## Youth Congress leader resigns over ticket allocation row

- MD Azeem resigns as Karimnagar district Youth Congress General Secretary
- Cites denial of B-form and alleged deviation from secular principles as reasons
- Criticises ticket allocation to new entrants over committed youth leaders

MD Azeem, General Secretary of the Karimnagar district Youth Congress, has resigned from his post, citing dissatisfaction over the party's ticket allocation process in the current municipal elections. He has submitted his resignation to the State President of the Indian Youth Congress.

Addressing a press conference in Karimnagar, Azeem said he has been associated with the Indian National Congress since 2014 and stood firmly with the party during its most challenging phase in Telangana. He

recalled contesting the 2020 municipal elections on a Congress ticket when the party was struggling to regain public trust and said he worked consistently to strengthen the organisation at the grassroots level.

Azeem expressed deep disappointment over being denied a B-Form in the present municipal elections despite his long-standing dedication and contributions. He alleged that the reasons cited for rejecting his candidature, particularly those linked to religious vote calculations, were against the secular principles traditionally upheld by the Congress party.

He further questioned the

entry of Hindu-Muslim polarisation into the candidate selection process and criticised the allocation of tickets to recently joined members while overlooking committed young leaders. Such decisions, he said, demoralise grassroots workers and undermine the purpose of nurturing young leadership within the organisation.

"With a heavy heart, and considering the injustice in the ticket allocation process, I feel it is appropriate to step down from my responsibilities," Azeem said, adding that he remains grateful for the opportunities given to him and will always cherish his association with the party.

## Collector directs officials to finalise municipal vote counting arrangements

DISTRICT Collector Abhilasha Abhinav has instructed officials to ensure that the counting of votes in the upcoming municipal elections is conducted transparently and under tight security arrangements. CLEAR guidelines have been issued to candidates contesting the Nizamabad Municipal Corporation elections on behalf of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), said Nizamabad Urban MLA

Dhanpal Suryanarayana. He asserted that a decisive victory in Nizamabad is certain if party leaders, workers and candidates work in coordination.

Addressing party leaders and candidates, the MLA said that during the past two years of representing Nizamabad in the As-

the upcoming municipal elections, he said the post of Mayor would go to the BJP this time. He claimed that surveys conducted in the city were completely in favour of the BJP and reflected public support for development-oriented and transparent governance.

He further stated that the slogan "Mana Indore, Our Mayor" was resonating strongly among the people, describing it as a true reflection of public sentiment. The Urban MLA said he would actively participate in the election campaign from Tuesday, taking part in rallies and door-to-door campaigning.
