

Congress MLA challenges opposition to account for past development failures

• K R Nagaraj accuses BJP and BRS of spreading false propaganda in Waradhanapet

WARADHANAPET MLA K R Nagaraj has criticised the former MLA and leaders of the BJP and BRS, accusing them of indulging in politics based on lies, and said the people of Waradhanapet would teach them a fitting lesson. Speaking at a media

conference on Tuesday at the Municipal Election Office, he also announced the names of 12 ward members supported by the Congress Party.

MLA K R Nagaraj alleged that opposition leaders, unable to accept the public support for Congress welfare schemes in Ward No. 12, are spreading falsehoods

and baseless propaganda. He said Congress leaders are campaigning door-to-door and receiving strong backing from residents, focusing on households that have benefited from government welfare programmes. He criticised former rulers for not spending on development during their ten-year tenure and

contrasted it with Congress achievements in the past two years.

Highlighting tangible development, Nagaraj stated that 143 Indiramma houses and new ration cards have been provided to the poor, and works worth Rs 200 crore, including an Integrated School, a 100-bed hospi-

tal, a mini stadium, a Munsif Court, a sub-jail, and a Banjara Bhavan, have been sanctioned. He also reaffirmed that the 100-bed hospital foundation stone was laid based on public opinion and assured its completion.

The MLA further criticised opposition parties for troubling tribals by merging hamlets into municipalities, while Congress fought to convert them into Gram Panchayats.

He highlighted feeder channel repairs during the rainy season and asserted that Congress is delivering genuine justice to weaker sections through its six guarantees. MLA K R Nagaraj appealed to voters to reject opposition propaganda and ensure a decisive victory for all 12 Congress candidates in the upcoming municipal elections.

Forest officials arrest two for hunting wild boar in Mancherial

FOREST officials on Tuesday arrested two men for hunting, killing and consuming a wild boar in Karnapeta village. Acting on reliable information, the authorities apprehended Mareneni Bhoomayya and Guniganti Laxman and produced them before the court, which remanded them to 14 days of judicial custody. Of-

ficials said the accused had illegally killed the wild boar by setting up an electric wire trap in a paddy field near Pellimadugu.

During searches of their residences, forest officers seized wild boar meat, electric wires and J-wire used in the act.

The arrest highlights the continued efforts of forest authorities to prevent poaching and protect wildlife in the region.

thakunta mandal, where she planted saplings along with beneficiaries. The Collector said oil palm saplings were planted over 110 acres in the district in a single day, involving 32 farmers.

Explaining the economic benefits, Garima Agrawal said oil palm starts yielding from the fourth year and currently has a support price of Rs 20,456 per tonne, making it a profitable option.

Collector's hospital visit exposes gaps in patient care

DISTRICT Collector K. Haritha on Tuesday emphasised the need for improved medical services at government hospitals, stating that patients, particularly those from common and tribal communities, must receive respectful and quality healthcare.

The District Collector made a surprise visit to the government hospital at the district headquarters, where she inspected various wards and departments. She interacted with patients under-

going treatment and sought details regarding the medical facilities and services being provided.

During the inspection, Haritha reviewed the functioning of the blood bank and enquired about the services rendered by doctors, nurses and other hospital staff.

She later held a review meeting with the doctors, stressing the importance of punctuality and diligence in duty.

She directed hospital authorities to maintain cleanliness in wards and hospital, ensure quality standards in the food supplied to patients

and provide clean drinking water. She also instructed doctors and staff to continuously monitor patients' health conditions and avoid any form of negligence.

Stating that government hospitals cater largely to economically weaker sections and tribal populations, the District Collector underlined the responsibility of medical staff to treat every patient with dignity and care.

Hospital Superintendent Praveen, Medical College Principal Subodh Kumar, along with doctors and other staff members, were present during the inspection.
