

Resurvey will ensure error-free land records, asserts Revenue Secretary

Statewide exercise to rectify land disputes and fix precise boundaries using coordinates, targeting completion by March 2027

REVENUE Secretary DS Lokesh Kumar has stated that every mistake in land records will be corrected through the ongoing land re-survey, expressing confidence that the exercise will be completed within the stipulated deadline. Speaking to The Hans India, DS Lokesh Kumar said that encroachments on private properties will be detected and boundaries will be accurately fixed by determining precise latitudes and longitudes. He noted that land records will be cleaned up simultaneously with the re-survey, which will ultimately help create clear, accurate documentation across the state. He explained that Telangana has a total geographical area of 1,12,077 square kilometres, amounting to approximately 112.08 lakh hectares or 276.95 lakh acres. Of this total, 25 lakh acres



comprise assigned lands, 66 lakh acres are forest lands, and about 13 to 14 lakh acres are occupied by irrigation projects, roads, schools, colleges, and other government establishments. However, approximately 65,000 acres of land remain under dispute, and DS Lokesh Kumar emphasized that the re-survey will provide a clear, unambiguous picture regarding these properties.

He informed that the re-survey is already underway across the state, having been successfully completed in 35 villages, while pilot surveys

have commenced in selected villages across almost all mandals. DS Lokesh Kumar affirmed that the re-survey will be completed within the timeframe mandated by the government. It may be recalled that Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy had set a target deadline of March 2027 to finish the comprehensive statewide land re-survey exercise across three distinct phases. The Minister also previously stated that farmers will be allotted unique 'Bhudhaar' identification numbers for every land parcel.

Revanth prods babus to promote vegetable cultivation across state

The State government to provide subsidised seeds

- Asks to focus on areas surrounding centralised school kitchens for growing vegetables

CHIEF Minister A Revanth Reddy ordered officials to take necessary measures to promote vegetable cultivation in coordination with the Agriculture Department across Telangana. Announcing that the government is ready to provide required seeds at subsidized rates to farmers, the Chief Minister emphasized the need to focus on areas surrounding newly constructed centralised kitchens, which sup-

ply breakfast and mid-day meals to students in government schools, for growing vegetables.

The Chief Minister instructed officials to create awareness among farmers regarding organic methods for cultivating vegetables and other crops. Officials were ordered to take steps for direct procurement of produce grown by farmers and appoint extension officers from the Agriculture Department to educate cultivators in relevant areas. On Thursday, an Expert Committee submitted a report to Chief Minister Revanth Reddy regarding the impact of El Nino conditions at Bodhi Pavilion in the MCRHRD institution.

The committee made several important recommen-

dations to the government to address current El Nino impacts in Telangana and outlined an emergency action plan.

The panel suggested formulating village-wise contingency plans to promote the cultivation of pulses, oilseeds, millets, and vegetables, providing seeds for these crops at a 75 per cent subsidy, and sanctioning new

loans for alternative crops.

The expert committee also advised encouraging fodder cultivation through subsidized fodder seeds and ensuring uninterrupted power supply for irrigation. Providing technical guidance to farmers via agricultural university scientists, promoting vegetable cultivation in villages surrounding Hyderabad, arranging

transport facilities to Rythu Bazaars, offering financial assistance for establishing dairy units in rural areas, and forming village-level teams to monitor contingency measures were discussed during the meeting. State Planning Board Vice-Chairman G Chinna Reddy and members of the expert committee participated in the review session.

Abortion kits seized in medical shop raid

OFFICIALS of the Drugs Control Administration (DCA) seized 113 'Safe-T Kit' (Medical Termination of Pregnancy/MTP kits), valued at Rs 47,672, from a wholesale medical shop in Nalgonda town in an enforcement drive on Thursday.

Acting on credible information, DCA officials conducted a raid at Sri Lakshmi Medical Agencies, a wholesale medical store owned

by P Sudhakar, in Mahaveer Medical Market, Prakasham Bazaar, Nalgonda. During the inspection, officials found a large quantity of abortion kits that were allegedly stocked without valid purchase invoices.

The seized kits were manufactured by Akums Drugs and Pharmaceuticals Limited, based in Haridwar, Uttarakhand. According to DCA officials, the samples of the seized kits have been collected and sent for laboratory analysis, and authorities

stated that strict legal action will be initiated against those responsible.

The DCA also highlighted the serious health risks associated with the unsupervised use of Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) kits. Officials cautioned that using abortion medication without a qualified doctor's supervision or in violation of medical guidelines can lead to severe complications, including excessive bleeding, infections, and even life-threatening conditions.

Police arrest 3 in attempted murder case

SLEUTHS of Tappachabutra police apprehended three persons in connection with an attempted murder case stemming from a family property dispute at Daibagh in Hyderabad on Thursday. According to police, the prime accused Mohammed Dastagir Shareef allegedly conspired to kill his sister-in-law Shameem Sulthana over property disagreements and domestic issues.

The main accused sought assistance from two accomplices, Ghulam Nabi Qureshi and Mohd Osman, to execute the murder plan.

On 27 July, the trio reached the victim's residence on a scooter and gained entry.

Ghulam Nabi Qureshi attacked the woman with a butcher knife, assaulted her husband when he attempted to intervene, and chased the victim before stabbing her in the stomach. The assailants fled the scene after local residents gathered at the spot. Police recovered the scooter, weapon used in the offence, and other key evidence. All three accused were produced before the court and remanded in judicial custody.

DOST special phase allotments released, commerce and physical sciences top seat preferences

TGCHE releases degree seat allocations for 53,967 candidates, instructing successful applicants to complete online self-reporting by August 1

TELANGANA Council of Higher Education (TGCHHE) and the Commissioner of Collegiate Education (CCE), Degree Online Services, Telangana (DOST), announced the special phase seat allotment on Thursday. TGCHHE Chairman and DOST Convener V Balakista Reddy, alongside Commissioner of Collegiate Education A Sridevasena, declared the special phase allocations. Officials stated that 44,179 candidates were allotted seats based on their first priority choices, while 9,788 candi-

dates secured seats against their second and lower priorities. However, 3,723 applicants exercised web options but failed to secure seat allotment due to specifying limited web options.

Out of 57,690 candidates who exercised web options in the Special Phase, Commerce emerged as the most sought-after stream with 23,516 students opting for it, followed by Physical Sciences with 10,988, Life Sciences with 10,316, Arts with 9,116, and other streams accounting for 31 candidates, bringing the total number of allocated seats to 53,967. TGCHHE informed

that candidates allotted seats will receive an SMS on their registered mobile numbers. Applicants can access seat allotment details through candidate logins on the DOST website and via WhatsApp on demand.

All candidates securing seats in the Special Phase must reserve their allotment through online self-reporting between 30 July and 1 August by paying Rs 500 or Rs 1,000 in the DOST candidate login portal. Students allotted to Government Degree Colleges or University Colleges who are provisionally eligible for ePASS fee reimbursement following

caste and income certificate verifications need not pay any amount during online self-reporting.

Furthermore, self-reported candidates will receive a CCOTP via SMS on their registered mobile numbers. TGCHHE instructed candidates who have self-reported online during the Special Phase to physically report to their respective allotted colleges from 31 July to 1 August by submitting their CCOTP.

Candidates failing to report physically within the stipulated timeframe shall forfeit their allotted and self-reported degree seats.

BRS intensifies demand for Kazipet Railway Division

BRS leaders from the Warangal West constituency staged a peaceful dharna at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on Thursday, demanding that the Centre immediately announce a railway division with Kazipet as its headquarters during the ongoing Parliament session. The protest was organised under the direction of former government Chief Whip and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar, with leaders alleging that Telangana has been

consistently overlooked in railway development.

The protesters demanded that the Kazipet Railway Coach Factory remain under government control and that 80 per cent of employment opportunities at the facility be reserved for local youth. They also sought the retention of crew links at Kazipet, establishment of a centralised crew lobby at Kazipet or Warangal, construction of a foot overbridge at Bodagutta, apprenticeship opportunities for local ITI students, vending zones for small traders and im-

proved railway infrastructure, including new train services from Kazipet. The BRS leaders further urged the Centre to increase railway budget allocations for Telangana, expedite pending railway projects and fulfil assurances made under the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act. They alleged that the BJP-led Central government had ignored Telangana's legitimate demands, while accusing BJP and Congress MPs from the State of failing to secure the region's rightful share of railway development and funding.
