

Rs 603-cr underground drainage project sanctioned for MBNR

THE long-pending drainage problems of Mahabubnagar city are set to end soon, with the government approving a massive Rs 603-crore underground drainage project. Announcing the project at his camp office on Tuesday, Mahabubnagar MLA Yennam Srinivas Reddy said it would serve as a permanent solution to the city's sewage issues and mark a new milestone in Mahabubnagar's development.

He informed that the project would be funded through the Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (UIDF), with Rs 430.32 crore from the National Housing Bank and Rs 172.68 crore from the State government.

The MLA said the tender process will begin soon, and the works will be executed at the earliest.

He recalled that he had promised to bring both an IIIT/NIT and a comprehensive underground drainage system to Mahabubnagar during his election campaign. "The IIIT has already

started functioning with 240 students, and now the underground drainage project is moving toward implementation. It is a proud moment for all of us," he said.

The MLA noted that since his election, nearly Rs 1,000 crore worth of development works have been sanctioned for Mahabubnagar, includ-

ing several that are already completed and others in tender or grounding stages.

Recounting his background, Srinivas Reddy said he had left a central government job at the age of 29 to join the Telangana movement and dedicate himself to public service. "My only mission is people's welfare.

The development of Mahabubnagar and the well-being of its residents are my top priorities," he asserted.

The MLA said he is working tirelessly to attract record-level funding for the city by maintaining co-ordination with both state and central governments, keeping political differences aside.

"If anyone can show that such large-scale projects were ever brought to Mahabubnagar before, I am ready for an open discussion," he remarked.

Later, he thanked the people of Mahabubnagar for their continued support and trust, assuring that every effort will be made to ensure inclusive development.

A Khammam-based organisation, Vibrants of Kalam, has embarked on a special project to immortalise the legacy of aerospace scientist and former President of India, late Dr APJ Abdul Kalam.

As part of the initiative, the organisation plans to install statues of Dr Kalam in all the erstwhile districts of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. Thirteen statues prepared for Andhra Pradesh were unveiled by Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu in May this year at Amaravati.

Speaking to the media, Vibrants of Kalam founder Vijay Kalam said that each statue, standing 10 ft tall, has been sculpted by Modugu

Prasad of Tiruvur in Andhra Pradesh's Krishna district. Work on statues meant for Telangana is currently underway. The height of the statue symbolises the tenth death anniversary of Dr Kalam, observed this year. Vijay plans to have the first statue in Telangana unveiled by Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy this November.

He said the entire project would cost around Rs 1 crore, including Rs 1 lakh per statue and the cost of constructing platforms for installation.

Explaining the inspiration behind the initiative, he shared that even a decade after Dr Kalam's passing, there were few places where admirers could pay homage on his

birth and death anniversaries. "As the founder of Vibrants of Kalam, the largest organisation in the country dedicated to spreading the vision and ideology of Dr Kalam, I felt it was my responsibility to ensure his legacy lives on for future generations," he said.

Notably, the organisation aims to complete installations across all 23 erstwhile districts of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh by July 27 next year, coinciding with Dr Kalam's death anniversary.

"Annual events such as elocution, essay writing, and quiz competitions will also be organised for students and youth on his birth and death anniversaries to promote his ideals," Vijay added.

'Midday Meal' prog launched for jr college students

LEGISLATOR from Kothagudem Kunamneni Sambasiva Rao on Tuesday launched a midday meal programme for students of the Government Junior College in Palvoncha. The initiative has been taken up by the Shyamala Gopalan Education Foundation to support underprivileged students.

18L quintals cotton yield expected from Gadwal

THE Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) has officially begun cotton procurement operations in Jogulamba Gadwal district. The inauguration ceremony was held on Tuesday at the Sri Balaji Cotton Ginning Mill, where Marketing Department Officer Pushpamma launched the procurement along with Rahul the CPO of CCI by breaking a coconut in traditional fashion.

According to officials, the district is expecting a yield of around 18 lakh quintals of cotton this season. Currently, only two procurement centers have been opened i.e. one at Gadwal and another at Alampur. These centers, operating out of two ginning mills, have a combined capacity of 3,500 quintals.

Officer Pushpamma noted that procurement in Alampur had already begun a week ago and has been running smoothly since then. However, several

farmers in Gadwal expressed frustration that despite repeated attempts, they are unable to book slots for selling their cotton. The marketing officer explained that the shortage of Ginning mills is the main reason for the delay and difficulties in slot booking. Farmers, on the other hand, are urging the CCI and district administration to identify and open at least five or six additional ginning mills for procurement to ease the congestion and ensure timely purchases.

COTTON MILLERS CALL FOR BANDH

Farmers told not to book cotton sale slots tomorrow

ADDITIONAL Collector P Srinivas Reddy has appealed to farmers not to book slots for cotton sale on November 6, as the Telangana Cotton Millers and Traders Welfare Association has called for a one-day bandh on that day.

Chairing a review meeting with Market Committee Chairmen, Ginning Mill managements, and officials at the Collectorate on Tuesday, the Additional Collector said that 478 metric tonnes of cotton have been procured so far from 242 farmers across the district. He noted that only fair-quality cotton is being purchased at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) through the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI).

Reddy advised farmers not to bring their cotton to Khammam and Enkoor market yards on Thursday and not to book sales slots on the CCI app for November 6, in view of the bandh.

The meeting reviewed the ongoing cotton procurement operations and discussed co-ordination among market committees, ginning mills, and related departments to ensure smooth transactions and fair prices for farmers.

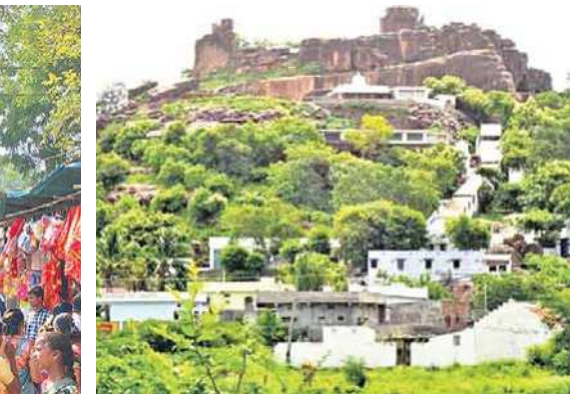


Packets of laddu and pulihora are prepared, and shamanas (canopies) are set up for devotees to rest.

The temple of 'Ramaa Sahitha Sri Satyanarayana Swamy' famously known as 'Gudem Gutta' is also referred to as 'Ratnadri'. Located in Gudem village of Dandepalli mandal, in Mancherial, this renowned pilgrimage site in India has earned the name 'Second

Annavam'. In 1964, a devotee named Govardhana Perumandla Swamy had a divine vision in which the deity revealed His presence on Ratnadri hill, leading to the temple's rise to prominence.

Nearby, there are also temples dedicated to Sri Ayyappa Swamy and Pan-chamukha Anjaneya Swamy. The Ayyappa temple is built on another hill close to



the Satyanarayana temple, modeled after Sabarimala, and is fondly called "Sabarimala of the Telugus".

Devotees from Telangana and other states visit Gudem to worship Sri Satyanarayana Swamy.

There is a deep belief that the deity blesses devotees by fulfilling their wishes and granting happiness, health, and prosperity.

Pilgrims take a holy dip in the sacred Godavari river before visiting the temple. Every year during the month of Kartika, large numbers of devotees come for darshan.

On Kartika Pournami, couples perform the Rama Sahitha Sri Satyanarayana Swamy Vratam. Many women light Kartika lamps during this auspicious month. To mark Kartika Pournami, a grand annual fair (Jatara) is held at Gudem Gutta.
