

## KTR accuses Revanth, Bandi Sanjay of sheltering POCSCO accused

**BRS Working President demands accountability, alleges conspiracy to intimidate victim's family and suppress media reports**

BRS Working President KT Rama Rao on Friday alleged that a young woman in Telangana suffered injustice due to the collusion between Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Union Minister Bandi Sanjay.

Speaking sharply against the State Government, KTR accused the Chief Minister of intimidating the victim's family, orchestrating a counter-case against them, and shielding the accused for nine days.

Rao condemned the "reckless remarks" made by the CM on the case, asserting that it was the State Government that subjected the minor girl to severe distress, forcing her to wait at the police station until midnight when she went there with her parents to report the injustice. He questioned how the accused was allowed to remain at large for over a week, alleging it was due to the "close ties" between Bandi Sanjay and Revanth

Reddy. "The accused was finally arrested only after the High Court refused to grant bail, and after public outrage across Telangana," KTR said. He criticised the CM, who also holds the Home portfolio, for offering excuses like, "The police were, too, busy due to the Prime Minister's visit." KTR questioned whether the Prime Minister's visit justified allowing associates to roam freely while crimes went unchecked.

KTR said his party had maintained silence out of sensitivity toward the young girl, avoiding politicisation of the matter. However, he was compelled to speak after the CM levelled criticism against BRS.

He demanded clarity on whether there was any other instance in the country where an accused in a POCSCO case was shielded for nine days. Reports suggest the accused was allegedly sheltered in a hospital owned by a close associate of the Chief Minister. KTR called for a thorough government inquiry into the matter.

He challenged both Bandi Sanjay and the CM to reveal who orchestrated the conspiracy to file a counter-case alleging a "honey trap" against the victim's family. KTR also alleged that the two leaders personally contacted media offices to suppress the publication of reports exposing the case.

Concluding his statement, KTR asserted that whenever injustice is committed against women in Telangana, it is the BRS that steps forward to fight for justice, and accused the ruling government of failing its duty to protect the vulnerable.

THE market value of lands in Telangana is set to increase from May 28. The Stamps and Registration Department has made elaborate arrangements to register properties with the revised

market values from the end of this month.

In a bid to generate additional revenue, the government has also finalised guidelines for the HILT policy, and the State Industries Department is expected to issue a notification soon.

The Cabinet Sub-Com-

mittee on Resource Mobilisation held a meeting with officials of the Registration and Industries Departments to review the revised land market values. Irrigation Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy instructed officials to take strict action against individuals involved in illegal

activities that cause financial losses to the state exchequer.

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka directed officials of all departments to focus on mobilising additional revenue sources to meet the budgetary requirements of the current financial year and accelerate the state's economic growth.

He emphasised that resource mobilisation should be aligned with the budget estimates proposed for the 2026-27 financial year. Officials were instructed to completely plug all leakages and fully utilise every available revenue source to achieve the budget targets.

Bhatti further clarified that officials across departments must work towards enhancing revenue strictly in accordance with the predetermined timeline and implementation calendar.

## Kavitha slams govt, held after roadside paddy protest

TRS leader Kalvakuntla Kavitha was arrested by police on Friday after she led a protest in which party leaders dumped farmers' harvested paddy near the Secretariat.

Kavitha slammed the Congress government as incompetent, stating that farmers are left stranded at procurement centres in scorching 48-degree heat without even basic amenities.

Alleging procurement fraud, she said authorities are deliberately registering Grade-A paddy as Grade-B to avoid paying the promised bonus on fine-variety paddy (sanna vadlu).

She further alleged that district collectors are worsening the situation of farmers, while unfair weight deductions are

being used to exploit them. She demanded immediate action from the government to ensure farmers are not cheated by middlemen.

As part of the protest, she staged a sit-in and poured paddy on the road, highlighting the government's failure. Protesters raised slogans against the administration before police intervened and arrested them.

Kavitha, along with several women and farmers, was taken to Falaknuma Police Station and later released.

Lashing out at the administration, Kavitha said the Chief Minister has not conducted a single review meeting on the Agriculture Department in the last two and a half years.

## NIMS sets national record with 2,000 kidney transplants

**Chief Minister Revanth Reddy hails medical team for exceptional service**

CHIEF Minister A Revanth Reddy congratulated the doctors at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS) for achieving a landmark milestone in kidney transplant operations. The institute has now completed 2,000 kidney transplants, setting a national record. The Department of Urology successfully carried out these transplants, making NIMS the number one institution in South India for kidney transplant surgeries. Nationally, the Institute of Kidney Diseases and Research Centre (IKDRC) in

Gujarat holds the top rank, followed by Christian Medical College, Ludhiana, with NIMS at third place.

Revanth Reddy praised the NIMS medical team for their dedication and exceptional service to patients suffering from kidney ailments.

Out of the 2,000 patients, 1,900 individuals (95%) underwent kidney transplants free of cost under the Rajiv Aarogyasri scheme and the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. Remarkably, the institute performed 500 kidney transplants in just three years and four months, starting from January 2023, setting a record in efficiency and patient care.

## Court sentences man to 60 days for ill-treatment elderly parents

THE Court has sentenced a 44-year-old man to two months of imprisonment for harassing and ill-treating his elderly parents in their house in Narayanguda.

According to the police, the respondent, identified as G Srinivas, had been constantly harassing his aged parents. Based on a formal complaint received from the aggrieved parents, Narayanguda Police registered a case against him under Section 70B of the City Police (CP) Act, and Section 115(2) of

the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). The Investigation Officer, Srikanth Reddy, Sub-Inspector of Police conducted a thorough probe, collected strong evidence, and produced the respondent before the Hon'ble V Special Judicial Magistrate Court at Nampally, Hyderabad.

Upon perusing the case facts and evidence under STC No. 1780/2026, the Judge, M Bhasker, found the respondent guilty of the offence and sentenced him to undergo 2 months (60 days) of jail terms along with a fine of Rs 50.

## ACB raids Medchal deputy collector in DA case

THE sleuths of Telangana Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Friday carried out raids at the house of Medchal-Malkajgiri Deputy Collector Vamsi Mohan in connection with a disproportionate assets (DA) case booked against him.

The Rangareddy district ACB special teams carried out searches at eight places linked to him across Medchal and Ranga Reddy districts to collect more details about the DA assets beyond his known sources of income. Mohan earlier worked as Serilingampally RDO. Following allegations that Mohan amassed disproportionate assets, the ACB booked a case against him. The investigation has also brought attention to allegations linked to government land transactions during Vamsi Mohan's period as Shamirpet and later Serilingampally revenue officer.

During the investigation, officials reportedly identified nearly eight acres of land in Abdullapurmet and Piglipuram that were allegedly registered in the name

of the deputy collector's father-in-law and later handed over to a realtor for development.

ACB officials also found that the realtor allegedly transferred 10 plots to the deputy collector through gift deeds. The agency is now examining property documents, financial transactions and linked assets as part of the investigation.

ACB teams are also verifying ownership records and other investments connected to the deputy collector and his family members. The assets recovered from his residence are believed to be valued at several hundred crores of rupees, including documents, immovable properties, and movable assets.

Officials said further investigation is underway to determine the total value of the assets and whether they are disproportionate to the officer's declared income. Senior ACB officials announced that a case of disproportionate assets has been filed against Vamsi Mohan, and investigations are ongoing to uncover other individuals involved in the corruption network.
