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ED raids K'taka PWD Minister Satish Jarkiholi

BENGALURU: The Enforcement Directorate on Wednesday searched Karnataka PWD minister Satish Jarkiholi, his MP daughter Priyanka Jarkiholi and some others as part of an investigation, officials said. They said about 18 premises in the state are being searched, including those belonging to the 64-year-old minister in the Dollars Colony area of the city, his MP daughter Priyanka Jarkiholi and brother-in-law Y D Manjunath in Belagavi. A contingent of the CRPF provided security to the search teams. Priyanka, 29, represents the Chikkodi Lok Sabha seat. There was no immediate comment from Jarkiholis or the Congress party on the ED action.

Man beaten to death on suspicion of cow theft

INDORE: A 35-year-old man was beaten to death here on suspicion of cow theft and the assailants are absconding, police said on Wednesday. The incident took place under the Lasudia police station area, said Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police Amarendra Singh. A man's cow went missing. During the search, it was found with Chander (35). Suraj Jat and three others allegedly assaulted him, accusing him of stealing the animal. Chander was admitted to the Government Maharaja Yashwantrao Hospital in Indore where he died late Tuesday night. A case of murder was registered against Jat, who already has a criminal record, and the others, the official said, adding that probe was on.

SI suspended after man drinks toilet cleaner

MEERUT : A police post in-charge in Meerut has been suspended for alleged negligence after a man brought there for questioning in a motorcycle theft case purportedly drank a chemical substance kept in the premises' toilet, officials said. The incident took place under the Kharkhoda police station area, they said. Kithore Circle Officer Vishvajyoti Rai said Mithun, a resident of Noorpur in Ghaziabad, had been brought to the Dhir Khara police post for questioning in connection with a motorcycle theft case.

THE Supreme Court on Wednesday said it would seek explanation from the Greater Noida executive magistrate for issuing a notice to a student there over his participation in the CJP-led Jantar Mantar protest.

Chief Justice of India (CJI) Surya Kant questioned how the executive magistrate could issue such

a notice when the top court has earlier directed that no penal action would be taken

against students. A lawyer mentioned the matter before a three-judge bench

led by CJI Kant, asserting that "experiment" was being done on students, and that

the notice, which was also revoked subsequently, was contrary to the top court's order. "You are absolutely right. There is no question of taking action against our youth.. We have passed a clear order," the CJI stated. "We are surprised how can the magistrate issue a notice when we have already annulled.. No penal action against any student. It was a clear-cut order," added the CJI. CJI Kant asked the lawyer

to place the facts on record and said, "We will ask for explanation. Let him explain." The bench also comprised Justices Joymalya Bagchi and V Mohana. A student of Gautam Buddha University (GBU), who allegedly participated in a CJP-led protest at Delhi's Jantar Mantar, was served a notice by the Greater Noida Executive Magistrate seeking a personal bond of Rs 5 lakh

for maintaining peace, officials said on Tuesday, adding that the order was later revoked. The student, Akshat Tripathi, however, denied the allegations and claimed that he had participated in the protest peacefully and was not attending university classes at the time. The notice was issued on September 4 under Section 130 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS).

CM orders use of bulldozers against illegal construction

IN a major crackdown by the Delhi government following the Satya Niketan building collapse that claimed seven lives, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Wednesday directed the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) to take strict action against illegal construction, including the use of bulldozers against illegal structures.

The Chief Minister has ordered strict and comprehensive action following the Satya Niketan building collapse incident.

The Chief Minister directed the MCD to carry out demolition action in several areas of Delhi and instructed all senior municipal corporation officials to remain present on the ground during the exercise, as per the CMO.

CM also directed officials to conduct intensive inspections of all paying guest hostels across Delhi and take action against illegal construction found on the premises



Gupta also directed officials to conduct intensive inspections of all paying guest (PG) hostels across Delhi and take action against illegal construction found

on the premises. "Conduct intensive inspections of all PG hostels in Delhi and take action against illegal construction," the Chief Minister said.

She further instructed officials to scrutinise building records to establish when the illegal construction took place and determine under whose jurisdiction it was carried out. "Scrutinise building records--determine exactly when the illegal construction took place and under whose jurisdiction," Gupta said in her directive.

In a post on X, Delhi CMO wrote, "On the instructions of Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, MCD has been directed to demolish the dilapidated building adjoining the accident site in the interest of public safety. The belongings of students inside the building are being safely removed by Delhi Fire Service personnel in a systematic manner. All students and local residents are requested to cooperate with the authorities." --ANI

'AI may kill us all by decade-end'

A 27-year-old AI researcher, Jacob Coxon, walked away from Anthropic after a three-year stint. Not quietly. Not with a bland "pursuing other opportunities" LinkedIn post. He went straight to X and lit a match.

"I resigned from Anthropic today," he wrote. "I spent the last three years doing pretraining research at both OpenAI and Anthropic. Neither company is acting responsibly. They are racing straight to self-improving superintelligence and gambling with our lives. More thoughts below."

That was just the opening line. Coxon didn't stop there. In a thread that quickly went viral, he made a claim that should stop anyone scrolling mid-swipe:

"The people building AI earnestly believe that it could kill us all by the end of the decade. This is



not a marketing stunt. If anything, many executives and senior researchers will couch their phrasing in the press to sound sensible -- but I hear the same people express fear privately. No other human activity poses this level of danger."

He wasn't done. Coxon described what's coming next in blunt terms: "Do

not underestimate the power of this technology. These will soon be superhuman systems that can hack anything, revolutionise any field overnight, and acquire real power and resources. We have all witnessed the progress in each of these domains, and progress is not slowing."

'Hybrid terrorist' arrested as terror module busted

SRINAGAR: Security forces on Wednesday busted a terror module run by an ex-terrorist in Kupwara district of Jammu and Kashmir, police said.

Police in Handwara received reliable information regarding the activities of an ex-terrorist who was operating as a "hybrid terrorist" as part of a module of the banned Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) in the Handwara-Kupwara area, a spokesperson said.

"Hybrid terrorist" refers to an unlisted, radicalised individual who performs a specific subversive or violent task assigned by his handlers and then slips back into normal life.

Acting swiftly on the information, the police spokesperson said, security forces launched an operation at the identified location in Handwara town.

SIR row: 'No notice issued to Bharat Ratna Rao'

BENGALURU: GBA Chief Commissioner M Maheshwar Rao on Wednesday said that no notice was issued to Bharat Ratna awardee Prof C N R Rao in connection with the ongoing SIR of the electoral roll, as appeared in a section of the media.

In a statement, the Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA) said there was a discrepancy in the name of Rao but instead of issuing any notice, the Booth Level Officer recommended including his name.

The GBA said as part of the SIR, Enumeration Forms were respectfully delivered in person to Rao and his family members at their residence by the State SVEEP Nodal Officer, along with the Commissioner of the Bengaluru West City Corporation. The required



information was also duly filled in.

The GBA said Rao was enrolled as a voter in Part No-129, Serial No-431 of the 76-Malleswaram Assembly Constituency in the electoral roll of 2002. "At that time, his name was recorded as 'Rama'. At present, he is registered as a voter in Part No-59, Serial No-187 of the 157-Malleswaram Assembly Constituency, under the name 'Prof CN Rao M'. Accordingly, his name has also been included in the draft electoral roll," the statement said.

US destroys five Iranian oil tankers

TEXAS: US Central Command (CENTCOM) said that its forces destroyed five Iranian crude oil carriers in the Middle East, noting them as retaliatory strikes after the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) targeted an American Navy warship with ballistic missiles twice over a 48-hour period. According to a statement by CENTCOM, the targeted American warship successfully evaded both attempted missile strikes and suffered no personnel injuries or operational damage, remaining on active patrol in regional waters. "U.S. Central Command (CENTCOM) forces destroyed five Iranian crude oil carriers, Sept. 8, after the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) targeted a U.S. Navy warship with ballistic missiles twice over the past two days. The U.S. warship successfully evaded the attempted Iranian attacks and continued to patrol regional waters.

Cabinet approves 3 Rly projects covering 14 dists

THE Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Wednesday approved three Railway Ministry projects with a total cost of Rs 10,783 crore.

These projects include construction of the fourth line between Kharagpur-Jharsuguda and Katni-Pendra Road section as well as the third line between Bilaspur (Uslapur)-Pendra Road section.

"The increased line capacity will significantly enhance mobility, resulting in improved operational efficiency and service reliability for Indian Railways. These multi-tracking proposals are poised to streamline operations and alleviate

congestion," a press note said.

"The projects are planned on PM-Gati Shakti National Master Plan with focus on enhancing multi-modal connectivity and logistic efficiency through integrated planning and stakeholder consultations. These projects will provide seamless connectivity for movement of people, goods, and services," it added.

The three projects covering 14 districts across the states of West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, will increase the existing network of Indian Railways by about 656 kms.



SC: Exempt Std 6 this year from 3-language policy

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Wednesday asked the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) to consider exempting Class 6 students from its three-language policy for this academic year.

A three-judge bench led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Surya Kant, while deferring the hearing on a batch of pleas challenging the CBSE's three-language policy to September 17, asked the Board to look into the possibility of accommodating the students of Class 6 in the ongoing academic session.

BJP's 'Seva' drive to mark Modi's 25 yrs in public office

THE BJP on Wednesday announced a month-long nationwide 'Seva Sankalp Abhiyan' to mark Prime Minister Narendra Modi completing 25 years in constitutional public office, combining social-service activities with programmes highlighting his governance journey.

BJP national president Nitin Nabin said the campaign will run from September 17 to October

BJP to showcase Modi's rise from Gujarat CM to Prime Minister and highlight his governance record; blood donation camps, cleanliness drives, exhibitions, seminars and welfare awareness programmes planned

17, covering Modi's 76th birthday on September 17 and the 25th anniversary of his taking oath as Gujarat Chief Minister on October 7, 2001. Nabin said Modi served

Gujarat for nearly 13 years before becoming Prime Minister in 2014. Describing his journey from an ordinary BJP worker to the country's "Pradhan Sevak", he said the past 25 years had been



guided by public service.

The BJP will use the campaign to highlight what it describes as India's transformation under Modi,

including economic growth, the startup ecosystem, women-led development, youth empowerment and development of border

villages. Nabin also cited initiatives such as Khelo India, Fit India, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, Lakhpati Didi and the Nari Shakti Vandan Act. He claimed around 25 crore people have emerged from poverty during Modi's tenure and highlighted free ration and medicines during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The campaign will begin on Modi's birthday with blood donation camps and an 'Aashirwad Ka Diya' programme. A nationwide cleanliness drive will be held on October 2. Photo and

digital exhibitions chronicling Modi's 25-year political journey will be organised, along with seminars on good governance, development and Antyodaya. Special camps will spread awareness about Central and state welfare schemes. BJP national general secretary Vinod Tawde has been appointed national convener. Seven-member teams, comprising a minister, an organisational general secretary and five senior leaders, will coordinate the campaign in each state.

Oxygen cylinder blast in Okhla leaves one dead, 4 injured

ONE person was killed and four others injured after an oxygen cylinder exploded while it was being unloaded from a truck at a commercial godown in southeast Delhi's Okhla Phase-I on Wednesday, police said.

The deceased was identified as Mohit Singh (35), a helper working with a company which operates from Okhla Phase-I. He was a resident of Jaipur and had re-

portedly been working with the firm for around three years, police said.

The injured were identified as Umesh, Arvind, Manoj and Pankaj. They were immediately rushed to the AIIMS Trauma Centre for treatment.

According to officials, a PCR call regarding the blast was received at around 10:45 am, following which police and fire department teams reached the spot and secured the area. Three water tenders and a multi-casualty first responder vehicle were also

rushed to the site following information about the blast.

Preliminary police inquiry found that the labourers were working for a firm engaged in trading and local distribution of industrial oxygen cylinders, which were intended for medical purposes and



gas-cutting work.

The firm's manager, in a statement, said the vehicle carrying the cylinders had arrived at the premises in the morning as part of the firm's routine operations. The workers were in the process of unloading the cylinders and shifting them inside the godown when one of the cylinders fell from the vehicle onto the road.

"An immediate explosion followed. Preliminary inquiry suggests that only one cylinder exploded. The exact

technical cause of the blast has not yet been established. The scene, the cylinder, the vehicle and other relevant material will be examined by technical and forensic agencies to determine the precise cause of the explosion," the officer said.

"The blast was so intense that a ringing sound continued in our ears for some time," he said.

The blast was powerful enough to shatter glass windows of nearby buildings, according to eyewitnesses.

Jal Board STP case: Court grants bail to four accused

THE Rouse Avenue Court in Delhi on Wednesday has granted bail to four accused in the alleged Delhi Jal Board sewage treatment plant (STP) scam, bringing relief to former board officials and private contractors facing corruption allegations in the case.

Special Judge Digvinay Singh ordered the release on bail of former Delhi Jal Board CEO Udit Prakash Rai, former contractual consultant Ankita Srivastava, AN Enterprises owner Nagendra Yadav and Srijanhar owner Pankaj Verma. Former Delhi minister

Satyendar Jain, who is also an accused in the case, had earlier been granted bail by the court.

Jain and the other accused were arrested on August 18 in connection with the case. Challenging Jain's arrest, senior advocate Maninder Singh had argued that the arrest was unlawful because the reasons for taking him into custody were allegedly not communicated to him at the time.

The defence maintained that this amounted to a violation of the arrest safeguards and guidelines laid down by the Supreme Court.

The Anti-Corruption Branch had arrested Jain along with several other in-



dividuals in the case.

The list of accused arrested by the agency includes Udit Prakash Rai, former contractual consultant Ankita

Verma, proprietor of Sirjanhar. The latest bail order also comes in the backdrop of Satyendar Jain's earlier legal battle in a separate money-laundering case.

The Enforcement Directorate arrested Jain on May 30, 2022, and he spent 872 days in Tihar Jail in connection with that case.

He was subsequently granted bail by the trial court on October 18, 2024, and walked out of jail.

With four more accused now granted bail in the Delhi Jal Board STP case, the proceedings will continue on the allegations surrounding the tender process and the ACB's claims of corruption and favouritism.

Emergency treatment to EWS patients SC slams hospital for not responding to notice

THE Supreme Court on Wednesday rapped Yatharth Super Speciality Hospital for not responding to a contempt notice issued by it over preparation of a standard operating procedure (SOP) for providing emergency medical care to EWS patients.

A bench of Justices Prashant Kumar Mishra and Shree Chandrashekhara sought reply from the hospital in two weeks.

The top court noted that the hospital in its affidavit stated that it had not been served with any notice to participate.

"This statement is contrary to the office report dated April 2, 2026, which clearly records that notice had been served. The statement made in the reply is, therefore, ex facie false. Accordingly, we draw up formal contempt proceedings against the



said respondent through its Medical Superintendent," the bench said.

During the hearing, the top court was informed by amicus curiae and senior advocate Sanjay Jain that only 12 hospitals have participated in the meeting out of 52.

He informed the apex court that a revised standard operating procedure (SOP) has been filed as per the court's direction.

"It is stated that only 12 hospitals participated in the consultation process. Senior

counsel appearing on behalf of several hospitals submit that they wish to file their responses and suggestions to the revised SOP," the bench said while posting the matter for hearing on September 30.

The top court was hearing a plea related to its 2018 judgment which held that hospitals which received land at concessional rates must provide free treatment to EWS patients, to the extent of 10 per cent at in-patient departments and 25 per cent at out-patient departments.

Dariyapur gang member arrested

AN alleged member of the Sonu Dariyapur gang was arrested with an illegal country-made pistol, leading to the busting of an arms manufacturing unit in Uttar Pradesh's Aligarh, Delhi Police said on Wednesday.

The accused, Anurag alias Hunny (22), was apprehended on September 2 following a tip-off that he would arrive in Narela by road carrying an illegal weapon, they said.

A country-made pistol was recovered from his possession, following which a case was registered at Narela Industrial Area police station. Subsequently, he was arrested.

During interrogation, Anurag disclosed that he had procured the weapon from an illegal arms supplier operating from Talaspur Khurd in Aligarh. Based on the disclosure, a police team conducted a raid at a house in Talaspur Khurd, where an illegal arms manufacturing setup was allegedly found



on the rooftop. Seven additional country-made pistols and 20 live rounds of 8 mm calibre were recovered from the premises, the police said. Six of the seven pistols were found in semi-finished condition, indicating that illegal manufacturing of firearms was underway at the site. With the recovery of the weapon from Anurag, the total seizure includes eight country-made pistols and 20 live rounds. Anurag, a resident of Jain Colony near Barwala in Delhi, has two previous involvements. Further investigation is underway.

HC SEEKS REPLY ON DU HOSTEL PIL

THE Delhi High Court on Wednesday issued notice and sought responses from the Union Government, Delhi Government and Delhi University on a public interest litigation seeking adequate hostel facilities for students across colleges run by or affiliated with the University of Delhi.

The PIL has been filed in the backdrop of the recent Satya Ni-

ketan building collapse near Delhi University's South Campus, where a five-storeyed building being used as a paying guest accommodation collapsed, resulting in the deaths of several college students and injuries to others.

A Division Bench comprising Chief Justice D K Upadhyaya and Justice Tejas Karia sought the response of the authorities on the plea filed by Vinod Jakhar. Advocate Vimal Tyagi appeared for the petitioner.



The Court, however, questioned the inclusion of the University Grants Commission as a respondent in the petition and directed that the UGC be deleted from the array of parties.

Observing that a public interest litigation was a "very serious business", the Bench directed the petitioner's counsel to file an amended memo of parties within one week.

The matter will now be heard on September 25, when another PIL concerning the Satya Niketan building collapse incident is also listed before the High Court.

2 shooters injured in Rohini gunfight

TWO alleged shooters linked to gangster Himanshu Bhau's gang were injured in a gunfight with Delhi Police in Rohini, while three suspects, including a juvenile, were apprehended on Tuesday night, police sources said.

The sources said that the accused were allegedly involved in the murder of a property dealer named Pramod in Narela when he was going to gym.

The encounter took place when a team of the Rohini

district police's Special Staff intercepted the suspects in connection with the murder, they said.

According to sources, over 10 bullet rounds were fired from both sides during the exchange of fire.

"The two accused, identified as Deepak Pahalan and Nitik, sustained bullet injuries in their legs and were taken to a hospital for treatment. A juvenile allegedly associated with the gang was also apprehended," the source told PTI.

Police said the killing was suspected to have been car-

ried out after the victim allegedly failed to pay an extortion demand. Following the murder, police teams were working to trace the suspects.

Acting on specific information about their whereabouts, the Special Staff team laid a trap in Rohini, the source said.

When the suspects allegedly opened fire at the police team, the personnel retaliated, resulting in the encounter. Further investigation is underway to establish the motive and identify others involved in the murder and its alleged links to Bhau.

Bizman's home burgled of valuables worth crores

NEW DELHI: A businessman's residence in north Delhi's Timarpur was allegedly burgled of cash, gold and diamond jewellery worth crores while he was in Australia with his family, police sources said. Two domestic helps, who allegedly had keys to the house, are under the scanner and have been untraceable since the incident, they said.

The incident came to light when the businessman's nephew reached the first-floor residence on Mall Road and found its doors open, the source said. "On entering the premises, he found the rooms in disarray and cupboards open. Cash and valuables kept inside the cupboards were missing, following which police were informed," the source said. The businessman had left for Australia with his family on September 2. His younger brother lives in another portion of the same flat, they added.

Another PG landlord held, building repairs probed

A PG operator has been arrested in connection with the collapse of a five-storey building in Delhi's Satya Niketan that left seven people dead, as police are probing the role of the leaseholders of the building on lease and the construction and repair work carried out there, sources said on Wednesday.

Sudhanshu, one of the two business partners running the 'Hostel Daze' PG, was arrested during the investigation and is being questioned by police, sources said. Police sources said the building owner Mahesh had leased the property to Sudhanshu and his business partner Shubham Tyagi in August 2025. The duo subsequently started operating the premises as a paying guest accommodation under the name 'Hostel Daze'.

Tyagi is currently absconding and efforts are underway to trace him, the sources said. A labour contractor, Sanoj, has already been apprehended in connection with the case. He is being brought from Kasganj in Uttar Pradesh to Delhi for questioning over the construction and repair work carried out at the building. The development comes as investigators scrutinise the rent agreement under which the PG was being operated. According to a police source, the agreement stated that the PG operators would not be responsible for any "casualties or risk" to tenants.

16 killed in 5 building collapses in Delhi this year

THE five-storey building that collapsed in Satya Niketan is the fifth in the city this year, the seven people killed in the congested colony near Delhi's University's South Campus taking to 16 the number of those who lost their lives in the tragedies.

According to official figures and police statements, the 16 deaths have come from three incidents - six in

Saket in May, three in Rohini in July and seven in the latest incident on September 6.

The underlying factors leading to the collapse of all the buildings are common, said officials. These include unregulated and unauthorised construction, additional floors, ageing structures and a lack of structural assessments. Add to the list inadequate precautions during repair work and monsoon-related water damage to foundations, walls and base-

ments and the picture of negligence is complete.

On May 30, a multi-storey commercial building housing a coaching centre, cafes and offices in south Delhi's

Saket area crumbled like a house of cards. Like in Satya Niketan, most of the six killed were students. Eight people were injured.

A magisterial inquiry

ordered by the Delhi government later held the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) "primarily responsible" for the collapse.

It found that illegal third



and fourth floors had been added to the building and that the civic body failed to act on a complaint about the unauthorised construction received more than two months earlier.

The inquiry also found that MCD officials created "fabricated" records after the collapse to suggest they had already taken action.

The MCD suspended two engineers, while police arrested the building owner and two contractors.

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Iran conflict escalates; India must respond appropriately

IF there is one region that is perennially in turmoil, it is the Middle East. A cocktail of factors—religious conflicts, disputes between superpowers, and, of course, oil—keeps it in the news all the time. After a full of a few weeks, with Washington focusing on economic strangulation rather than kinetic action, the region has heated up again, as the US military struck five Iranian oil tankers on Tuesday. This happened, according to the US Central Command (CENTCOM), “after the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) targeted a US Navy warship with ballistic missiles twice over the past two days.” The US warship successfully evaded the attempted Iranian attacks and continued to patrol regional waters. No American personnel were harmed, it added.

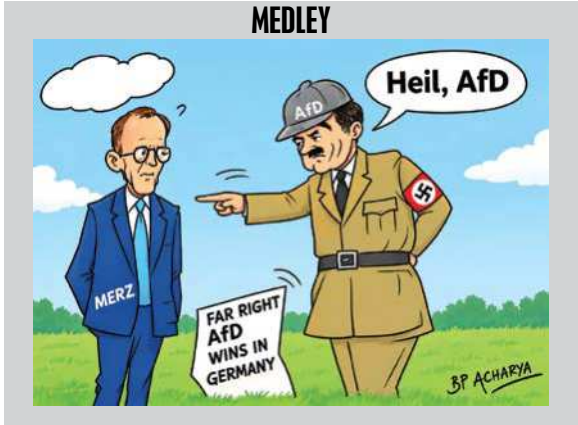
There is also a report of Iran firing about 20 ballistic missiles towards Jordan, targeting two US military bases. Meanwhile, the pro-Tehran Houthis in Yemen have also launched ballistic missiles toward Israel. They also launched a wave of attacks on Saudi Arabia on Tuesday, wounding over 70 people and igniting fires at oil facilities and utilities in the kingdom.

Tensions seem to be escalating. It looks like conflict will stay that way for some time. The reason is that US President Donald Trump is unwilling to fight the war all-out, with American troops on the ground. This is in tune with his opposition to the ‘forever wars’ that the US has fought many a time. His core base, the MAGA crowd,

hates America’s wars in faraway lands, gobbling up resources and killing young soldiers. Besides, his party, the Republican Party, must face midterm elections soon. At the same time, Trump doesn’t want to let Iran off the hook. Hence the blow-hot-and-cold nature of the ongoing war in the Middle East.

The escalation has affected crude prices, which hit a six-week high. Brent futures are touching the \$100 mark. Owing to our heavy dependence on crude imports, the government has changed the composition of its top five suppliers, with Brazil and Venezuela replacing the US and Nigeria. Russia, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) stay the top crude sellers.

The government must chalk out short, middle, and long-term strategies to end or at least curtail the country’s excessive dependence (around 88 per cent) on imported crude. In the short term, the priority should be to diversify sources of supply, build adequate strategic petroleum reserves, and maintain flexibility in purchasing crude from different markets so that geopolitical disruptions do not immediately translate into domestic price shocks. The government should also strengthen bilateral energy partnerships with major oil-producing countries and explore long-term contracts at competitive prices. In the medium run, India needs to accelerate the transition towards cleaner and more efficient sources of energy. Greater

Cabinet decides to reintroduce students’ elections in varsities, colleges

BENGALURU: The Karnataka Cabinet on Wednesday decided to reintroduce students election in the universities and colleges, Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister G Parameshwara said. Political parties will not be allowed to take part in these elections, he said. “Student elections were earlier held in colleges but were subsequently banned. We have now decided to reintroduce elections in universities and colleges,” Parameshwara briefed reporters after the cabinet meeting. He explained that in each college, there will be one student president, two vice-presidents, including one woman, one general secretary, two joint secretaries, including one woman, and an executive committee of six members, including two women. There will be no reservation in these elections as the government does not want to promote caste-based elections among students, the Deputy CM said. The detailed modalities regarding when and how the elections will be held will be decided later, he added.

Parameshwara clarified that the students’ elections are not mandatory for colleges and it can happen only if students want it. “If students don’t want it, they can decide not to have it. The management cannot decide.

ooking is the art, science, and craft of preparing, heating, and combining raw ingredients to make them safe, digestible, and flavoury; a vital life skill that directly impacts our health, saves money, builds self-reliance, and connects us to different cultures.

Culinary art is the professional discipline and creative practice of preparing, cooking, and presenting. Serving food is a creative form of expression.

The practice of preparing safe, tasty and nutritious meals, and the need to consume simple, fresh and healthy food together with seasonal vegetables and fruits, has been connected with spiritual matters in various faiths across the world, including Hinduism, Christianity, Islam and Greek.

And, according to Greek mythology, Prometheus, the Titan, while not a cook himself, stole fire from Mount Olympus and gave it to humanity. By doing so, he taught mortals how to use fire to cook food and transition from raw diets to civilization.

Among the well-known practitioners of the culinary art are Gordon Ramsay and Sanjeev Kapoor.

In the books of the inimitable P G Wodehouse, Anatole is the supremely skilled

French chef, who is described as ‘God’s gift to gastric juices’. Many people are known to be fond of good and tasty food. In that sense, a ‘gourmet’ is one who appreciates high-quality, sophisticated food, drink, or who judges fine culinary experiences. In a similar sense, ‘foodies’ is a person who has an enthusiastic, refined, or passionate interest in food, eating it not just out of hunger, but as a hobby or lifestyle.

This is perhaps why there is the famed saying, “the way to a man’s heart is through his stomach”, meaning that cooking delicious food is a good way to win someone’s love and affection.

Mythologies of various cultures in the world contain references to famous persons who excelled in culinary art. In Mahabharat, Bheema is known to be a great cook. In fact, when the Pandava princes need to remain incognito for a whole year and are forced to seek shelter in the court of King Virata, Bheema chooses to don the guise of a cook. Meanwhile, Nala, who ruled the Nishada Kingdom, is renowned not only for his valour and wisdom, but also his mastery of the culinary arts.

A good, tasty, nutritious, and balanced spread is recommended across cultures. In the western countries, a 7-course meal is a structured fine-dining experience where seven distinct dishes are served sequentially in a specific order to guide and balance the diner’s palate.

Mexican cuisine, on the other hand, is celebrated for the ingredients of corn, fresh chilies, avocados, and is famous for the recognition accorded by UNESCO.

Reservation must reach the last person: Reform, don’t abolish



INDIA needs a more intelligent affirmative-action architecture: preserve protection against discrimination but deliberately widen first access to families and communities still waiting for opportunity. India’s affirmative-action journey predates the Republic. In 1902, Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj of Kolhapur reserved 50 per cent of government posts for backward classes, recognising that formal equality meant little when entire communities lacked access to education, administration and power. After Independence, B R Ambedkar and the Constitution gave this principle a durable democratic framework: equality sometimes requires corrective measures where history has produced structural exclusion.

Reservation is not a poverty scheme:

Reservation should not be confused with poverty alleviation. Its central purpose is social

inclusion, representation and protection against entrenched discrimination. A family may gain education or a government job and still encounter caste identity in workplaces, housing, social networks and marriage. One successful generation therefore cannot automatically be treated as proof that discrimination has disappeared.

Who is still waiting?

At the same time, supporters of reservation must confront an uncomfortable question: are the benefits circulating widely enough within eligible groups? Families that have already acquired education, information and networks can often compete more effectively, while a first-generation student from a deprived family may never reach the starting line. The answer is neither to stigmatise repeat beneficiaries nor to abolish reservation. It is to improve its distribution.

A first-opportunity window:

A pragmatic reform would create a ‘first opportunity’ window within the existing reservation categories. Around 25–35 per cent of opportunities should be prioritised for first-time or first-generation beneficiary families. If adequate candidates are unavailable, those opportunities should flow back to the wider



parent category rather than remain vacant. Previous beneficiaries would not suddenly lose all protection; instead, the system would ensure that a meaningful share reaches families that have never received its benefits.

Apply deprivation measures across categories:

The same logic can travel upward across the opportunity structure. Rural or remote schooling, low family income and assets, parental education, first-generation graduate status and poor access to quality schools can disadvantage candidates even outside caste-reserved categories. These factors should supplement—not replace—caste-based safeguards. A transparent opportunity or deprivation index could operate horizontally across categories, because a wealthy rural household and a poor urban household cannot sensibly be treated as identical simply by geography.

Political representation also needs circulation:

The principle should also inform political representation. Within constitutionally reserved political opportunities, India should debate mechanisms that encourage first-generation political entrants and sections that remain under-represented, rather than allowing representation to become concentrated in a small set of political families or networks. A 25–30 per cent first-opportunity principle deserves serious study here too, although any such mechanism would require careful constitutional and legislative design.

Beyond endless sub-caste fragmentation:

The Supreme Court’s 2024 Davinder Singh decision opened constitutional space for sub-classification within Scheduled Castes (SCs). That can help governments address unequal access, but India should be cau-

tionous about answering every inequality by permanently multiplying caste compartments. Policy should increasingly ask measurable questions: Who has received opportunities? Who remains excluded? Which families are first-generation entrants? Where is representation still weakest? The goal should be circulation of opportunity, not permanent social fragmentation.

Reform is better than ‘reservation hatao’:

The August anti-reservation mobilisation around Jantar Mantar reflects genuine public dissatisfaction, including demands for greater attention to economic disadvantage. Such concerns deserve democratic debate. But abolishing caste-based affirmative action because its benefits may be unevenly distributed would confuse a problem of design with a failure of purpose. The answer to imper-

fect affirmative action is better affirmative action.

Make reservation less necessary:

The ultimate success of reservation should be measured by whether society gradually needs less of it. That requires far more than quota engineering. India must equalise school quality, enforce anti-discrimination norms in employment and housing, weaken caste barriers in marriage and social networks, and reduce unnecessary caste signalling in routine public life—while retaining caste data where needed to measure exclusion and enforce rights. A mature policy should neither romanticise reservation nor demonise its beneficiaries. It should keep opening doors until birth no longer determines opportunity.

made short work of China's Liang Qiurong and Xia Lei, winning 6-0 in straight sets.

India took the opening set 35-31 before winning the second 36-33 and completing the clean sweep with a 34-32 victory in the third.

Bhawna then added another bronze in an all-Indian para recurve women's bronze-medal play-off, defeating compatriot Rajshree Rathod 6-0.

Sheetal returned in the evening session and produced a

composed performance against Kazakhstan's Aizada Seidan in a thrilling compound women's individual final. Both the archers started with perfect 30s and remained locked at 59 after the second end, with both shooting 29. Aizada then edged ahead by a point in the third end after shooting 28 to Sheetal's 27.

The fourth end ended 29-29, before Sheetal produced a 29 in the final end against Aizada's 28 to level the scores at 144-all and force a shoot-off.

BEN Shelton beat defending champion Carlos Alcaraz 6-7(5), 6-1, 6-3, 1-6, 7-6(10-7) in the early hours of Wednesday to reach the U.S. Open semi-finals in the latest-finishing match in tournament history.

Shelton's win sets up a match in the last four with compatriot Frances Tiafoe, boosting home hopes of a first American men's Grand Slam champion since 2003. Seven-times major champion Alcaraz arrived at Arthur Ashe Stadium with a 13-0 Grand Slam record against U.S. men but found Shelton tough to break down in a match that

began at 11.05 p.m. on Tuesday and finished at 3.33 a.m. on Wednesday.

"For me it's always about the people in the crowd," Shelton said in explaining how he got through the gruelling contest.

"Whether it's my coaches and my team there, all my family and friends here, or the city of New York that showed up tonight till 3 a.m. with the USA chants until the very end.

"That's what kept me going, and that's what got me this win tonight. "It's incredible. I always say that this is the greatest sports city in the world. I say that this is the greatest stadium in the world."

Alcaraz clinched a tight first-set tiebreak and looked to have all the momentum but uncharacteristic sloppiness allowed Shelton to breeze through the next set before the American tightened his grip on the quarter-final by taking the third.

ASIAN GAMES: 400 ATHLETES EVACUATED



Hundreds of athletes and officials were briefly evacuated after heavy rain battered Nagoya, but the city's mayor on Wednesday ruled out any disruption to the Asian Games. Torrential rain flooded roads and water entered some of the venues for the multi-sport event, scheduled from September 19 to October 4. Around 400 people, including staff and athletes, had to be evacuated due to the heavy rain, but they later returned and no injuries were reported, an Asian Games official told Reuters.

Nyra youngest Indian to qualify for Nationals

NEW DELHI

DELHI shooter Nyra Sharma, aged just 10 years and three months, has become the youngest Indian to qualify for the National Championship.

Nyra secured her place in 10m air rifle after scoring 363/400 at the recently concluded All India Inter School Shooting Championship in Bhopal. Nyra trains at the TOPGUN Shooting Academy in Delhi and will now prepare for the National Championship, scheduled to be held later this year. Her rise has been remarkably swift. She made her competitive debut at the Delhi State Championship in June, followed by the India Open in July at Dehradun. At only her third competition, she produced the score that earned



her a place at the Nationals.

Speaking about the achievement, Nyra's father, Prashant Sharma, said, "As a father, I feel immense pride and gratitude on seeing Nyra become India's youngest shooter to qualify for the Nationals. This remarkable achievement is the result of her hard work, discipline,

and determination, along with the guidance and support of TOPGUN Shooting Academy."

For a shooter who entered competitive sport only a few months ago, qualifying for the Nationals at just 10 years old marks an exceptional beginning to her competitive career

IOA to probe Lakra's harassment charge

NEW DELHI

THE Indian Olympic Association (IOA) has constituted a four-member independent inquiry committee headed by retired High Court judge Deepa Sharma to probe the allegations of harassment and intimidation levelled against Hockey India secretary Bhola Nath Singh by former women's team captain

Asunta Lakra.

The panel, formed following a directive from the Sports Ministry, includes former track-and-field athlete Vandana Rao, former women's hockey team captain Mamta Kharb, and lawyer Sitwat Nabi as members.

Lakra, who is also a member of Hockey India's Executive Board, had accused Singh of threatening and har-

assing her after she objected to the alleged sexual harassment of girls in Jharkhand at the hands of local coach Sudhir Golla.

Hockey India has been directed to handle all requisite payments concerning the committee's honorarium, travel, accommodation, and incidental expenses.

"Hockey India is also requested to extend its full co-

operation to the committee and to ensure that all relevant documents, information and such other assistance as may be required is made available to the committee in a timely manner..." IOA President PT Usha's letter to HI stated.

The dispute between between Hockey India and Lakra had taken an ugly turn after the national federation's ethics committee is-



sued a show cause notice and launched an inquiry against the former captain after she was accused of threatening young player Albela Rani Toppo, who is also from Jharkhand.

TOP COURT: ENFORCE SEAT BELT LAW STRICTLY

The law is very clear on seat belts. The question is implementation. How can we ensure that every citizen and every driver in this country complies with it?

NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said there are adequate laws mandating wearing seat belts while a vehicle is in motion and it is the duty of the law enforcement agencies to ensure compliance.

The observation came from a bench of Chief Justice of India (CJI) Surya Kant and Justices Joymalya Bagchi and

V Mohana, which was hearing a petition seeking directions for mandatory wearing of seat belts in vehicles.

The petitioner's counsel told the bench that many deaths and injuries from road accidents could be prevented if the law mandating seat belt use was followed.

He said that despite the law, a number of vehicles have non-functional seat

belts because of fancy seat covers or other modifications.

The bench said, "The law is very clear on seat belts. The question is of implementation. How can we ensure that every citizen and every driver in this country complies with it?"

The top court asked the petitioner to send his suggestions on the issue to the com-

petent authority.

"It is the work of the law enforcement agencies to ensure compliance," it said.

Referring to Rule 138(3) of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, the bench said it requires the driver, the person seated in the front seat or the persons occupying front-facing rear seats to wear seat belts while the vehicle is in motion.

The petitioner's counsel argued that negligence of people and weak enforcement of law lead to serious injuries and even deaths in road accidents across the country.

The bench noted that there are adequate laws concerning road safety measures, including wearing of seat belts while a vehicle is in motion.

It said non-compliance of

law by people or failure of law enforcement agencies in taking appropriate action against the defaulters was essentially a question of maintenance of law and order.

The bench disposed of the plea while granting liberty to the petitioner to forward a copy of his petition to the concerned authority to consider the suggestions given by him.



Faridabad: Infant dies after drowning in water bucket

FARIDABAD

IN a tragic incident, a one-year-old boy died after drowning in a water-filled bucket while playing at his home in Jeevan Nagar Part-2, Faridabad, police said on Wednesday.



The deceased child was identified as Aryan.

Aryan's grandmother, Meena, said that at the time of the incident, the child and her mother were upstairs at home. While her mother was in a room, Aryan was playing outside. His father was away at work.

While playing, he wandered towards a bucket full of water kept near the bathroom and fell into it headfirst.

"After some time, I realised something was amiss when I could no longer hear any sound from the child," Meena said, adding that when she went to check on Aryan, she found him in the bucket.

She said that they then rushed Aryan to a government hospital, from where he was referred elsewhere. Aryan was then taken to a private hospital, where doctors declared him dead, Meena added.

"The child's body has been placed in the mortuary at ESIC Medical College and Hospital for a post-mortem examination. Further action will be taken based on the post-mortem report," said a senior police officer of Mujesar police station.

'UP govt docs can now serve till 70'

LUCKNOW

GOVERNMENT doctors in Uttar Pradesh will now be able to continue providing services through reappointment until the age of 70, Deputy Chief Minister Brajesh Pathak has said.

Pathak -- who also holds the health portfolio -- said the move is aimed at further strengthening government healthcare services in the state.

Under the existing system, government doctors can serve until the age of 65. Following Pathak's direction, the health department has now initiated the process of issuing an order to facilitate their reappointment up to the age of 70, according to an official statement.

Government hospitals, community health centres (CHCs) and primary health centres (PHCs) in the state receive a large number of patients daily. Extending the services of experienced doctors would provide patients with better medical consul-



tation and treatment, while also easing the pressure on hospitals and health centres, the deputy chief minister said on Tuesday.

"The Provincial Medical and Health Services cadre is the principal medical cadre of the Health Department and includes medical officers and specialist doctors who play a crucial role in providing healthcare services at government hospitals, CHCs and PHCs," Pathak said.

He said allowing eligible and experienced doctors to serve until the age of 70

would enable patients to directly benefit from their expertise.

The arrangement would be particularly useful in departments facing a shortage of specialist doctors, and would also help strengthen healthcare services in rural areas, he said.

Pathak said the additional chief secretary, health department, has been directed to expedite the process of issuing orders regarding reappointment of doctors after retirement, up to the age of 70

Food licenses of Rly catering, ISKCON suspended

The Maharashtra Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on Wednesday suspended the licenses of a supplier linked to a railway caterer, a dairy unit and multiple eateries at a religious centre in Juhu for alleged violations of food safety norms. Improvement notices issued to four others. Licenses of three food establishments operating at ISKCON, Juhu, suspended. Serious irregularities found in the milk business, Kharghar; license suspended. Licenses were also suspended for 20 renowned food establishments (hotels, restaurants, etc.): 6 in Mumbai, 3 in Konkan Division, and 11 in Pune Division," FDA stated. According to the Maharashtra FDA, "Inspection of food establishments, specifically base kitchens and food plazas supplying food to railway passengers conducted by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA)." The food license of a hospitality and catering company was suspended and improvement notices were issued to four others. The enforcement drive also hit the dairy sector, with authorities suspending the license of a Kharghar-based milk business after uncovering alleged operational irregularities.

5,326 missing; Nepal toll climbs to 1,365

CHITWAN

THE death toll from the devastating flash floods in Nepal climbed to 1,365 on Wednesday as more bodies were recovered from the affected areas, authorities said.

Rescue teams continued to search for 5,326 people, including at least 589 foreign nationals, who remain missing, according to a Nepal Police news bulletin.

Rescue teams recovered 363 bodies from Chitwan district, 226 from Nawalparasi East, 222 from Nawalparasi West, and 197 from Nuwakot.

Similarly, 174 bodies were recovered from Rasuwa district, 75 from Gorkha, 70 from Dhading and 38 from Tanahu.

So far, 102 bodies have been handed over to the family members after completing the identification process, police said.

Security personnel have safely kept 1,147 unidentified bodies underground in accordance with all prescribed protocols, including the collection of DNA samples to facilitate their identification.

The flash floods, triggered by an ice-rock avalanche near the Nepal-Tibet border on August 26, devastated towns and villages in northern and central Nepal.

Geopolitical storm batters D-Street as Sensex cracks 813 points

BRENT CROSSES \$100, IT STOCKS PLUNGE AND INDIA VIX RISES OVER 6%

MUMBAI

FALLING for the third straight day, benchmark stock index Sensex tumbled 813 points to a three-month low, and the Nifty settled below 23,450 following selling in IT, FMCG, financial services and oil & gas shares, as escalating tensions in West Asia drove crude oil to over \$100 per barrel.

The 30-share BSE Sensex tanked 813.35 points, or 1.08 per cent, to settle at the day's low of 74,764.23, also the lowest closing level in nearly three months.

The 50-share NSE Nifty declined 203.60 points, or 0.86 per cent, to end at a nearly three-month low of 23,431.50. The index had closed near this level on June 11 previously.



Among the 30 Sensex firms, HCL Tech fell the most, down 4.55 per cent. Infosys dropped 4.43 per cent, Tech Mahindra by 3.87 per cent, and Tata Consultancy Services by 2.26 per cent. HDFC Bank and Hindustan Unilever were also among the major laggards.

Adani Ports was the lead gainer, rising by 3.67 per

cent. Tata Steel, Trent and NTPC were among the winners. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, jumped 2.67 per cent to \$100.5 per barrel.

India VIX climbed more than 6 per cent, reflecting increased hedging activity and growing caution over the near-term outlook, he added. The BSE SmallCap Select index declined 0.59 per

cent and the MidCap Select index dipped 0.52 per cent. Among the BSE sectoral indices, IT tanked the most by 3.21 per cent, followed by Focused IT (2.99 per cent), Realty (2.01 per cent), Insurance (1.49 per cent), Housing Finance (1.39 per cent), Top 10 Banks (1.03 per cent) and Bankex (0.74 per cent). Commodities, Energy, Utilities, Hospitals, Metal, Power and Services were the winners.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 123.19 crore on Tuesday, according to exchange data. On Tuesday, the Sensex dropped 555.23 points, or 0.73 per cent, to settle at 75,577.58. The Nifty declined 144.05 points, or 0.61 per cent, to end at 23,635.10.

Rupee loses ground as oil shock, market sell-off intensify

MUMBAI: The rupee slumped by 34 paise to close at 95.08 against the American currency on Wednesday as crude prices crossed the \$100 per barrel mark, stoking concerns over inflation and high forex outflows. Weak equity markets and FII outflows also pressured the rupee, forex traders said.

Brent crude futures surpassed \$100 a barrel for the first time in almost six weeks after attacks on oil facilities and ships in West Asia threatened to weaken the already strained supply chain amid the US-Iran tensions. Brent crude was trading higher by 2.94 per cent at \$100.73 per barrel.



At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened at 94.80, also its intraday high, against the US dollar. The local unit fell to an intraday low of 95.22 as crude oil prices surged. The rupee settled at 95.08, down 34 paise from its previous close of 94.74.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading at 98.84, higher by 0.05 per cent.

Adani Airports enters global top three after \$1-bn fundraise

NEW DELHI

BILLIONAIRE Gautam Adani's airport business is set to rank among the world's most valuable airport operators after securing about USD 1 billion in fresh equity from investors including Temasek, BlackRock-managed funds, Alpha Wave Global and Premji Invest.

The transaction values Adani Airport Holdings at about \$18 billion before the investment. Its implied post-money equity value of approximately \$19 billion places it around third globally among major listed and recently valued airport operators, behind Spain's Aena and Airports of Thailand,



according to market research analysts.

The comparison is not strictly like-for-like as Aena and Airports of Thailand are publicly traded, while Adani Airport Holdings is privately held within Adani Enterprises. Public-market valuations also fluctuate with share prices.

Under the agreements,

the investor consortium will acquire newly issued shares in three tranches and collectively hold about 5.54% once the transaction is completed. The final tranche is expected by July 2027.

The capital will fund expansion and modernisation of Adani's airport network, airport-linked commercial infrastructure and businesses such as ground handling and passenger services. The company aims to increase annual airport capacity to about 200 million passengers. Adani Airports operates eight airports, including Mumbai International Airport, and handles roughly a quarter of India's passenger traffic and about a third of its air-cargo

volumes. It is India's largest airport operator by number of airports, although GMR handles larger passenger volumes.

The valuation puts Adani Airports ahead of Groupe ADP, valued at about \$13 billion, and GMR Airports at around \$10.9 billion, according to analysts. Aena has a market value of about \$46 billion and Airports of Thailand about \$27 billion.

The company also plans about 22 million sq ft of mixed-use development in the first phase of its airport-city projects, adding commercial and real-estate revenue streams. The fundraise follows Adani Enterprises' Rs 15,000-crore QIP in July.

Jio Platforms begins global roadshow for \$3.8-bn IPO

MUMBAI

Jio Platforms is set to begin investor outreach later this week for its proposed initial public offering, which is widely expected to become India's largest public offering at about \$3.8 billion, according to sources.

The digital services arm of Reliance Industries received Sebi's final observations on August 28, clearing the way for the IPO. Jio Platforms had filed its draft papers in June.

Investor meetings are expected across key global financial centres, including the US, Hong Kong, Singapore and the UK. Jio did not respond to an email seeking comment.

Under its draft prospectus, Jio Platforms plans to issue up to 27 crore fresh equity shares, representing about 2.9% of its post-issue equity base. The offering could value the company at around \$137 billion.

Most of the proceeds will be used to repay or prepay about Rs 27,500 crore of outstanding borrowings of Reliance Jio Infocomm, Jio Platforms' material subsidiary. The balance will be used for general corporate purposes.

Jio Platforms houses Reliance's digital businesses, including its telecom operations.

Reliance Jio Infocomm has a 39.29% share of India's mobile connections, serving 506 million customers, and a 32.89% share of fixed-line connections with 157.9

The IPO would be Reliance group's first public offering since 2008 and its first IPO of a consumer-focused business.

O P Bhatt steps down as Coforge chairman after board report row

NEW DELHI: Coforge Chairman and Independent Director O P Bhatt has resigned with immediate effect after an internal audit raised concerns over the handling and presentation of a board evaluation report, including the non-disclosure of certain material information, the IT services company said on Wednesday. Coforge clarified that the board evaluation exercise conducted in March-April 2026 for the previous year did not relate to the company's financial statements or financial matters. It also said the issue had no bearing on its operations or business performance and



did not affect its near-, mid- or long-term guidance.

As part of its audit plan for the second quarter of FY26, the company's internal auditor reviewed the process followed for the board evaluation exercise conducted under Bhatt's guidance and the resulting Board Evaluation Report presented by him to the board. The review identified concerns over how the report had been dealt with and presented.

Coforge shares tank Cover 5 pc as Chairman Bhatt resigns New Delhi, Sep 9 (PTI) Shares of IT firm Coforge tumbled over 5 per cent on Wednesday after its Chairperson O P Bhatt resigned abruptly from the company after an internal audit raised concerns over the manner in which a 'board evaluation report' was handled. The stock tanked 5.24 per cent to end at Rs 1,846.90 on the BSE. During the day, it dropped 8.67 per cent to Rs 1,780.10.

TG govt, Zepto partner to set up 5 rest centres for gig workers in Hyd

NEW DELHI: The Telangana government and quick commerce platform Zepto have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to establish five dedicated rest and amenity centres for gig and platform workers across Hyderabad. Named 'Project PRAGATI Centres', these facilities will be platform-agnostic, catering to last-mile delivery personnel across various sectors, including food delivery, quick commerce, e-commerce, and logistics. Under the agreement signed with the Cyberabad Municipal Corporation, Zepto will fund and maintain the five centres on an ongoing basis, the company said in a statement.

AI and career growth fuel executive job-hopping

94% of senior leaders open to new opportunities, Page Executive report finds

NEW DELHI

INDIA'S senior leadership market is becoming increasingly fluid, as 94 per cent of executives are open to exploring new career opportunities, according to the Executive Compensation and Talent Trends Report by Page Executive India, part of Michael Page India.

The report, based on a survey of more than 1,200 C-level executives and senior leaders, found that 63 per cent are actively looking



for a new role, while 41 per cent do not expect to remain in their current position for more than a year. Executives are seeking faster career progression, broader responsibilities and greater opportu-

nities for impact.

Page Executive India Managing Partner Jon Goldstein said the executive market was not constrained by a lack of talent but by the pace at which organisations could

develop and retain it. Senior leaders, he said, were looking for faster progression, greater impact and clearer alignment between performance and reward.

Artificial intelligence is also becoming central to senior leadership roles. The report found that 75 per cent of executives actively use AI in their work. An equal proportion reported higher productivity from the technology, while 72 per cent said it had improved the quality of their work. Nilay Khandel-

wal, Senior Managing Director, Michael Page India and Singapore, said the conversation around AI was moving from adoption to accountability. Identifying, developing and retaining talent capable of working effectively alongside AI would become an increasingly important leadership priority. On compensation, 65 per cent were satisfied with remuneration, while 87 per cent cited pay as a key driver of job satisfaction. However, the report said compensation alone was

no longer enough to retain senior leaders, who were increasingly prioritising career progression and promotion opportunities.

The report also found that skills-based hiring was gaining ground as organisations sought to widen access to talent and reduce bias.

The findings point to a competitive senior talent market in which companies may need clearer career paths and opportunities with emerging technologies to retain experienced leaders.

'Policy must balance innovation with accountability'

MUMBAI: Policy should provide room for innovation to grow while ensuring that accountability and resilience grow alongside it, RBI Deputy Governor Rohit Jain said on Wednesday. The objective of policy, therefore, is to create the conditions in which useful innovation can develop responsibly, he said here at the Global Fintech Fest 2026. "This requires clear guardrails where the risks are understood, room for experimentation where they are still emerging, and the ability to adapt the framework as technology and its uses evolve."
