

ODISHA GETS RS 10.9K CR FOR RAILWAY SECTOR

Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw on Monday said the Centre has allocated Rs 10,928 crore for the railway sector development in Odisha in the Union Budget for 2026-27 financial year. Addressing a press conference through virtual mode from New Delhi, Vaishnaw said railway projects worth Rs 90,659 crore are under progress in the State.

“We had promised to invest more than Rs 1 lakh crore in Odisha. Now, with the recent budget allocation, the total investment in the railway sector will cross Rs 1 lakh crore soon,” he said.

The present allocation exceeded 13 times the average allocated amount of Rs 838 crore Odisha had received each fiscal during the UPA regime between 2009 and 2014, he said. The State in the 2025-26 financial year was allocated Rs 10,599 crore.

The Railway Minister said Odisha will also benefit from



the East-West freight corridor project.

The 2,052-km corridor will connect Dankuni in West Bengal with Surat in Gujarat. “It will pass through Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Gujarat. The corridor will boost industrial development and economic activity across Odisha,” he stated.

Stating that six pairs of Vande Bharat Express and six pairs of Amrit Bharat Express

are currently operational in Odisha, Vaishnaw said that the State will also have bullet train service soon. In the last 11 years, around 2,200 km of new railway tracks have been constructed in Odisha, which exceeds the total railway network of Malaysia, he pointed out.

For protection of wild elephants from train accidents, Vaishnaw said his ministry would instal AI-based thermal cameras along railway

tracks to detect and prevent collisions with elephants. The project will be launched within 6 months. Besides, 200 spots have been identified across the country for construction of underpasses to allow smooth movement of the elephants, he added.

East Coast Railway (ECoR) General Manager Parmeshwar Funkwal said a total of 59 stations in Odisha have been identified for complete redevelopment under the Amrit Station Scheme with a cost of Rs 2,439 crore, of which work at six stations—Cuttack, Baripada, Barpali, Bimlagarh, Paralakhemundi and Talcher-- have been completed.

About 88 per cent of the total budgetary allocation made for the ECoR for the year 2025-26 has been utilised so far.

When it comes to Odisha, the total expenditure stood at 91 per cent, he informed mediapersons.

Meanwhile, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi thanked Prime Minister Nar-

endra Modi, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and the Railway Minister for the railway budget. This initiative of the Central government towards the progress of Odisha has further strengthened the resolve of building a ‘Prosperous Odisha’, Majhi wrote on X.

“I firmly believe that the ‘East-West Freight Corridor’, which was approved in the current budget, will usher in a new era in the industrial and commercial fields in Odisha,” he said.

Majhi said the use of AI-based thermal cameras and Optical Fibre Cable (OFC) to prevent elephant deaths on railway tracks will create a model towards the protection of wildlife.

Stating that his government is committed to providing all possible support to the Central government for the overall development of Odisha, the Chief Minister said, “With our joint efforts, Odisha will definitely become a progressive and prosperous State.”

Prez arrives on 6-day visit to Odisha

PRESIDENT Droupadi Murmu arrived here on Monday on a six-day visit to Odisha during which she will attend religious and academic programmes across five districts, officials said. President Murmu was received at the Biju Patnaik International Airport here by Governor Hari Babu Kambhampati, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and others.

She was accorded a ceremonial welcome as different cultural troupes performed at the airport and on the way to Lok Bhavan. According to her itinerary, she will attend programmes across Khurda, Jaipur, Balasore, Puri and Mayurbhanj districts over the next few days.

“Elaborate security arrangements have been made at all the places she will visit,” a senior police officer said, adding that special deployment have been made in Bhubaneswar where the President will stay for four days. After an overnight stay at Lok Bhavan, President Murmu will visit Jaipur on Tuesday to offer prayers at Maa Biraja temple and perform rituals at Navi Gaya, a sacred place for offering puja in honour of ancestors.

Public entry to Maa Biraja



temple is restricted from 5.30 am till departure of the President on Tuesday. On Tuesday afternoon, she will attend the convocation ceremony of Fakir Mohan University in Balasore as the chief guest and proceed to Puri, where she will perform ‘pind daan’ at Swetanganga tank on Wednesday morning and visit Shree Jagannath Temple around 7.40 am. Public visit to the 12th century shrine is also regulated during Murmu’s visit in Puri.

Later in the day, the President will visit her home district, Mayurbhanj, where she will inaugurate a holiday home at Rairangpur, visit a Girls’ Higher Secondary School, unveil the statue of tribal leader Bhanjir Sunaram Soren and inaugurate a sports complex.

On the final leg of her Odisha tour, the President will visit the Simlipal National Park

on February 5 and spend the night there. The visit of tourists to Similipal is also restricted for three days starting February 4 due to security reasons, a Forest department official said.

Before going to Similipal, the President will attend a special programme at the Rairangpur Jagannath Temple and interact with tribal women and youth groups.

On February 6, Murmu is scheduled to attend the Black Swan Summit India, an event jointly organised by the Odisha government and the Global Finance & Technology Network (GFTN) to discuss the impact of AI and future technology stacks on global capability centres, education, and the future of jobs in the FinTech and InsurTech sectors. She is scheduled to leave Bhubaneswar for Chhattisgarh on Saturday, officials said.

CM unveils Rs 600 cr growth package for Rayagada

RAYAGADA: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Monday laid the foundation stones for several key development projects in Rayagada, marking a significant push to the district’s growth and infrastructure. Upon arrival at Yesco Ground, Majhi participated in the 108-kundiya Vedic Vishwashanti Mahayajna, where he offered the ‘Purnahuti’. He later inaugurated the Subhadra Shakti Mela, a powerful showcase of women’s empowerment in the district, and extended various forms of assistance to women from Self-Help Groups (SHGs).

Majhi launched development projects worth Rs 600 crore in Rayagada and announced that 80 per cent of jobs in industries being set up in the district would be reserved for local youth. The Chief Minister inaugurated 22 projects worth Rs 238 crore and laid the foundation stones for 87 others valued at over Rs 366 crore. The projects include infrastructure development works such as roads, bridges, healthcare, schools and women empowerment initiatives. Majhi also laid the foundation stone for beautification of Maa Majhariani temple with an in-

vestment of Rs 37 crore.

Among major infrastructure announcements, Majhi said a six-lane road connecting Berhampur with Jeypore would be constructed to improve regional connectivity. He also promised that a medical college would be established in Rayagada in the near future, addressing a long-standing demand of the district. During the programme, women from Self-Help Groups were felicitated for their contributions and achievements.

While addressing the media, Majhi highlighted the objectives of the Subhadra Yojana, claiming that the scheme is intended to create livelihood opportunities for women through cottage industries, self-employment and small businesses, with the Subhadra Shakti Mela envisioned as a platform to connect women entrepreneurs to national and even international markets.

Referring to the Union Budget, the Chief Minister stated that Odisha has received due importance from the Centre. He highlighted that thousands of women in Rayagada district have become Lakshmi Didi, reflecting the success of women-centric livelihood programmes.

CM rolls out projects worth Rs 276 cr for Subarnapur

CHIEF Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Sunday unveiled development projects worth Rs 276 crore and announced new initiatives involving an additional Rs 633 crore for Subarnapur district during his one-day visit to the western town. Majhi launched the projects while attending the ‘Subhadra Shakti Mela’, a congregation mostly comprising women at Subarnapur.

Of the projects launched, foundation stones were laid for 24 projects worth Rs 173 crore, while 34 projects valued at Rs 103 crore were inaugurated.

Before attending the Mela, the Chief Minister visited the ‘Samadhi Peeth’ (memorial) of Santha Kabi Bhima Bhoi, who guided Odisha’s social and spiritual consciousness, will be honoured through the comprehensive development of his Samadhi Peeth, for which Rs 35 crore will be spent.

KIIT organises mega blood donation camp

Over 1K mobile phones seized from 21 burglars

ODISHA Police on Sunday arrested 21 burglars and recovered 1,066 mobile phones during raids in Ganjam district, officials said. According to police, 20 of them are from West Bengal.

The arrests were made during raids in Bhanjanagar, where the gang members were staying. They were allegedly involved in looting mobile phones from different parts of Odisha and neighbouring Andhra Pradesh, police added.

Police said they seized 1,066 mobile phones, five tablets and accessories, including 1,275 batteries and 424 motherboards, besides 11 motorcycles



and nine fake number plates. The value of the seized items has been estimated at around Rs 50 lakh.

Ganjam Additional SP Ranjan Kumar Dey said police suspect the accused may have smuggled the looted mobile phones to other countries. “A detailed investigation is underway to ascertain the source of the mobile phones and the rea-

son for possessing such a huge number of devices,” he said.

Out of the arrested persons, 20 hail from different districts of West Bengal and the remaining one was from Bhanjanagar. The accused resided in four rented houses in Bhanjanagar. While seven of them stayed in a house, 13 others lived in three houses, police added.

Wildlife activists welcome Budget’s ‘turtle trail’ initiative

WILDLIFE activists expressed hope that the proposed sea turtle research centre in Ganjam district will be expedited after Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman mentioned “turtle trails” near major nesting sites in her Budget speech.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi also said turtle trails will be developed near major nesting sites in Odisha, Karnataka and Kerala to promote wildlife tourism and environmental protection. “This nature-based tourism scheme announced in the Budget will focus on eco-friendly tourism infrastructure, the Chief Min-

ister said.

Earlier, there was a proposal to set up a sea turtle research centre near the mouth of Rushikulya river, a major mass nesting site of Olive Ridley turtles. The location has good communication facilities and is close to Berhampur University and a regional centre of the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) in Gopalpur.

The Forest department had identified around 3.5 acres of government land near Purunabandh for the establishment of the proposed centre, but no further progress has been made, sources said. “As the Union Finance Minister proposed the turtle trail, which includes research on the sea



creature, we hope the research centre will be expedited with the assistance from the Central government,” said Rabindra Nath Sahu, secretary of the Rushikulya Sea Turtle Protection Committee, an organisation working on Olive Ridley conservation for several years.

Research on different aspects of sea turtles, including Olive Ridelies, could be carried out in the proposed research centre, Biswajit Mohanty of Wildlife Society of Odisha (WSO) said. He said it was high time the State government took steps to expedite work on the establishment of the research centre, which would be one of the few such centres in the country.

Berhampur MP Pradeep Kumar Panigrahy said he would take up the matter with the State government and the Union minister concerned and try to establish such a centre. A senior forest officer said they have already submitted the proposal to the government, which was under consideration.

Officials said a record number of around 9 lakh Olive Ridelies laid eggs at the Rushikulya rookery in two phases last year. Olive Ridley turtles visit Odisha’s coast near Gahirmatha beach in Kendrapara district, the Devi river mouth in Puri district, and the Rushikulya river mouth in Ganjam district for annual mass nesting.
