Mahesh Goud takes potshots at Harish Rao's '3-month water fix' claim

TPCC chief Mahesh Kumar Goud on Friday responded to remarks made by former BRS minister and Siddipet MLA T Harish Rao, who claimed that he could resolve the state's water crisis if given an opportunity to serve as Irrigation Minister for three months.

Why ask for another three months?" Goud questioned. Responding to comments made by Telangana Jagruthi president K. Kavitha regarding BRS party funds, Mahesh Kumar Goud said, "There is truth in the allegations made by Kavitha regarding BRS party funds. How did a regional party come to possess Rs 1,400 crore?" he said.

On internal issues within the Congress party, Goud said differences of opinion were natural in any organisation. He assured that the issues involving Minister Konda Surekha, MLA Kadiyama Srihari, and the situation in Tungaturthi would be resolved after hearing the concerns of all sides. He emphasised that all party members were equal and said two senior leaders had been appointed to resolve internal disputes as the Disciplinary Committee Chairman was occupied with other responsibilities. He clarified that suspension was not the only way to address differences within the party. Recalling earlier political developments, Goud said 10 MLAs had supported the Congress government when attempts were allegedly made to destabilise it. He also alleged that Eateela Rajender was a minister when the alleged irregularities in water resource management took place.

Pebbair police conduct special drive against vehicles sans number plates

ACTING on orders from the SP, the police conducted a special inspection drive targeting vehicles without numberplates in the Pebbair municipal area. Officers inspected vehicles in front of the local police station and at Subhash Crossroads, identifying over 70 operating without numberplates. They moved them to the station. Subsequently, the police educated vehicle-owners about road safety and regulations of the Motor Vehicles Act. The vehicles were released only after new num-

berplates were fixed in compliance with rules and their importance was explained. Fines amounting to Rs 50,000 were imposed on motorists for various violations. SI Venkateswarlu Goud stated that driving vehicles without numberplates is illegal. Such vehicles are often susceptible to use in criminal activities. He emphasised that numberplates play a crucial role in investigation of thefts and other crimes. Strict action would be taken against those riding two-wheelers without helmets. Vehicles violating regulations would be seized and cases registered under the MV Act.
