

Smartphones distributed to Anganwadi teachers

THE INITIATIVE AIMS AT STRENGTHENING GRASSROOTS NUTRITION AND CHILDCARE SERVICES

IN a significant initiative aimed at strengthening grassroots nutrition and childcare services, smartphones were distributed to Anganwadi teachers of the Karimnagar Urban Project at TNGO Bhavan on Wednesday. The distribution was carried out by Karimnagar MLA Gangula Kamalakar, Mayor Kolagani Srinivas, and SUDA Chairman Narendra Reddy.

On the occasion, 17 differently-abled beneficiaries were also provided with retrofitted motor vehicles to enhance their mobility and independence. As part of the Prajapalana Pragathi Pranalika, a growth drive



was conducted in which rewards and prizes were awarded to children who were found to be healthy.

The programme also marked the launch of Poshan Pakhwada, scheduled to be observed from April 9 to 23, focusing on nutrition awareness and

child health. Speaking on this occasion, MLA Gangula Kamalakar urged beneficiaries to make full use of Anganwadi services. He noted that the government's initiative to provide smartphones to Anganwadi staff would usher in greater transparency and efficiency

in service delivery.

Mayor Kolagani Srinivas stated that the primary objective behind distributing smartphones is to facilitate the effective implementation of the Poshan Abhiyaan app and to accelerate the data entry process. Officials informed that Sam-

sung smartphones were procured and distributed to Anganwadi teachers under the Karimnagar Urban Project. Each device costs around 12,000.

These phones are specifically for the Anganwadi teachers and helpers to record the survey data, maintain details of children, and update health information of pregnant and lactating women. To ease the data entry and app usage.

Cultural performances by children are the key highlights. District Welfare Officer Saraswathi, CDPO Sabitha, DMHO Dr. Venkata Ramana, supervisors, Poshan Abhiyaan coordinators, and Anganwadi teachers participated in the event.

Education department officials trapped by ACB in bribery case

- In-charge MEO and teacher are caught red-handed in ACB trap
- Bribe is demanded for processing pension benefits
- Accused are taken into custody and investigation is underway

IN a surprise operation conducted by the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Wednesday, an In-charge Mandal Education Officer (MEO) and a school assistant teacher were caught red-handed while allegedly accepting a bribe for processing pension benefits of a retiring teacher. According to official sources, Ravikumar, serving as In-charge MEO of Gudur mandal in Mahabubabad district and also working as Headmaster of Ayodhyapuram Zilla Parishad Secondary School, along with teacher Chandramouli, was apprehended by ACB officials while accepting Rs 15,000 from a complainant.

The victim, a primary school teacher under the Ayodhyapuram ZPSS cluster, was due to retire on the 30th of this month. As part of the mandatory procedure, pension-related documents and allowances were required to be verified and forwarded to the accounts department at least three months prior to re-

irement. It was alleged that Ravikumar had initially demanded a bribe of Rs 45,000 to process the file. Despite repeated visits over the past three months and requests citing financial constraints, the teacher failed to get the work completed.

Subsequently, Chandramouli reportedly intervened as a mediator and suggested a reduced settlement amount of Rs 15,000 — Rs 10,000 for the MEO and Rs 5,000 for himself. Unwilling to succumb to the demand, the victim approached ACB authorities and lodged a complaint.

Acting on the information, ACB officials laid a trap and caught both the accused while they were accepting the bribe amount. The team also conducted searches and gathered incriminating evidence, said DSP Sambaiah.

Both individuals were taken into custody, and further investigation was underway. The accused were to be produced before the ACB court in Warangal on Thursday, officials added.

165 Aganwadi employees receive phones in Hanumakonda

IN a step aimed at enhancing transparency and efficiency in Anganwadi services, Parkal MLA Revuri Prakash Reddy distributed smartphones to Anganwadi teachers on Thursday. The initiative was undertaken at the MLA camp office in Parkal town, covering staff from Parkal, Damera, Atmakur and Nadikuda.

Speaking on the occasion, the MLA said the introduction of smartphones would simplify monitoring mechanisms and ensure that quality services reach beneficiaries without delays. He informed that a total of 165 Anganwadi staff under



the Parkal project were provided with mobile phones as part of the initiative.

He explained that under the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), six essential services are being delivered to pregnant women, lactating mothers and children aged between 0-6 years. The use of

smartphones, he said, would help in accurately recording and tracking these services. Digital entry of data related to nutrition distribution, health updates and child development was expected to improve accountability and transparency.

Revuri Prakash Reddy further stated that the Congress govern-

ment, under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, had been prioritising women's welfare and strengthening grassroots systems like Anganwadi centres. He noted that the adoption of digital tools would enable regular monitoring of whether nutritious food and essential services were reaching the intended beneficiaries effectively.

Highlighting the broader vision, he said the government was also committed to implementing pre-primary education in government schools to support early childhood development. He emphasised that Anganwadi centres played a crucial role in laying a strong foundation for children's future and assured that continuous efforts were being made to improve their functioning.

Cash reward offered for information on ganja activities in Mahabubabad

MAHABUBABAD district police have announced a reward of up to Rs 5,000 for credible information on the use and illegal trafficking of ganja, urging citizens to come forward and assist

in tackling the growing drug menace. The initiative aims to strengthen community involvement in identifying and eliminating illegal activities.

Superintendent of Police Dr Shabarish said the department is committed to taking stringent action against drug abuse and the illegal drug trade.

He appealed to responsible citizens, youth leaders, and public representatives to actively support the police by sharing reliable information. Authorities assured that the identity of informants would be kept strictly confidential, and those providing actionable inputs would be rewarded.

The police also issued a dedicated contact number for the public to report such cases.

REAFFIRMING the commitment of the Congress government towards inclusive development, Wardhannapet MLA K.R. Nagaraju said that the welfare of the poor, marginalised and weaker sections remains the primary objective of the state government.

On Thursday, at Maa Gardens under Kazipet mandal limits, the MLA distributed cheques worth Rs 80,09,280 to 80 beneficiaries belonging to divisions 44, 45, 46 and 64 of the Greater Warangal Municipal Corpora-

tion. Additionally, under the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF), cheques amounting to Rs 4,30,000 were handed over to 18 beneficiaries.

Addressing the gathering, Nagaraju stated that the government was extending financial support through the CMRF to ensure that poor patients undergoing medical treatment did not face financial burdens. He highlighted that flagship schemes such as Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak were playing a crucial role in supporting marriages of girls from eco-

nomically weaker families, thereby providing them financial security.

He further noted that the Congress government was implementing several welfare measures, including the distribution of fine quality rice free of cost to ration card holders across the state. Emphasising women's empowerment, he said the government aimed to make one crore women financially strong through various initiatives.

The MLA asserted that development works were being carried out in all divisions without political

bias, focusing on the overall growth of colonies. He added that special priority was being given to the education and healthcare sectors in Wardhannapet constituency.

Encouraging public participation, Nagaraju advised citizens to utilise the "Dial Your MLA" programme to communicate their grievances and assured that all eligible beneficiaries would receive assistance under the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

He also pointed out that unlike in the past, when money was allegedly collected in the name of double bedroom housing schemes, the present government was providing houses under the Indiramma scheme free of cost to eligible poor families.

Issuing a stern warning, he said strict action would be taken against anyone collecting money in the name of government schemes, and reiterated that all welfare programmes would be implemented with complete transparency.

Collector flags off AIDS awareness rally in Warangal

Karimnagar man finds relief after failed surgeries with advanced treatment

A middle-aged man from Karimnagar, who had been battling hydrocephalus for over a decade, finally found relief after undergoing an advanced brain procedure at Medicovert Hospitals in Hyderabad. According to hospital sources, the patient had endured years of recurring health complications and

had previously undergone multiple shunt surgeries. However, these procedures failed due to repeated blockages and infections, forcing him to undergo further in-

terventions over time. Upon detailed evaluation, a team of doctors led by Dr Ramesh Shighakolli decided against performing another conventional shunt

surgery. Instead, they opted for a neuroendoscopic procedure, a minimally invasive approach aimed at addressing the root cause more effectively.

Explaining the procedure, Dr Ramesh Shighakolli said it allows cerebrospinal fluid to drain through a natural pathway within the brain, thereby reducing dependence on artificial shunts and lowering the risk of re-

currence complications. The surgery was carried out successfully, following which the patient began showing rapid signs of improvement. Doctors reported that he experienced significant relief from chronic headaches and showed enhanced alertness within a short period.

Hospital authorities further stated that even after four months of the procedure, the patient remained

stable and had not required any additional surgical intervention, marking a significant improvement in his quality of life.

Medical experts noted that such advanced neuroendoscopic techniques are increasingly offering long-term solutions for patients suffering from recurrent neurological disorders, reducing the need for repeated surgeries.
