on Monday morning that left 19 people dead and dozens wounded and soaked the entire state into grief, has raised many eyebrows. People are now questioning the safety of the passengers who chose to take a journey through a narrow, rough and bumpy road from Moinabad to Aloor in Chevella mandal of Rangareddy district.

The tragic incident gives a deep insight into the alleged blind-eye towards development of this 45-km stretch on the National Highway No. 163 from Moinabad to Aloor village that often plays as a death trap always chasing commuters.

The ill-maintained highway in a pathetic state continues to haunt commuters on this otherwise calm passage that cover areas such as Aziz Nagar, Moinabad, Chevella, Damargidda, Aloor, and Mirzapur villages in Rangareddy and further moves to Manneguda in Vikarabad.

The moment one enters



the Moinabad area from Hyderabad side, poorly maintained potholes filled, cracked, and uneven highway passage welcomes them much to their utter shock.

Uneven patches, some even overpowered half of the highway every few meters poses a grave threat to the commuters passing through this stretch.

"Accidents, some as ghastly as Monday's mishap that make headlines on several occasions, are very common on this particular stretch,"

rued M.Balaiah a local resi-

dent. In December 2020, a car collided with a bore-well drilling truck that left seven members of the same family belonging to the Kalapathar area of Hyderabad. The accident occurred on December 3, 2020 near Malkapur Gate in Chevella mandal on the Hyderabad-Bijapur Highway. All the victims were heading toward Karnataka following the same stretch that un-leased a mayhem on Monday morning.

Four years later, another ghastly accident took place at the same Aloor area on

December 2, 2024 wherein at least four people killed and six others were injured when a speedy tipper rammed into the vegetable vendors selling their stuff wayside of the road.

Mohd Ghouse, a passenger regular to this stretch said, "Lack of proper supervision of this part of the highway over the years leading to such ghastly accidents frequently. Despite loss of precious lives, no serious measures were taken at least to maintain the stretch from Moinabad to Aloor."

"Officials from National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) frequently travel through this stretch when they are on their mission to carry out new projects. However, no one gives a hoot about the pathetic state of this part of the road that serves as a main passage that links at least three neighbouring states, such as Karnataka, Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh," said Mallesh Goud, a construction material trader.

Floodwater submerges govt offices and houses in Choutuppall

RAJGOPAL REDDY INSPECTS FLOOD-AFFECTED AREAS

HEAVY rains in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district have caused the village tank in Choutuppall municipal center to overflow, flooding nearby areas.

As a result, floodwater entered several government offices, including the RDO and MPDO offices, as well as the milk collection center and the TTD function hall.

Water flow from the overflowing tank has also reached low-lying residential areas, particularly Vinayaka Nagar Colony in the 13th ward. Residents there are facing severe difficulties as floodwater has entered their homes, leaving the entire area waterlogged and disrupting daily life.

Munugode MLA Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy visited the flood-affected areas in Choutuppall, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district, along with officials and local leaders. The MLA inspected the situation after floodwaters overflowed from the village tank near the Choutuppall Municipality center, flooding the service road along the national highway.

He reviewed the water flow to prevent flooding in low-lying areas and instructed officials to create alternative routes to divert the floodwater.

Speaking about the situation, Rajgopal Reddy said that due to continuous heavy rains, the tanks have filled to the brim, and the overflow has turned into floods. In the past, floodwaters from these tanks kept the

left-side areas of Choutuppall Municipality submerged for nearly a week. "We anticipated this danger earlier and arranged diversions to prevent flooding," he explained.

He pointed out that the drain built alongside the national highway service road has become an obstacle, preventing rainwater from the nearby colonies from flowing out, causing water to accumulate on the road. Upon learning of the issue, he immediately visited the site with the RTO and municipal officials and ordered measures to ensure smooth drainage of rain and sewage water.

Rajgopal Reddy also noted that the National Highways Authority had constructed a drain suitable only for surface water from the road, not for the heavy inflow from nearby colonies.

He assured that a comprehensive plan will be implemented to ensure that even during heavy rains in the future, the region will not face any flooding problems.

GOVT NEGLIGENCE LED TO RISE IN ROAD ACCIDENTS: BJP LEADER

SENIOR BJP leader Palamuru Vishnuvardhan Reddy alleged that road accidents are occurring due to government negligence. He criticized the government for failing to undertake road expansion projects, despite a series of accidents, and said such indifference is unacceptable. He also condemned the transport department officials for ignoring overloaded lorries and tippers, calling their



behavior regrettable.

He further alleged that RTC buses are operating without proper fitness certification and that poor administrative oversight is contributing to accidents. He urged the government to stop

acting negligently and take appropriate measures to protect people's lives.

The event was attended by BJP leaders Mohan Singh, Narasimha Yadav, Sudhakar Appa, Chittam Lakshmi Kant Reddy, Mahender Reddy, and others.

Govt allocates minority welfare, public enterprises portfolio to Azharuddin

THE state government has assigned portfolios to the newly appointed Minister Mohammad Azharuddin. On Tuesday, Chief Secretary K Ramakrishna Rao issued the orders designating Azharuddin to the portfolios of Minority Welfare and Public Enterprises, with the Governor's consent.

Presently, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy oversees the portfolios related to Municipal Administration

and Urban Development, General Administration, Law and Order, among others, including the Public Enterprises department, which has now been transferred to Azharuddin.

Additionally, the government allocated the portfolios of SC, ST, Minority, Disabled, Elderly Welfare, and Transgender Empowerment to Adhuri Laxman, who joined the cabinet last June. The minority portfolio previously held by Laxman has now been reassigned to Azharuddin.

A private travel bus rammed into a tractor from behind on the Addanki-Narketpally highway near Buggabavugudem in Vemulapally mandal, Nalgonda district. The impact caused the tractor to overturn on the road. Four people traveling on the tractor were injured in the accident and were shifted to the Miryalaguda Government Hospital for treatment. The bus was traveling from Kavali in Andhra Pradesh to Hyderabad at the time of the incident. There were 45 passengers on board, and a major tragedy was narrowly averted.

Agri scientists put emphasis on quality foundation seeds

PRINCIPAL rice scientist Dr Padmaja stated that high yields can be achieved using the KNM-1638 rice seed variety. On Tuesday, agricultural department officials and scientists conducted a field demonstration at the paddy farm of farmer Manasani Venkat Reddy in Kondannaguda village, located in Farooqnagar Mandal of Shadnagar constituency.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Padmaja explained that the KNM-1638 rice seeds, developed by the Rajendranagar Rice Research Station, were sown in Venkat Reddy's field. She mentioned that the government has distributed quality foundation seeds to three model farmers in every village.

She emphasized that using this high-quality seed not only helps farmers achieve better yields but also allows fellow farmers to reuse



the seeds for future cultivation. Farmers reported that by following the guidance of agricultural officers regarding fertilizers and pesticides from sowing to harvest, they were able to achieve higher yields.

Mandal Agriculture Officer Nishant Kumar added that during the rainy season, 108 mini kits of KNM-1638 rice seeds were distributed to three farmers in each revenue village of the mandal. He encouraged farmers to make the best use of this opportunity, utilize the quality seeds for seed production, and serve as role models for other farmers.

Farmers struggle as canal breach floods paddy fields

:Farmers near Aregudem village in Chityala mandal of Nalgonda district are facing severe problems after a breach occurred in the Pillai canal five days ago. Due to the break, heavy rainwater

has been flowing into the fields, submerging vast areas of paddy crops. The affected farmers are deeply worried as their crops are almost completely damaged. Despite repeatedly approaching officials, no action has been

taken so far. The farmers are demanding that the government immediately close the canal breach, assess the crop damage, and provide prompt financial assistance to help them recover from their losses.

CCI officials directed to ensure hassle-free cotton procurement

COTTON farmers in Mahabubnagar have been urged to properly dry their produce and ensure the moisture content remains between 8% and 12% to be eligible for the Minimum Support Price (MSP), highlighting this District Collector Viziyyendira Boyi has appealed to the farmers to take precautions while bringing cotton to the procurement centers, warning them not to transport loose or wet cotton in bulk, as it may lead to rejection or reduced prices.

In a review meeting on Tues-



day, the Collector interacted with cotton mill owners, CCI officials, and officers from the marketing, police, and revenue departments. She instructed Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) officials to begin procurement operations immediately

across all L1, L2, and L3 category mills, ensuring that no farmer faces inconvenience during the 2025-26 Kharif marketing season.

With the State Ginning Mills Association announcing a temporary closure of cotton pur-

chases from November 6, the Collector convened this emergency meeting to prevent disruption to farmers. She firmly directed mill owners not to close their units, stressing that farmers have already booked slots to sell their produce. "Every farmer must get a fair opportunity to sell cotton at the support price," she said, adding that CCI officials must ensure procurement for every eligible farmer.

Mahabubnagar district currently has five cotton mills, out of which four have already started operations. The Collector ordered officials to reopen the remaining mill immediately to handle the incoming produce.

Earlier in the day, the Collector conducted a surprise inspection at the CCI procurement center set up at M/s Padmanabha Cotton Industries in Ranipet village, Midgil mandal. She reviewed the arrangements and instructed officials to procure cotton with the ideal moisture content without any delay.

Considering the early winter dew, she advised farmers to thoroughly dry their cotton before bringing it to the centers, ensuring smooth transactions. The Collector also interacted with farmers, listened to their concerns, and assured them of full support from the district administration.
