BRS stages massive protest against HC stay on schemes

Demands continuation of the schemes and financial assistance be provided to eligible poor families

BRS leaders and workers staged a massive protest against the Telangana High Court's stay on Kalyana Lakshmi and Shadi Mubarak schemes under which poor families are provided financial assistance on the occasion of their daughters' marriage. The protesters demanded that the State government should continue the scheme for the benefit of destitute families.

Led by former MLA Marri Janardhan Reddy, they staged a road blockade on the Mahabubnagar-Srisailem main road, leading to brief tension in the area.

After the road blockade, BRS leaders and activists attempted to proceed to the RDO office to submit



a memorandum. Police stopped them, resulting in a brief scuffle and pushing between the police and BRS workers.

The BRS leaders demanded that the Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak schemes be continued and that financial assistance be provided to eligible poor families. They later submitted a memorandum with their demands to the officials.



Activist demands action against encroachments on govt lands

HUMAN Rights Protection Organisation Telangana state secretary and social activist Punem Pradeep Kumar on Thursday demanded immediate action against alleged encroachment of government lands, footpaths, drains and water bodies in Bhadrachalam.

Pradeep Kumar staged a one-day hunger protest at Ambedkar Centre, alleging that government lands were being occupied by influential persons for commercial and real estate activities.

He said footpaths along major roads had been encroached upon, forcing pedestrians to walk



on roads, while drainage channels were allegedly occupied and constructions were carried out over them.

He also alleged that a nearly two-acre pond in Shantinagar Colony had recently been filled with soil for real estate activity. Gondwana Welfare Parishad president Sonde

Veeraiah and other activists demanded protection of government lands and strict enforcement of agency laws.

They urged the district administration to recover encroached lands and warned of a larger agitation if immediate action was not taken.

NEW AADHAAR CENTRE OPENS IN NALGONDA

A new Aadhaar Seva Kendra (ASK) was inaugurated at Padma Nagar on Hyderabad Road, in Nalgonda district headquarters on Thursday. The centre, established under the supervision of the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI), is aimed at providing Aadhaar enrolment, correction and update services closer to people in the district.

Minister for Roads and Buildings Komatireddy Venkat Reddy inaugurated the centre and said Aadhaar has become an essential identity document for citizens. He stressed the need to make Aadhaar-related services easily accessible to the public.

The Minister said the Nalgonda facility was the fifth Aadhaar Seva Kendra in Telangana and would benefit residents of Nalgonda Municipal Corporation and surrounding areas. The centre is expected to reduce the need for people to travel



to Hyderabad for Aadhaar-related services, saving them time, travel expenses and inconvenience. The centre will

also function on Sundays, providing greater convenience to people who cannot visit on regular working days.

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Collector orders extensive construction of farm ponds

DISTRICT Collector Adarsh Surabhi directed that farm pond construction be undertaken extensively across the district, noting that these ponds help harvest rainwater, replenish groundwater, and ensure water availability for agricultural needs.

The Collector, accompanied by Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Khimya Naik, inspected farm pond construction works being carried out under the Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGN-REGS) in Goplapur village, Panagal mandal on Thursday.

He interacted with Pallavi, a farmer who was having a farm pond constructed, and inquired about the details of the

work. The farmer informed that she was building a farm pond covering an area of two guntas on her two-acre land. She explained that the farm pond would allow rainwater storage, groundwater replenishment, borewell recharging, and water usage for agricultural purposes.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector instructed officials to identify farmers interested in farm pond construction and take steps to build more of them. He suggested holding meetings with members of women's groups to create awareness about the benefits of farm ponds. He also directed the Additional Collector to complete the district's assigned target for farm pond construction within the stipulated timeframe.

Minister Jupally inspects D-8 Canal

TOURISM and Culture Minister Jupally Krishna Rao inspected the D-8 Canal constructed as part of the Kalwakurthy Lift Irrigation Scheme here on Thursday. He inspected the water flow and condition of the canals from the main canal near Thoodukurthy through Sakalpally, Yedutla,



Gopalpet, Remaddula, Singayapally, Turakapally and Gopulapuram. The Minister enquired with Irrigation department officials about the water being released into canals and distributaries

and the status of the ayacut. He also reviewed whether irrigation water was reaching the tail-end lands of the ayacut.

In view of the El Niño effect, Minister Jupally urged farmers and officials to conserve every drop of water and avoid wastage. He directed officials to use the available water judiciously and ensure irrigation facilities reach a larger extent of farmland. He

instructed Irrigation officials to continuously monitor water releases, flow levels and the ayacut situation. He stressed the need for strict measures to prevent water wastage and ensure adequate supply to the tail-end areas.

Wanaparthi District Library Chairman Govardhan, former Kodair MPP Ramamohan Rao, Irrigation Department officials and others accompanied the Minister.

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
