

# Summer relief measures rolled out for devotees at Bhimeshwara Swamy temple

IN view of the rising summer temperatures, the temple administration introduced a series of relief measures for devotees at Sri Bhimeshwara Swamy Temple, an affiliated shrine of Sri Rajarajeshwara Swamy Devasthanam. The arrangements were implemented under the supervision of temple Executive Officer L. Ramadevi, who has been taking a keen interest in improving facilities for visiting devotees.

As part of the initiative, the temple administration introduced a WhatsApp information service to help devotees access details about temple rituals, services and facilities. Visitors can obtain complete

information by scanning the QR code installed on the temple premises or by sending a "Hi" message to 8736936969.

To provide relief from the summer heat, two large fans were installed within the temple premises, while additional fans and lighting arrangements were made at several locations to improve comfort for devotees waiting in queues. Two drinking water centres named "Rajanna Jalaprasadam" were also set up, and drinking water taps were installed along the queue lines for easy access.

Volunteers were deployed through Cool Bubbles to

distribute drinking water to devotees at different points across the temple premises. In addition, shade tents were erected to allow devotees to rest comfortably while waiting for darshan.

A dedicated water plant was also established at Bhimeshwara Sadan, from where drinking water was supplied to devotees as well as temple offices.

Temple officials stated that the arrangements were part of the temple administration's efforts to ensure that devotees experienced a comfortable and hassle-free darshan during the summer season.

LEADERS and activists of the Communist Party of India (CPI) staged a protest in Naspoor on Monday condemning the Central government over the recent increase in cooking gas prices and the rising cost of essential commodities. The demonstration was organised under the leadership of the Naspoor Mandal Committee at the Telangana Talli statue centre.

During the protest, CPI leaders raised slogans against the price hike and demanded that the government immediately reduce the prices of domestic LPG cylinders and other essential goods. They alleged that the sudden increase had placed a heavy burden on common people already struggling with ris-

ing living costs.

The party leaders also criticised the international policies of the United States and alleged that global political developments were creating instability. They accused US President Donald Trump of acting like a global dictator and claimed that unilateral actions in collaboration with

Israel against Iran were contributing to global crises.

They further alleged that India's sovereignty was being compromised, claiming that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had been forced to seek approval from the United States even in decisions related to oil purchases. According to them, such devel-

opments were detrimental to India's independent economic policy.

The CPI leaders expressed anger over the sudden increase of Rs.60 in the price of domestic gas cylinders, stating that it had caused severe hardship for ordinary citizens.

They said that small hotels and hostels were particularly affected by the hike and some establishments were facing closure due to rising operational costs.

Condemning what they termed as the Central government's "irresponsible policies", the protestors demanded that the price hike be rolled back immediately. They also urged the government to take strict action to prevent black-market practices and ensure the availability of cooking gas to the public at reasonable prices.

## Arvind Dharmapuri seeks immediate maize procurement centres in Nizamabad

between Rs 1,700 and Rs 1,800 per quintal.

MP Arvind Dharmapuri urged the District Collector to immediately establish maize procurement centres in the district to safeguard farmers from financial losses. In a letter addressed to the Collector, the MP highlighted that farmers in Nizamabad had harvested a large maize crop this season but were facing difficulties due to the delay in opening government purchase centres.

He said that although the Central Government had fixed the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for maize at Rs 2,400 per quintal, the absence of procurement centres had forced farmers to sell their produce to private traders at much lower prices ranging

Rs 20,000 to Rs 25,000. He requested the District Collector to take immediate steps to set up maize procurement centres and ensure that farmers could sell their produce at the MSP.

Arvind Dharmapuri also suggested that all necessary arrangements be made to facilitate a smooth procurement process so that farmers do not face any inconvenience and maize purchases could begin without further delay.

## Collector Ila Tripathi directs speedy resolution of public complaints

COLLECTOR Ila Tripathi directed officials to ensure the speedy resolution of public complaints during the weekly Public Complaints Programme held on Monday at the conference hall of the Integrated District Offices Complex. ## Congress consolidates power in Dharmapuri with Adluri Laxman Kumar at the helm

- Congress strengthens its position in Dharmapuri after winning 15 municipal wards
- Adluri Laxman Kumar plays key role in removing constituency from BRS influence
- Development plans prepared for Dharmapuri ahead of Godavari Pushkarams

MINISTER Adluri Laxman Kumar has been steadily making his mark in the Dharmapuri constituency after the Congress party secured a significant victory in the Dharmapuri municipal elections. The minister, regarded as a loyal Congress leader and grassroots worker, played a key role in ensur-

ing the party's success, with Congress winning 15 wards in the municipality.

Political observers said the result marked a major shift in the region's political landscape. Dharmapuri had long been considered a stronghold of the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). However, under the leadership of Adluri Laxman Kumar and with the support of the state leadership led by A. Revanth Reddy, the constituency witnessed a notable political turnaround, with Congress now consolidating its position.

From the state Congress leadership to political analysts, the victory has been widely discussed as a sign of changing political equations in Dharmapuri. Observers described the result not merely as an electoral win but as a reflection of growing public trust in the Congress leadership in the region.

Dharmapuri constituency, which emerged after the re-organisation of constituencies, had for years remained under the influence of rival parties, particularly the BRS.

Many political watchers had initially doubted whether the Congress could regain its footing in the region. However, the 2023 Assembly elections altered the political

trajectory when Adluri Laxman Kumar secured victory as MLA.

After entering the Assembly, the minister reportedly strengthened his political base by maintaining direct contact with the public and focusing on resolving local issues. His approach of engaging with grassroots concerns helped the party expand its support base across the constituency. The Congress party's growing influence was also reflected in local body elections, where 108 Congress-backed candidates reportedly secured victories in 149 gram panchayats within the Dharmapuri constituency. Political observers considered this outcome a significant achievement for the minister and an indication of the party's expanding organisational strength in rural areas.

Adluri Laxman Kumar began his political journey as a

student leader and gradually rose through the ranks. His career path, starting from local body politics and advancing to district-level leadership before entering the Assembly and becoming a minister, has been viewed by many as an inspiring political journey.

Local residents said the minister had been focusing on both development initiatives and the implementation of welfare schemes in the constituency. Plans were also reportedly being prepared to enhance the development of Dharmapuri town in view of the upcoming Godavari Pushkarams, which attracts large numbers of devotees and visitors.

Observers believed that the recent electoral victories and developmental focus could further strengthen the Congress party's presence in Dharmapuri in the coming years.
