

# Shaikpet-Masab Tank corridor set for major traffic revamp

WITH an aim to ease traffic congestion, enhance road safety and provide seamless connectivity for citizens, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation allocated Rs 120 crore for traffic management in the city.

Hyderabad city police, along with GHMC officials,

on Thursday conducted a field inspection of the Model Corridor development from Shaikpet flyover to Masab Tank to resolve traffic issues and improve road infrastructure.

The authorities inspected the entire stretch; also identifying water-logging points and the officials concerned were instructed to remove obstructions on the main road to speed up the Model Corridor

works.

Hyderabad Police Commissioner VC Sajjanar and GHMC Commissioner RV Karnan, along with other senior officials, conducted a field inspection by bus. Several key decisions were taken to resolve traffic issues and improve road infrastructure between Masab Tank and Shaikpet stretch.

Sajjanar stated that the traffic bottlenecks have been identified, categorising them into 'Doable' (immediate) and long-term plans. Karnan announced an allocation of Rs 120 crore (Rs 20 crore per zone) for traffic improvement and confirmed that pending works at KBR Park would be completed within one to two years.

During the inspection, they discussed the construction of a new foot-over-bridge (FoB) at SD Eye Hospital and at Brindavan Colony Road No 1 Tolichowki and installation of Pelican signals and zebra crossings at Shaikpet nala. Instructions were issued to remove obstructions on the main road to speed up the Model Corridor works.

Furthermore, the fixation of drainage leakages at Tolichowki 'U' turn and Al-Hanath Colony, construction of CC Road from Ice Magic Parlor to Brindavan Colony and

installation of a bus shelter at Majestic Function Hall and translocation of three trees near Shah Ghouse Hotel.

In order to facilitate smoother traffic flow, the officials have decided to reduce the width of the rotary at Nana Nagar Junction and widen the road.

From Rethibowli Junction to Nana Nagar - the widening of the road by removing the central median and trees, removal of Ramalayam Arch at Nana Nagar bus stop, Boddu Rayi at Golf Club Road, and tombs at Shaikpet Nala to ensure smooth traffic flow and removal of three trees and electric poles for a free left from Balika Bhavan towards Tolichowki.

The works in Masab Tank include - reducing the width of the Sulabh Complex and shifting the bus shelter, land acquisition at NMDC and Dell Store (opposite S.D. Eye Hospital) for road widening as per the Master Plan, installation of height restriction barriers and warning boards on both sides of Masab Tank Flyover and shifting the electrical transformer at the Medhitpanam end of the flyover. And also, development of a slip road connecting - Pochamma Basti directly to Road No. 12.

HEALTH Minister Damodar Raja Narsimha on Thursday said the government is establishing 31 trauma care blocks in the state. Of these, nine have

been completed, while 21 are under construction and are expected to be operational by the end of this year.

The Minister on Thursday laid the foundation stone for the construction of a 100-bed critical care block in Kondapur.

Speaking to the media, the minister said that the government had launched a comprehensive trauma care policy aimed at saving lives by ensuring the immediate transport of victims to hospitals during road accidents and other emergency situations.

As part of this initiative, the government was establishing 109 Trauma Care Centres equipped with all necessary facilities along national and state highways across the state. "We are strengthening the emergency response system to ensure that assistance reaches the scene of a road ac-

cident or other emergency within 10 minutes of its occurrence," said Raja Narsimha.

The minister further said that in furtherance of this effort, the government was increasing the number of 108 ambulances. "We are establishing 31 critical care blocks across the state. Critical care blocks have already been inaugurated in Nizamabad, Nalgonda, Karimnagar, Mahabubabad, Jagtial, Sangareddy, Narayanpet and Adilabad.

The construction of another 21 critical care blocks (CCBs) was currently underway; we aim to make all of them operational by the end of this year," he said adding, today, he had laid the foundation stone for the construction of a 100-bed critical care block in Kondapur, at an estimated cost of Rs 41 crore.

## No compromise on safety, pollution, CMC tells developers

IN a strong move to ensure orderly urban growth and environmental sustainability, the Cyberabad Municipal Corporation (CMC) has intensified its focus on strict compliance and responsible construction practices.

A high level meeting was held on April 9 under the chairmanship of the Commissioner bringing together key stakeholders from leading builder associations, including National Real Estate Development Council (NAREDCO), Confederation of Real Estate Developers' Associations of India (CREDAI), and the Telangana Developers Association, along with several individual developers.

The meeting centered on reinforcing adherence

to construction norms, environmental standards, and regulatory frameworks across all ongoing and upcoming projects within CMC limits, Commissioner Dr G Srijana issued clear and firm directives to ensure that development aligns with approved guidelines and public safety priorities.

Builders were instructed to implement robust safety measures at construction sites, ensuring worker protection and minimising on-site risks. Strict measures were also emphasised for controlling dust and air pollution, along with compliance with noise pollution norms to reduce the impact on surrounding communities.

Highlighting regulatory discipline, the Commissioner reiterated that partial Occupancy Certificates (OCs) must only be sought after full

completion of projects as per sanctioned plans, in line with G.O.Ms (Government Order Miscellaneous) No. 168. Developers were also directed to ensure proper debris management by handing over construction waste to authorised agencies, preventing illegal dumping and environmental harm.

Furthermore, strict adherence to buffer zone development as per approved layouts was mandated, along with full cooperation with civic authorities during inspections and OC processing.

The meeting underscored a unified vision of safe, sustainable, and compliant construction practices. The Commissioner concluded by stressing that responsible development is essential for building a cleaner, safer, and well planned Cyberabad.

## GHMC worker killed in accident

A GHMC sanitation worker was killed after a speeding RTC bus rammed into her at Amberpet on Thursday. Following the incident, the GHMC workers protested by blocking the road and demanded action against the bus driver.

The victim, M Pushpa, was crossing the road and an RTC bus hit and ran over the victim. The woman died on the spot due to the severe injuries.

Following the death, the GHMC workers sat on the road and blocked the thoroughfare for an hour, demanding action against the bus driver and compensation to the victim.

Police from Amberpet reached the spot soon after receiving information. A case has been registered. Investigation is underway to determine the exact cause of the accident.

## From lakes to lanes: Cyberabad Commissioner reviews civic gaps

EMPHASISING cleanliness, safety and sustainable urban management, Commissioner of the Cyberabad Municipal Corporation G Srijana carried out a sanitation inspection on Thursday, across key locations in Kompally Circle. The visit resulted in a series of directives aimed at improving sanitation, restoring water bodies, and enhancing civic infrastructure.

During the inspection, the Commissioner interacted with local stakeholders and issued strict instructions to shopkeepers to maintain cleanliness by placing dustbins within their premises, reinforcing the importance of responsible waste management at the source.

A major highlight of the visit was the inspection of Fox Sagar lake, where the Commissioner directed officials to complete the removal of water hyacinth within 10 days. This move is expected to significantly improve the ecological health of the lake and restore its natural balance.

The Commissioner also reviewed water logging issues in Jayabheri Col-

ony and instructed engineering teams to prepare detailed proposals to address the problem effectively, ensuring long-term solutions to recurring civic challenges.

Attention was also drawn to safety concerns caused by overhanging cables in several areas. Officials were instructed to coordinate with relevant agencies to eliminate such hazards and prevent future occurrences, enhancing public safety across the circle.

Additionally, nearby parks and open spaces were inspected, with directions issued to submit proposals for the development of basic amenities based on ground level requirements. This initiative aims to improve public utility spaces for residents.

The inspection reflects a proactive governance approach, with a strong focus on accountability, infrastructure improvement, and citizen centric urban development in Kompally Circle.
