THE annual Brahmotsavam of Goddess Yellamma at Dharveshipuram (Parvathagiri) in Kanagal Mandal of Nalgonda district, under the supervision of the Endow-

ments Department, will be held from June 23 to June 25, according to Temple Chairman Chideti Venkat Reddy and Executive Officer Ambati Nagi Reddy. As part of the festival preparations, wall posters and pamphlets related to the

annual fair were unveiled by R&B Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy at his residence in Hyderabad on Tuesday.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister called upon devotees and organisers to ensure the successful con-

duct of the Brahmotsavam and directed officials to provide all necessary facilities for pilgrims. As part of the festivities, the Goddess Kalyana Mahotsavam will be conducted at 10:30 am on June 24. This will be followed by a Maha Annadanam (mass community feast) for devotees at 1:00 pm. On June 25, a Shatakataabhishekam will be performed at 8:00 a.m., while the traditional Bonalu procession from two villages will be organized at 4:00 p.m., temple authorities said. Temple officials stated that thousands of devotees

participate in the annual fair every year, with pilgrims arriving not only from Nalgonda district but also from various parts of Telangana.

They added that extensive arrangements are being made to conduct the Brahmotsavam with devotion, grandeur, and traditional fervour. BRS conducts awareness meet on voter list revision

Booth committee members told to safeguard every eligible vote

THE Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) on Tuesday conducted an awareness programme for booth committee members on the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and the party's digital membership registration drive at Telangana Bhavan in Khammam.

Former minister Puvvada Ajay Kumar, BRS Khammam district in-charge and MLC Takkellapalli Ravinder, and Khammam Assembly constituency in-charge Enugula Rakesh Reddy attended the meeting as chief guests. The programme was organized for booth committee members from Raghunathapalem mandal, Khanapuram Haveli mandal, and Khammam Two Town area to create awareness on the voter list revision process and digital membership enrolment.

Addressing the gathering, Puvvada and Takkellapalli said booth committee members have a key responsibility



in safeguarding every eligible vote. They urged party workers to thoroughly understand the SIR process and assist voters in completing the required formalities without difficulty.

The leaders advised booth-level workers to help voters obtain necessary documents wherever required and ensure that relevant details are verified and submitted within the stipulated time. They also called for immediate identification and rectification of any discrepancies in the electoral rolls.

Puvvada said the BRS leadership would remain full-

ly accessible to party cadres and the public until the completion of the SIR exercise. He announced that review meetings would be held once every fifteen days to monitor the implementation of the process and address issues arising at the grassroots level.

The former minister stressed that no eligible voter should be left out of the electoral rolls and called upon booth committee members to discharge their responsibilities diligently. He said every vote is valuable and that grassroots workers play a crucial role in protecting democratic processes.

BJP seeks solution for civic issues



KHAMMAM: BJP Khammam 1 Town leaders, led by Town President Gadila Naresh, met Municipal Commissioner Abhishek Agastya on Tuesday and submitted a memorandum highlighting civic issues affecting divisions of the city. The leaders requested the installation of speed breakers and streetlights in Mustafa Nagar and nearby areas following a recent road accident near Shanti Nagar School. They also urged the civic body to address waterlogging problems in Kaman Bazaar, Old Bus Stand, Kasba Bazaar, Aziz Galli, and Bommana Centre ahead of the monsoon.

They raised concerns over pending road expansion works near the Railway Station area, alleging inconvenience to locals due to delays in cooperation from stakeholders.

ZP official suspended for illegal collections

SURYAPET: District Collector Tejas Nandalal Pawar issued orders suspending SK Mainuddin, a senior assistant in the Zilla Parishad (ZP) office, for allegedly collecting money illegally from Panchayat Secretaries.

Mainuddin had previously served as a senior assistant in Garidepally Mandal. During his tenure there, allegations surfaced that he had extorted money from several Panchayat Secretaries under his jurisdiction. Acting on the Collector's instructions, an inquiry was conducted into the allegations. The investigation reportedly established, with supporting evidence, that Mainuddin had indeed collected money illegally from Panchayat Secretaries. Based on the inquiry report, Pawar initiated strict disciplinary action against the official. Emphasising that negligence in duty and corruption will not be tolerated, the Collector issued suspension orders. Officials stated that similar action would be taken against any government employee found involved in corrupt practices.

SP hands over insurance cheque

GADWAL: District SP Srinivasa Rao handed over a cheque for Rs 5,00,000 to a deceased ASI's wife, Sajida Sultana; w/o late MA Samad, an ASI with the Jogulamba Gadwal District Police, who lost his life in a road accident last May. The SP presented the cheque on Tuesday under the Chief Office Welfare Group Personal Accident Insurance scheme.

99 teachers absent on second day after schools reopened: DEO

TEXTBOOK distribution for students was held on Tuesday at the ZPHS in Pebbair. In-charge DEO Yadaiah, the chief guest, emphasised the importance of discipline and responsibility in the education system. He expressed concern that 99 teachers in the district were absent from duty on only the second day after schools reopened.

The DEO said it was troubling that the very teachers responsible for educating students and shaping their future had failed to report for work. "Education has the power to transform society. If teachers who provide that education neglect their responsibilities, students' discipline and interest in learning will suffer. Every teacher



should recognise their duty, report to work on time, and serve as a role model for students," he said.

Later, public representatives stated that the government was giving special priority to development of

government schools. It was committed to providing quality education to students while ensuring that schools have the necessary infrastructure and that teachers receive the facilities they need.

Municipal chairman Akki Srinivas Goud, vice-chairman Sumitra, MEO Jayaramulu, local councillor Soujanya, market committee chairman and vice-chairman, teachers and students were present.

Show cause notices issued to two medical staff for negligence

- Collector displeased with Kasturba Vidyalaya staff for not preparing food for students

DISTRICT Collector Rizwan Basha Shaik visited the Primary Health Centre in Rajoli on Tuesday. Upon inspecting the staff attendance register, he took a serious view of the fact that two employees—Ranjith Kumar and Kishtamma—had failed to record their attendance for several days; he subsequently directed senior officials of the Medical and Health Department to issue show-cause notices to them.

Noting the low patient turnout at the Primary Health Centre (PHC), the Collector directed the medical staff to improve their performance and ensure the public makes full use of the medical facilities provided by the government. He expressed displeasure over the failure to thoroughly review and update various registers. After inspecting different departments within the hospital, the Collector warned that appropriate action would be taken if the staff did not improve their performance within a month. During his visit to the Rajoli



Kasturba Vidyalaya, the Collector checked staff attendance and inquired about personnel details. He questioned why students had not yet arrived, given that educational institutions had reopened two days prior. He advised the staff to contact the students' parents and take the initiative to ensure the students attended school.

Subsequently, the Collector inspected various sections of the facility and expressed displeasure with the staff upon noticing that no food was being prepared for students arriving for admissions.

He assured that the drainage issue at the school would be resolved and that efforts would be made to expedite the construction of additional classrooms and the compound wall. Earlier, Shaik directed officials to curb illegal sand transportation and ensure that sand is supplied to consumers in accordance with regula-

tions. On Tuesday, the Collector visited the Rajoli mandal headquarters and conducted a surprise inspection of the nearby Thummilla sand ramp.

He emphasized the need for robust measures to prevent illegal sand transport and inquired about the ramp's operations. He stressed the importance of continuous monitoring via CCTV cameras and directed officials from the Mining, Police, and Revenue departments to work in co-ordination. He also inspected the registers maintained at the site and issued appropriate instructions.

Later, when Rajoli village Sarpanch Gangireddy and Deputy Sarpanch Sandhyareddy brought various issues to his attention, he promised to work towards resolving them.

Tahsildar Rammohan, MPDO Syed Khan, Markfed DM Chandramouli, SI Gokari, and others accompanied him during the visit.

Forest-revenue boundary disputes take centrestage

KHAMMAM: District Collector Divakar TS directed officials to take co-ordinated measures to resolve land disputes arising from forest and revenue boundary issues in the district. At a review meeting on Tuesday, the Collector assessed issues relating to forest and revenue land boundaries with officials from the concerned departments.

Divakar said the district administration has initiated steps to address disputes involving forest and revenue land boundaries and emphasized the need for close coordination between departments to ensure effective resolution. The Collector reviewed issues related to CA land mutations, forest-revenue boundary disputes, and problems concerning lands covered under the Recognition of Forest Rights (RoFR) Act. He sought inputs from field-level officials on the status of these cases and the challenges being faced in resolving them. Divakar also directed officials to take steps for sanctioning borewells to lands covered under RoFR pattas. Referring to RoFR titles distributed in 2008 and 2021-22, he asked officials to conduct field-level inquiries into pending issues.
