

'FUTURE CITY WILL USHER IN AN ERA OF GLOBAL INVESTMENT SOON'

Chief Whip dismisses Opposition's allegations regarding urban core project shaping future of city outskirts

RETREATING the government's commitment towards ushering an era of development on the city outskirts, Chief Whip Patnam Mahender Reddy said on Friday that, "the government's core urban planning project 'the future city' will be a haven for global investments in coming days."

Addressing a district-level event organized as part of the 99 days Praja Palana program at the collectorate complex, he said the government is moving forward with dual objectives such as development and welfare. The program is not just ensuring the implementation of welfare schemes for all eligible, but facilitating identification and understanding of issues faced by people.

"During the last two years,

the Chief Whip said, the RR district witnessed a blistering pace of development and welfare initiatives. Besides, he stated, financial assistance under Rythu Bharosa scheme amounting to Rs.722 crore was disbursed among 2,97,000 farmers.

Additionally, he said, 735 peasant families benefited

with Rs.367 crore under the Rythu Bima Scheme. As many as 16,050 Indiramma houses were sanctioned for the homeless families for which Rs.22 crore has been released for the beneficiaries.

To ensure adequate food supply to eligible families, the government sanctioned 1,06,000 ration cards in the

district benefitting 3,52,000 individuals. He listed the benefits under schemes such as Aasara Pension, Indiramma Saarees and free travel scheme for women being implemented in the district.

Reddy brushed aside the allegations made by the Opposition regarding the Future City project by terming it as inap-

propriate. He said, the Future City will emerge as a haven for investments not just for Telangana but for the whole global trade fraternity.

Earlier, collector C Narayan Reddy explained development and welfare activities being taken up as part of the Praja Palana program as well as achievements. Double bedroom houses would be allocated to beneficiaries through a lottery system. Besides free electricity will be provided to beneficiaries under Gruha Jyothi Scheme. Ration cards would be issued to families.

Officials from various departments placed detailed reports through Power Point presentations. Later, bank loan cheques were distributed among beneficiaries of Mahila Shakti Groups, Kalyana Lakshmi and Shadi Mubrak schemes.



Environmental time bomb: Eatala demands action on Jawahar Nagar dump

Massive waste pile triggers health, ecological hazards

A high-level inspection and review meeting was conducted at the Jawahar Nagar dump yard on Friday, led by Member of Parliament Eatala Rajender, along with leaders from all parties, government officials, and representatives of Ramky Group.

The visit highlighted the severe environmental and health hazards posed by the accumulation of nearly 10,000 metric tonnes of waste at a single site.

Speaking to the media after the inspection, Rajender expressed grave concern, stating that such massive waste accumulation at one location is unprecedented in world history. He criticised the government's agreement with Ramky Group, which had promised recycling and zero discharge but had failed to implement them. As a result, lakes within a 40-kilometre radius have been destroyed, groundwater has become toxic, and the health of lakhs of residents has been severely compromised.

Rajender pointed out alarming consequences: miscarriages among pregnant women, death of livestock, disruption of ecological balance, and the transformation of the area into an uninhabitable zone. He emphasised that conditions assuring zero pollution have been blatantly violated, leaving residents exposed to air, water, and noise pollution.

The MP revealed that he had already met the Chief Minister to discuss the is-

sue, stressing that as a former representative of the area, the CM has full knowledge of the problem and now holds the responsibility to resolve it. Rajender urged the government to adopt global best practices and modern technology to provide relief to the people of Balaji Nagar and the surrounding areas.

During the inspection, Rajender, Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, and Ramky representatives reviewed the site and directed the preparation of a detailed report within three days. He assured that after receiving the report, he would meet the Chief Minister to push for a permanent solution. Plans include decentralising waste disposal across multiple sites to reduce pollution.

Rajender reiterated that the issue transcends politics, promising a lasting resolution with the Central government's support. He accused Ramky of failing to recycle even half of the daily waste, leading to groundwater contamination. He also criticised the company for allegedly using false reports and legal loopholes to evade accountability, despite ongoing protests by Joint Action Committees (JACs).

The inspection was attended by Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, MLA Mallareddy, DCC President Vajresh Yadav, IMC Chairman Bommallapelli Narasimha, Jawahar Nagar Mayor Mekala Kavya, and several local leaders, along with residents. Rajender reaffirmed his commitment to fighting for a permanent solution that ensures the health and safety of the people.

TPCC chief urges cadre to stay calm over 'false' media reports

TELANGANA Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) President B Mahesh Kumar Goud appealed to Congress workers to remain calm and

composed following the broadcast of what he described as a fabricated news report targeting him and the party in a section of media.

In a message addressed to party cadre, Mahesh Kumar Goud stated that a television

channel had aired false and misleading reports throughout the day with the intention of damaging his personal reputation and creating confusion within the party ranks.

He acknowledged that the reports had triggered anger



and disappointment among Congress workers but urged them not to react emotionally. Emphasising the Congress party's commitment to demo-

cratic and constitutional values, he said the party respects both freedom of the press and freedom of expression. At the same time, he asserted that media narratives cannot determine the party's strength or performance.

Mahesh Kumar Goud reminded workers that it is the party cadre—not media organizations—that ultimately evaluates and shapes the party's performance and public standing.

Malreddy slams Harish Rao for Pharma City remarks

HYDERABAD: Ibrahimpatnam MLA Malreddy Ranga Reddy on Friday launched a sharp attack on BRS senior leader and former Minister T. Harish Rao, describing his comments on the Pharma City project as "shameless" and warning of strong public backlash against the opposition party.

The MLA said that the people had already rejected the BRS in the past elections due to the controversial Pharma City proposal and asserted that the party would not regain public support. He alleged that despite this, BRS leaders were continuing to make statements aimed at reviving the project.

Referring to Harish Rao's remarks from the US, Malreddy said the former minister had suggested scrapping the proposed "Future City" project and reviving Pharma City instead. He strongly objected to these comments and challenged Harish Rao to return to Telangana and substantiate his claims regarding the Congress government's policies.

Govt clears pension for 2,356 more dialysis patients

HYDERABAD: The Telangana government has sanctioned pensions for over 2,350 additional dialysis patients, in addition to the existing 4,710 beneficiaries.

According to officials, since the formation of the Congress government, 'Cheyutha' pensions have been provided to 4,710 dialysis patients. Recently, pensions were newly sanctioned for another 2,356 dialysis sufferers.

Panchayat Raj Minister Seethakka recently signed the relevant file, and the beneficiaries are set to begin receiving their pensions starting next month.

Furthermore, officials disclosed that another 488 applications are currently under review, and pensions will be sanctioned to eligible applicants very soon. Dialysis patients face multiple challenges, including frequent hospital visits for treatment, expenses related to medication and travel, and loss of livelihood. In these circumstances, the 'Cheyutha' pension of ₹2,016 provided by the government offers significant financial relief.

BJP announces new ST Morcha State Committee

CS Madhusudhan (Hyderabad Central) has been named treasurer.

The committee also includes conveners for media, social media, IT, tours, policy research, legal cell and special initiatives such as "Mann Ki Baat." Notably, Ganesh Modi (Nagar Kurnool) will serve as Media Convenor, while Banoth Jyothi (Hyderabad Central) has been appointed Media Co-Convenor. Jarpulavath Vishal Naik (Malakpet) and Kethavath Surender (Mahabubnagar) will lead social media responsibilities. Spokespersons include Sukunavath Krishna Naik (Malakpet) and Banoth Krishna (Mahabubabad), ensuring communication outreach across the state.

In addition to office bearers, 15 State Executive Members have been announced, representing districts such as Adilabad, Asifabad, Kamareddy, Medchal, Sangareddy, Suryapet, Mahbubnagar, Warangal, Jangaon, Khammam, Nirmal, Goshamahal, Karimnagar, and Medak. ST Morcha State President Nenavath Ravi Naik, who released the list, emphasised that the committee will work closely with tribal communities to address their concerns and strengthen the BJP's presence in Telangana's rural and tribal regions. He noted that the appointments reflect inclusivity and the party's commitment to grassroots leadership.
