

Devotional fervour marks idol re-consecration ceremony

THE idol re-consecration ceremony was held with religious fervour at Sri Moksha Venkateswara Swamy Devasthanam in Gudipadu (Ramachandrapuram) village of Palvoncha mandal on Monday, drawing devotees, public representatives, and local leaders in large numbers.

The programme was organised under the leadership of N Suresh Reddy, Chairman of the Shyamala Gopalan Educational Foundation, as part of the temple's renovation and idol installation festivities.

CPI MLA, Kunamneni Sambasiva Rao, attended the event as the chief guest. He was accorded a traditional welcome by Vedic scholars and temple priests upon his arrival.

spiritual legacy was essential for protecting the region's heritage. The MLA lauded the dedication and commitment of Suresh Reddy and his family in conducting the idol re-consecration ceremony in a grand and organised manner.

He expressed hope that the development of the temple would also contribute to the socio-economic growth of nearby tribal villages. Emphasising the importance of community participation, Rao assured that he would extend all possible support

for the development of the temple and the surrounding areas, including infrastructure and basic amenities.

Several dignitaries, including the temple Executive Officer, CPI district secretary Sabir Pasha, the Mayor, local CPI leaders, prominent citizens, village elders and devotees, were present at the ceremony.

The event witnessed elaborate religious rituals, homams and Vedic recitations performed by priests, creating a spiritually charged atmosphere. Awareness session on AI tech in governance held

Collector underlines thorough review of outputs generated through AI

"THE use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tool 'Claude' can significantly enhance efficiency and improve the quality of public administration," Anudeep Durishetty, District Collector of Khammam, said on Monday.

Addressing district officials at the Collectorate, Durishetty conducted an awareness session on the application of AI technology in governance. He demonstrated how the tool 'Claude' can be used to prepare presentations, analyse data, and generate reports within a significantly shorter timeframe. "Reports that typ-

ically take two to three hours can now be prepared within minutes with the help of AI tools, subject to proper supervision," he noted.

Explaining its practical utility, the Collector said that by uploading datasets, such as five years' procurement details of paddy, the tool can generate actionable insights. "These include identifying rice millers with high pending stock levels, thereby helping the administration prioritise interventions," he said. Durishetty emphasised that outputs generated through AI must be thoroughly reviewed before implementation. He urged department heads to adopt AI tools to monitor govern-

ment schemes, evaluate staff performance, and ensure the timely delivery of services to beneficiaries in accordance with official guidelines.

He also called upon departments to build internal capacity by training staff in the effective use of AI-based applications. The Collector suggested exploring the development of customised AI-driven applications tailored to specific departmental needs.

As a follow-up measure, he directed that at least two officials from each department present, next week, detailed proposals on integrating "Claude" into their respective workflows.

Resolve pending Bhu Bharati applications: DC


DISTRICT Collector Adarsh Surabhi has instructed Tahsildars to give special attention to pending Bhu Bharati applications and to work with the goal of fully resolving all applications within the coming week.

The Collector conducted a review with Tahsildars of all mandals regarding the status of applications on Monday. He directed Tahsildars to focus particularly on pending applications in the Revenue Department and aim for their complete



disposal within the next week. He advised that there should be no delay in resolving revenue-related applications. "Especially, applications pending for more than 60 days should be prioritized, thoroughly exam-

ined, and resolved swiftly," he said. "The District Collector's office will monitor the processing of these applications, and there will be continuous supervision over the movement of files," he said.

WARANGAL Police Commissioner Sunpreet Singh stated that due to non-compliance with traffic regulations, the country was losing many young lives the very future of the nation in road accidents.

As part of the second phase of the "Arrive Alive" programme, conducted during the last week of every month in accordance with State Government directives, Warangal Traffic Police organised an awareness session for students at Vaagdevi College in Hanumakonda on Monday. At the outset, traffic

officials delivered a Power-Point presentation outlining the traffic rules that every motorist must follow and explained the consequences of violations.

The programme was attended by the Warangal Police Commissioner as the chief guest, along with Central Zone DCP Dara Kavitha, Traffic Additional DCP

Prabhakar Rao and ACP Satyanarayana.

Addressing the students, Commissioner Sunpreet Singh urged motorists to exercise caution while driving. He emphasised that drivers bore responsibility not only for their own safety but also for the safety of others on the road. He stated that violation of traffic rules significantly

increased the risk of accidents and warned that reckless driving for thrill could prove fatal, causing irreversible loss and lifelong suffering to families. He advised students to practise defensive driving and always prioritise safety. The Commissioner further stated that last year around 800 people lost their lives across the State due to murders and other causes, whereas nearly 7,500 people died in road accidents, calling the figure deeply distressing. He appealed to motorists to strictly adhere to traffic regulations and urged students to spread awareness among their family members and friends about safe driving practices.

At the conclusion of the programme, traffic officials administered a pledge to students to follow traffic rules diligently.

A tragic road accident occurred on the national highway near Dorakunta village in Kodad mandal of Suryapet district. A car traveling from Vijayawada towards Kodad suffered a sudden tyre burst, causing the driver to lose control. The vehicle overturned and was flung onto the opposite lane, where it violently collided with another car heading from Kodad to Vijayawada.

In the mishap, Uppuvelli

Satyam Babu, a 45-year-old pastor from Kodad town, died on the spot. Another person traveling with him sustained serious injuries. In the other car coming from Vijayawada, eight passengers were severely injured. Among the injured, the condition of two individuals is reported to be critical.

Locals and police personnel promptly reached the scene and shifted the injured to the Government Hospital in Kodad for treatment. Police have registered a case and initiated an investigation into the incident.
