

# Minister Vivek outlines govt's vision for a skilled Telangana

**Calls upon unemployed youth to make best use of skill development programmes and overseas employment opportunities being created by the State government**

MINISTER for Labour, Employment, Training and Factories Vivek Venkat Swamy on Friday called upon unemployed youth to make the best use of skill development programmes and overseas employment opportunities being created by the State government.

He was speaking at the Foreign Employment Mega Job Mela organised by the Telangana Overseas Manpower Company (TOMCOM) here on Friday.

The Minister said that after the formation of Telangana, job aspirants had waited nearly a decade for employment



opportunities and added that the Congress government has already filled nearly one lakh government vacancies.

He said Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy has envisioned transforming Telangana into a three-trillion-dollar economy

under the Telangana Rising initiative, with a strong focus on developing a skilled workforce.

As part of the initiative, the government plans to establish 120 Advanced Technology Centres (ATCs) across the State at an estimated cost of Rs 4,500

crore. Despite financial constraints, nearly Rs 4,000 crore will be mobilised through Tata Group's CSR support, he said. The centres will provide training in emerging sectors such as virtual analysis and design, electric vehicle maintenance and digital manufacturing, besides offering a monthly stipend of Rs 2,000 to trainees.

Vivek Venkat Swamy said TOMCOM has also been strengthened to provide skill training, language coaching and overseas placements.

He encouraged youth to be willing to relocate for employment, stating that quality jobs are available in Hyderabad, other Indian cities and abroad. Referring to opportunities in Germany, he said trained candidates could earn substantially higher salaries and legally undertake part-time work while employed there. Addressing the gathering, Transport and BC Welfare Minister

Ponnab Prabhakar said the foundation stone for a Rs 45-crore ATC building has already been laid in Husnabad, enabling local youth to access advanced skill training closer to home. He also announced a monthly stipend of Rs 1,000 for students learning the German language in Husnabad and proposed establishing a dedicated German Language Training Centre.

He further assured that a driving school would be sanctioned for the constituency to improve overseas employment prospects.

The Minister highlighted several development works taken up in Husnabad, including a 250-bed hospital, Ellamma Cheruvu tourism development, an industrial park and an urban forest park.

Nearly 1,500 unemployed youth registered for the mega job mela, and the Ministers distributed appointment letters to selected candidates.

# Warangal to be developed into a model city: Naini

**Lays foundations for development works worth Rs 1 crore**

WARANGAL West MLA Naini Rajender Reddy said on Friday that the government is moving ahead with a well-planned strategy to transform Warangal into a model city; Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has been giving special attention to the city's development.

Reddy stressed that development works must be completed within the stipulated timeframe and with high quality, warning officials and contractors against showing negligence even in small works.

He laid foundations for development works worth nearly Rs 1 crore in Sahakar Nagar and Revenue Colony (50th division) and in the Sikhwada area of Kakatiya Colony (9th division) of the constituency. He said the works were sanctioned keeping in view needs of locals.

Reddy asserted that the government would not compromise on development of Warangal city. A special action plan is being imple-



mented to improve internal roads, drainage, water pipelines, street lights and other infrastructure. The government is committed to identifying public issues and providing permanent solutions.

The MLA instructed officials to ensure every work undertaken with public funds is executed transparently, maintaining high quality and completed within the deadline. Even small works have a direct impact on daily lives of people and must be

carried out with utmost responsibility. He expressed confidence the projects would significantly improve transportation and sanitation in the colonies.

Reddy said his objective is to remain in constant touch with people, understand their problems and ensure development of every division. He reaffirmed commitment to developing the constituency in all sectors and creating a model living environment for its residents.

# Outsourcing jobs provided to 30 displaced persons

# Sarpanchs must resolve long-standing issues in villages: DC Haritha

SARPANCHS and panchayat secretaries must work in coordination to identify and resolve long-standing issues in villages, said district Collector K Haritha here on Friday.

She was speaking at a training programme on village development held at the Collectorate, alongside Additional Collector Yuvraj Marmat and Swachh Bharat Mission State Nodal Officer Sridhar.

The program was attended by Mandal Parishad Development officers, Mandal Panchayat officers, panchayat secretaries, and sarpanchs. Speaking on the



occasion, the Collector emphasized that Sarpanchs should identify problems within their Gram Panchayat limits and collaborate with panchayat secretaries to address them. She advised installing controllers to ensure streetlights do not remain on during the day, thereby saving electricity, and urged against the indiscriminate disposal of

plastic covers and bottles in villages, noting that such waste accumulates in drains during heavy rains, obstructing flow and causing sewage to enter residential areas.

She also called for measures to construct soak pits in villages, particularly in areas where water tends to stagnate. Instructions were issued to take measures for the

construction of additional classrooms and toilets in schools; it was noted that construction work is being vandalized during holidays, and directives were given to identify the perpetrators and take appropriate action against them.

Sarpanchs and Panchayat Secretaries were advised to work in coordination to ensure village development.

# Krishnaiah assumes charge as Kagaznagar RDO

# 'Set up a Rs 5,000-cr special corporation for welfare of TG agitation activists'

GUDIMALLA Ravikumar, State chairman of Telangana Agitation Activists and a senior advocate, on Friday urged the government to establish a Rs 5,000-crore special corporation to ensure welfare and social security of those who actively participated in the statehood movement.

Addressing a press conference here, he expressed concern that the government is yet to release an official list of activists who sacrificed their lives, were imprisoned, faced

police cases, were bound over, sustained injuries, or actively participated in the movement.

Many activists had hoped their lives would improve after the formation of Telangana, but, instead, faced disappointment. Nearly 1,200 activists had died over the past 12 years due to financial hardship and health issues.

Ravikumar demanded the government extend welfare measures to the activists, including 250 square yard house-site, a monthly pension of Rs 25,000, free bus pass, health insurance, a triple-



bedroom house, and 10% reservation in education and employment. He called for creation of a permanent welfare fund

through a Rs 5,000-crore corporation dedicated to welfare of the activists. He pointed out that States, such as Jharkhand,

Uttarakhand, Chhattisgarh, have provided pensions, health cards and reservation benefits to their statehood movement activists,

while Telangana has allegedly neglected those who fought for statehood. Just as the Government of India recognised and extended welfare benefits to genuine freedom fighters, the government should provide social security and financial assistance to the activists.

He announced a memorandum containing suggestions on identification and welfare of the activists would be submitted to the KK committee on July 17 on behalf of the activists from the erstwhile Warangal district.
