

# BRS will return to power as people are disillusioned with Cong Raj: Puvvada

CLAIMING that the Congress government had failed to make a meaningful impact even after more than two years in office, former minister Puvvada Ajay Kumar expressed confidence that the BRS would return to power under KCR's leadership. He said people are "disillusioned" with the Congress government over unfulfilled promises and looking at the BRS for solution of their problems. Addressing a meeting of key leaders of Khammam constituency at his residence, Ajay Kumar criticised the Congress government, claiming it had failed to imple-

ment its "six guarantees" and was instead taking credit for developmental works carried out during the previous BRS regime led by K Chandrashekar Rao. He alleged that the ruling party, unable to counter the opposition in the Assembly, had resorted to suspensions. "The Congress came to power by maligning the image of BRS leaders during the elections, but has failed to deliver on its assurances," he said. Ajay Kumar also accused the government of misleading the public and questioned its handling of land-related issues, alleging irregularities and lack of accountability. He further criticised the demolition of houses in certain areas

of Khammam, calling it "unjust". Referring to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, he alleged that the State government was focusing on issues outside Telangana rather than addressing local concerns. He also mentioned Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan in this context. He announced that a mini plenary meeting of the party would be held in Khammam on April 19, which will be attended by senior BRS leader T. Harish Rao.

ROADS and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy stated that the government's primary goal is to provide quality healthcare to the poor through government hospitals. As part of the "Prajapalana-Pragathi Pranalika" programme and the Health Festival being conducted from the April 6 to 11, the Minister inaugurated a new Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) at Manyam Chelka in Nalgonda on Wednesday. The facility was constructed at a cost of Rs 1.91 crore. Speaking on the occa-

sion, the Minister said that due to heavy patient load at the Nalgonda Government General Hospital, this new UPHC would help provide better and accessible healthcare. Along with government funds, infrastructure and doctors have been arranged with an additional Rs 50 lakh contribution from Prateek Foundation. The center has been equipped with a new building and essential medical equipment,

with provisions to add more if needed. He emphasised that the facility would cater especially to nearby residents, elderly people, and pregnant women, offering a wide range of medical services and diagnostic tests, with referrals to the main hospital when required. Public representatives were urged to identify patients and direct them to the center. The Minister also an-

nounced plans to establish an eye hospital on three acres in collaboration with LV Prasad Eye Institute. Additionally, arrangements have been made to supply emergency medicines through a private medical shop if unavailable at the UPHC, based on doctors' prescriptions. Efforts are also underway, with support from Akshaya Foundation, to provide food to patients if necessary. Of-

ficials highlighted that the center would significantly benefit local communities by delivering quality and accessible healthcare services. Strict Action if Farmers Face Trouble in Paddy Procurement State Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy warned that strict action will be taken if farmers face difficulties during Rabi paddy procurement. He said farmers who work hard should not be troubled by buyers or millers. Officials were instructed to procure paddy quickly and transport it to mills without delay, considering the summer heat. On Wednesday, he inaugurated and inspected procurement centers in Nalgonda and Kanagal mandals. Responding to transport issues, he directed officials to arrange sufficient lorries and ensure uninterrupted movement of paddy. The Minister emphasised round-the-clock procurement if necessary and assured that the government is closely monitoring the process. He added that bonus support is being provided and reaffirmed the government's commitment to farmers' welfare.

## Two killed in road accident

A tragic road accident claimed lives of two persons while they were on their way to fulfill religious vows during a family function at home on Wednesday. According to local sources, around 20 members of a family belonging to Janiga Narasimharao from Mellacheruvu mandal in Huzurnagar constituency of Suryapet district were traveling in a Bolero vehicle. They were heading to offer prayers at Peddagattu Lingamthala Swamy temple in Durajpalli. Before proceeding, the family stopped at the Echarla Muthyalamma temple located on the outskirts of Vallabhapuram village.

There, they performed rituals, including breaking coconuts and offering a chicken as part of their vow. After completing the rituals, they resumed their journey towards Durajpalli. At around 2 am, near the same area, an Eicher DCM vehicle proceeding towards Hyderabad from Vijayawada at high speed reportedly rammed into the Bolero from behind due to negligent driving. Out of the 20 passengers, around 10 sustained minor injuries. However, Janiga Satish (25) and Janiga Narasimharao (37) succumbed to their injuries while undergoing treatment. The injured have been shifted to the Government Hospital in Suryapet for treatment.

## Pvt hospitals urged to adopt humane approach towards poor patients

DISTRICT Collector Rizwan Basha Shaik instructed doctors to ensure better medical services for patients in government hospitals and to discharge their duties responsibly as per rules. Speaking at a meeting held at the Collectorate on Wednesday, as part of the 99-day Public Governance Progress Programme and Health Week celebrations, the Collector addressed doctors and medical officers from across the district during the Safe Motherhood programme. He directed that all hospitals must be registered under the Clinical Establishments Act and emphasised that sex determination tests are illegal. He instructed authorities to display awareness boards in all hospitals. The Collector stated that around 10,000 deliveries take place annually in the district, with nearly 5,000 occurring in government hospitals, about 2,500 in private



hospitals, and the remaining in other areas. He stressed the need to create awareness so that every pregnant woman opts for delivery in government hospitals. He also instructed private hospitals to display fee details for normal and cesarean deliveries and other medical services. He urged private hospital managements to adopt a humanitarian approach and provide treatment to poor patients at lower costs. He emphasised proper biomedical waste management and maintaining cleanliness in hospital premises. Noting that the district is lagging in TB screening, he directed officials to effectively implement government support

schemes for TB patients. The Collector also called upon private hospitals to actively participate in all health programs conducted by the Health Department. On this occasion, DMHO Sandhya Kiranmayi explained various ongoing health initiatives. Later, the Collector, along with medical officials, released posters on Safe Motherhood and Home-Based Newborn Care. District Hospital Superintendent Indira, Programme Officers Prasoonarani and Raju, along with other medical officers and doctors from government and private hospitals, were present at the meeting.
