

Govt's goal is comprehensive development of villages: Ponnam

Holds review meeting with officials and public representatives regarding village development and implementation of welfare schemes

TRANSPORT and BC Welfare Minister Ponnam Prabhakar stated that the government is moving forward with the objective of achieving the comprehensive development of villages.

He explained that the "Palle Palleku Ponnanna Anna - Palle Pallo Praja Palana" (Ponnanna Anna to every village - People's Governance in Every Village) programme aims to directly understand the issues faced by villagers and initiate measures to resolve them in the presence of officials.

The Minister visited Veerlagadda Thanda in Bheemavarapalli mandal. At the Gram Panchayat office, he held a review meeting with officials and public representatives regarding village development and the



implementation of welfare schemes. He received representations from villagers concerning various issues and directed the concerned officials to take immediate action to resolve them.

Officials briefed the Minister on the welfare and development programmes being implemented in the village since the formation of the "Praja Palana" programme. The Minister also distributed smart cards—a flagship initiative of the government—to the beneficiaries.

When villagers requested the reopening of the closed government school in the village, the Minister assured them that steps would be taken to restart it by providing all necessary infrastructure to facilitate student admissions for the upcoming academic year. The villagers also brought issues regarding internal village roads, distributary canals of the Gauravelli project, and 'Indiramma' housing schemes to the Minister's attention.

He directed the concerned officials to discuss these issues and take measures to resolve them.

The Minister remarked that every village faces certain challenges and noted that people and local public

representatives offer suggestions and submit representations with the aim of further developing their villages. He added that village-level issues are being identified and documented in the presence of officials, with measures being taken to resolve them in a phased manner. He explained that, alongside assessing the reach of government welfare and development programmes, they are formulating development plans based on public suggestions regarding necessary infrastructure. Given the current low rainfall, the Minister advised everyone to harvest every drop of rainwater to replenish groundwater levels. He emphasised that abundant groundwater is essential for improving agriculture and crop yields. He urged farmers to focus on crop diversification suited to local conditions, suggesting that cultivating alternative crops—particularly oil palm—on a portion of their land could yield better long-term income.

The Minister commended Lavudya Mangya, who is engaged in oil palm cultivation. Officials were directed to create awareness among farmers regarding the benefits of oil palm cultivation and the assistance provided by the government.

Instructions were issued to ensure that government welfare schemes reach every eligible individual. Officials noted that the pension application process would continue until the 31st of this month and were directed to widely publicize the government welfare and health services available to the public. Officials were directed to create awareness among the public about this scheme.

My target is Revanth, not Cong party, says Susmitha

WHILE Endowments Minister Konda Surekha in the eye of storm and demands are being made to remove her from the State Cabinet for her daughter's remarks against Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, Konda Susmitha appears to be unperturbed.

On Friday she clarified that her political criticisms are aimed at Revanth Reddy and not the Congress party. Sushmita said she respects Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi and Sonia Gandhi but accused Revanth Reddy and his brothers of corruption and irregularities. "My target is Revanth Reddy, not the Congress party," she said, adding that she questions only the Chief Minister's style of functioning.

She also raised objections to Revanth Reddy's apparent unilateral authority in party affairs, asking who gave him the power to announce MLA candidates. Sushmita said she objects to decisions taken single-handedly in party matters.

Sushmita further declared she is prepared to contest as an independent if necessary, and added she will not hesitate to take any step



required to serve the people and pursue her political goals.

Her remarks have become a talking point in Warangal politics, particularly because she stressed that she has no differences with the Congress party itself and that her criticisms are directed solely at the chief minister's conduct.

Aadhaar services resume at head post office

BJP seeks removal of properties from 22-A list

THE BJP district unit has urged the authorities to remove houses and plots belonging to poor families in Rekurthi, Vidyanagar and other parts of Karimnagar district from the 22-A prohibited list.

A delegation led by BJP district president Saini Mallesham submitted a representation to District Revenue Officer J Swamy at the Collectorate on Friday. Deputy Mayor Yadagiri Sunil Rao, Mayur Kolagani Srinivas, Parliament constituency convenor Boyinapalli Praveen Rao, corporators and other leaders were present. Speaking on the occasion, Sunil Rao alleged that several properties were included in the prohibited list



without prior notice to owners. Many poor families had purchased private plots with their savings and had been living there for decades. The restrictions had left residents unable to register or sell their properties when required, causing financial hardship, he alleged. He demanded immediate removal of eligible properties from the 22-A list and action against officials responsible for the alleged lapses.

Sunil Rao urged the district administration to resolve the issue at the earliest, warning that the BJP would launch a large-scale agitation if the grievances of affected families were not addressed.

On Friday, Tirupati went to the panchayat office with the money. The secretary instructed him not to hand over cash but to transfer the amount via PhonePe to a friend's account. The complainant

then alerted ACB officials. Under the supervision of ACB DSP Madhu, a well planned operation was carried out. Once the Rs 13,000

transaction was completed, officials took Varalakshmi into custody and registered a case, DSP Madhu confirmed.

TRSMA demands protection for private school teachers

DEMANDING robust government protection for private school teachers, representatives of the



Telangana Recognised Schools Managements Association (TRSMA) conducted a massive protest rally in Bodhan on Friday. Over a thousand private

school teachers marched through the town's streets, raising slogans of "Roopa Reddy Amar Rahe" to protest the brutal murder of Principal Roopa Reddy in

Nalgonda. Expressing deep outrage over the incident, the protesters highlighted the growing vulnerabilities faced by teaching staff in private institutions and urged the state government to initiate immediate safety measures to secure their workplace environment.

Following the demonstration, the union

leaders submitted a formal representation to the Bodhan Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO), demanding exemplary punishment for those responsible for Principal Roopa Reddy's killing to deter future occurrences.
