

# CPI to hold 3-day march for rural job scheme

- Party to conduct padayatra from Anantapur to Bandlapalli (April 10-12) to demand MGNREGA protections, with national secretary Ramakrishna and PCC chief Sharmila expected to join
- Accuses Union govt of weakening the employment guarantee framework through alternative schemes that strip legal safeguards and shift funding patterns, risking rural labour livelihoods
- Concluding public meeting will be held at Bandlapalli, the village tied to the programme's early implementation

CPI announced a three-day padayatra from Anantapur to Bandlapalli from April 10 to 12, demanding the continuation of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA). Addressing a press conference at the CPI district office, party leaders said that the march will begin at Samatha Gram in Anantapur and culminate in a public meeting at Bandlapalli on April 12. Several prominent leaders,

including CPI national secretary Ramakrishna, Congress state president Y.S. Sharmila, and leaders from various Left parties and farmer organizations, are expected to participate in the march and the concluding sabha. CPI leaders alleged that the Union government has weakened the rural employment guarantee framework by introducing alternative schemes that lack legal safeguards. They expressed concern that changes in funding patterns and implementation authority could adversely

impact rural labourers and small farmers. The party said that the employment guarantee programme had significantly reduced rural distress and migration while improving livelihoods. It warned that any dilution of the scheme could lead to loss of employment rights and increased hardship in rural areas. A large public meeting will be held at Bandlapalli, the village associated with the early implementation of the scheme, with participation from national and state-level leaders.

A major step towards improving rural infrastructure was taken on Thursday as District Collector G Raja Kumari launched household tap connection works in Kothaburuzu village of Dhone mandal in Nandyal district. The project, costing Rs 30

lakh, is being taken up under the District Mineral Fund. Dhone MLA Kotla Jaya Surya Prakash Reddy was also present at the event. The aim is to provide safe drinking water to every home, as promised earlier by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu during his visit to the village. The Collector said that access to clean drinking water will improve health and living standards of villagers. She also announced that 30 households will get individual toilets under

the Swachh Bharat Mission, with a total cost of Rs.4.5 lakh. She stressed that better sanitation will lead to a cleaner and healthier environment. She added that all approved development works will be completed on time, and pending proposals will be cleared within a week. Speaking about agriculture, the Collector encouraged farmers to shift towards horticulture, which can bring higher income compared to traditional crops. She said crops grown on 7 lakh acres

generate about Rs.4,000 crore, while horticulture on 49,000 hectares earns nearly Rs 7,000 crore. The administration is also working on a 100-day plan to improve water security by restoring tanks and clearing feeder channels. The MLA said the government is committed to rural development and will fulfil all promises, including welfare schemes, housing, roads, and better irrigation methods like drip and sprinkler systems.

# SIMS hospital performs complex pancreas surgery

SIMS Hospital successfully performed a highly complex surgery to remove stones from a patient's pancreas. Bhavani Lokesh, a 27-year-old homemaker from Tumakuru district of Karnataka, had been suffering from severe abdominal pain for a year due to Chronic Calcific Pancreatitis. Expert surgeon Dr N Mohammed Shahid removed all stones from her pancreas and reattached the organ to the small intestine. The procedure,

typically performed only in major cities like Hyderabad or Bengaluru, was completed with remarkable precision. Lokesh was discharged just five days post-surgery. The medical team included Dr Shahid, along with critical care specialists Dr A Sanjana, Dr Vijay, Dr Arun and Dr Gautam. Hospital managing directors Dr M Ashwath Reddy and Dr G Swaroop Reddy noted that advanced surgical infrastructure is now available locally, ensuring comprehensive healthcare for Anantapur residents.

Dinakar, chairman of the 20-Point Programme Committee, during a review meeting held at the Collectorate on Thursday. The meeting, attended by MP Ambika Lakshminarayana, District Collector O

Anand, and senior officials, reviewed the implementation of key Central schemes,

The review also covered health programmes under the National Health Mission, maternal and child welfare schemes, and drinking water supply initiatives. MP Lakshminarayana urged strict implementation of Central schemes and timely achievement of targets. Collector O.
