

No water for farmers even as Nagarjuna Sagar project briming

WATER levels in the Nagarjuna Sagar reservoir are gradually rising with the inflows reaching the reservoir from the Srisailem Project through power generation.

As of 9 am on Friday, the water level in Nagarjuna Sagar reached 531.70 feet, while the storage stood at 171.4844 TMC. The reservoir is receiving heavy inflows of 55,278 cusecs. At present, the Nagarjuna Sagar crest gates remain closed, and no water is being released through the main power house or the right and left canals. Only 500 cusecs of water is being released through the SLBC (AMRP), with the total out-flow recorded at 500 cusecs.

Meanwhile, confusion continues among farmers in the Nagarjuna Sagar ayacut area over the release of irrigation water. Despite the heavy inflows into the res-

ervoir, officials have so far not given clarity on when irrigation water will be released to crops in the ayacut area, causing concern among farmers. Farmers said the Kharif crop season is currently at a crucial stage and warned that any delay in supplying irrigation water could result in crop losses.

They expressed concern that timely water supply is essential to protect their standing crops. With the reservoir storage steadily increasing,

farmers have urged the government and irrigation authorities to immediately make a clear announcement regarding the release of irrigation water to the Nagarjuna Sagar ayacut.

While the rising water level in Nagarjuna Sagar has brought some relief, farmers remain uncertain about when water will reach their fields. They are anxiously awaiting clarity from the authorities on the irrigation water release.

Nagurjana water for Hyderabad

IRRIGATION Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy on Friday said the Meteorological Department had warned that there might not be adequate rainfall during September and October due to the impact of El Nino. He said the water available in Nagarjuna Sagar may

have to be conserved and used for Hyderabad's drinking water requirements through the coming summer. Therefore, the available water must be used cautiously, giving equal importance to both agricultural and drinking water needs, he clarified.



Release Nagarjuna Sagar water to farmers immediately: Jagadish

FORMER minister and Suryapet MLA G Jagadish Reddy accused the Congress government of failing to protect Telangana's water interests and alleged that Andhra Pradesh was diverting Krishna water through Pothireddypadu.

Addressing a press conference in Nalgonda, Jagadish Reddy alleged that the district ministers, N. Uttam Kumar Reddy and Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, had remained silent while water was being diverted from Srisailem. He claimed that the diversion was adversely affecting agriculture in the Nagarjuna Sagar ayacut. Jagadish Reddy said the water level in the Nagarjuna Sagar reservoir currently at around 532 feet and argued that irrigation water could be released to the left canal and lift irrigation schemes. He claimed around 30 TMC of water was available in the reservoir and questioned why the government was de-



laying the release. Recalling the previous BRS government, he claimed that irrigation water had been supplied to the Nagarjuna Sagar ayacut on 17 consecutive occasions, even when the reservoir had much lower water levels. He also alleged that water was being diverted through Pothireddypadu to fill projects in Rayalaseema.

The BRS leader claimed that around 148 TMC of water had been diverted through Pothireddypadu and alleged that water which should have reached Nagarjuna Sagar was being divert-

ed elsewhere.

He criticised the government for conducting a yagam instead of taking concrete measures to provide irrigation water to farmers. He demanded immediate water release to the left canal and lift irrigation schemes.

Jagadish Reddy warned that the BRS would launch a major agitation if the government failed to respond. He said the party would discuss the issue with K Chandrashekar Rao and formulate an action plan to fight for the farmers' irrigation rights.

Kunamneni urges youth to fight for social justice

KOTHAGUDEM MLA and CPI state secretary Kunamneni Sambasiva Rao on Friday called upon young people to actively participate in social struggles and work towards building an exploitation-free society.

Addressing the 25th district conference of the All India Youth Federation (AIYF) here on Friday, Kunamneni said people must come forward to fight for their rights.

Referring to recent mobilisations by Gen Z, he said young people demonstrated that they were willing to come out and raise their voice when situations demanded. "Patriotism does not mean merely carrying sticks and moving around," Kunamneni said, stressing that it should be reflected through commitment to society and standing up against injustice.

He said life should not be restricted to being born, growing up, getting married and eventually dying, but should have a broader social purpose.

Referring to freedom fighter Alluri Sitarama Raju, the MLA said having a fam-



ily did not prevent an individual from fighting for society.

Kunamneni also spoke about the evolution of the Left movement and said the CPI had played a foundational role in the development of various Left parties. He described the CPI as being like a "mother" to the different red parties.

He criticised attempts to attach caste identities to members of revolutionary movements and said people from different social backgrounds had participated in struggles associated with the Left movement.

Advocating socialism, Kunamneni said it was the only ideology capable of guiding humanity towards a society free from exploitation.

The MLA also urged youth to maintain good

health and physical fitness. He said consuming pan and gutka or harassing women should not be regarded as signs of heroism.

"Young people should be healthy and physically fit," he said, calling upon them to channel their energy towards constructive activities and social responsibility.

Recalling Khammam's history as a stronghold of the Communist movement, Kunamneni said the district had once been known as a "Communist fortress" and asserted that the Communist movement continued to retain its presence in the region.

He urged young activists to understand the history of social struggles and work towards equality, social justice and an exploitation-free society.

Expedite land acquisition for irrigation projects: Collector Khushbu Gupta

DISTRICT Collector Khushbu Gupta directed engineering and revenue officials to expedite pending land acquisition, compensation payments to displaced families and rehabilitation processes related to irrigation projects in the district.

On Friday, Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy reviewed the progress of irrigation projects with all district Collectors through a video conference from Hyderabad. Collector Khushbu Gupta participated in the meeting from her camp office in Mahabubnagar.

After the video conference, the Collector directed district officials to speed up pending land acquisition,



compensation payments and rehabilitation works. She instructed officials to identify issues related to land acquisition at the field level, interact with farmers and resolve their grievances at the earliest.

During the video conference, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy stressed the need to complete pending land acquisition works for timely completion of irrigation projects.

He directed officials to ex-

pedite land acquisition and rehabilitation works to facilitate the creation of new ayacut areas. As funds required for land acquisition are available, there should be no delay in completing the process, he said, directing Collectors to ensure that project works face no hurdles.

Revenue Additional Collector J.L.B. HariPriya, Special Deputy Collector for Land Acquisition Ram Reddy and other concerned officials attended the meeting.

Principal's murder: Private school teachers concerned about their safety

PROTESTING the killing of a school principal in neighbouring Nalgonda district and demanding stronger measures to ensure the safety of educators, private school managements and teachers took out a rally in the city on Friday.

The rally was organised by the Khammam district unit of the Telangana Recognised Private Schools Management Association (TRESMA) in protest against the murder of Roopa Reddy, principal of Nagarjuna Public School in Nalgonda district recently.

FEMA convenor Muvva Srinivasa Rao flagged off the rally participated by a large number of school management representatives and teachers. The participants condemned the killing and expressed concern over what they described as growing threats to teachers and educational institutions. They said teachers play a crucial role in shaping students and producing skilled human resources for various sectors of society, and that attacks on them could have serious implications for the education system. The school managements urged the Centre and the state government to formulate a concrete action plan to ensure the safety and security of teachers,



principals and other staff working in educational institutions.

"If such incidents continue, teachers and school managements will find it increasingly difficult to continue in the profession," the participants said, stressing the need for effective preventive measures and strict action against those attacking educators.

They also warned that continued insecurity in educational institutions could adversely affect the functioning of the education sector and called for a comprehensive mechanism to protect teachers and school managements.

Khammam TRESMA president Gurram Kantha Rao, secretary Naidu Venkateswara Rao and treasurer Yelishetti Nasaraiyah were among those who participated in the rally.
