farmers associations and others were present.

Crime-free Tirupati is top priority: SP Subbarayudu

Takes charge and asserts that key focus areas will be women's safety and drug-free Tirupati

Massive security plan readied for Srivari Brahmotsavams to be held from September 24

TIRUPATI District Superintendent of Police L Subbarayudu took charge on Sunday after offering prayers at Lord Venkateswara temple in Tirumala. Speaking after assuming office at the District Police headquarters, he said that maintaining peace and security would remain the foremost duty of the police force.

Making his priorities clear, the SP assured that the police would be available round-the-clock to serve the public

and urged people to directly approach police stations with grievances. Stressing the importance of community support, he said friendly policing would be encouraged, while those indulging in unlawful activities would face strict action. Measures would also be taken to ensure visible policing across the district.

Highlighting the heavy influx of devotees from across India and abroad in Tirumala, the SP stated that comprehensive security arrangements would be made

to ensure hassle-free darshan. Women's safety would be given top priority with strengthened SHE teams to curb harassment and crimes against women and girls. Strict action would be initiated against offenders, he added. On the growing threat of cybercrimes, Subbarayudu said awareness programmes would be organised to educate people about online frauds, stressing that bank details and OTPs should never be shared with strangers.

He also announced a spe-

cial plan to eradicate drugs from Tirupati and make it a 'drug-free city', with strong legal action against those involved in transport, sale, or consumption of narcotics.

Later in the day, the SP reviewed arrangements for the upcoming Srivari Brahmotsavams in Tirumala beginning September 24.

Discussions were held on security deployment, traffic and parking management, crowd control, and crime prevention. He instructed officials to strengthen surveillance through the command-and-control system, ensure foolproof security during VIP visits, and prevent thefts during the festivities.

Additional SPs K Ravi-manoharachari, Nagabhushana Rao, I Rama Krishna, Srinivasa Rao, DSPs J Venkatarayana, Bhaktavatsalam, Srilatha, Shyam Sundar, Vijaya Sekhar, Srinivasa Rao and police officials took part in the review meeting.

Beggars, illegal traders evicted from Tirumala

IN view of the ensuing annual Srivari Brahmotsavam in Tirumala from September 24 to October 02, under the instructions of the TTD Chief Vigilance and Security Officer Muralikrishna and Tirupati District SP Subbarayudu, the TTD Vigilance and Security sleuths, Health staff along with Tirumala police on Sunday carried out a special drive to evict unauthorised persons and beggars in Tirumala.

The beggars and illegal traders who have been staying for a long time at the sheds near Kalyanakatta and SV Shopping Complex were evicted from Tirumala. The police, TTD Vigilance, Health & Sanitation officials identified

82 unauthorised traders who were doing business without any permits and beggars who have been staying here for a long time and of them were sent down from Tirumala and the fingerprints of the suspects were also checked.

On this occasion, the police made some suggestions to the owners of local hotels, tea shops and retail shops to provide adequate accommodation and facilities to those working

for them. They instructed that after the completion of the day work, they should be accommodated in Tirupati and not in Tirumala.

A similar joint drive was conducted last month and 75 people were sent down, and such programmes will be conducted frequently in the future to remove suspects, unauthorised traders, and beggars menace from Tirumala.
