THE Telangana State Civil Supplies Department has successfully completed 50 days of its strategic 100-day operational action plan, Mission K-100, achieving significant milestones in pending Custom Milled Rice (CMR) evacuation, clearing warehouse, and fund mobilisation ahead of Kharif 2026–27.

During a comprehensive mid-term review meeting chaired by Commissioner of Civil Supplies M Stephen Raveendra, said that the department has achieved an overall cumulative CMR delivery of 11.17 Lakh Metric Tonnes (LMT), demonstrating strong operational discipline. This includes 8.34 LMT delivered across Weeks I to VI, recording an impressive 74 per cent achievement rate against targeted weekly allocations. The intensive monitoring mechanism has successfully activated 340 previously dormant mills, bringing down zero-delivery units from 1,351 to 1,011 across the state.

Vigilance teams are actively conducting intensive field inspections and registering FIRs against defaulters. The department was also executing the Revenue Recovery (RR) Act to seize properties and freeze bank accounts of defaulting millers, he said. So far the recovery of auctioned paddy has yielded a total of Rs. 1,000.57 crores as of August 19, 2026.

GHMC Commissioner RV Karnan on Thursday convened a review meeting at the GHMC head office with Additional Commissioners, Zonal Commissioners and Heads of Departments to review the comprehensive arrangements for the smooth and peaceful conduct of the festival.

As part of the advance preparedness, all Zonal Commissioners have been directed to conduct zonal-

Manikonda residents flag land grab bid; call on HYDRAA chief

RESIDENTS of Manikonda have raised concerns over attempts by some individuals to enter and allegedly encroach upon lands earlier protected by the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Assets Protection Agency (HYDRAA) in Tirumala Hills and Venkateswara Colony.

A delegation of the Federation of All Colonies RWAs of Manikonda, led by its president Arvapalli Vamshi, met HYDRAA Commissioner AV Ranganath and brought the issue to his notice. The delegation urged HYDRAA to take immediate steps to ensure that the lands previously protected from encroachments continue to remain safeguarded.

According to the residents, Ranganath heard their concerns and assured them of efforts to protect the lands. He also directed HYDRAA senior inspectors to visit the sites and take appropriate action. The delegation further requested HYDRAA's support for developing a park, which is spread over 6,054 square yards space on the protected land for the benefit of residents and the wider community. Ranganath responded positively to the proposal and assured them that the matter would be examined, Vamshi said.

"We are hopeful that lands in Manikonda that have been protected from encroachments will continue to remain safeguarded. We will continue our efforts to protect these lands and ensure that the interests of residents and the community are protected," Vamshi said.

Tirumala Hills Colony president Dr P Avinash, general secretary Srinivasa Rao, treasurer Subhash and other residents were present.

10-floor Ambedkar Tower to come up at Lower Tank Bund

HYDERABAD: A 10-floor Dr BR Ambedkar Tower will come up at Lower Tank Bund in Hyderabad, with the State government approving its construction

at an estimated cost of Rs 108 crore. An official order to this effect was issued on Thursday. According to the order, the Ambedkar Tower will be constructed on the

premises of the existing Dr BR Ambedkar Bhavan at Lower Tank Bund. The building is in a dilapidated condition and has remained unused for the past 12 years.

A consultancy will be appointed to prepare and finalise the design and other details of the proposed tower. The government has already made a provision of Rs 25 crore in the Budget estimates for the current financial year.

The Scheduled Caste Development Department has been entrusted with implementing the project.

Sajjanar takes bike ride to check KBR Park traffic flow

POLICE COMMISSIONER URGES MOTORISTS TO FOLLOW TRAFFIC RULES AND COOPERATE WITH POLICE

TO ensure motorists do not face inconvenience under the newly implemented one-way traffic system around KBR Park, clear signboards have been installed at all junctions and adequate traffic personnel deployed to guide commuters. Hyderabad City Police Commissioner VC Sajjanar inspected the arrangements on Thursday, riding a motorcycle to assess the traffic situation firsthand.

Without any fanfare and dressed in plain clothes, Sajjanar set out on a motorcycle at around 10 am to get a first-hand assessment of the traffic situation on the ground. He rode twice along the one-way route covering Road No. 45, Jubilee Check Post, Venkatagiri, KBR Park



Main Gate, Mugdha Junction, Basavarakam, Agrasen Chowrasta, and Film Nagar Junction and back to Road No 45.

The Police Commissioner again monitored traffic flow in the afternoon and interacted with personnel deployed at key junctions, including Agrasen Chowrasta, Film Nagar, Journalist Colony, Jubilee Hills Check Post and KBR Park Main Gate, to assess the situation and challenges on the ground.

Sajjanar said the one-way traffic system around KBR

Park was flowing smoothly. While motorists faced some confusion over lane switching on the first day of implementation, vehicle movement became considerably smoother by Thursday, he said.

"To ensure that motorists do not face any inconvenience, clear sign boards have been set up at all junctions and sufficient personnel have been deployed to guide and assist commuters," the Commissioner said.

He added that efforts were underway to complete the H-City project works at the earliest in coordination with GHMC and the construction agency. Appealing for public cooperation until the works are completed, Sajjanar urged motorists to strictly follow the Hyderabad Traffic Police guidelines and traffic regulations.

MMC chief prods officials to resolve public woes in a time-bound manner

MALKAJGIRI Municipal Corporation Commissioner T Vinay Krishna Reddy on Thursday issued clear instructions to the officers of various departments to take coordinated steps to resolve public issues within a time-bound manner during his visit to New Sri Sainagar Colony under Boduppal Circle.

He reviewed various civic and infrastructure issues received from the representatives of Sri Sai Nagar Welfare Association and locals. The Commissioner instructed the officers to immediately start the SNDP development works approved by the Standing Committee earlier. If the contractor fails to start the work, it is suggested that the necessary proposals for re-tendering should be submitted as per the rules.

The authorities have been instructed to issue notices

to relocate the transformers on the road behind Anutex Commercial Complex to the premises of the respective property owners wherever possible and coordinate with the relevant departments.

The Commissioner has ordered the town planning authorities to take action against those who are using the cellar parking spaces in commercial buildings for other commercial activities.

The Commissioner has also directed that narrow roads in the colony be identified and steps be taken for road widening work in the necessary areas. It is suggested that a plan be prepared to reduce traffic congestion and provide better transportation facilities to the people.

The officials were instructed to bring the complaints received regarding drinking water pipeline leakages to the attention of HMWSSB officials and coordinate to resolve the

issues expeditiously.

Noticing that several commercial establishments in the colony had not renewed their trade licences, the Commissioner issued notices to all the shop owners and directed the officials to take steps to ensure that the licenses are renewed by this week.

The officials were instructed to identify the unauthorised structures built encroaching on the parking area near Akshara School and issue notices to the owners concerned to remove them. The Commissioner ordered that mosquito control measures be intensified. It was suggested that continuous fogging should be carried out in all colonies and sufficient diesel, staff and other requirements should be provided to ensure that two fogging autos are fully available. It was directed that fogging vehicles should be used systematically in areas and cover all colonies.

10.89 tonnes of adulterated spices seized, two held

THE Malkajgiri Special Operations Team (SOT) and Food Adulteration Surveillance teams conducted a raid on a spices manufacturing unit at Srinivas Nagar Colony under the Medipally police station limits on Thursday and seized 10.89 tonnes of adulterated spices worth Rs 25 lakh. The teams raided Sai Tirumala Enterprises and took two persons, Sathanarayana and Rudrashekar, into custody. The seized material was handed over to the Medipally police for further action.

According to the police, turmeric, chilli and coriander powders, along with garam masala, were being manufactured and packaged under unhygienic conditions without adhering to prescribed food safety and quality standards.

Police confiscated 2,300 kg of turmeric powder, 3,350 kg of chilli powder, 5,140 kg of coriander powder and 100 kg of garam

masala. The teams also inspected the raw materials used for production and packaging, processed powders, packaging materials and machinery.

Chilli powder was found to contain 30 per cent dust, while counterfeit packaging and labels were allegedly being used to mimic genuine brands. Police said substandard food products were being attractively packaged and supplied to the market.

Malkajgiri Police Commissioner B Sumati took a serious view of adulterated food items being brought to the market by exploiting consumer trust and warned of strict action against the perpetrators.

Citizens can also provide information on suspicious activities related to adulterated food items to the number 8712662111. Police urged people to buy products only after verifying essential details such as brand name, manufacturing date, expiry or best-before date, batch number, and Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) details.
