#### **Trump sues** BBC for \$10bn

**Accuses it of defamation** over Jan 6 edited speech WASHINGTON: President

Donald Trump filed a lawsuit pm Monday seeking USD 10 billion in damages from the BBC, accusing the British broadcaster of defamation as well as deceptive and unfair trade practices.

The 33-page lawsuit accuses the BBC of broadcasting a "false, defamatory, deceptive, disparaging, inflammatory, and malicious depiction of President Trump," calling it "a brazen attempt to interfere in and influence" the 2024 US presidential election.

It accused the BBC of "splicing together two entirely separate parts of President Trump's speech on January 6, 2021" in order to "intentionally misrepresent the meaning of what President Trump said." The lawsuit, filed in a Florida court, seeks USD 5 billion in damages for defamation and USD 5 billion for unfair trade practices. The BBC did not immediately respond to a request for comment from The Associated Press. The broadcaster apologised last month to Trump over the edit of the Jan. 6 speech. Continued on Page 7

# G RAM G Bill introduced in LS amid Oppn uproar

A Bill that seeks to guarantee rural jobs for 125 days every year and replace the 20-year-old MNREGA was introduced in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday amid strong objections by the Opposition to the "removal" of Mahatma Gandhi's name from it.

Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, while introducing the Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) Bill, 2025, said the government not only believes in Mahatma Gandhi but also follows his princi-



ples. "The (Narendra) Modi govt has done more for rural development than previous governments," he said.

# IPLAUCTION Uncapped players strike gold! CSK splurge Rs 14.2cr each on Prashant & Kartik

**KOLKATA Knight Riders** 

(KKR) splurged a recordbreaking Rs 25.20 crore to land top Australian all-rounder Cameron Green and Rs 18 crore to acquire the services of Sri Lankan pacer Matheesha Pathirana in the Indian Premier League players' auction here on Tuesday.

Uncapped Indian players were also a big hit with Uttar Pradesh's 20-year-old left-arm spinner Prashant Veer going to Chennai Super Kings for Rs 14.20 crore. He became the highest paid uncapped player in the history of IPL auction after coming in at a base price of Rs 30 lakh. Jammu and

# Kashmir pacer Auqib Nabi

Dar also attracted a hefty sum of Rs 8.40 crore from Delhi Capitals to be among the top gainers in the mini auction. Dar's base price was also Rs 30 lakh. Indian stars Prithvi Shaw and Sarfaraz Khan, however, went unsold in the auction despite their good run of form with the bat.

Green surpassed compa triot Mitchell Starc (Rs 24.75 crore) to become the most expensive overseas player at an IPL auction. This was after Kolkata Knight Riders and Chennai Super Kings were involved in an intense bidding



war for him before the latter emerged winner.

KKR also went after Venkatesh Iyer before pulling out of the race against Royal Challengers Bengaluru, who

got the India all-rounder for Rs 7 crore. The three-time champions then entered the fray to buy Pathirana after Delhi Capitals and Lucknow Super Giants withdrew following an intense bidding war between the two franchises. Entering the auction at a base price of Rs 2 crore, Pathirana became the most

expensive Sri Lankan sold in an IPL auction. As far as Green is concerned, his salary for the season would still be Rs 18 crore (USD 1.9 million) as the rest of the amount will go towards the BCCI's player development programme as per the rules of the auction for foreign players.

Pathirana will get the full amount as it falls within the salary cap. Green, who previously turned up for

Mumbai Indians and Royal Challengers Bengaluru, has so far played 29 matches in the IPL to aggregate 707 runs and take 16 wickets. Shaw. however, went unsold despite his fine run of form in the domestic circuit lately, and so was the case with Sarfaraz, who smashed a 22-ball 73 in a Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy match for Mumbai on Tuesday. Big-hitting South African batter David Miller was bought by Delhi Capitals for his base price of Rs 2 crore, but New Zealand swashbuckler Devon Conway, whose base price was also Rs 2 crore, went unsold in the auction. NEW DELHI: India is set for a power-packed presence at the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting in Swiss ski resort town of Davos next month with four Union ministers, including Ashwini Vaishnaw and Shivraj Singh Chouhan, set to join five CMs and over 100 CEOs from the country. Minister for Civil Aviation K Ram Mohan Naidu and Minister for New & Renewable Energy, Consumer Affairs, and Food & Public Distribution Pralhad Joshi will also be part of the Indian delegation at the 5-day annual meeting from January 18. The Chief Ministers include Devendra Fadnavis of Maharashtra. N Chandrababu Naidu of Andhra Pradesh, Assam's Himanta Biswa Sarma. Madhya Pradesh's Mohan Yadav and Telangana's A Revanth Reddy. While Reddy is from Congress and Naidu is from Telugu Desam Party (an ally of BJP), the other three CMs are from BJP. Among the Union ministers, Ram Mohan Naidu is from TDP while other four are from BJP.

# Re-survey and mutation process via video conference reviewed

JOINT Collector Noorul Qamar has directed the revenue machinery to complete the ongoing re-survey process in the district within the stipulated timeframe without any errors, while also ensuring that land mutation applications are disposed of promptly without pendency.

Emphasising the importance of accuracy and timeliness, he instructed officials to treat the re-survey as a priority task, given its direct impact on citizens' land rights.

The Joint Collector conducted a comprehensive review of the re-survey, mutation and related issues through a video conference from the Collectorate's Video Conference Hall, interacting with Revenue Divisional Officers (RDOs) and Tahsildars.

During the review, he assessed the progress made at various stages and issued clear directions to strengthen monitoring at the field level to avoid delays and

discrepancies.

Referring to the first phase of the re-survey pilot project, Joint Collector Noorul Qamar stated that clerical corrections in the 25 selected villages must be completed within the

prescribed period, ensuring there is no scope for mistakes.

In the second phase, covering 24 villages identified under the pilot project, he instructed officials to complete the mutation process in all cases and take steps to issue the final notification.

He stressed that every mutation application should be examined thoroughly and final orders issued without leaving any cases pending.

In the third phase, covering 32 villages where the resurvey has commenced, the Joint Collector directed officials to complete ground truthing (GT) and other related processes within the government-mandated deadline.

He cautioned that negligence, undue delay or errors at any stage would invite strict action. Highlighting that the resurvey process is crucial for safeguarding land ownership rights, he urged all concerned officers to work in close coordination and ensure successful completion of the exercise.

THE Andhra Pradesh High Court on Tuesday underscored the need to modernise the process of counting offerings at the Tirumala Sri Vari Parakamani (treasury), suggesting that the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) substantially reduce human intervention and

adopt machine-based and artificial intelligence-driven systems.

Hearing the Parakamani theft case, the High Court observed that incidents involving the alleged theft of offerings at Tirumala cannot be treated as ordinary offences. The court noted that the funds deposited in the Parakamani represent the faith and devotion of millions of devotees across the world, and any misappropriation of such offerings directly hurts religious sentiments.

During the course of arguments advanced by counsel from both sides, the court remarked that continuing



with traditional, manual methods of counting offerings despite repeated theft allegations was neither prudent nor acceptable.

It emphasised that modern technology must be

leveraged to ensure transparency, accountability and security in the handling of temple funds.

The High Court also expressed concern over the practice of subjecting volun-

in the counting process to searches that resemble criminal scrutiny. It observed that individuals who come forward with a spirit of service should not be treated

Such measures, the court said, undermine the dignity of devotees and erode trust in temple administration.

with suspicion or humilia-

Further, the court made it clear that outsourcing employees should not be entrusted with the sensitive task of counting offerings. It advised the TTD to reconsider its existing procedures and evolve a foolproof mechanism that minimises

human handling and the scope for irregularities.

The bench directed the counsel appearing for the TTD and other parties to place before the court concrete proposals and expert-backed suggestions on modernising the Parakamani counting system. The court indicated that it expects a comprehensive approach that balances technological efficiency with the sanctity of religious practices.

The matter was posted for further hearing, with the High Court signalling that systemic reforms, rather than ad hoc measures, were necessary to safeguard the integrity of Tirumala's treasury.

# VAJPAYEE'S ROLE IN INFRA DEVELOPMENT DRAWS PRAISE

ENERGY minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar said that former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee earned the rare distinction of being an 'Ajata Shatru' (Man without enemies) in Indian politics, respected across party lines. He was speaking on Tuesday when the Atal Sandesh–Modi Suparipalana Yatra reached Bapatla.

The minister, along with ministers Anagani Sathya Prasad and Kolusu Parthasarathy and BJP state president P V N Madhav, unveiled the bronze statue of Vajpayee.

Addressing the gathering, Ravi Kumar described Vajpayee as a beloved son of Bharat Mata who rendered unparalleled service to the nation. He recalled that Vajpayee was elected nine times to the Lok Sabha and twice to the Rajya Sabha and served as Prime Minister on three occasions.

Even after losing the Prime Minister's post by a single vote, Vajpayee stepped down with dignity, setting a high benchmark for democratic values and winning the hearts of millions of

Ravi Kumar said Vajpayee firmly believed strong infrastructure was the key to rapid national development.

# Road repairs to be fast-tracked in state

R&B minister Janardhan Reddy says his department has stepped up measures to fast-track road repairs and development

Single bids to be accepted in road tenders to avoid delays

Explains move is aimed at speedy execution of road projects without procedural hurdles

STATE roads and buildings, investments and infrastructure minister B C Janardhan Reddy on Tuesday said that the coalition government is undertaking road repair works across the state on a war footing to provide better infrastructure to the public.

In a statement on Tuesday, the minister said that under the leadership of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, the government's primary objective is to complete road development works expeditiously and ensure smooth vehicular movement.

vehicular movement. As part of this effort, the roads and buildings (R&B) department has taken a key policy decision to accelerate the execution of road works and eliminate avoidable procedural delays. The minister explained that during the tendering process for road development contracts, it is common for only a single bid to be received. Until now, such tenders were routinely recalled, leading to repeated invitations, submission of fresh bids, evaluation, finalisation and execution of agreements—a process that often consumed more than 45 days.

Due to these delays, road works failed to commence on time, forcing people to endure damaged and unsafe roads for extended periods. To address this issue and prioritise public convenience, the R&B department has decided to accept and process tenders even if only a single bid is received at the first instance, without recalling the tender.

The minister said this is the

first such decision taken by the department with the clear aim of speeding up road repairs and development works. By finalising tenders without unnecessary repetition, works can begin immediately, preventing avoidable delays and ensuring timely completion of projects. He added that the decision would help deliver better-quality roads to the public within a shorter time frame, improve road safety and facilitate smoother travel across the state. The coalition government, he reiterated, is committed to providing pothole-free roads and strengthening infrastructure to support overall development.

# Minister vows support to beleaguered aquaculture

STATING that the aquaculture sector has become a key pillar of Andhra Pradesh's economy, minister for agriculture and fisheries K Atchannaidu said the coalition government is extending full support for the development of aquaculture with the prime objective of increasing farmers' income.

The minister was the chief guest at the oath-taking ceremony of the governing body members of the Andhra Pradesh State Aquaculture Development Authority, held at the fisheries department office at Penamaluru near here on Tuesday.

Addressing the gathering, Atchannaidu said the prevailing conditions in the global market and the tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump have impacted aquaculture farmers. He added that the state government is taking measures in coordination with the Central government to overcome these challenges.

He stressed the need for extensive promotion of the quality and credibility of Andhra Pradesh shrimp across the country and globally. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, he said, is continuously striving to explore new markets, boost exports and ensure remunerative prices for farmers. Emphasising quality consciousness, the Minister said farmers would receive better prices only by maintaining high standards.

Atchannaidu noted that Andhra Pradesh contributes 29 per cent to the country's

The government has removed difficulties earlier faced by farmers in pond registration and has also introduced geo-tagging of ponds.

The minister further stated that aquaculture farmers have been provided with electricity subsidy worth Rs 800 crore so far, which will be increased to Rs 1,200 crore. He clarified that the subsidy will be applicable only to registered farmers.

Atchannaidu asserted that the development of backward and weaker sections is possible only under the coalition government. He was speaking after participating as chief guest, along with BC welfare minister S Savitha, at the oath-taking ceremony of the chairman and directors of the Andhra Pradesh State Kalinga Vaishya Development Corporation in Vijayawada. The oath was administered to corporation chairman Boyina Govindarajulu and other directors.

He recalled that during the previous TDP government, BCs had received the highest number of jobs and medical seats. # VB-GRAMIN Bill raises fears among rural workers

THE Viksit Bharat-Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (VK-GRAMIN) VB-G RAM G Bill which was introduced in Parliament on Monday to replace the two-decade-old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), promises increase in workdays from 100 to 125, but masks fundamental changes that could leave rural workers worse off. Any spending beyond the allocated ceiling is borne entirely by state budgets. A controversial provision allows states to suspend all scheme work for 60 days during peak agricultural seasons.

For landless labourers who depend on the programme when farm work is scarce or exploitative, this legally closes a crucial safety net precisely when income is most needed.

Technology requirements compound access barriers. Mandatory biometric attendance, GPS tracking and appbased systems may exclude elderly workers, those with poor connectivity or worn fingerprints, and people lacking proper documentation.

All work must now come

from pre-approved Viksit Gram Panchayat Plans integrated with national infrastructure systems. This removes MGNREGA's flexibility for urgent, simple employment during distress, favouring large infrastructure projects requiring multischeme coordination.

Chakradhar Buddha, coordinator for LibTech India, an NGO, observed that many provisions of the VB-GRAMIN Act are unfair. He said that the employment system shifts from a demanddriven legal entitlement with relatively simple ground-level processes to a Centrally-controlled, technology-heavy scheme, where budget constraints and digital compliance may override workers' survival needs. He said that Andhra Pradesh used to receive feedback and suggestions on best practices for the MGNREGA through APNA (Andhra Pradesh NGOs Alliance).

He advised the state, which played a key role in the design and implementation of the MGNREGA, to retake the lead and restart consultations with stakeholders and the NGOs network to propose actionable changes that help workers from all regions receive work when they really need it and wages on time.


# Single light pulse can control quantum states in 2D materials: IIT Bombay

cientists at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay announced that they have discovered a simple new way to use light to control quantum states inside ultra-thin materials, a breakthrough that could lead to computers that are far faster and more energy-efficient than today's electronic devices.

The research focuses on two-dimensional semiconductors, materials that are only one atom thick and thousands of times thinner than a human hair.Inside these materials, electrons can exist in two distinct quantum states known as valleys, labelled K and K'.

These two states can be compared to the 0 and 1 used in digital computing, forming the basis of a growing research area called valleytronics.

Until now, controlling these valley states has been



difficult. Earlier techniques required complex laser setups using circularly polarised light and multiple laser pulses, and even then, the control was often incomplete or hard to measure.

As a result, reliable and reversible switching between the two valley states remained a major challenge.

The IIT Bombay team has now shown that this com-

plex setup is not necessary. In a study published in the journal 'Advanced Optical Materials, the researchers demonstrated that a single linearly polarised laser pulse can both control and read the valley state of electrons.

The key lies in introducing a small, controlled skew in the laser pulse's polarisation. According to Prof. Gopal Dixit from IIT Bombay, this slight asymmetry in the laser pulse is enough to push electrons into either the K or K⊠

By reversing the skew in the pulse, the electrons can be switched back to the other valley. This makes the process fully reversible, with the two valley states effectively acting as quantum versions of 0 and 1.

What makes the discovery even more significant is that the same laser pulse also generates a tiny electric current.

This current acts as a builtin signal that reveals which valley state the electrons have moved into. In simple terms, the system can be controlled and read at the same time, without the need for extra lasers or measuring devices.

The researchers also found that the method works across a wide range of laser wavelengths and does not need to be finely tuned to the material's energy levels.

## Employment guarantee scheme must be free from political interferences

R evamping welfare schemes is a good idea, so changes in the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, per se, are not objectionable. However, the way it is being done smacks of a desire to score political points. It begins with the name. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) is proposed to be replaced with the Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Grameen), or VB G RAM Priyanka Gandhi Vadra reacted with "Why are they removing Mahatma Gandhi's name? He is considered the biggest Indian leader. Whenever such a name changes, a lot of expenditure happens in stationery and

paperwork." More than that it makes the government a target for its detractors, which is increasingly coming under the influence of Gandhi haters. This does no good to the government under the Sangh Parivar, many of whose members have expressed admiration for Nathuram Godse. Enacted by the Congress-led United Progressive Alliance (UPA) government in 2005, the MGNREGA guarantees 100 days of work in villages. The Act has a provision for an unemployment allowance. "MGNREGA is bottom-up, people-centred, demand-driven, self-selecting and rights-based programme. It provides a legal guarantee for wage employment by providing allowances and compensation both in

cases of failure to provide work on demand and delays in payment of wages for work undertaken," an official document says. The new Bill proposes several changes. It raises the 100-day guarantee to 125. Also, the scheme will no longer be demand-driven. Further, states will bear the financial burden partially. At present, the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme is entirely a Centrally-sponsored scheme—that is, the Centre provides 100 per cent of wages, while states take care of a small part of the expenses in hiring skilled labour and arranging materials. Under G Ram G, the Centre's contribution will be limited to 60 per cent, whereas most states will have to spend 40 per cent. For

Northeastern and Himalayan states, this ratio will be 90:10. The new legislation proposes that work under the revamped scheme will not be available during the peak agricultural season. The government will rely on biometrics and geo-tagging for transparency. Non-availability of work during the peak agricultural season will be vehemently protested by the Left and civil society organisations. Communist leaders are no longer as powerful or influential as they were when the MNREGA came into being but Left-leaning NGOs and public intellectuals are still a force to reckon with.

The government will have a tough time tackling their resistance. At any rate, this provision privileges the interests of farmers over labour-

ers; it will be interesting to see how the BJP will face the criticism of being anti-poor. Besides, states, especially those under non-BJP parties, will be loath to share the burden of the rural employment guarantee scheme.

There are also states like Kerala, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, and Punjab, which face tremendous fiscal challenges, and it will be extremely difficult for them to finance the revamped scheme. Therefore, all stakeholders must try to sort out the matter in a spirit of cooperative federalism. The Centre should be willing to accept reasonable amendments to the proposed legislation, and states should rise above party and parochial interests to make the

# Can CBI contain cybercrime effectively?

**◄**HE Supreme Court's decision comes as a whiff of fresh air to the countless victims of cyber frauds. It is heartening that courts, when necessary, take responsible and appropriate decisions on key public issues — decisions that governments and police should be making — and even provide guidelines for their implementation. This is a wakeup call for those who uphold democracy and the separation of powers of their duty.

With "digital arrest scams" proliferating across the country, the Supreme Court's directions to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for carrying out a comprehensive probe into such crimes and criminals - including seeking Interpol's cooperation and tracing the origins — should be seen as a positive development in criminal justice prudence. The

Reserve Bank of India (RBI), directing it to use artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning to investigate deeprooted patterns of funds being moved through various banks in these crimes, so that proper inquiries can be conducted and perpetrators cannot escape. Referring to the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021, the Supreme Court ordered online intermediaries to cooperate with the CBI and asked them to collect and hand over data and information related to digital arrests to investigative agencies.

The court suggested that states and Union Territories not only set up coordination centers to thoroughly investigate cybercrime but also adopt plans to proactively prevent such offenses. The apex court also directed that the cybercrime coordination centres be linked with law enforcement agencies so that cybercrimes can be taken up for investiga-

A few days ago, under the leadership of Chief Justice Suryakant, the Supreme Court gave the CBI detailed guidelines on cybercrime—particularly digital arrests-sending a strong signal that tackling

It is only when training and skills are provided to the agency that the Supreme Court orders can be implemented meaningfully. Manekshaw's genius lay in combining strategic patience with an unshakeable moral confidence. His famous "I'm always ready, sweetie" was not banter but a declaration rooted in preparedness. Equally prescient was his warning that premature political orders, if issued, "may never be received," a rare assertion of professional integrity in civil and military relations. His humour, often quoted, was forged in far harsher circumstances. The surrender of 93,000 Pakistani soldiers was not merely a battlefield triumph but an unprecedented strategic leverage. That such leverage failed to deliver a final settlement on Kashmir remains one of India's costliest diplomatic omissions. Against this legacy, Pakistan's present attempts to elevate General Munir to Manekshaw's stature appear aspirational at best. After all, history, not rank or rhetoric, confers stature.

# Saluting VNVK Sastry, a selfless supporter of adivasis

ITTLE boys and girls of La primary school in Nalgonda district once cried inconsolably when their beloved teacher, V N V K Sastry, was transferred. Refusing to accept the loss quietly, they walked nearly ten kilometres to the national highway and staged a protest until their voices were heard. Blessed indeed is the teacher who wins such young

hearts. That instinctive affection followed Dr Sastry wherever he went. A retired senior officer, social anthropologist, and lifelong fieldworker, he habitually won hearts through devotion to duty and an unshakeable concern for the people he served. Recalling their nearly five-decade-long association around 2020, senior journalist and former editor of The Hindu (Hyderabad), Dasu Keshav Rao, summed him up in simple terms: a man who never worked for files alone, but for people.

#### A full moon night in

Srisailam: One incident narrated by Keshav Rao captures the essence of Dr Sastry's life. On a full-moon night in December 1988, when he was heading the Chenchu Project, they were in the core area of the Srisailam Tiger Sanctuary, where they were treated to welcome festivities that were organised by the Chenchu community. Earlier that day, they had visited

an ashram school where conditions were appalling. The warden was absent, as usual; chilrice and tamarind water in the name of sambar. The fine rice meant for the children never reached the school.

Dr Sastry suspended the absentee warden on the spot and immediately arranged a proper meal—rice, curries, sambar and milk-something the children rarely got to toast. The following morning, as they were driving away, a group of men suddenly intercepted their vehicle, running and panting from a distant hamlet located beyond a hill.

Alarmed, they asked if something was wrong.

"Pani emi ledu saar. Meeru maa penta vachaaru. Memu adiviki poyaamu. Choodadaaniki vachaamu. Anthe

Nothing was wrong, they explained. They had only come to see and thank the officer who had visited their village.

#### A life dedicated to adivasi communities:

The humble friend of adivasis he passed away in the early hours of December 8, at the age of 78. His demise marks the end of a remarkable five-decade journey that was dedicated to understanding, documenting, and empowering adivasi communities in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

A Ph.D. in Social Anthropology from Andhra University (1980), he spent 52 years in research, fieldwork, institutional building, and training. He emerged as one of South India's most respected scholars of tribal societies. He authored ten major books and over a hundred research papers and articles in English and Telugu, covering tribal women, forest rights, cultural change, development models, and the everyday lives of remote communi-

ties. Reflecting on the physical price of such commitment, he once remarked with characteristic humour:

"I earned malaria as a recurring deposit and amoebiasis as a fixed deposit—no regrets." Asked what "VNVK" stood for, he smiled and said, "I don't know-perhaps Very Nice, Very Kind."


#### 20 years of service post-retirement:

Joining government service in the early 1970s, Dr Sastry served for 34 years in the Tribal Welfare Department of the Government of Andhra Pradesh, retiring in 2005 as Director of Tribal Cultural Research and Training Insti-

tute (TCR&TI), Hyderabad. His postings took him deep into the tribal belts of Warangal, Adilabad, Kurnool, and the erstwhile Khammam district, where he implemented complex welfare, education, forest rights, and rehabilitation programmes.

He held key positions across ITDAs, TCR&TI, TWREIS, and EPTRI Hyderabad.

Colleagues remember him as a deeply field-oriented officer whose work consistently placed tribal communitiesnot bureaucratic convenience—at the centre of administration.



#### A Adilabad specialist:

Reverentially hailed as an Adilabad specialist, the district's history, culture, and struggles were etched deeply into his scholarship and memory. It is now 44 years since the police firing at Indervelli, where several Gond tribals were martyred. His work stands as a tribute not only to the Gonds, but also to the people of the district and their rich cultural diversity.

The mighty Godavari, Pranahitha, Penganga, Kaddem, and numerous rivulets flow through dense forests that account for nearly half of the district's geographical area.

Adilabad also houses a significant tribal population. Here, diversity is strikingly evident: Gonds, Kolams, Naikpods, Lambadas, Pardhans, and Thotis live in a complex and symbiotic relationship with nature.

Images from those years flicker vividly: the Indervelli firing on the Gonds; police-Naxal encounters in the Aalampally forests; the Tamil Nadu Express accident near Sirpur; the Dakshin Express derailment at Mancherial; and the tireless efforts of committed officers such as VPC. Sastry, CVSK Sarma, KR Kishore, Subrahmanyam, Manohar Prasad, GN Phani Kumar, and VNVK Sastry to improve the

lives of tribal communities. Equally vivid are memories of Prof Christoph von Fürer-Haimendorf's visit to Marlawai to perform the last rites of his wife, Betty, and the vibrant Keslapur Jatra.

#### **Indervelli killings:**

Three officers from Hyderabad were among the first to reach Indervelli, where police had opened fire on protesting Gonds the previous evening, killing many and injuring several others. The administration was dazed and uncertain about the actual casualty figures. The three officers trekked through forests and hill-top habitations, braving scorching summer heat and humidity, to meet the injured and the families of the deceased.

Later, when the Collector, AK Goel, informed forest officials at Mancherial that the Indervelli toll was far higher than the officially stated figure-he did mention the actual number to Keshav Raoit became clear how deeply the truth had been suppressed.

#### A pioneering anthropologist

Dr Sastry's scholarliness traversed anthropology, ecology, tribal history, and literature. His works, published in academic journals and government reports, and available on public platforms, remain foundational texts for students, administrators, and young re-

His notable publications are: Andhra Pradesh Tribal Women and Children - An Overview, Changing Patterns in Tribal Societies, Komaram Bheem (Telugu), Sanchara Sravanthi (Telugu), Reports for the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, and Training manuals and textbooks, including contributions to undergraduate

Even after retirement, Dr active and socially committed. For nearly two decades, he served as a freelance consultant and guest faculty, Institute of Tribal Development Studies, Hyderabad; contributed to NALSA Tribal Rights training modules for legal services authorities; expert investigator, Centre for Good Governance (World Bank land governance project); Course editor, PG Diploma in Tribal Development Management, NIRD; Member, National Expert Committees on Bauxite Mining (A.P.) and Kolleru Lake Sanctuary; senior consultant, APARD and adviser for Andhra Pradesh Community Forest Management Project (World Bank).

His deep understanding of forest rights, land governance, and community institutions made him a sought-after expert across government agencies and academic institutions.

#### Congress will return to power in 2028 as well: CM

BELAGAVI: Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Monday asserted that the Congress will return to power in Karnataka in 2028 with the people's mandate, just as it did in 2023, and said the BJP would continue to remain in the Opposition.

Speaking in the Legislative Assembly at Suvarna Soudha while responding to questions raised by the Opposition, the Chief Minister Siddaramaiah said the Congress government enjoys the support of 140 MLAs and that there was no need for the Opposition to create unnecessary speculation.

# POLITICAL ROWDIES HAVE **NO PLACE IN AP: NAIDU**

Vijayawada

CHIEF Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Tuesday issued a stern warning against what he described as the rise of "political rowdyism" in the state, declaring that those who commit crimes under the guise of politics have no right to remain in the state. He asserted that his government would show no leniency towards criminal elements, regardless of political affiliation.

Addressing a gathering at the appointment letter distribution ceremony for newly selected 5,757 police constables at the Andhra Pradesh Special Police (APSP) Battalion parade ground in Mangalagiri, the Chief Minister reiterated his resolve to maintain strict law and order. "Those who indulge in rowdyism in this State have no right to be here. I still stand by that statement," he said.

At the outset, Naidu announced a significant hike in the stipend for constables undergoing training, increasing it from Rs 4,500 to Rs 12,500

Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister K Pawan Kalyan distributing appointment orders to a police constable at APSP 6th Battalion Mangalagiri on Tuesday. Home minister V Anitha and DGP Harish Kumar Gupta are also seen.

He described the decision as part of the government's commitment to strengthening the police force and boosting morale among new

Reflecting on past incidents, the Chief Minister referred to the murder of former minister Y S Vivekananda Reddy during the 2019 elections, stating that the crime had initially been projected as a natural death.

He alleged that crucial

evidence was tampered with and that political opponents sought to shift blame onto him. "If that crime had been detected properly at the time, history would have been different," he remarked, adding that he had since become more vigilant and determined.

Naidu said crime rates had come down significantly after the formation of the NDA coalition government and warned of uncompromising action against offences involving women and drugs. He described the ganja menace as a blot on the state's image and said a special task force had been constituted to suppress it "with an iron hand". The Chief Minister also noted that the nature of crime was changing and called upon the police to adopt proactive methods, including extensive use of CCTV surveillance and swift

investigation. Stressing the principle of "visible policing and invisible ogy-driven and professional policing was the need of the hour. He cautioned that some criminals were becoming emboldened due to political patronage and made it clear that the government would not hesitate to act even against its own party members if required.

Highlighting employment generation, the Chief Minister said his government had fulfilled its promise of providing jobs by conducting the Mega DSC and police recruitments with transparency.

He said a total of 23,676 police jobs had been provided during his tenure, including 5,757 constable appointments in the current phase, and asserted that examinations were conducted without corruption, using digital technology.

Naidu said peace and order were prerequisites for attracting investments and development. Deputy chief minister Pawan Kalyan, home minister Vangalapudi Anitha and director general of police Harish Kumar Gupta were present at the event.

# A 'north-south divide' over Hindi names for new laws

THE row over the renaming of MNREGA has highlighted the Centre's new practice of naming Bills in Hindi, deviating from the tradition of providing a Hindi and an English name for each Bill.

A slew of Bills in recent months have come with just Hindi names -- packing in an acronym -- which many have claimed is another attempt at homogenization through language.

The practice has resonated especially in the south, where leaders have equated it with another attempt at Hindi imposition.

The Congress is already seeing red over naming MNREGA -- a homage to Mahatma Gandhi -- after Lord Ram. While the BJP is jeering that it is another evidence of the party's aversion to Hindu religion and ethos, the use of Hindi names appears to be about to widen the north-south divide.

Many MPs and political leaders, meanwhile, have contended that the names in Hindi are difficult to understand.

On Monday, as Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan presented

the Viksit Bharat Shiksha Adhisthan Bill in the Lok Sabha, RSP(A) leader NK Premachandran said it was difficult for him to pronounce the name. He contended that this practice of using Hindi names violates Article 348(B) of the Constitution, which savs new laws should have names in English.

Congress member Jothimani and DMK member T M Selvaganapathi also made their reservations clear. "I see this as an imposition of

a Hindi acronym. The "Sustainable Harnessing and Advancement of Nuclear **Energy for Transforming** India" has the short name of SHANTI, meaning peace. Earlier, the laws that replaced the Indian Penal Code, the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Indian Evidence Act were called Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, and Bharatiya Sakshya Bill. The Bhartiya Vayuyan Vidheyak law has replaced the Aircraft Act of 1934.

"Under this, the poorest of the poor get 100 days of employment. This (present) Bill is weakening the employment rights of the poor. It is against the Constitution," she claimed. have been incorrectly excluded from the draft list can now raise objections and request corrections. After addressing these objections, the final list will be published in February next year. The announcement of the Assembly polls in Bengal is expected after the publication of the final list. SIR was last conducted in Bengal in 2002.

Trinamool MP Saugata Roy termed the deletion of 58 lakh names "injustice". "This is the BJP's conspiracy to remove legitimate voters

from Bengal's list. We have set up voter assistance booths and we will help them submit forms to include their names in the voter list," he said.

The publication of the draft list is likely to intensify the political uproar in Bengal over SIR. Chief Minister and Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee has opposed the exercise and accused the Centre and the Election Commission of using SIR to delete the names of lakhs of eligible voters ahead of the election.

The Chief Minister asserted that the PPP model is a globally accepted mechanism that is being implemented across sectors, including healthcare, to expand capacity and improve service delivery. He said the model would help increase the number of medical seats while ensuring access to corporate-level healthcare for economically weaker sections.

Naidu also launched a sharp personal attack on former chief minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, alleging the latter's disregard for judicial processes. He said Jagan Mohan Reddy frequently skipped court appearances in cases related to alleged illegal assets and raised objections even when Supreme Court directions were being implemented. Such conduct, he remarked, reflected a lack of respect for constitutional institutions.

Referring to the TTD Parakamani theft case, the Chief Minister recalled that the High Court had expressed concern over attempts to treat it as an ordinary offence. He said offerings made by devotees carry deep religious sentiment and welcomed the court's suggestion to adopt artificial intelligence-based systems for the counting and management of temple donations.

On governance and administration, Naidu said the government's practice of issuing appointment letters to newly selected candidates in the presence of their family members was intended to instill a sense of pride and responsibility. He noted that this approach, earlier followed during DSC recruitments, is now being adopted for police constable appointments under the 'Yuvagalam' programme.

Turning to party affairs, the Chief Minister said he had held discussions with three-member committees on district-level organisational matters. He indicated that objections related to district party president appointments would be reviewed and resolved shortly. He also underlined the need to strengthen women's representation in party leadership, stating that the current 28.4 per cent representation should be increased to 30 per cent in view of pos-

sible future reservations. Naidu said the list of district party presidents would be announced within two days, followed by the declaration of the state committee before the end of the month. He added that organisational performance would be reviewed every three months and warned that non-performing office-bearers would be replaced, stressing the need for strict adherence to the party calendar from January onwards.

A 10-member national and international expert advisory team on public health participated in the meeting virtually.

Naidu said the government would focus on preventive healthcare by leveraging digital tools and artificial intelligence, rather than merely treating diseases after they occur. He said digitalisation of health records would help identify and analyse the top ten diseases affecting the population and significantly reduce medical expenses. The Chief Minister asked the expert panel to help showcase Andhra Pradesh's digital healthcare initiatives at the upcoming Global AI Convention in Mumbai.

Referring to the success of the Mustabu programme aimed at improving personal hygiene among tribal students, the Chief Minister said the NDA government was committed to building a "healthy, wealthy and happy Andhra Pradesh". He stressed that effective implementation critical to the success of any

policy. Interacting with the expert panel, former WHO chief scientist Dr Soumya Swaminathan underlined the importance of nutrition, availability of doctors and nurses, and the impact of pollution on public health. UNAIDS founding Executive Director Peter Piot said public health should not be viewed purely as a medical issue, as it was influenced by multiple social and environ-

mental factors. Former Union secretary Aarti Ahuja highlighted the need for root-cause analysis of diseases and expressed concern over the rising number of dialysis cases among youth due to pollution. Prof Yik-Ying Teo of the National University of Singapore said AI and digital health records could help deliver more efficient healthcare services. Harvard T H Chan School of Public Health's Margaret Elizabeth Kruk noted Andhra Pradesh's effective utilisation of the Hepatitis vaccine.

Khosla Labs founder Srikanth Nadhamuni said AI-enabled health services were becoming central to public healthcare delivery, while NABH Chairperson Dr Rizwan Koita observed that Andhra Pradesh was emerging as a hub for digital healthcare. AIIMS Delhi's Dr Nikhil Tandon stressed early diagnosis and risk assessment, and AIG Hospitals Chairman Dr D Nageswara Reddy said health education from a young age was essential.

Gates Foundation India Country Director Archana Vyas said an action plan would be prepared based on expert recommendations, including the formation of a health secretariat to monitor public health outcomes. Health Minister Satyakumar Yadav said the expert inputs would guide the state's healthcare reforms. The Chief Minister directed officials to hold such expert consultations every six months.



# Rupee falls 23 paise to settle at fresh record low of 91.01/\$

The rupee has fallen from 90 a dollar to 91 in the last 10 trading sessions

THE rupee fell 23 paise against the greenback to settle at a new all-time low of 91.01 (provisional) on Tuesday, as the government in the Rajya Sabha attributed the sliding value of domestic currency to widening trade deficit and the ongoing developments related to the India-US trade agreement.

During the session, the local unit lost 36 paise from its previous close against the greenback to hit its lowestever level of 91.14, but regained some ground later in the day. Even a weaker greenback and a sharp decline in global crude oil prices could not prevent the slide in the local unit, forex traders said.

The rupee has fallen from 90 a dollar to 91 in the last 10 trading sessions. The unit has slipped 1 per cent against the greenback in the past five sessions alone.

The issue was brought up in the Rajya Sabha on Tuesday, and Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said, "During the current



financial year, the depreciation of the Rupee has been influenced by the increase in trade deficit and likely prospects arising from the ongoing developments in India's trade agreement with the US, amid relatively weak support

"The depreciation of currency is likely to enhance export competitiveness, which in turn impacts the economy positively. On the other hand, depreciation may raise the prices of imported goods. However, the overall impact of exchange rate depreciation on domestic prices depends on the extent of the passthrough of international

#### Gold snaps 4-day record rally, drops ₹1,700

NEW DELHI: Snapping the four-day record rally, gold prices declined by Rs 1,700 to Rs 1,35,900 per 10 grams in the national capital on Tuesday as investors booked profits amid weak global cues, according to the All India Sarafa Association.

The precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had surged by Rs 4,000 to touch an all-time high of Rs 1,37,600 per 10 grams on Monday. The metal rose by Rs 6,000 over the previous four days, trading at record highs. "Gold prices witnessed profit booking and remained volatile, with the yellow metal slipping towards the \$ 4,275 level in global markets and staying under pressure," Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst - Commodity and Currency, LKP Securities, said. Echoing sentiments, Dilip Parmar, Research Analyst, HDFC Securities, said, "Domestic gold prices also softened, curtailing a four-day advance. These losses were, however, notably mitigated by the persistent weakness in the Indian Rupee which quoted at a record low level".

Moving the 'The Sabka Bima Sabki Raksha (Amendment of Insurance Laws) Bill, 2025' for consideration of the Lok Sabha, Sitharaman said the draft legislation was aimed at bringing transparency, ease of compliance mandates and increasing foreign direct investment (FDI) in the sector.

"These have brought in a greater push for the insurance sector. The number of insurers has risen from 53 in 2014 to 74 now," Sitharaman said. She said insurance penetration has improved from 3.3 per cent in 2014-15 to 3.8 per cent now and insurance density or the average insurance premium paid per



person in a year has jumped from \$55 in 2014 to \$97 now.

The minister said the total insurance premium paid has risen from Rs 4.15 lakh crore in 2014-15 to Rs 11.93 lakh crore and assets under management increased from Rs 24.2 lakh crore to Rs 74.4 lakh crore. "We are now looking for greater penetration, better regulatory oversight, easier compliance and more FDI," Sitharaman said. The minister said over the year, an ecosystem has developed in the country for providing greater access for people to insurance.

Sitharaman said that various government schemes such as the PM Fasal Bima Yojana and the Jana Arogya Yojana have brought poor people under the insurance umbrella, a move that has helped immensely during the Covid pandemic.

Established in 1984 at Lalkuan (Nainital, Uttarakhand), pulp and paper undertaking Century Pulp and Paper (CPP) of ABREL is a well-established player in the Indian paper industry with an installed capacity of 4.8 lakh metric tonnes per annum. In March, ABREL said, "The transfer of the business will be for a lump-sum cash consideration of Rs 3,498 crore, to be paid by ITC to ABREL."

### India's long-term outlook remains positive, indices to remain near all-time high in 2025

NEW DELHI: India's longterm outlook remains firmly positive, underpinned by favourable demographics, policy continuity, rapid urbanisation and sustained productivity gains, a report said on Tuesday. As 2025 draws to a close, Indian equity markets are sending mixed signals. Benchmark indices remain close to record highs, but beneath the surface, the picture is far more nuanced.

Smallcase Managers, in its report, said that valuations are stretched across large parts of the market, smaller stocks are under pressure, and investors are becoming increasingly selective about where they deploy capital. The managers noted that as US growth moderates and the Federal Reserve eventually pivots, interest-rate differentials should increasingly favour Emerging Markets, with India standing out as the most attractive destination.

Dhiren Shah, smallcase Co-Founder, manager, Kamayakya, said: "We re-



ties in 2026, with a clear focus on stock selection rather than index levels. While public capex has driven growth so far, the next phase will come from a revival in private capex as corporate balance sheets strengthen and capacity utilisation rises, setting up the next leg of India's structural growth."

India's macro backdrop remains constructive, aided by moderating inflation, the beginning of a rate-cut cycle and continued policy focus on manufacturing, infrastructure and exports. The report expects the economy to

Among Sensex firms, Axis Bank tanked the most by 5.03 per cent. Eternal, HCL Tech, Bajaj Finserv, Tata Steel, UltraTech Cement and Bajaj Finance were also among the laggards. However, Titan, Bharti Airtel, Mahindra & Mahindra and Asian Paints were among the gainers.

"Continued INR weakness to fresh record lows, driven by persistent FII outflows and subdued global sentiments, dragged domestic markets into negative territory," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited, said.

The rupee breached the record low level of 91 against the US dollar and hit 91.14 in intra-day trade due to foreign fund outflows on Tuesday. The BSE midcap gauge dropped 0.78 per cent, and the smallcap index dipped 0.69 per cent. Among sectoral indices, realty tanked 1.36 per cent, followed by bankex (1.03 per cent), commodities (0.91 per cent), IT (0.90 per cent), BSE Focused IT (0.86 per cent), financial services (0.83 per cent) and metal (0.82 per cent). Telecommunication and consumer durables were the only gainers. A total of 2,519 stocks declined while 1,651 advanced and 158 remained unchanged on the BSE.

"A risk-averse mood dominated trading as the rupee's breach of the 91 level against the US dollar raised macro concerns, while weakness across Asian markets added to global uncertainty. This combination prompted investors to reduce risk, triggering broad-based profit-booking, particularly across realty, financial services, metal and IT names, Ponmudi R, CEO of Enrich Money, an online trading and wealth tech firm, said.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 1,468.32 crore on Monday, while domestic institutional investors (DIIs) bought stocks worth Rs 1,792.25 crore, according to exchange data. On Monday, the Sensex dipped 54.30 points or 0.06 per cent to settle at 85,213.36. The Nifty edged lower by 19.65 points or 0.08 per cent to 26,027.30.

# Modi govt's illegality exposed: Cong on relief to Gandhis

THE Congress on Tuesday claimed the "illegality" of the Narendra Modi government and its "politically motivated prosecution stands fully exposed" after a court here refused to take cognisance of the Enforcement Directorate's National Herald money laundering case against Rahul Gandhi, Sonia Gandhi and others.

it has no FIR, without which there is no case. This politically motivated prosecution by the Modi government over the last decade of the principal opposition party stands exposed before the people of India," she said.

"No case of money laundering, no proceeds of crime and no movement of property; all baseless charges that have been a part of a politi-



cal witch hunt, propaganda, reputation assassination and campaign which stands defeated today," Shrinate said. She said the Congress

party and its leadership are committed to fighting for the truth and for the rights of every Indian. "We cannot, and will not ever be intimidated, because we fight for the truth," she added.

C Venugopal said, "Through this judgment, the court has exposed the illegal and mala fide political targeting by the Narendra Modi govern-

"From day one, the opposition, especially Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi, has been targeted without any legal basis or wrongdoing. This judgment clearly vindicates our stand," he added.

# Luthra brothers deported, taken into police custody

AURAV Luthra and Sau-**U**rabh Luthra, co-owners of the Birch by Romeo Lane nightclub in Goa where a massive fire killed 25 people, were deported from Thailand on Tuesday and taken into custody by Delhi and Goa police as soon as they landed in Delhi. The brothers arrived in the Indian capital in an Indigo flight and were immediately handed over to authorities for further legal proceedings, 10 days after a blaze tore through the Birch by Romeo Lane nightclub in Arpora in North Goa.

Gaurav, 44 and Saurabh, 40, will be produced before a Delhi court where the Goa police will seek their transit remand.

A TV reporter tracking the brothers from Bangkok attempted to shoot inside the aircraft, prompting the airlines and accompanying security officials to summon additional force to whisk away the two



The Luthra brothers are facing a case of culpable homicide and negligence following the December 6 tragedy, which investigators allege was compounded by the nightclub operating in violation of mandatory fire safety norms. The incident raised serious questions over alleged fire safety violations and lapses by the management. Gaurav and Saurabh fled to Phuket in the early hours of December 7, hours after the fire at their nightclub, prompting the authorities to issue an Interpol Blue Corner Notice and cancel their passports. The duo was detained by

Thai authorities at Phuket on December 11 following a request from the Indian government which later coordinated with officials in Thailand to deport them under legal treaties between the two nations.

On December 11, a Delhi court rejected the transit anticipatory bail pleas. Additional Sessions Judge Vandana termed the allegations against the brothers "prima facie grave and serious" and severely criticised their "conduct."

The court took note of the police investigation that the brothers had booked tickets to Phuket one hour after the fire, a fact their counsel had initially "concealed" while seeking protection from immediate arrest.

The judge said that leaving immediately after the tragedy was a clear attempt to "evade the legal process".

The surrendered cadres, primarily from the South Sub-Zonal Bureau, also include members linked to the Dandakaranya Special Zonal Committee (DKSZC), Telangana State Committee, and Andhra-Odisha Border (AOB)

Key figures include a Divisional Committee Member (DVCM) from the Keralapal

Area Committee with a Rs 8 lakh bounty, several PLGA (People's Liberation Guerrilla Army) members, Area Committee Members (ACMs), platoon leaders, militia commanders, and frontal organisation office-bearers like DAKMS and CNM presidents.

Disillusioned with Maoist ideology, they pledged allegiance to the Indian Constitution, vowing a peaceful life. Each received Rs 50,000 immediate incentive under the state's rehabilitation policy, Police officials said.

#### **Cong MLA raises** 'Vote Chori' issue in Assembly, Oppn opposes debate

BELAGAVI: Congress MLA B R Patil on Tuesday tried to raise the issue of alleged "vote theft" in the Karnataka Assembly, claiming that attempts were made to prevent his election as the legislator. The MLA from Aland assembly constituency in Kalaburagi wanted a discussion, but the opposition objected to it, saying that until the Special Investigation Team submits its report on 'Vote Chori', a discussion cannot take place.

"There were attempts to stop me from entering the Assembly. The Special Investigation Team has identified the accused in the 'vote chori' scam," the Aland MLA said in the House. Minister Priyank Kharge supported Patil, saying the MLA should be given a chance. "He should be given a chance to speak. There were attempts to steal votes for Rs 70 per vote."

BJP MLA V Sunil Kumar objected to the demand, saying, "Let the Home Minister table the SIT report on 'Vote Chori' as well as Dharmasthala. Then only the discussion on this topic can happen." The issue of vote theft was raised by Leader of opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, who alleged that attempts were made to delete over 5,000 votes in the Aland assembly segment.

The SIT has so far arrested one person from West Bengal for trying to delete votes using an application 'OTP Bazaar'. The SIT has also filed a charge sheet in this case, naming the BJP candidate Subhash Guttedar, his son Harshanand Guttedar. Adya and four others in this case.

#### Separate nodal officer in all dists to prevent female foeticides

BELAGAVI: Accepting that the female foeticide has not stopped in the state, Karnataka Health Minister Dinesh Gundu Rao on Tuesday said that the government is taking strict measures to prevent it. The minister said the government is appointing separate nodal officers in all districts and tightening measures to prevent foeticide, which he called a "social evil". for not wanting a girl child. These things are happening based on the sex determination of the foetus at some hospitals. Sex determination is illegal, but with the advancement in technology, portable ultrasound machines have been developed, which can be easily carried anywhere, and scans and tests can be done.

This needs to be controlled. We will bring it to the notice of the central government," he said.

In some districts and in a few hospitals, a higher number of male child births is happening.

It is found with the help of intelligence input, the minister said.

# Man arrested for attempt to grab 532 acres of govt, forest land: Khandre

FOREST, Ecology and Environment Minister Eshwar B. Khandre said that police have taken into custody MB Nemanna Gowda alias MB Manmatha for allegedly attempting to illegally acquire large tracts of forest and government land at Kengeri B.M. Kaval using forged documents.

Addressing the media,

Khandre said the accused had submitted fake documents and obtained court orders in an attempt to grab 532 acres of forest and government land, of which 482 acres fall under forest land. He added that Manmatha had previously made a similar attempt to claim ownership over 512 acres and 26 guntas of forest and government land by producing false records.

Khandre said that follow-

ing these attempts, the Assistant Conservator of Forests had lodged a complaint at the Mudigere Circle Police Station on November 28, after which the local Tahsildar also filed a complaint. Based on these complaints, police registered an FIR and have now taken the accused into custody.

He expressed confidence that the investigation would reveal the full conspiracy behind the attempted land grab, including identifying all individuals involved in facilitating the illegal claim over valuable forest and government land.

The Minister said he had observed that some officials and government advocates were directly or indirectly assisting land grabbers attempting to illegally acquire forest land worth thousands of crores of rupees.

In this regard, he has written to the Chief Minister, seeking a CID probe or a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to thoroughly investigate the matter.

Khandre issued a stern warning, stating that any attempt to encroach upon forest land through forged documents will not be tolerated.

"As Forest Minister, I will not allow anyone to grab forest land. This should serve as a warning to all," he said.



# **Congress will certainly return** to power in 2028: Sidda

CHIEF Minister Siddaramaiah on Monday asserted that the Congress will return to power in Karnataka in 2028 with the people's mandate, just as it did in 2023, and said the BJP would continue to remain in the Opposition.

Speaking in the Legislative Assembly at Suvarna Soudha while responding to questions raised by the Opposition, the Chief Minister Siddaramaiah said the Congress government enjoys the support of 140 MLAs and that there was no need for the Opposition to create unnecessary speculation.

Referring to a popular proverb, Siddaramaiah remarked that the role of the Opposition seemed to be adding salt to a burning wound. He said that despite repeated provocations, none of the ruling party legislators would be swayed. "The people have blessed me to serve as Chief Minister for five years. We have the strength of 140 MLAs, and the Opposition need not indulge in sour commentary," he said.

The Chief Minister said the Congress government clearly understands the pulse of the people. "Just



as the people blessed us in 2023, they will do so again in 2028. The people of Karnataka will never bring the

BJP to power," he asserted. Siddaramaiah alleged that although the BJP has ruled the state twice, it never came to power with a clear popular mandate. He claimed that in 2008 and 2018, the BJP formed the government through defections under 'Operation Kamala' and entered power through the back door rather than through people's blessings. He said this clearly showed that the people of the state do not favour the BJP.

political developments, Siddaramaiah said the Congress had formed a coalition government with the JD(S) in 2019 with the intention of preventing the BJP from coming to power, but the BJP questioned even that alliance. The Chief Minister said that while the Congress follows the final word of its high command, the BJP has failed to arrive at a consensus even in the selection of its party president. He alleged that frustration and jealousy were evident within the BJP ranks.

"We will provide a stable government for five years

and face the next election confidently. In 2013 and again in 2023, the people gave Congress a mandate. The BJP has never received such a mandate and will not receive it in the future either," Siddaramaiah said, adding that the BJP would continue to sit in the Op-

Quoting poet Kanakadasa, he said leadership was not about individuals but collective responsibility. "This is not my government, it is our government. I am the Chief Minister now and will remain so until the high command decides otherwise," he concluded.

# Raichur residents oppose hi-tech slaughterhouse near residential hub

THE construction of a hi-tech slaughterhouse on the outskirts of Raichur city by the district administration and the municipal corporation has triggered strong opposition from local residents, who have demanded that the project be shifted to an alternative

The slaughterhouse is being built on five acres of government land in Survey No. 95/1 of Yeramarus Ward No. 33. Locals argue that the selected site is surrounded by densely populated residential layouts and important public institutions, making it unsuitable for such a facility. Schools, colleges, hostels, religious centres and newly developed housing layouts are located in the immediate vicinity. In addition, construction of the Raichur airport is progressing nearby, turning the area into a prime development

Residents fear that the slaughterhouse will adversely affect public health, hygiene and the environment in the long run. More than 300 families currently reside in the KI-ADB Housing Layout alone, while several new layouts are also coming up in the area. Locals have expressed concern that waste and odour from the slaughterhouse could create serious problems in the future, despite assurances of modern technology.

"This is a rapidly developing residential area. Establishing a slaughterhouse here is unscientific and insensitive to the needs of residents and students," said local residents, adding that the project should be relocated immediately. They also pointed out that the site lies close to institutions such as the Morarji Desai Residential School, Abdul Kalam Residential Hostel, boys' and girls' hostels, and multiple religious centres.

Interestingly, the slaughterhouse was earlier proposed to be constructed on Ashapur Road. However, due to various reasons, the



project was shifted to the Yeramarus Camp area, a decision that residents have termed arbitrary and illogical.

Meanwhile, the district administration has defended the project. Deputy Commissioner Nitish K. said the proposal for a modern slaughterhouse was submitted to the Central government to replace the existing unhygienic facility near Mavinakere. The Centre has sanctioned Rs 9 crore for the project, which is being constructed using advanced technology.

According to the administration, the new facility will ensure scientific processing of meat without releasing waste into the environment. Meat processed at the slaughterhouse is expected to be exported to cities such as Mumbai and Hyderabad, and even overseas. Officials also claim that the project will generate employment opportunities for local residents and provide quality meat at affordable prices.

The Deputy Commissioner further stated that the existing slaughterhouse near Mavinakere is functioning under poor sanitary conditions, with waste reportedly being discharged into the lake, in violation of Supreme Court guidelines. The new hi-tech facility, he said, is aimed at addressing these concerns. Despite these assurances, residents remain unconvinced and continue to press for relocation, setting the stage for a growing confrontation between the administration and the local community.

## Four key bills on urban governance, transport and public trusts tabled in Assembly

THE Karnataka government on Tuesday tabled four bills in the state Assembly, aiming to modify administrative structures and enhance various authorities across the state.

The Bombay Public Trust (Karnataka Amendment) Bill was introduced to appoint the regional commissioner of the Belagavi region as its Charity Commissioner, the Deputy Commissioner of the district concerned as the Joint Charity

Commissioner and the

jurisdictional Assistant Commissioners and Tehsildars as the Deputy Charity Commissioner and Assistant Charity Commissioner.

The Karnataka State Road Safety Authority (Amendment) Bill was presented in the House to omit the upper limit in levy and collection of one-time cess at the time of vehicle registration.

Nadaprabhu Kempegowda Heritage Area Development Authority (second amendment) Bill was introduced to include the Director of the

Planning Department and the Chief Town Planner of Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA) as members of the Nadaprabhu Kempegowda Heritage Area Development Authority.

The Bengaluru Metropolitan Land Transport Authority (BMLTA) (Amendment) Bill was introduced to make provisions to include the mayors and the commissioners of the newly formed five municipal corporations in Bengaluru.

# Assembly clears second amendment to Greater Bengaluru Governance Bill

THE Karnataka Legislative Assembly on Tuesday passed the Greater Bengaluru Governance Bill (Second Amendment), 2024, paving the way for key changes in the composition of the Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA).

Presenting the amendment in the Assembly, Deputy Chief Minister and Bengaluru Development Minister DK Shivakumar said the revision was necessary to correct omissions and ensure proper representation of elected representatives residing within the Bruhat

Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) limits.

Shivakumar explained that certain areas falling under the constituencies of Rajya Sabha MP Sudha Murty and Chikkaballapur MP Dr K Sudhakar have now been brought under the BBMP jurisdiction. However, several public representatives residing within the civic body's limits were not included in the GBA member list. The amendment seeks to include local body representatives and Members of the Legislative

Council in the authority. He further said that since the Chief Minister serves as the head of the Greater Bengaluru Authority, the Chief Secretary and the

Additional Chief Secretary of the Urban Development Department have been included as members. In addition, the Finance Department Secretary will also be part of the authority.

These gaps were noticed during the first GBA meeting, which opposition members had not attended due to political reasons, prompting the government to introduce the amendment, he said.

During the debate, BJP MLA Suresh Kumar raised concerns over the provision of nominated members, pointing out that with 369 elected BBMP councillors already in place, adding nominated membersat the ratio of one per

20,000 residents—could create confusion and raise questions about the structure's appropriateness.

Responding to the concern, Shivakumar clarified that the Greater Bengaluru Authority is not an elected body but a state-level administrative institution. He said elections would be held within six months whenever new areas are merged into the BBMP.

Until then, nominated representation was proposed to ensure transitional governance. However, accepting the opposition's suggestion, he announced that the government would drop the provision for nominated members.

## Request made to BCCI to hold IPL's opening match in Bengaluru: Venkatesh Prasad

Mysuru

BENGALURU is likely to host the opening match of this year's Indian Premier League (IPL), with the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) formally requesting the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) to conduct the marquee fixture in the city.

Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar on December 12 had announced that cricket matches will be allowed at Bengaluru's Chinnaswamy Stadium with

safety measures. "We've allowed cricket matches to be held at the stadium, taking necessary precautions to ensure safety and maintain Bengaluru's reputa-

tion," Shivakumar said. Speaking to reporters in Mysuru on Tuesday, KSCA

President and former Indian pacer Venkatesh Prasad said discussions have already been held with the BCCI on hosting the IPL opener in Bengaluru.

The BCCI was also actively considering the proposal, Prasad added. Traditionally, the IPL opening match is held at the home ground of the team that won the trophy in the previous season.

However, Prasad said certain issues that arose during the Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) victory celebrations had led to confusion earlier. Following the KSCA elections, he said the cricket association had held discussions with the state government to ensure smooth conduct of the matches.

"The Chief Minister (Siddaramaiah) and the Deputy Chief Minister (D.K. Shiva-



kumar) have already given a green signal for hosting the tournament. I have also spoken to the Home Minister over the phone. The date for this year's IPL opening

match will be finalised soon," Prasad said

He added that Bengaluru would continue to host IPL, international matches and games across all formats.

Prasad also said star cricketer Virat Kohli would be visiting Bengaluru for the Vijay Hazare Trophy matches.

He noted that Bengaluru has three stadiums, including the M. Chinnaswamy Stadium, and a decision on the venue for the matches is yet to be taken. He also said discussions are underway to develop an international standard cricket stadium in Mysuru. Referring to the past three years, Prasad acknowledged that the cricket association had faced internal issues, but assured that his team would resolve all pending matters and prioritise the promotion of quality cricket.

Deputy Chief Minister Shivakumar had said, "Home Minister G. Parameshwara has been tasked with overseeing the arrangements, and the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) President Venkatesh Prasad and police officials will discuss the details." Shivakumar emphasised that the decision

was made to uphold Bengal-

uru's reputation and prevent any untoward incidents. The decision follows suspension of cricket matches at the stadium after 11 people died in a stampede during an RCB victory celebration in July this year.

The Chinnaswamy Stadium had also lost the opportunity to hold a Women's World Cup match due to security concerns. The stadium has not hosted any matches since the stampede on June 4, in which 11 people were killed.

The announcement came after KSCA President Venkatesh Prasad and other office-bearers met Deputy CM Shivakumar in Belagavi. They had also met the Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and had submitted a request for the resumption of cricket matches.
