A dedicated children's play area has been arranged for women visiting the station

station can record their complaints through voice at the 'She Box.' The system will automatically generate a report and forward it to the concerned authorities via the Dharma App legal support system.

Over the past six months, in coordination with NH authorities, 20 black spots and 78 accident-prone locations have been identified, where safety measures such as speed breakers and reflective barricades have been installed.

Additionally, innovative methods like "Face Wash and Go" to prevent driver fatigue and advanced drone surveillance are being effectively utilised. As a result of these sustained efforts, the district has recorded a 9.47% reduction in road accidents and an 11.63% reduction in fatalities caused by road accidents.

After reviewing these statistics, Naidu expressed satisfaction with the initiatives undertaken by the SP to curb road accidents.

He further informed that wearing helmets will be made mandatory from April 15, and the "No Helmet - No Fuel" policy will be enforced, especially in the district headquarters. To strengthen road safety, six special road safety squads have been deployed to conduct continuous inspections.

## Need for shift in teaching methodologies stressed

EAST Godavari district collector Kirti Chekuri has stressed the urgent need for a shift in teaching methodologies to address the decline in students' comprehension and learning abilities following the COVID-19 pandemic. Speaking at a meeting held on Thursday at the Science Park conference hall, which covered a broad agenda ranging from educational reforms to economic development, she noted that students, particularly those in Classes 1 to 3, are struggling with foundational skills such as basic subtraction, multiplication, and addition.

A noticeable gap has also been observed in primary reading and writing skills. The collector said that teachers and schools should not be held solely responsible for this trend. She attributed the decline to a combination of factors, including the long-term impact of the pandemic and the home environment.

"When a student loses confidence in their early years, it creates a domino effect on their future education. It is vital to foster a creative teaching environment that restores their self-belief," the collector stated. The government's

GSL initiative aims to enhance conceptual understanding among students in Classes 1 to 5, she added.

The meeting also reviewed the Annual Credit and Livelihood Plan (ACLP). The collector set a goal to create at least one entrepreneur in every

village. In the Banking & MSMEs section, discussions were held on securing bank support for the establishment of 500 units under the PMEGP and PMFME schemes.

She also reviewed the performance of Mandal Samakhya and directed officials to focus on providing specialised training to DRDA (District Rural Development Agency) staff to streamline livelihood projects.

The meeting saw the participation of several key officials, including Y Satyam Naidu, Additional Project Director, DRDA, K Vasudeva Rao, District School Educational Officer, S Subhashini, Project Director, SSA, DV Prasad, Lead Bank Manager and others. Representatives from the District Federation Kandikatla Aruna Kumari, Dokku Lakshmi Parvathi, and Sheikh Fatima also attended.

## Sewage treatment plant in Sattenapalli soon

GUNTUR: Chairman of Swachh Andhra Corporation Kommareddy Pattabhiram visited Sattenapalli town and inspected the municipal dumping yard on Thursday.

He conducted an awareness programme with municipal sanitation workers and emphasised the need for improving sanitation standards in the town. He stated that the government is giving top priority to cleanliness and public health.

He announced that nearly 19,000 metric tonnes of garbage accumulated at the dumping yard will be cleared at the earliest. He alleged that irregularities and corruption had taken place at the dumping yard during

the previous YSRCP regime and said that proper attention was not given to municipal administration. He further assured that the existing dumping yard will be cleared and developed into a park for public use. He also announced that a sewage treatment plant will be established in Sattenapalli with an estimated cost of Rs 15 crore. He said that flood-prone areas in the town have been identified and necessary measures are being taken to prevent waterlogging and flooding.

He added that Sattenapalli municipality is currently ranked 20th at the state level and efforts are being made to further improve its performance

## Govt urged to act against rising religious tensions

Monsignor Father Muvvala Prasad says that Christianity always stands for peace and never incites violence

Expressing concern over tensions, he said that while such conflicts are often reported in northern parts of India, their spread to AP is alarming

MONSIGNOR Father Muvvala Prasad of the Vijayawada Catholic Diocese emphasised that "humanity itself is Christianity". He stated that Christian missionaries have upheld human values since before India's independence, and that the contribution of Christians to the nation's development remains unforgettable. He was speaking at a press conference organised

on Thursday at St Paul's Cathedral premises near Benz Circle under the joint aegis of the Federation of Churches and the United Christian Forum.

Father Prasad said that Christianity always stands for peace and never incites violence. He recalled that prominent leaders like Jawaharlal Nehru and LK Advani had acknowledged

the significant role played by Christians in nation-building. He added that Christians consistently pray for the country's well-being and good governance, and do not act in ways that disrupt communal harmony.

Expressing concern over rising religious tensions, he said that while such conflicts are often reported in northern parts of India, their

spread to Andhra Pradesh is alarming. He warned that the state, once considered a symbol of communal harmony, is now witnessing incidents that could disturb that balance. Increasing attacks on Christians, vandalism of churches, and targeted actions against a particular community indicate that certain extremist elements are fuelling un-

rest, he alleged. Referring to recent clashes in Pedapeta village of Akividu mandal during the Sri Rama Navami festival, he said the incidents have adversely affected communal harmony in the area. He urged the government to act immediately by forming peace committees and fact-finding committees to prevent further escalation.

Rev Pastor Salluri Jayakumar Babu, Chairman and Director of Bethel Ministries Bible College, also expressed concern over attacks on Christians in states like Manipur and Chhattisgarh. He alleged that similar tendencies are now emerging in the state and urged the government to take strict measures to prevent such incidents. He further demanded the formation of a peace committee comprising members of all communities in Undi constituency.

Retired Circle Inspector from Rajahmundry, Bro K Salman Raju, alleged that

following the clashes in Pedapeta over a land dispute during Sri Rama Navami, 57 Dalits were arrested and remain in jail. He claimed that although some have secured bail, influential individuals in constitutional positions are allegedly intimidating others from coming forward to provide surties. Earlier, the participants staged a protest holding placards, expressing concern over the ongoing religious tensions in Akividu and calling for immediate measures to restore peace and harmony.

Several leaders including Bro Geddam Jyothi Anand of Faith Worship Centre, Swarnadeepika editor Belamkonda Shivaji Raju, Vijayawada Greater Pastors Fellowship secretary Pastor Bethapudi Ravikant, treasurer Pastor Beeraraju, Pastor Arun Kumar (Lutheran representative), Korukonda Ashok Kumar, and D Anand Singh of the Salvation Army attended the meeting.
