# TELANGANA AIMS TO BECOME \$3-TRILLION ECONOMY: BHATTI

Farmers' welfare and women's empowerment top priorities

- Agriculture is not merely an occupation but the foundation of the State's culture
- Govt Spending around Rs 14,000 cr annually towards providing free electricity to the agriculture sector

DEPUTY Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on Friday said the Congress government was committed to transforming Telangana into a \$3-trillion economy by 2047, while simultaneously strengthening agriculture, empowering women and ensuring transparent governance.

Addressing the Rythu Ashwira Sabha at Jagannathapuram in Chinthakani mandal of Khammam district, Bhatti said the government's vision extended beyond welfare programmes and focused on making Telangana globally competitive through sustained investments in agriculture, infrastructure, education and social development.

He said the government transferred Rs 9,000 crore under the Rythu Bharosa scheme into farmers' bank accounts within nine days, describing the exercise as a reflection of its commitment to the farming community. Agriculture, he said, was not merely an occupation but

an integral part of Telangana's culture and way of life, adding that expenditure on farmers should be viewed as an investment in economic growth rather than as a subsidy. The Deputy Chief Minister said the State has spent over Rs 1.67 lakh crore on agriculture sector during the last two-and-a-half years. As many as 16.81 lakh farmers have benefited from the latest round of investment support.

The government continued to provide free electricity to the agriculture sector by bearing an annual subsidy of around Rs 14,000 crore.

Highlighting the government's focus on women's empowerment, Bhatti said interest-free loans worth Rs 67,000 crore has already been extended to women's self-help groups, while the credit ceiling had been enhanced from Rs 5 lakh to Rs 10 lakh.

He said the government

was encouraging women entrepreneurs by providing opportunities in setting up petrol pumps, canteens and power projects, with the long-term objective of improving their economic independence.

He said the government increased diet charges in government educational institutions by 40 per cent and cosmetic charges by 200 per cent, while work was underway to establish 100 Young India Integrated Residential Schools with an estimated investment of Rs 200 crore. The government has also introduced a mid-day meal programme for intermediate students, he added.

Launching a political attack on the previous BRS government, Bhatti alleged that it pushed Telangana into a debt burden of Rs 8.21 lakh crore and criticised its handling of irrigation projects, particularly the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project. He claimed that the

project's cost had escalated significantly and alleged financial irregularities in its execution.

The Deputy Chief Minister contrasted Kaleshwaram with irrigation projects such as Nagarjuna Sagar, Srisailem, Jurala, Sriram Sagar and Sripada Yellampalli, stating that projects built during Congress governments continued to benefit farmers for decades.

He also accused opposition leaders of spreading misinformation against the government through sections of the media and social media, and urged people not to be misled by what he described as false propaganda.

Reiterating the government's long-term vision, Bhatti said the Congress administration would continue to protect public resources, maintain fiscal discipline and pursue inclusive development under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy.

## Mahesh Goud takes potshots at Harish Rao's '3-month water fix' claim

TPCC chief Mahesh Kumar Goud on Friday responded to remarks made by former BRS minister and Siddipet MLA T Harish Rao, who claimed that he could resolve the state's water crisis if given an opportunity to serve as Irrigation Minister for three months. Speaking to the media, Goud said that if Harish Rao genuinely wished to join the Congress party, the matter would be discussed internally. He added that a decision on whether to induct Harish Rao into the party would be taken after deliberations in the Political Affairs Committee (PAC).

Questioning Harish Rao's claim, Mahesh Kumar Goud said that a person who could not achieve significant results during 10 years in power could not be expected to accomplish much in three months. He said the present government was working to address the debts and mistakes inherited from the previous administration.

"What did Harish Rao achieve during his 10-year tenure as a minister? A project constructed while he was the Irrigation Minister collapsed—what does he have to say about that? What did

he do during those 10 years? Why ask for another three months?" Goud questioned.

Responding to comments made by Telangana Jagrathi president K. Kavitha regarding BRS party funds, Mahesh Kumar Goud said, "There is truth in the allegations made by Kavitha regarding BRS party funds. How did a regional party come to possess Rs 1,400 crore? he said. On internal issues within the Congress party, Goud said differences of opinion were natural in any organisation. He assured that the issues involving Minister Konda Surekha, MLA Kadiyam Srihari, and the situation in Tungaturthi would be resolved after hearing the concerns of all sides.

He emphasised that all

party members were equal and said two senior leaders had been appointed to resolve internal disputes as

the Disciplinary Committee Chairman was occupied with other responsibilities. He clarified that suspension was not the only way to address differences within the party. Recalling earlier political developments, Goud said 10 MLAs had supported the Congress government when attempts were allegedly made to destabilise it.

He also alleged that Eatela Rajender was a minister when the alleged irregularities in water resource management took place.

## Pebbair police conduct special drive against vehicles sans number plates

ACTING on orders from the SP, the police conducted a special inspection drive targeting vehicles without numberplates in the Pebbair municipal area.

Officers inspected vehicles in front of the local police station and at Subhash Crossroads, identifying over 70 operating without numberplates. They moved them to the station. Subsequently, the police educated vehicle-owners about road safety and regulations of the Motor Vehicles Act.

The vehicles were released only after new numberplates were fixed in compliance with rules and their importance was explained. Fines amounting to Rs 50,000 were imposed on motorists for various violations.
