MUSLIMS TAKE OUT GRAND PROCESSION MARKING 1,500TH MILAD-UN-NABI

THOUSANDS of Muslims on foot, bikes, and cars took out a grand Miladun-Nabi Peace procession, amid tight security on Sunday, marking the 1,500th birth anniversary of the last messenger Prophet Mohammed (PBUH).

To mark the occasion, the Markaz-e-Milad Juloos Committee said that yearlong events were planned. The celebrations started on Saturday night and on Sunday, several Islamic organisations held peaceful rallies. On this occasion, people distributed sweets, snacks, juices, and water among others, besides distribution of food.

A festive mood was observed among the Muslims celebrating the birth anniversary of Prophet Mohammed, with religious zeal to manifest reverence, respect, and commitment to the teachings of the last Prophet. Thousands of Muslims especially youngsters participated in the Milad in the Old City. The procession began from Dargah Quadri Chaman in Falaknuma to Mecca Masjid near Charminar via Aliabad



- Shalibanda - Moghalpura. Scores of people took small processions from Chandrayangutta -Kalapather – Jahanuma - Misrigunj - Vattepally -Bahadurpura – Talabkatta and various other areas and joined the main procession

After prayers at Mecca Masjid, Islamic scholars flagged off the rally at Charminar. It passed through Gulzar Houz -Pathergatti - Nayapul, Salar Jung Museum - Darulshifa and ended at Moghalpura. Eminent religious scholars and others leading Islamic scholars and ulema besides eminent icons from all sections of life led the Milad procession which passed



through its traditional routes with great jubilation and emotions of pleasure.

Meanwhile, to ensure the procession took place peacefully without any untoward incidents, Hyderabad City Police provided security

arrangements by deploying Rapid Action Force, City Police teams, including Quick Response Teams, City Rapid Action Force, and platoons of the City Armed Reserve and local police.

11 lakh cases resolved in National Lok Adalat


A National Lok Adalat was held on Saturday across Telangana where 11.08 lakh cases were resolved. This included 3.63 lakh pre-litigation cases and 7.43 lakh cases that were pending in the courts.

According to Telangana State Legal Services Authority Member Secretary CH Panchakshari, the settlement of these cases led to orders for compensation payments amounting to Rs. 595 crore.

A notable case highlighted in the report was a road accident where the tribunal announced a compensation of Rs. 98.30 lakh, which was then settled for Rs. 1.20 crore with 8% interest by New India Assurance Company.

Kumar, a B.Tech student, who received this assistance





A Lok Adalat, or "People's Court," is an alternative dispute resolution forum in India. It is a statutory organization that aims to provide a fast, cost-effective, and amicable way to settle disputes. The awards or decisions made by a Lok Adalat are legally binding and are considered a decree of a civil court, with no provision for appeal.

Benefits of Lok Adalats:

- No court fees: This makes the legal process accessible to all. If a case is already pending in a regular court and is settled at a Lok Adalat, the court fees paid are refunded.
- Fast and flexible: The process is informal and not bound by strict procedural laws like the Civil Procedure Code and the Indian Evidence Act, leading to quick resolutions.
- Binding awards: The decision is final and cannot be challenged in a higher court, which prevents further delays and
- Reduces burden on courts: By resolving a large number of pending and pre-litigation cases, Lok Adalats help reduce the workload on the conventional judicial system.
