

Heavy rains, gales flatten maize crop

HEAVY rains accompanied by strong gusty winds wreaked havoc in Tungaturthi village of Ketepally mandal on Tuesday night, leaving vast stretches of maize

crop completely flattened. The sudden spell of unseasonal rain lashed the region, causing severe damage to standing crops just weeks before harvest.

According to local farmers, the intense winds uprooted and bent the maize plants to the ground, resulting in heavy losses. "Within a few hours, our entire crop was destroyed. We invested heavily in seeds, fertilizers and labour, hoping for a good yield this season," lamented a farmer from the village.

The unexpected weather has come as a major setback, as many farmers were depending on the maize harvest to repay loans and meet household expenses. With the crop flattened and soaked in rainwater, prospects of recovery



appear bleak.

Farmers have urged the state government to conduct an immediate field survey and assess the extent of the damage. They demanded adequate compensation and financial assistance to help them recover from the losses caused by the unseasonal rains.

Agriculture officials are expected to visit the affected fields soon to evaluate the damage and submit a report to higher authorities.

The Government of Telangana vide State Govt.G.O.Ms.No.121, EFS&T (FOR.I) Dept., Date:29-12-2025 has issued Stage-II approval under Forest (Conservation) Act 1980, for Diversion of 4.8409 Ha of Forest land for the work Improvement of existing road to BT Standard to Road from L028-Laxmipur to Baddampally of Vemanapally mandal in Mancherial District (including c/o. two (2) Bridges at 6/600 km and 8/800 km) in RFs of Chennai and Bellampally Forest Divisions of Mancherial District in favour of District Panchayat Raj Engineer, PIU, Mancherial District.

In concurrence to the above orders Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Forest Force) T.S., Hyderabad vide Rc.No.FC2/FC09/35/2022 (4557/2018/FCA2), Dt:11-01-2026 issued instruction to fulfil the following conditions & stipulated in the G.O.noted in above para.

- Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged;
- The State Forest Department shall carry out compensatory afforestation over an extent of 4.8409 ha out of 28.45 ha NFL identified in Sy. No. 67/1 at Venkatapur Village, Mudhole Mandal of Nirmal Division in lieu of proposed diversion of forest land for various road proposals under PMGSY Scheme in various Divisions and Districts of the Telangana State. The portion of non-forest land out of 59.468 ha, identified for CA purpose for the subject project, shall be demarcated properly to identify the same for monitoring purpose.
- Non-forest land and degraded forest land identified for CA purpose and CA scheme shall not be changed without prior approval of the Central Government.
- Entire non-forest land identified for raising compensatory afforestation over an extent of 28.45 ha in Sy. No. 67/1 at Venkatapur Village, Mudhole Mandal of Nirmal Division shall be transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department and shall be declared as Reserved Forest under Section-4 or Protected Forest under Section-29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant Section(s) of the local Forest Act within 6 months from the date of issue of Stage-II approval. A copy of the original notification shall be submitted to this office for information and record;
- The Nodal Officer (FCA) of the State of Telangana shall instruct all the field level officers to implement the CA scheme in its entirety as per the proposal and no CA amount should be left unspent; Additional amount of the Net Present Value (NPV) of the diverted forest land and if any, becoming due after revision of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in future, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency.
- Wildlife Mitigation Plan as approved with financial out lay of Rs.150.08 lakhs shall be implemented by the State Forest Department at the cost of the User Agency and report compliance to the Regional Office / Sub Office.
- The User Agency shall construct retaining walls and check walls wherever required, by consulting the DFO concerned, at the project cost;
- Construction of culverts / bridges, if any, over the natural streams/rivers/canals shall be done in such a manner that it does not hamper the natural course of water, does not give rise to water-logging, and also does not hamper movement of wild animals;
- Roadside cuttings and fillings which require engineering support shall be provided as per the instructions of the DFO concerned so as to stabilize the soil;
- The dug out material / overburden shall be dumped outside the forest area. Storage of any material shall not be done in the forest area;
- The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government;
- The User Agency shall provide fire wood preferably alternate fuel to labourers working at the site to avoid damage/tree felling and no labour camp shall be established inside the forest area;
- Felling of trees shall be carried out wherever necessary under the strict supervision of DFO concerned;
- Disturbance shall be kept minimum by creating labour camps outside the forest area as far as possible and it shall be the responsibility of the User Agency to ensure that the labourers & staff engaged in execution of work do not destruct nearby forest flora & fauna;
- The total forest area utilized for the project shall not exceed 4.8409 Ha (width of the carriageway / BT portion of the road shall be restricted to 3 mtrs) and the forest area diverted shall not be used for any purpose other than those shown in the diversion proposal.
- The forest land proposed for diversion shall under no circumstances be transferred or sublet to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government.
- Any other conditions that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change Regional Office, Chennai/Sub Office, Hyderabad (Central) may impose from time to time in the interest of afforestation, conservation and management of flora and fauna in the area, shall be complied by the User Agency;
- Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 and action would be taken as prescribed in para 1.16 of Chapter 1 of the Handbook of Comprehensive Guidelines of Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 as issued by this Ministry's letter dated 29.12.2023.
- The State Government, before issuing the final diversion order, shall ensure that the user agency has complied with all the provisions of all Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order(s) and NGT Order(s), including compliance of Forest Rights Act, 2006, pertaining to this project, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project; and
- The User Agency shall submit the annual self-compliance report in respect of the above stated conditions to the State Government, concerned Regional Office, Chennai/Sub Office, Hyderabad (Central) by the end of March every year regularly.
- The compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (<https://parivesh.nic.in/>).
- KML of the CA NFL and DFL lands shall be uploaded on the e-Green watch portal.

BC Commission Chairman Niranjn termed the death of a two-month-old infant during the incident at the Shiva temple in Kummera village of Nagarkurnool mandal as extremely tragic. On Tuesday, he visited the village along with District Collector Badavath Santosh, Superintendent of Police Dr. Sangram Singh G.

Patil, and Commission members Rapolu Jayaprakash, T. Surender, and Balalakshmi. The team inspected the Sri Mallikarjuna Swamy temple premises where the incident took place and collected detailed information from officials. DSP Buri Srinivasulu showed the Chairman a video recorded by a Home Guard during the incident. The Commission Chairman paid floral tributes at the infant's

grave, observed a two-minute silence, and later visited the residence of the child's parents, Ganesh and Mounika, to console them.

Officials informed that around 10,000 devotees had attended the Mallanna Jatara. Niranjn stated that the BC Commission has taken the matter with utmost priority and has sought comprehensive reports from the District Collector, SP, and the Endow-

ments Department. He said a detailed report will be submitted to the State Government after receiving all inputs.

He stressed that safeguarding the rights of backward and weaker sections is the Commission's responsibility and directed officials to take strict legal action against the accused, regardless of their status. He called for a transparent police investigation to uncover the truth and urged strong measures against caste discrimination to prevent recurrence of such incidents. He assured full support to the victim's family.

District Collector Badavath Santosh and SP Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil briefed the Commission on the actions taken by the district administration over the past three days.

BRS sees graft conspiracy in Pebberu market land row

FORMER Minister and BRS leader Singireddy Niranjn Reddy has alleged a large-scale corruption conspiracy in the name of land acquisition for the Pebberu market (santha) land.

Addressing a press conference at Pebberu on Tuesday, Niranjn Reddy said the dispute over Survey No. 392, pertaining to 30 acres and 19 guntas of land, has been pending for nearly three decades between private landowners and the Endowments Department. He stated that courts had delivered judgments in favour of the landowners in 2003, 2007 and again in 2022.

He alleged that during the election period, certain political leaders, ignoring the judicial process, claimed that the entire extent of land belonged to the government and accused him of attempting to encroach upon it. "They publicly declared that within a month the entire market land would be taken over by the government and a compound wall constructed. Three years have passed, but they have neither fulfilled their promise nor respected the court's verdict," he said. Niranjn Reddy maintained that in the interest of Pebberu residents and traders, efforts were made to resolve the issue amicably by persuading landowners to allot 16 acres for the market in exchange for alternative agricultural land. He said a gift deed had been secured from the land-



owners in this regard, but political opponents allegedly spread misinformation during elections, accusing him of land grabbing. Criticising the present move to initiate land acquisition, he alleged that it was a pretext for large-scale corruption. Citing what he described as reliable information, he claimed that landowners were being offered highly valuable land near the Outer Ring Road outside the district as compensation and that influential persons were involved in the process. He further alleged that the arrangement could result in a scam worth thousands of crores. Questioning the silence of leaders who had earlier made strong statements about taking over the land without compensation, he said the recent court verdict reaffirming ownership rights of landowners had exposed their claims.

Niranjn Reddy demanded a public apology from those who had accused him of encroachment. "If they have
