Congress intensifies SIR drive, calls for unity ahead of elections

PAC meeting in Nizamabad urges BLAs to complete voter verification and strengthen grassroots organisation

THE District Political Affairs Committee (PAC) meeting of the Congress party was held at the District Congress Committee office in Nizamabad on Thursday, with party leaders stressing the need to strengthen the organisation and expedite the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls ahead of the upcoming elections.

The meeting was chaired by DCC President Katipally Nagesh Reddy and attended by State Government Advisor and Bodhan MLA P. Sudarshan Reddy as the chief guest. Addressing party leaders and Booth Level Agents (BLAs), Sudarshan Reddy called for completing the SIR process across the district with nearly 100 per cent coverage. He said every eligible voter should be enrolled and no genuine voter should be left out of the electoral rolls.

He urged Congress leaders to work in close coordination, set aside differences and focus on strengthening the party at the grassroots level. He said the welfare initiatives introduced by the State Government should be effectively taken to the people so that beneficiaries are aware of the



schemes and the party's commitment to public welfare.

Expressing confidence in the Congress party's prospects, Sudarshan Reddy said united efforts by leaders and workers would help the party secure victory in the forthcoming elections. He also assured party workers that those who had worked sincerely for the organisation would be given due recognition and justice.

Bhadrakali bund works to be finished in 15 days: Commissioner

Venkanna reviews development works, orders faster execution and greenery plans for Bhadrakali and Waddepally Bunds

BALDIYA Commissioner T. Venkanna has directed officials and the contracting agency to complete all pending works on the Bhadrakali Bund within the next 15 days.

During an inspection of the ongoing development works at Bhadrakali and Waddepally Bunds on Thursday, the Commissioner reviewed the progress and instructed engineering officials to speed up the remaining works and ensure timely completion.

At Bhadrakali Bund, Venkanna stressed the need to finish all pending works without delay. Inspecting Waddepally Bund later, he directed officials to complete the project by August.

He also instructed the horticulture department to prepare estimates for developing greenery along Bhadrakali Bund. Since the tender process for landscaping at Waddepally Bund has already been completed, horticulture officials were asked to begin plantation works immediately.

Superintending Engineer Raj Kumar, Horticulture Officer Lakshma Reddy and other officials accompanied the Commissioner during the inspection.

IN a major boost to urban public transport, Transport and BC Welfare Minister Ponnam Prabhakar on Thursday inaugurated City Metro Express bus services at the Dr B.R. Ambedkar Bus Station in Karimnagar to improve connectivity and provide better commuting facilities for city residents.

Following the inauguration, the Minister, along with Choppadandi MLA



Dr Medipally Satyam, Husnabad MLA Kavvam-pally Satyanarayana, Karimnagar Mayor Kolagani Srinivas, District Collector Chitra Mishra and senior officials, travelled in one of the newly introduced buses from the Karimnagar bus station to Vageshwari College. In the first phase, the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) introduced City Metro Express services on three routes: Karimnagar-Vageshwari College, Karimnagar-Chinthakunta, and Karimnagar-Kothapalli Haveli.

Speaking on the occasion, Ponnam Prabhakar said the launch of the city bus services fulfilled a long-pending demand of Karimnagar residents and would strengthen the city's public transport network in

line with its growing population and expanding urban limits.

He said the government also plans to extend the services to Prathima, Chalmeda and Manakondur, with additional buses and round-the-clock operations to be considered based on passenger demand. Urging citizens to make greater use of public transport, the Minister said the government is expanding bus services across the State while strengthening TG-SRTC through new buses, fresh recruitments and the Mahalakshmi Scheme, which provides free travel for women in RTC buses across Telangana. He added that TGSRTC currently operates nearly 35 lakh kilometres daily, serving around 65 lakh passengers across the State.

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Expedite blackspot elimination on highways: MP Kavya

Calls for permanent safety measures in accident-prone areas

WARANGAL MP Dr Kadiyam Kavya has urged the Centre to expedite the elimination of blackspots on national highways and implement permanent safety measures in accident-prone areas. Raising the issue in Parliament on Thursday, she said that road safety should be given top priority and that pending works must be completed within a stipulated timeframe to reduce



accidents.

Dr Kavya sought details of blackspots identified on national highways passing through the Warangal region and the progress of works taken up for their elimination. She stressed that merely identifying accident-prone locations was not sufficient and called for long-term solutions to prevent recurring accidents.

In a written reply, Union

Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari said that 6,358 black corridors had been identified across the country using an AI-based system developed by IIT Kanpur based on e-DAR data from 2023 to 2025. He added that safety measures are being undertaken as part of national highway development and maintenance works, as there is no separate fund exclusively for blackspot elimination.

Dr Kavya urged the Centre to accelerate the ongoing works and approve additional projects wherever necessary to improve road safety and significantly reduce accidents.
