

Govt sanctions Rs 2,742.40 cr tariff subsidy to discoms

- Advance subsidy for second quarter of 2026-27 to ensure uninterrupted power supply across State
- Funds allocated to APSPDCL, APEPDCL and APCPDCL under Electricity Act provisions

THE state government accorded administrative sanction for the release of Rs 2,742.40 crore as advance tariff subsidy to the State's three power distribution companies (discoms) for the second quarter of the 2026-27 financial year. The decision is aimed at ensuring uninterrupted and quality power supply while strengthening the financial position of the utilities. To effect this, energy department special chief secretary K Vijayanand



issued GO Rt No 46 on Thursday. The sanction has been accorded under Section 65 of the Electricity Act, 2003, based on proposals submitted by the Andhra Pradesh Power Coordination Committee (APCC). As part of the allocation, Andhra Pradesh Southern Power Distribution Company Limited (APSPDCL) will receive Rs 1,574.53 crore, APEPDCL will receive Rs

659.80 crore and APCPDCL will receive Rs 508.07 crore. The funds will be released under various budget heads earmarked for tariff subsidy payments.

The government has directed the assistant secretary and drawing and disbursing officer of the energy department to remit the sanctioned amounts directly to the respective bank accounts of the three discoms.

The chairmen and MDs of APSPDCL, APEPDCL and APCPDCL, along with the member convener of APCC, have been instructed to take necessary follow-up action for utilisation of the funds.

The Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Assistant Inspector General of Forests (Central) vide FP / AP / ROAD / 532871 / 2025 Dt: 21.04.2026 has accorded in Principle (Stage-II) approval for diversion of 0.19 Ha forest land in Compartment No. 63, Pennar Plantation RF, Kalamalla Beat, Muddanur Range of YSR(T) Division for Rehabilitation and Upgradation of Newly declared National Highway NH 167K from Kurnool/ Kadapa Border-Jammalamadugu section of NH-167K i.e., Design Ch. Km 248+010 to Km 269+900 to 2 lane with paved shoulders in the State of Andhra Pradesh subject to the following conditions

- Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged;
- No labour camp shall be established on the forest land
- The User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas
- The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the Proposal
- The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government
- The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government
- No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused
- Any tree felling shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department
- The State Government shall complete settlement of rights, in terms of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, if any, on the forest land to be diverted in accordance with the relevant guidelines issued by the MoEFCC
- The State Government shall monitor compliance of conditions of Forest Clearance and shall submit in this regard yearly report as on 31 st December of every year
- Any other condition that the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry may stipulate, from time to time, in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife
- The User Agency and the State Government shall ensure compliance to provisions of the all Acts, Rules, Regulations and Guidelines, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project
- The total forest area utilized for the project shall not exceed 0.19 Ha.
- No additional or new paths will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less
- Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Van (Sanrakshana Evam Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980 and action would be taken as prescribed under the Act, Rules and Guidelines.
- Overburden shall not be dumped outside the width of the road. The muck generated in the earth cuttings will be disposed of at the designated dumping sites and in no case the muck/debris will be allowed to roll down the hill slopes.
- The designing of culverts/bridges, if any, over the natural streams/rivers/canals should be done in such a manner that it does not hamper the natural course of water, does not give rise to water-logging, and also does not hamper movement of wild animals
- (The KML file of the area diverted and CA area shall be uploaded in the e-green watch portal with all requisite details and same shall be submitted along with compliance report
- The State Government shall carryout Compensatory afforestation by raising of 3500 plants in the degraded forest land identified in Compartment.No.56, Kosinepalli Extn RF, Kalamalla Beat and maintain the same for the specific period as per the provision of FC rules 2023. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and mono-culture of any species may be avoided.
- The approved CA scheme shall not be changed without prior approval of the Govt. of India
- The User Agency shall provide CA in NFL area for compensatory afforestation in lieu of the forest area diverted, if applicable, based on the final outcome in the WP No.1164/2023, which is currently pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The State Forest Department shall ensure that an undertaking from the user agency is obtained in this regard
- The User Agency has made payment Rs.22,61,132/- towards CA and NPV (Rs.20,27,700/- towards CA, Rs.2,33,432/- and towards NPV). The levies paid by the UA shall be utilized for the same as per the approved plan/scheme.

As per the Government of India instructions dated F.No.7-232012-FC Dt: 24.07.2013, the entire forest clearances granted is herewith published so as to make people's aware of the permission granted to the project proponent for use of forest land for non forest purposes.

Juvvaladinne harbour opened to private operator ahead of launch

WITH the Juvvaladinne fishing harbour in Nellore district nearing completion, the state government has initiated the process of bringing the facility into commercial operation by inviting a private operator to manage and maintain the harbour.

The government has approved the issuance of a Request for Proposal (RFP) to select an operations and maintenance (O&M) operator for the harbour, marking the final step before the project becomes operational.

Spread over 114.13 acres, the harbour has been developed on 47.31 acres with core fisheries and allied infrastructure. Construction has reached 96 per cent completion, and the facility

has been designed to serve the region's fishing sector for the next 40 years. Once operational, the harbour will have the capacity to accommodate 1,250 fishing vessels, including 1,000 boats of 9 metres, 100 each of 12-metre and 15-metre vessels, and 50 boats of 25 metres, with an annual fish handling capacity of 41,250 metric tonnes.

The Andhra Pradesh Maritime Board (APMB) told the government that outsourcing operations has become the preferred model at major fishing harbours. A professional operator would ensure efficient harbour management, maintenance of infrastructure and uninterrupted services to fishermen, while reducing the government's long-term maintenance burden.

To attract wider participation from experienced operators, the government has reduced the performance security requirement from Rs 6 crore to Rs 2 crore and extended the bid submission period to 45 days, giving prospective bidders more time to evaluate the project and submit proposals.

The RFP was vetted by the tender evaluation and EPC committee, which recommended inviting bids after government approval. The Juvvaladinne fishing harbour is expected to significantly strengthen marine infrastructure in coastal Andhra Pradesh by providing organised berthing, fish landing, handling and allied facilities, benefiting fishermen across Nellore district and improving the region's seafood logistics and fishing economy.

Scientists showcase nanotechnology applications during Nano Jatha

SCIENTISTS highlighted the growing importance of nanoscience and nanotechnology in agriculture, healthcare, industry, energy, electronics, space and environmental protection during Nano Jatha 2026, held at Sri Venkateswara University (SVU) on Thursday.

The lecture series, roadshow and exhibition was jointly organised by Sri Venkateswara University and the Centre for Nano and Soft Matter Sciences (CeNS), Bengaluru, as part of the curtain-raiser activities for Bengaluru India Nano 2026, which will be held from August 3 to 5 at Bengaluru.

The programme aimed to create awareness among students, particularly those pursuing degree courses, about the importance of nanoscience, its practical applications and the career opportunities available in the field. Vice Chancellor Prof Tata Narasinga Rao inaugurated the event and appreciated the organisers for bringing the science outreach programme to the university. He encouraged students to develop curiosity, scientific thinking and an interest in emerging areas of research.

Prof GU Kulkarni of Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research, Bengaluru, and Prof BLV Prasad, Chief Scientist at National Chemical Laboratory, Pune, delivered keynote lectures. They explained how nanoscience and nanotechnology are being used

in agriculture, electronics, communications, healthcare, energy, material sciences, space research, industry and environmental protection. They said these technologies are opening up new possibilities for innovation and scientific development. Rector Prof Ch Appa Rao and Registrar Prof M Bhupathi Naidu appreciated the initiative, saying such programmes help introduce students to advanced scientific fields and encourage them to explore research opportunities. Dean of Research and Development Prof G Narasimha coordinated the programme and said Nano Jatha was designed to help students understand nanoscience through expert lectures, demonstrations and interactive learning activities. Students took part in expert talks, video presentations, interactive sessions, quiz competitions and live demonstrations. The exhibition featured displays on gold nanoparticles, galvanisation reactions, piezoelectric pavement, electricity generated from fruit juice, humidity sensors, among other things.

Rs 500 cr spent for repairs of govt welfare hostels in State: TDP

NELLORE: TDP Nellore Parliament General Secretary Chejerla Venkateswara Reddy said the coalition government has brought significant improvements to government welfare hostels and residential schools in order to promote quality education to the poor.

Addressing a press conference at party district office here on Thursday, Chejerla expressed gratitude to Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu for approving 10 per cent increase in mess charges for students studying in government welfare hostels and residential schools, though the State is facing severe financial crisis. He recalled that Andhra Pradesh became first State in the country to introduce nutritious meals, including chicken in government hostels, while implementing several welfare measures for hostel residents during Chandrababu Naidu's tenure between

2014-2019. Criticising the previous YSRCP government for neglecting welfare hostels and residential schools which fell into disrepair, the TDP leader claimed that after assuming office in 2024, the coalition government led by Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu spent nearly Rs 500 crore on repairing SC, ST, BC and Minority welfare hostels across the State and constructing additional toilets to improve living conditions, in the last two years.
