

Trade unions to protest in Delhi on June 29 against Labour Codes

• AITUC State General Secretary S Venkatasubbaiah alleges that the Centre's policies are detrimental to workers and common people

• Criticises both the Central and State govt for failure to enact comprehensive welfare law for workers in the unorganised sector

A joint action programme by central trade unions and farmers' organisations against the labour and public policies of the Central Government will be announced at a convention to be held at Talkatora Stadium in New Delhi on June 29, AITUC State General Secretary S Venkatasubbaiah said on Wednesday.



Addressing a press conference here, he alleged that the Centre's policies were detrimental to workers and common people. He warned that any move to privatise the Visakhapatnam Steel Plant would trigger a massive agitation across Andhra Pradesh, stating that the industry

was established through the sacrifices and struggles of students and youth.

Referring to the recent accident at the steel plant, Venkatasubbaiah described it as highly unfortunate and said trade unions would continue their fight until justice was delivered to the affected workers' families.

He said a delegation of central trade unions would visit Visakhapatnam on June 24 to assess the situation at the steel plant.

He criticised both the Central and State governments for their failure to enact a comprehensive welfare law for workers in the unorganised sector.

He further alleged that the renaming of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act was part of a larger effort by the Centre to weaken the legislation. Venkatasubbaiah also accused Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu of forgetting the promises made to workers during the previous elections.

Speaking on the occasion, AITUC State Treasurer B V P Kondala Rao demanded the withdrawal of the Labour Codes and restoration of the earlier labour laws. He said that 154 employees and workers' organisations would jointly formulate a common programme of action at the June 29 protest in Delhi. AITUC State Vice-President Tatipaka Madhu, District General Secretary K Rambabu, Working President Allam Venkateswara Rao, District Vice-President V Kondala Rao and other union leaders were present.

Completion of Undi ROB by Dasara assured

Union Minister of State for Steel and Heavy Industries Bhupathiraju Srinivasa Varma inspects the ongoing works

UNION Minister of State for Steel and Heavy Industries Bhupathiraju Srinivasa Varma has assured that the construction of the Railway over Bridge (ROB) at Undi will be completed on a fast-track basis and opened for public use by the Dasara festival.

The Minister inspected the ongoing construction works at the project site on Wednesday and reviewed the progress with officials. He sought an explanation for the delays in execution and was briefed on the status of the project.

Officials informed him that while three bridge slabs are to be laid as part of the project, two have already been completed. They said work on the third slab is awaiting approval from the Railway Department. Responding to the issue, Srinivasa Varma said he would take up the matter with senior railway authorities and ensure that the required permissions are granted within three days so that construction can proceed without further delay.

Speaking to the media, the Minister said technical issues had arisen after the

previous contractor failed to execute the work. He stated that the matter was brought to the attention of Union Ministers and senior officials, following which a new contractor was appointed, resulting in faster progress of the project. He directed officials to ensure that all remaining works are completed by October. The Minister also said he would secure approval for a halt of the Machilipatnam-Visakhapatnam Express at Undi Railway Station, a long-pending demand of local residents.

Dedicated Commission receives representations in Guntur

CHAIRMAN of the Dedicated Commission, Rajeev Ranjan Mishra, received representations and suggestions from members of the public, people's representatives, political leaders and Backward Classes (BC) associations during a consultation programme held at the Collectorate in Guntur on Wednesday. The meeting was organised as part of the Commission's ongoing study on the implementation of reservations for Backward Classes in local bodies across Andhra Pradesh.

During the interaction, the Commission sought views on the implementation of BC reservations in local bodies in the erstwhile Guntur district, as well as issues related to the social, economic and political empowerment of BC communities.

Representatives from various BC organisations, community groups and political parties submitted written representations and recommendations to the Commission. They highlighted the need for adequate and effective representation of Backward Classes in local bodies and urged the Commission to consider measures

that would further empower BC communities in the democratic process. Addressing the gathering, Rajeev Ranjan Mishra assured participants that all representations, suggestions and recommendations received during the consultations would be carefully examined. He said the Commission was committed to conducting a comprehensive study and would take into account the views of all stakeholders before preparing its report for submission to the Government. Joint collector Ashutosh Srivastava and other district officials attended the programme and coordinated the proceedings.

Four BLOs suspended for neglecting duties

GUNTUR Municipal Corporation (GMC) Commissioner K. Mayur Ashok has suspended four Booth Level Officers (BLOs) for remaining absent from the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls without obtaining prior permission from the concerned authorities.

According to official orders issued on Wednesday, the suspended officials are V. Raj Kumar, attached to Polling Station No. 243, and K Nagaraju,

attached to Polling Station No. 164, both from the Guntur West Assembly Constituency. Dharani, attached to Polling Station No. 225, and B. Pawan Kumar, attached to Polling Station No. 72, from the Guntur East Assembly Constituency, were also suspended.

The Commissioner stated that the officials failed to attend the crucial Special Intensive Revision duties, which are essential for ensuring the accuracy and integrity of the electoral rolls. He stressed that election-related responsibilities are of utmost importance

and warned that strict action would be taken against any staff member found neglecting such duties.

K. Mayur Ashok reiterated the administration's commitment to conducting the revision process efficiently and transparently. He said all officials involved in the exercise must discharge their responsibilities diligently and adhere to the prescribed guidelines.

The Commissioner also appealed to citizens to cooperate fully with Booth Level Officers who visit households as part of the electoral roll revision

exercise. He urged residents to provide the required information and documents promptly to facilitate the smooth and successful completion of the revision process.

The Special Intensive Revision is a key exercise aimed at updating voter records and ensuring that eligible citizens are accurately included in the electoral rolls ahead of future elections. Authorities have emphasized that public participation and the active involvement of field-level staff are critical to the success of the programme.
