

# SIR: Parties urged to appoint BLAs for clean voter lists

The role of political parties is crucial in the ongoing SIR process aimed at ensuring accuracy and transparency in the voters' list, says Rizwan Basha Shaikh

Clarifies that the objective of the SIR is not to delete genuine voters

DISTRICT Collector Rizwan Basha Shaikh has emphasised the need for appointing booth level agents (BLAs) by all political parties to ensure the preparation of a transparent and error-free electoral roll.

A review meeting on the progress of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) was held with representatives of various political parties at the Collectorate on Tuesday.



Addressing the meeting, the Collector stated that the role of political parties is crucial in the ongoing SIR process aimed at ensuring accuracy and transparency in the voters' list.

He clarified that the objective of the SIR exercise is not to delete genuine voters, but to eliminate duplicate entries pertaining to the same individual and to

rectify discrepancies arising due to migration. The process also involves preparing a clean and updated electoral roll.

The Collector informed that voter lists of 2002 and 2025 are being compared, and voters are being categorised into A, B, C, and D groups for field-level verification. He instructed political parties to mandatorily

appoint booth level agents for each polling booth and submit their details within one to two days. Official identity cards will be issued to the appointed BLAs.

He further stated that BLAs should be residents of the respective local areas to effectively assist in field verification of voter details and collection of necessary documents. Training for

the appointed agents will be conducted before March 25.

Expressing concern over the slow progress in urban areas, particularly in Gadwal town where only about 48 percent of the work has been completed, the Collector directed officials to expedite the process. He added that door-to-door surveys, along with distribution and collection of forms, will be carried out through BLAs.

Special attention will also be given to resolving issues related to migrated voters and newly registered voters, he said. The Collector urged political parties and officials to work in coordination to successfully complete the SIR process.

Among those present at the meeting were Collectorate Administrative Officer Bhupal Reddy, Election Section Superintendent Manjula, and representatives of various political parties.

# Panchayat workers demand better pay, job security

# Release irrigation water from Puligundala project, orders Tummala

AGRICULTURE Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao on Tuesday directed officials to immediately release irrigation water from the Puligundala project in Penuballi mandal following distress reports from farmers over withering crops.

Responding swiftly to complaints that standing crops were drying up in Brahmakunta village and surrounding areas, the minister instructed authorities to remove all obstacles hindering water discharge and ensure supply to nearly 1,000 acres. During a comprehensive review of the situation, Tummala identified both technical and administrative bottlenecks delaying water



release. He ordered officials from the revenue, forest and irrigation departments to work in coordination and resolve the issues on a priority basis.

The minister also spoke directly with Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav and District Forest Officer Siddhartha over the phone, asking them to address any pending issues without delay. He emphasised that there should be no impediments in releasing irrigation water and that farmers' interests must remain the top priority.

Issuing clear instructions to irrigation officials, Tummala called for action on a "war footing" to expedite the process. He stressed that field-

level implementation should be carried out without any delay given the urgency of the situation.

Stating that protecting farmers' crops is a key priority for the government, the minister assured that every effort would be made to ensure water reaches all affected agricultural lands. He expressed confidence that once water is released from the Puligundala project, it would provide much-needed relief to farmers and revive thousands of acres under cultivation.

Officials are expected to act swiftly following the minister's directions, while farmers in the region remain hopeful that timely intervention will help save their crops.

# BJP observes Chandur bandh over attack on party workers

A bandh was observed in Chandur municipal town in protest against an alleged attack on BJP workers by Congress activists.

BJP leaders and party workers took out a rally across Chandur town, raising slogans and staging a protest (dharna) at NTR X Road, condemning the incident.

Speaking on the occasion, senior leader Gangidi Manohar Reddy strongly condemned the attack and demanded immediate action against those responsible. He alleged that Congress workers were behind the violent incident and called for their arrest under Section 307 (attempt to murder) and immediate remand. He warned that such incidents should not be repeated and emphasized that any disputes should be resolved through

dialogue rather than violence.

Providing details, he stated that eight BJP workers were attacked, leaving six seriously injured. Among them, one suffered a head injury while another lost a tooth. He further accused the police of acting in favor of Congress leaders and failing to maintain law and order impartially.

The BJP leader also criticised the local MLA, alleging that the legislator is more focused on securing a ministerial post than addressing the concerns of people in the Munugode constituency. He expressed dissatisfaction with the response of senior police officials, including the SP and DSP, accusing them of treating the issue lightly. He claimed that even the Chandur Circle Inspector had dismissed the incident as a minor issue, which he strongly.

# Precious lives are lost due to lack of trauma centre in Aiza

Repeated incidents of deaths due to lack of the emergency facility highlight the urgent need for better medical infrastructure, including life-saving equipment and the immediate operationalisation of the 30-bed government hospital in Aiza town

SERIOUS concerns are being raised over the inadequate emergency healthcare facilities in Aiza town, as repeated incidents highlight the urgent need for better medical infrastructure, including life-saving equipment and the immediate operationalisation of the 30-bed government hospital.

On Tuesday, two distressing incidents exposed the critical gaps in emergency care. In one incident, three students traveling on a motorcycle collided with an RTC bus. One student Ramu (17) succumbed to injuries on the spot, while the condition of the other two Vishnu (17) VarsVardhan (17) remains critical. Due to the absence of proper emergency treatment facilities in Aiza, the injured had to be shifted nearly 60 kilometers away to Kurnool for advanced care.

In another tragic case, a young man identified as Rajagopal, son of noted public leader Nagaraddi Venkataramulu, died



suddenly after suffering a heart attack. The incident has intensified concerns among residents regarding the lack of immediate cardiac care in the region.

Locals report a worrying trend in recent months, with several young individuals—many around 30 years of age—succumbing to sudden cardiac arrests in Aiza and surrounding mandals. The absence of essential

emergency equipment such as an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in both government and private hospitals has made timely intervention impossible in many cases.

Medical experts emphasize that in cases of cardiac arrest, immediate CPR support along with AED intervention can significantly improve survival rates. However, due to the unavailabil-



ity of such facilities, patients are being referred to Gadwal or Kurnool hospitals. Poor road conditions and long travel times are reportedly contributing to preventable deaths during transit.

Residents of Aiza have collectively appealed to the authorities to urgently provide an AED machine at the government hospital, stating that the equipment costs approximately Rs 2 lakh—a mod-



est investment compared to the lives it could save.

Furthermore, the long-pending 30-bed government hospital in Aiza remains non-functional, adding to public frustration. Citizens are demanding its immediate inauguration and full-scale operation to ensure access to essential healthcare services locally.

The people of Aiza have urged government authorities to take swift and compassionate action to address these life-threatening gaps in healthcare infrastructure, expressing hope for a prompt and positive response to prevent further loss of lives.
