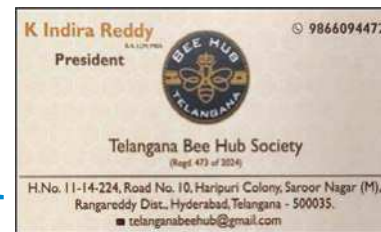

From Honeybees to Rural Prosperity: Telangana Bee Hub Society's Mission to Transform Beekeeping into a Sustainable Business

Hyderabad — What began as a small initiative in 2021 has grown into a full-fledged movement to promote scientific beekeeping, pure natural honey, and sustainable rural livelihoods. At the heart of this movement is the **Telangana Bee Hub Society**, led by its Director, **Indira Reddy**, who has emerged as one of the strongest voices in Telangana's apiculture sector — building bridges between farmers, entrepreneurs, consumers, and honeybees.

A Society Built Around the Bee

The Telangana Bee Hub Society was founded on a simple but powerful idea: that a single bee colony can do far more than produce honey — it can generate income, restore ecological balance, and create employment across rural Telangana. Under Indira Reddy's leadership, the Society works at the intersection of agriculture,

entrepreneurship, and environmental stewardship, positioning apiculture as a viable, scalable business model for farmers and unemployed youth alike.

Through its associated venture, **RUTIKA Innovations**, the Society has translated this vision into structured training programmes, commercial pollination services, and a growing line of bee-based products — all rooted in scientific, sustainable methods.

Director Indira Reddy: From Training to Transformation

Indira Reddy entered beekeeping with a clear objective — to help farmers earn more while making pure, natural honey accessible to consumers. She strengthened her technical foundation through advanced training associated with the **Central Bee Research and Training Institute (CBRTI), Pune**, before dedicating herself to sharing that knowledge across Telangana.

Her approach goes well beyond selling honey jars.

She believes the real value of a bee colony lies in the entire ecosystem it supports — honey, pollination, pollen, wax, royal jelly, and venom — and has built Society's programmes around unlocking that full value for rural communities.

Her contributions have been formally recognised with the **Best Social Entrepreneur Award from MSME**, acknowledging her work in social entrepreneurship and rural empowerment.



Training That Reaches Beyond the Farm: CRPF, Prisons, FPOs and SHGs

What sets the Telangana Bee Hub Society apart is the breadth of communities it trains. Under Indira Reddy's guidance, apiculture awareness and hands-on training programmes have been conducted for:

- **Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel**, introducing beekeeping as a skill for post-service livelihood and rehabilitation
- **Prison inmates**, as part of correctional and vocational rehabilitation programmes that equip individuals with a dignified, income-generating skill for life after release
- **Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs)**, helping farmer collectives diversify income through structured, group-based beekeeping models
- **Self-Help Groups (SHGs)**, particularly among women and tribal communities, opening a low-investment, high-impact route

to self-employment. These programmes cover the full beekeeping journey — selecting an apiary location, colony management, seasonal migration, harvesting, honey processing, packaging, marketing, and value addition. The objective is never just awareness; it is to help every participant move from learner to livelihood-earner.

Bees as Agricultural Partners: Pollination and Ecosystem Impact

One of the Society's most significant contributions lies in **commercial pollination services**. Bee colonies are provided to seed companies and farmers cultivating crops such as pomegranate, mustard, onion, and vegetables — crops whose yield and quality depend heavily on effective pollination. "A bee colony is not only a source of honey; it is also a natural agricultural partner. When farmers understand the value of pollination, beekeeping becomes a business opportunity as well as a service to agriculture," is the philosophy driving this work.

The Society also practises migratory beekeeping, moving colonies in step with flowering seasons and crops such as ajwain, sunflower, sesame, soapnut, and mustard. This not only produces distinctive, crop-specific natural honey but also strengthens pollination across a wider agricultural landscape — supporting biodiversity, improving crop yields, and reinforcing the ecological role bees play far beyond the hive.

Beyond Honey: The Byproducts That Multiply a Colony's Value

The Telangana Bee Hub Society and **RUTIKA Innovations** actively collect and process a wide range of byproducts from each bee colony, including:

- **Pure natural honey** — crop-specific, traceable, and minimally



processed

- **Bee pollen** — a nutrient-dense supplement gathered from diverse floral sources
- **Beeswax** — used to craft natural soaps, lip balms, lipsticks, and candles
- **Royal jelly** — packaged in small consumer sizes and promoted for its nutritional value
- **Bee venom** — collected for its specialised applications

By developing this full range of products rather than relying on honey alone, the Society has created multiple, layered income streams for the farmers and entrepreneurs it trains — turning a single hive into a small, diversified enterprise.
