Along with the Vedic school, foundation stones were laid for several temple-related development works aimed at developing Yadagirigutta Temple City on the lines of the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams.

The Chief Minister also laid foundation stones for dormitory halls and accommodation facilities for devotees at a cost of Rs 43.12 crore, a grand Kalyana Man-

dapam worth Rs 9.87 crore for conducting daily celestial weddings of the deity, a protective roof over the stairway from Vaikuntha Dwaram to the hilltop at a cost of Rs 1.41 crore, and new stairway construction connecting Mada streets near Rathashala at an esti-

mated cost of Rs 1.35 crore. However, controversy arose as no district officials were reportedly present to receive the Chief Minister when his helicopter landed at Peddagutta for the Vedic school foundation ceremony. Due to this, the Chief Minister and other ministers had to wait inside the helicopter for nearly 15 minutes before proceeding with the programme.

# SCCL becomes proactive ahead of monsoon

Takes measures to prevent rain disruption in coal production

STATE-owned coal mining major Singareni Collieries Company Limited has initiated precautionary measures to ensure uninterrupted coal production and supply during the ensuing southwest monsoon season, company officials said on Saturday.

Chairman and Managing Director Dr Buddhaprakash Jyoti conducted a comprehensive review meeting with General Managers of all mining areas and directed officials to immediately implement advance monsoon preparedness plans to avoid disruptions in production activities. According to company officials, nearly 95 per cent of Singareni's coal production presently comes from open cast mines, where heavy rainfall often leads to water accumulation and hampers mining operations.

To tackle the issue, the company has already deployed more than 100 heavy-duty pumps and motors across various open cast mines for dewatering operations. The CMD

instructed officials to arrange additional company-owned and private pumps wherever necessary and ensure that no water stagnation occurs near overburden and coal benches. He also directed officials to strengthen haul roads and complete all necessary arrangements well in advance. Corporate office General Managers concerned were asked to initiate tender-related processes immediately to ensure the availability of additional pumping equipment during the rainy season.

During the meeting, mine-wise monsoon preparedness

plans and proposals were reviewed in detail. The CMD instructed area officials to closely monitor weather advisories issued by the Meteorological Department and remain especially vigilant in mines that had suffered major production losses due to heavy rains in the past two years. Referring to rising power demand in the backdrop of international developments, Dr. Buddhaprakash Jyoti stressed the need to maintain uninterrupted coal supply to thermal power stations having Fuel Supply Agreements (FSAs) with Singareni.

# 'Human and AI intelligence to advance sports industry'

Expert from Japan addresses seminar on 'Global Collaboration & Academic Exchange'

"MODERN AI research focuses on analysing human experience, observation skills, and strategic thinking in sports," explained Professor Dr Akira Yamanaka from Ehime University, Japan. "Technologies, such as Machine Learning, Deep Learning, Computer Vision, and Data Analytics are being used to study player movements, game situations, and tacti-

cal decisions," he said. "AI-based systems are already being tested in sports like football, cricket, basketball, and tennis to assist coaches in making faster and more accurate decisions during matches," he added.

Prof Yamanaka was addressing a seminar on 'Global Collaboration & Academic Exchange' at Jaya Prakash Narayan College of Engineering (JPNCE), Mahabubnagar during which he delivered a presentation



on 'Tacit Knowledge' and explained how Artificial Intelligence (AI) is being used to replicate decision-making abilities of sports

coaches. "AI would not replace human coaches but would serve as a scientific support system to enhance decision-

making abilities," explained the professor. He added that the combination of human intelligence and Artificial Intelligence would bring significant advancements to the sports industry in the future.

Addressing the gathering, JPNCCE Chairman KS Ravi Kumar described the occasion as a historic day for the institution. He announced that 569 job offer letters had been secured through campus placements this year. Students selected by Infosys
