

Naini drops murder bombshell, demands PD Act against former MLA

WARANGAL West MLA Naini Rajender Reddy on Monday made sensational allegations against former MLA Dasayam Vinay Bhaskar, accusing him of orchestrating the murder of former BRS corporator Anishetty Murali, Vaddepalli Pasha, Goud and four others in the Warangal West constituency.

The MLA alleged that a series of violent attacks on Congress workers had been carried out at the behest of the former MLA. Accompanied by senior leaders, Naini met Warangal Police Commissioner Sun Preet Singh at the Commissionerate and submitted a detailed


complaint seeking immediate action. He stated that on Sunday, the 22nd of this month, local BRS corporator Bongu Ashok Yadav and his associates, allegedly under the influence of alcohol, attacked Congress worker Netula Raghu of the 4th Division and attempted to murder him. He further recalled that earlier, followers of Vinay Bhaskar had attacked Congress worker Thota Pawan at Hanumakonda Chowrasta in an alleged attempt to kill him.

Citing repeated attacks on Congress activists, Naini demanded a comprehensive investigation against Vinay Bhaskar within a week. He urged the police to invoke the Preventive Detention (PD) Act against the former

MLA and to initiate city extermination proceedings. He also demanded that rowdy sheets be opened against those involved in the attack on Netula Raghu.

Speaking to the media outside the Warangal Police Commissionerate, the MLA accused certain BRS leaders of behaving like goondas and indulging in violence-driven



politics. He alleged that such behaviour had been consistent even during the Telangana agitation period and criticised what he described as attempts to intimidate political opponents through force.

Clarifying that the Congress government was focused on development and not violence, Naini said they had exercised patience despite provocation. However, he warned that continued attacks on party workers would not be tolerated. "If you

touch our party workers, we will not spare you," he asserted, adding that if the police failed to act within a week, they would not be responsible for the consequences.

He further warned that if such incidents persisted, he would personally confront the former MLA at his residence.

He also alleged that efforts to exploit religious or caste sentiments and misuse Telangana sentiment for political gain would not succeed in the constituency.

Karimnagar ramps up summer water shield to ensure uninterrupted supply


- Water supply preparedness reviewed at LMD plant
- Rs 49 lakh allocated and tenders initiated to tackle summer demand
- Booster pumps and renovation works underway to strengthen supply system

CIVIC authorities intensified efforts on Monday to prevent any disruption in drinking water supply during the peak summer months, conducting a comprehensive inspection of the Drinking Water Purification Plant at Lower Mainair Dam (LMD) in Karimnagar.

Mayor Kolagani Srinivas, accompanied by Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai and engineering officials, reviewed the high-level reservoir, sump and motor pumps at the facility. The team assessed operational preparedness and directed staff to ensure uninterrupted water supply across the city, including all merged village divisions.

Addressing officials, the Mayor stated that a detailed Summer Action Plan had been prepared to manage the anticipated seasonal rise in demand. With the dam's current water level standing at 7 TMC, authorities were instructed to maintain optimum supply capacity. He informed that Rs 49 lakh had been allocated to address drinking water concerns, with the tendering process already initiated. Arrangements for tanker

supply and the hiring of wells would be made wherever necessary to prevent shortages. Pipeline works under the scheme were also progressing in the merged villages to strengthen the distribution network.

The Mayor further emphasised the need for proper chlorination of water, immediate repair of valve leakages and strict monitoring of both high-level and low-level supply systems.

He directed officials to take proactive measures to curb water leakages and resolve labour shortages to ensure smooth operations throughout the summer season. Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai stated that alternate-day

water supply had been implemented since 26 February due to reduced water levels and gravity constraints. To improve the intake of raw water, four booster pumps would be activated shortly.

Of the four filter beds at the plant, three were currently operational, while the 10 MLD unit was undergoing renovation and was expected to be commissioned in March. Once fully functional, the upgraded system was expected to ensure adequate and consistent water supply during the summer months.

Corporator Devender and other municipal officials were also present during the inspection.

Digital connectivity drive gains momentum in Asifabad

Review meeting held to expedite cell tower installations and ensure coordination among telecom providers

DISTRICT Collector K. Haritha on Monday directed officials to ensure that remote villages in the district are provided with reliable internet connectivity at the earliest.

A review meeting was held at the Integrated District Collectorate building conference hall in the district headquarters to discuss the establishment of cell towers and the expansion of internet services. The meeting was attended by District Additional Collector (Revenue) David, Training IFS Officer Bhargav Kumar, Asifabad Revenue Mandal Officer Lokeshwar Rao, Kazganagar Division Forest Officer Appaiah, along with Tehsildars, Forest Department officials and repre-



sentatives of BSNL, Airtel, Jio and T-Fiber. Addressing the officials, the Collector emphasised the need for coordinated efforts among all departments and service providers to improve digital connectivity across the district. She directed that the construction of cell towers being set up under the aegis of BSNL be expedited.

The Collector also instructed Airtel and Jio representatives to swiftly complete land identification and secure

the necessary administrative permissions for the installation of towers and provision of internet services. She stated that steps would be taken to ensure mobile signals and internet access reach even the most remote villages through the timely construction of infrastructure.

Officials from the concerned departments and telecom companies participated in the meeting and assured cooperation in implementing the connectivity plans.

Jeevan Reddy's political future in limbo amid exit buzz

- Internal rift with Jagtial MLA fuels exit speculation
- BJP and BRS reportedly reach out amid Rajya Sabha suspense
- Final decision likely after consultations with supporters

SENIOR Congress leader T. Jeevan Reddy's political future has become a subject of intense debate amid reports of growing differences within the party and invitations from opposition outfits.

A multiple-time MLA and former minister in the government led by Y. S. Rajasekhara Reddy, Jeevan Reddy has long been

regarded as a loyalist who stood firmly with the Congress even during its difficult phases in the State. He consistently criticised the

previous government when the party was out of power and worked to strengthen the cadre in the Jagtial constituency.

However, tensions escalated after Jagtial MLA Dr Sanjay joined the Congress. Jeevan Reddy reportedly expressed dissatisfaction over not being informed about Sanjay's induction into the party. The internal rift deepened following disagreements over party meetings and local political affairs.

In the recent municipal elections, Jeevan Reddy's faction contested independently and secured several councillor seats, signalling his continued influence in the region.

Despite repeated interventions by the party leadership, differences between the two leaders remained unresolved. A recent phone call from K. C. Venugopal, All India Congress Com-

mittee General Secretary, to Jeevan Reddy further fuelled speculation over his next move.

During a recent media interaction, Jeevan Reddy indicated that he was no longer interested in continuing with the Congress, intensifying rumours of a possible switch. While some party circles claimed he had been offered a Rajya Sabha seat to pacify him, reports suggested that he had also received calls from leaders of the BJP and the BRS.

It is learnt that Dharmapuri Arvind from the BJP reached out to him, with rumours suggesting that discussions even touched upon the possibility of recommending his name for a gubernatorial post after

consultations with Narendra Modi. Meanwhile, sources indicated that K. Chandrashekar Rao and K. T. Rama Rao from the BRS also contacted him.

As two Rajya Sabha seats from Telangana are set to fall vacant, suspense continued over whether Jeevan Reddy would be accommodated by the Congress. Political observers noted that if a Rajya Sabha berth was not offered, the possibility of his shifting allegiance could not be ruled out.

Jeevan Reddy is expected to hold consultations with his supporters in Jagtial district before announcing his decision. Meanwhile, his followers continued to hope that the party leadership would accord him due recognition and respect.
