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ECI recognises Vijay-led TVK as state party

Reserves 'whistle' symbol
CHENNAI: The Election Commission of India (ECI) has recognised Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) as a state party in Tamil Nadu and reserved the 'whistle' as its election symbol. The recognition comes after the party's performance in the Assembly election, winning 108 of the 234 seats in the State. This marks a significant milestone for the actor-turned-politician Vijay-led TVK party. In a communication dated September 9, the ECI said it had reviewed TVK's performance in the 2026 Tamil Nadu and Puducherry Assembly elections and found that the party had fulfilled the conditions prescribed under Para 6A of the Election Symbols (Reservation and Allotment) Order, 1968. Accordingly, the Commission granted TVK recognition as a state party in Tamil Nadu as well as in the Union Territory of Puducherry.

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25 killed after fire breaks out on cargo ship in China port



BEIJING: At least 25 people were killed and five were missing after a cargo ship caught fire while docked in a Chinese port, Chinese state media reported on Thursday. The vessel was undergoing repairs at Beihai Ship-building Co. at the port of Qingdao, a major shipping hub on China's northeastern coast, when the fire broke out. China's Xinhua news agency released a photograph identifying the ship as the Ocean Melody. The vessel sails under a Liberian flag, according to the tracking website VesselFinder. There were 42 people aboard the ship when the incident occurred, Xinhua reported. Twelve people were safely evacuated, while five others suffered injuries and were taken to hospital. Their condition was reported to be stable.

Turn district resources into wealth, CM tells Collectors

District-wise growth data to be shared with Ministers, Collectors

CHIEF Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has directed the District Collectors to unlock the potential of their districts, effectively market local resources and accelerate economic growth to achieve the State's GSDP targets. Addressing the 8th Collectors' Conference on Thursday, the Chief Minister asked RTGS officials to provide district-wise growth data to Ministers and Collectors to help them identify opportunities and monitor targets. Officials said the Centre had fixed 2022-23 as the base year for assessing various economic parameters. The projected growth rate for 2026-27 at current prices is 13.44 per cent. During the first quarter, GVA growth stood at 14.19 per cent in agriculture and allied sectors, 14.81 per cent in industry and 12.70 per cent in services. Aquaculture recorded a particularly high growth of 31.77 per cent, with production reaching 6.61 lakh metric tonnes. Power generation increased from 24,248 million

units to 28,664 million units, while consumption rose 14.28 per cent. Industrial GVA stood at Rs 1,13,638 crore and services GVA at

Rs 1,60,107 crore during the quarter. GST revenue also increased by 18 per cent. The CM said 359 projects approved in 20 SIPB meet-

ings had the potential to bring Rs 13.85 lakh crore investment and 10.6 lakh jobs. Of these, 160 projects have already commenced, involving Rs 4.03 lakh crore investment and expected employment for 5.9 lakh people. Naidu directed the Collectors to give priority to grounding the remaining approved projects, finalise commencement dates and coordinate with Ministers and public representatives to remove bottlenecks. Officials also noted that Andhra Pradesh had become the first State to establish an Artificial Intelligence Task Force. **Continued on Page 7**

across Andhra Pradesh, seeking to end delays in identifying land for industrial and developmental projects. Addressing the Eighth Collectors' Conference, Chandrababu directed officials to identify government land lying unused for years

with various departments and bring its details onto the portal. The land should be mapped department-wise and district-wise, enabling any government department requiring land to access the database and seek allocation. **Continued on Page 7**

Bank strike today

Services likely to be hit for 4 days

BANK unions will go ahead with their planned nationwide strike on Friday, after talks with the government over key demands, including service conditions, failed to break the deadlock. The United Forum of Bank Unions (UFBU) has said it will not defer the strike unless there is a favourable decision or a definite timeline on its principal demand for a five-day banking week. It may noted here that banks are closed on the second Saturday (September 12), followed by Sunday (September 13) and Monday (September 14: Ganesh Chaturthi) in some states. The latest conciliation talks were held at the office of the chief labour commissioner (central), with representatives of the UFBU, Indian Banks' Association (IBA), Department of Financial Services (DFS) and labour authorities. The DFS representa-

tive appealed to the bank unions to reconsider the strike call in view of the BRICS Leaders' Summit during 11-13 September in New Delhi. The unions, however, maintained that they could not defer the strike in the absence of a favourable decision or a definite timeline for implementation of the five-day work week. "Two rounds of online meetings were held today. There has been no concrete outcome on the five-day work week. The strike stands," said Rupam Roy, general secretary, All India Bank Officers' Confederation (AIBOC). The September 11 action is the first in a wider programme announced by the UFBU. The unions have also called a three-day nationwide strike during September 28-30 and have announced an indefinite strike from October 26 if their demands remain unresolved.

This alleged money laundering case is linked to the irregularities in the IRCTC hotel tender scam case registered by the CBI. DGCA ORDERS DRUG TEST FOR ALL PILOTS

NEW DELHI: After the captain of an Air India flight that was involved in a sudden altitude loss incident last month tested positive for drug use, aviation safety regulator Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) ordered all Indian airlines to conduct a one-time test for psychoactive substances on all their pilots by July next year, according to sources. Indian airlines are estimated to have close to 14,000 pilots. Following the incident that involved a Phuket-Delhi flight, and before the DGCA ordered tests for all pilots across airlines, the Air India group had voluntarily initiated one-time random drug tests on the about 5,000 pilots employed by Air India and Air India Express. Moreover, the draft of the new and likely more stringent norms on testing aviation personnel for psychoactive substance use is likely to be related by the DGCA by month-end, according to Civil Aviation Minister K Ram Mohan Naidu. **Continued on Page 7**

International air connectivity from Tirupati gets big push

UNION Civil Aviation Minister Kinjarapu Rammohan Naidu has pitched for direct international air connectivity between Tirupati and destinations like Kuwait, a long-standing demand of people from the region and overseas devotees visiting the temple city. Despite Tirupati airport being accorded international airport status in June 2017, the pilgrim city has so far remained without a direct

international flight connection. A direct service to Kuwait is expected to particularly benefit devotees and residents from the Rayalaseema region who have been seeking easier air access to the Gulf country. The minister made the remarks while virtually inaugurating the first flight of regional carrier FLY91 to Tirupati. With its entry into the city, FLY91 has added Tirupati as its 13th destination and its third station in the state. The airline has intro-

dry. The Tirupati-Hyderabad flight will operate daily, while services to Vijayawada

will run four days a week on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays. The

Rajahmundry service will be available on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The flight arrives from Hyderabad at 07.40 hrs, departs from Tirupati at 08.05 hrs and reaches Vijayawada at 09.15 hrs and again departs from Vijayawada at 09.45 hrs and reaches Tirupati at 10.50 hrs. Similarly, the flight arrives from Hyderabad at 7.40 hrs, departs from Tirupati at 8.05 hrs and reaches Rajahmundry at 9.30 hrs and again departs from Rajahmundry at 10.00 hrs and reaches Tirupati at 11:25

hrs. Naidu said improved air connectivity was important for Tirupati, which receives millions of pilgrims every year. He said efforts were under way to establish direct links with international destinations, including Kuwait, to make travel more convenient for devotees coming from abroad. The Hyderabad connection will provide passengers with access to a major aviation hub and onward links to several domestic and international destinations. **Continued on Page 7**



Chittoor, Tirupati MPs hail Arakkonam-Renigunta rail project

THE approval of third and fourth railway lines between Arakkonam and Renigunta has been welcomed by Chittoor MP Daggumalla Prasada Rao and Tirupati MP Madhila Gurumoorthy, who said the project would improve rail connectivity and support economic activity in the region.

The Union Cabinet has approved the construction of the two additional lines along 77-km Arakkonam-Renigunta route. The new lines will pass through Puttur in Nagari Assembly constituency, which falls under Chittoor parliamentary constituency.

Chittoor MP Daggumalla Prasada Rao thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu for approving the project. He described the expansion as an important develop-

ment for Chittoor and said it would strengthen the railway connection between Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu.

According to him, the additional lines will help reduce congestion, improve train speeds and ensure better punctuality.

Improved rail connectivity could also encourage investments in industries, warehouses, logistics parks and cold storage facilities in the Chittoor region. Better rail freight services would benefit the transport of Chittoor's major products, including mangoes, tomatoes, dairy products and granite.

He added that improved connectivity with markets would help the local economy. Tirupati MP Gurumoorthy also welcomed the Union Cabinet's approval and thanked Ashwini Vaishnaw and the Railway Ministry for clearing the project. He said the Arakkonam-Renigunta route is an important railway corridor in South India.

With Tirupati attracting a large number of devotees, tourists and passengers every day, he said the additional lines would help improve passenger services and ease pressure on the existing railway network.

Sigma Advanced Systems begins aerospace component production at Sri City

The UK-based company moved from ground-breaking to production in just eight months

UK-based Sigma Advanced Systems has commenced aerospace component production at Sri City, marking a key step in the State's efforts to attract advanced manufacturing investments. The company has moved its Sri City facility from construction stage to active production in just eight months. The first batch of precision-machined aerospace components manufactured at the facility has already been sent to Sigma's UK operations for final verification before being delivered to the customer.

The new facility covers 75,000 sq ft and forms part of a larger 5,00,000 sq ft campus. It currently has



the capacity to undertake 1,00,000 machining hours annually. The company has designed the facility to scale up its capacity to nearly 3,00,000 machining hours a year as operations expand. Sigma is developing the Sri City facility to replicate

the aerospace manufacturing capabilities of its UK operations in India. The company plans to gradually bring a larger part of the aerospace manufacturing value chain to the country. Once the planned expansion is completed, around

70 per cent of the manufacturing process is expected to be carried out in India.

The facility has also completed the initial stages of the source-control approval process with Rolls-Royce Aerospace. The process involves meeting stringent quality and manufacturing requirements followed by major global aerospace programmes.

The remaining part of the Sri City campus is expected to become operational over the next 12 months. The larger campus has been planned to support future expansion, including additional manufacturing capabilities and potential acquisitions.

Sigma Advanced Systems CEO and Executive Director Sunil Kalidindi said the

start of production at Sri City was an important milestone for the company as it expands its role as a global aerospace manufacturing partner.

He said the company's objective was not merely to increase machining capacity in India but to replicate its established UK capabilities and gradually shift a larger share of the aerospace manufacturing value chain to India.

As part of its long-term plans, Sigma will develop specialised aerospace manufacturing skills through on-campus training and capability development. The initiative is expected to contribute to the availability of skilled manpower for advanced manufacturing in the State.

Residential school students attempt to kill roommate for 'school holiday'

A bizarre belief reportedly led two Class VIII students at a residential school in Annamayya district to allegedly make a serious attempt on the life of their hostel-mate, after they came to believe that the death of a student would result in the school being declared a holiday.

The incident was reported from a residential school at Gyarampalle vil-

lage in Kambhamvaripalle mandal. The two boys, who were studying in Class VIII and residing in the hostel, allegedly targeted another student sharing their room.

According to officials, the incident took place around a week ago when the victim was asleep. The two students allegedly covered his face with a pillow and strangled him.

The boy, however, managed to free himself from their grip and survived the attack.

The matter reportedly remained undisclosed initially, with teachers allegedly keeping it confidential. The incident came to the attention of education authorities later, following which Mandal Education Officer (MEO) Reddy Basha visited the school on Wednesday and conducted an inquiry.

The MEO also interacted with the families and parents of the students involved as part of the investigation. During

the inquiry, the two boys reportedly claimed that a student had died at the same institution about two years ago, following which the school had been given a holiday. Officials said the students appeared to have formed the belief that another student's death would similarly lead to the declaration of a holiday. Acting on that belief, they allegedly attempted to kill their classmate.

Following the inquiry, Transfer Certificates (TCs)

were issued to both students and they were sent away from the school, the MEO said. The matter has also been brought to the notice of senior authorities. Meanwhile, Annamayya Superintendent of Police Dheeraj Kunubilli said police were conducting an inquiry into the incident. Investigators are examining the circumstances surrounding the alleged attack and the events that led to the students targeting their hostel-mate.

Varasidhi Vinayaka Mahotsava committee releases invitation cards

VARASIDDHI Vinayaka Mahotsava Committee on Thursday unveiled its official invitation card for this year's Vinayaka Chaviti, calling for traffic-free, eco-friendly and spiritually focused celebrations as the festival coincides with Sri-vari Brahmotsavams at Tirumala.

MLC Cipai Subrahmanyam and former Mayor Sirisha released invitation cards at the committee office, with convener Samanchi Srinivas, committee member Naveen Kumar Reddy and other office-bearers present.

Speakers highlighted that lakhs of pilgrims will visit Tirumala for Brahmotsavams from September 15 and urged all pandal organisers to install Ganesh idols without blocking roads or causing congestion for devotees travelling to the hill shrine. Citing water scarcity due to El Niño effect, they said Municipal Corporation and police are arranging clean, safe immersion facilities at Vinayaka Sagar and other designated ponds. Organisers were asked to cooperate with officials and use only approved immersion points.

The committee appealed for a complete ban on obscene dances and loud DJ music, requesting that only devotional programmes be conducted with discipline.



'Take stringent action against illegal layouts'

NELLORE Urban Development Authority Chairman (Nuda) Chairman Kotamreddy Srinivasulu Reddy has directed officials to take stringent action and book cases against those, who are developing layouts without obtaining necessary permissions from the government.

He held a review meeting with the officials over status of layouts, applications received under Layout Regularisation Scheme (LRS) and unauthorised layouts, at his office on Thursday.

Expressing angry over illegal formation of layouts, the Chairman directed officials to identify all layouts developed without NUDA approval within the authority's jurisdiction. He stressed the need to provide awareness among public about LRS. He directed officials to scrutinise LRS applications as per the prescribed rules and expedite disposal of eligible applications.

The NUDA chief appealed to people not to purchase plots in layouts that do not have NUDA approval and advised prospective buyers to verify whether a layout has valid NUDA permission before purchasing a plot. He directed officials to give priority in identifying and acting against unauthorised layouts while expediting disposal of eligible LRS applications.

MLA counters illegal mining allegations against Nellore MP Prabhakar Reddy

Prabhakar Reddy, the MLA asserted, holds legitimate mining contracts worth around Rs 50,000 crore across the country and entered politics only after achieving financial success to serve the people.

She admitted the VPR group briefly entered quartz industry in 2024 to create local jobs but withdrew in 2025 to avoid controversy.

She further alleged that vigilance reports were being prepared on illegal mining by Prasanna Kumar Reddy in Talamanchi, Panchedu and Rajupalem. Prashanthi warned that voters would reject such conspiracies in the coming local body polls.

Prawn farmers stage protest

PRAWN farmers from Gudur and Kota mandals under Prawn Farmers United Forum (PFUF) on Thursday staged protests at GMT, GVR and Penver processing plants, alleging that processing units and exporters were forming a syndicate and purchasing prawns at reduced prices.

They said the price of 30-count tiger prawns is Rs 430 per kg at present, which was Rs 580 per kg a month ago. They said the sharp fall

in prices had made it difficult for farmers to recover their cultivation costs and that they were uncertain about when traders would purchase their produce or stop procurement.

The farmers also alleged that feed companies had increased feed prices by Rs 26 per kg in violation of APSADA Act, resulting in a steep rise in production costs. They criticised the government and senior officials of Fisheries department for failing to take action to control the rising input costs.

THE coalition government is committed to finding a permanent solution to long-pending land disputes in Andhra Pradesh and ensuring full ownership rights to landholders, revenue minister Anagani Satya Prasad said.

Addressing the Collectors' Conference at the Secretariat here on Thursday, the minister said registration would be allowed for 9 lakh acres of freehold land that had been found compliant with the prescribed rules under the

previous government. However, a decision on another 4 lakh acres, where irregularities have been identified, would be taken after a detailed inquiry, he said.

The minister said 28 lakh acres had already been removed from the prohibited 22-A list.

The government had issued GO No. 444 to simplify the process of removing land from the 22-A list. Of the 28,790 acres for which applications had been received under the new procedure, 1,100 acres had already been removed from the prohibited list, while decisions on

the remaining applications would be taken soon. Under GO No. 445, whenever private land is proposed to be included in the 22-A prohibited list, the concerned official would have to establish the nature and status of the land, he said.

The Minister warned that

strict action would be taken against officials who include private lands in the prohibited list in violation of the rules.

He said ownership rights had been restored to thousands of people in several long-pending cases, including Vatticherukuru,

Shettipalli, Pulladigunta, Kangundi, Avulapalli and Gootupalli, besides four areas in Konaseema district. In the Kaikaluru constituency, more than 2,000 acres in four villages had also been removed from the prohibited list following the initiative of the local MLA.

The minister said the government was implementing the 'Mee Bhoomi - Blockchain Technology' project to provide a permanent solution to land-related issues and directed Collectors to continuously monitor its implementation.

He also said Re-Survey 2.0 was being carried out efficiently to avoid the mistakes of the previous government. While expressing satisfaction over growing public confidence in the Survey Department, he directed officials to ensure that the re-survey was conducted with 100 per cent accuracy.

Naidu's 'silent revolution' in irrigation: Keshav

FINANCE minister Payyavula Kesav said a 'silent revolution' was underway in the state's irrigation sector under the leadership of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, aimed at ensuring water security for every farmer and every family in the state.

Addressing the Collectors Conference on Thursday, Kesav said the Chief Minister's commitment to the irrigation sector had resulted in the launching of the Handri-Neeva project and the release



of water from the Polavaram Left Main Canal. Ministers and district Collectors gave a standing ovation to Chandrababu Naidu in recognition of his efforts towards strengthening irrigation infrastructure. Kesav said while the completion and launching of major irrigation projects were visible to everyone, the relentless efforts of the Chief Minister, who worked day and night to push forward several projects, often went unnoticed.

He said Chandrababu Naidu was the first to introduce drip irrigation in the State. The cost of drip irrigation, which was earlier around Rs 16 per metre, had now come down to Rs 1.60 per metre. This had made drip

irrigation more accessible to farmers and turned it into a major boon for horticulture in the Rayalaseema region, helping create greater wealth for farmers. The finance minister recalled that several political parties and individuals had initially opposed the Pattiseema Lift Irrigation Project. However, the project was now playing a crucial role in stabilising the Krishna delta ayacut. He said around 500 TMC ft of water had been diverted to the Krishna river through Pattiseema, equivalent to filling the Prakasam Barrage nearly 200 times.

Kesav said the Chief Minister's commitment to irrigation development had also received national recognition, with a leading English daily describing Chandrababu Naidu as a 'CEO CM' and a 'water man'. Thanking the ministers and collectors for the recognition, Chandrababu Naidu said it was the collective responsibility of everyone to ensure water security for all people and all regions of Andhra Pradesh.

State uses GST data for real-time economic tracking

- Manufacturing GVA estimated at ₹1.75 lakh cr, with 19.6% growth till July

ANDHRA Pradesh is leveraging GST and commercial taxes data to develop a real-time mechanism to assess economic activity and estimate Gross Value Added (GVA) across key sectors, commercial taxes department chief commissioner Babu A said. Addressing the 8th Collectors' Conference, Babu said the GST-based assessment of manufacturing activity indicated 19.6 per cent year-on-year growth up to July, compared with about 18 per cent growth recorded up to the first quarter. The estimated manufacturing GVA stood at around Rs 1.75 lakh crore.

He said the GST-based estimate was closely aligned with the planning department's first advance estimates, which are based on sample surveys, with a variation of only about 0.6 percentage points. The close correlation demonstrated the potential of GST data for real-time economic assessment, he said.

The commercial taxes department has developed an AI-based analytical methodology to calculate GVA

using GST data generated by manufacturing units. E-way bill data is also incorporated to improve accuracy by tracking the movement of goods into and out of the State.

The platform provides district-wise heat maps of manufacturing activity and enables collectors to drill down to individual manufacturing units, including their declared value and contribution to the sector.

Babu said GST returns, largely filed between the 18th and 20th of every month, could provide an early indication of economic activity in the preceding month, paving the way for monthly "now-casting" of economic growth. A similar methodology has been developed for the construction sector using GST data from around 65 relevant HSN categories, including cement, iron and steel. The estimated construction GVA was around Rs 1.25 lakh crore, against Rs 1.29 lakh crore estimated by the Planning Department, a variation of about 3.2 per cent.

Real-time assessments have

also been undertaken for trade, hotels and restaurants, real estate, communication and broadcasting, while work is underway to cover mining and electricity. Babu said GST and commercial taxes data would also help create a comprehensive database of MSMEs. Data relating to around 20.08 lakh MSMEs has been identified, including about 2.42 lakh in the GSTN system. To cover enterprises outside the GST network, the department is integrating GST information with electricity consumption data and NIC codes. The State Data Lake provides access to around 1.7 crore electricity connections, enabling officials to assess economic activity even among MSMEs not covered by GST turnover data.

He said around 1.21 lakh GST-linked MSMEs were currently inactive, with no reported turnover. District administrations would be able to identify such units and examine the reasons for their inactivity. The system will enable collectors to analyse activity down to the district, mandal and enterprise levels, helping identify businesses and sectors requiring intervention and potential revival. Babu said Andhra Pradesh's GST-based approach had also received appreciation at a national-level MSME coordination meeting in New Delhi.

THE state government is focusing on completing major infrastructure projects within stipulated timelines to strengthen investment and economic growth, infrastructure and investments department secretary Kona Sasidhar said at the Collectors'



Conference on Thursday.

He directed collectors to prioritise land acquisition, land transfer, legal cases, local clearances and inter-departmental coordination to speed up project execution. Land acquisition and alienation covering 25,662 acres for ports, fishing harbours, fish landing centres and airports are

to be expedited. The government is developing greenfield ports, fishing harbours and shipbuilding facilities. The targeted completion dates are March 2027 for Ramayapatnam Port, May 2027 for Mulapeta, December 2027 for Machilipatnam and September 2028 for Kakinada Gateway.

Fishing harbours at Juvvaladinne, Uppada, Nizampatnam and Machilipatnam are targeted for completion between December 2026 and December 2027. Aviation projects are underway at Bhogapuram, Kurnool, Tirupati, Kadapa, Vijayawada and Rajamahendravaram, while proposals for several greenfield airports are at different stages. Eight water aerodrome sites and nine heliport locations have been identified. Collectors were asked to identify 5-10 acres for heliports in the remaining districts

and expedite acquisition of 670 acres for expansion of the Puttaparthi airstrip. National highway projects worth Rs 1,18,566 crore covering 1,408 km are in the pipeline. The government has also approved repairs covering 10,238 km of roads, while 78 Pushkaram works and 14 incomplete bridges are being taken up.

Sasidhar said 42 railway and multi-line projects covering 2,678 km, costing Rs 46,789 crore, were underway. Another 343 ROB or RUB projects involve Rs 13,305 crore.

Land acquisition remains pending for 91 national highway projects, 37 railway projects and 13 ROB/RUB projects. Collectors were directed to resolve these issues on priority and maintain project-wise records of pending issues, responsible officials and deadlines.

THE state government has set an October deadline to accelerate the conversion of

investment proposals into actual projects, directing collectors to personally monitor land availability, approvals and other bottlenecks.

At the Collectors' Conference, industries and commerce department nodal secretary N Yuvaraj said the government aimed to convert at least 80 per cent of the 463 MoUs signed under PS-2025 by the end of October. So far, 198 have been converted, while 172 are pending. The remaining proposals represent about Rs 5.54 lakh crore investment and 5.4 lakh jobs.

Similarly, the government is targeting 75 per cent grounding of 359 SIPP-

approved projects by October. Of these, 160 have commenced, while 109 are yet to be grounded. The pending projects involve around Rs 6.35 lakh crore investment and nearly two lakh jobs.

Yuvaraj said 88,678 acres had been requisitioned for industrial purposes since June 2024, but only 22,533 acres had been acquired. Of 30,223 acres of government land requisitioned, 17,469 acres were still awaiting handover to APIIC.

He directed collectors to expedite land acquisition, remove eligible lands from the 22-A prohibited list and complete mutations in APIIC's

name. Though 9,933 acres have been removed from 22-A, another 59,080 acres remain pending. Mutation has been completed for only 5,184 of the 49,074 acres for which requests were initiated. Collectors were also told to hold DIEPC meetings every fortnight to resolve pending NOCs, environmental clearances, building approvals and other hurdles.

ITE&C secretary Katamneni Bhaskar said AP is targeting 6.5 GW of data-centre capacity by 2030, requiring faster land and infrastructure support in Visakhapatnam, Anakapalli and Vizianagaram. Around 1,000 acres is

proposed for an IT Park in Visakhapatnam, while 100 acres is sought for IT and GCC parks.

The government is also pushing electronics, semiconductors and quantum technology. A 250-acre Quantum Hardware Park is proposed in or around Amaravati, while the Quantum Computing Centre is being readied to host the IBM machine by October 15. The state has 23.85 lakh MSMEs, with 138 of 175 proposed MSME parks approved and 22 already operational. Collectors were asked to ensure the remaining parks and investment projects are grounded on schedule.

Jagan insists on Lokesh's resignation, CBI probe

- Alleges jobs were given to candidates who never wrote exams; demands CBI probe and Lokesh's exit
- Cites fake certificates, non-existent tournaments, and links to associations headed by Lokesh's relatives in jobs under sports quota
- Claims GOs were tweaked post-recruitment and APPSC exams stalled to hide similar irregularities

YSRCP president Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy on Thursday renewed his demand for the resignation of education minister Nara Lokesh and a CBI probe into the alleged irregularities in DSC 2025, asserting that the recruitment process was riddled with unprecedented violations and that jobs were handed out to candidates who did not even write the examinations.

Addressing a press conference at the YSRCP central office in Tadepalli,

Jagan questioned the "conspicuous silence" of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu and Lokesh on the issues repeatedly raised by the opposition. He said fresh irregularities in the teacher recruitment process were surfacing "day after day," indicating a deeper malaise.

Jagan alleged that the government was deliberately weakening the investigation into the DSC scam and asked why the Chief Minister was "trying to protect his son." He accused the administration of "playing with the lives

and futures of unemployed youth" by allowing questionable practices to dictate recruitment.

Raising specific concerns, he asked why the preparation and supervision of DSC examination papers were entrusted to a single individual and why the government introduced GO No. 4 and GO No. 47. He questioned the rationale behind altering these GOs after the recruitment process concluded.

Jagan said 372 posts under the sports quota were filled without conducting any examination. According to him, GO No. 4 and GO No. 47 "opened the gates for irregularities," while GO Nos. 23, 25 and 56 were brought in later "to close those gates after the work was done."

He alleged that jobs were given away in violation of norms and claimed that the coalition government stalled APPSC exams

after the DSC controversy erupted, fearing exposure of similar practices. "Jobs were given based on participation certificates for tournaments that never took place," he said, calling DSC 2025 "a gem in Chandrababu's list of scams."

Jagan accused the government of misleading the legislature and said officials were "running out of words" to defend the recruitment process. He cited case-by-case examples, including 39 sports quota appointments allegedly based on fake certificates. He claimed certificates for judo events in Khammam and softball tournaments were fabricated, and that individuals linked to Lokesh's family headed the associations issuing them.

He also pointed to alleged irregularities in Kho-Kho certificates and cited cases from Kurnool and Kadapa districts where candidates reportedly secured jobs despite not meeting TET or reservation criteria.

21 new nutrition centres to boost malnutrition care in AP

- Health minister says new NRCs will add 175 beds, taking the total to 515 across 42 centres
- Six more 10-bed centres sanctioned for 2026-27, adding another 60 beds
- NRCs recorded over 98% recovery among severely malnourished children in recent years

TWENTY-one new nutrition rehabilitation centres (NRCs) will be established across the state to provide specialised treatment and nutritional support to children suffering from severe acute malnutrition (SAM), health minister Y Satya Kumar Yadav said.

In a statement here on Thursday, he said that the new centres will add 175 beds to the existing capacity.

With these facilities becoming operational in phases, the number of NRCs in the State will increase from 21 to 42, while the total bed strength will rise from 340 to 515.

Eight 10-bed NRCs are being established at Araku, Munchingiput and Chintapalli in Alluri Sitarama Raju district, Anakapalli, Bapatla, Nandyal, Sunnipenta and Narasaraopet in Palnadu district. Works have already been completed at Araku and Nandyal and the centres are expected to become operational soon.

Civil works at Munchingiput are under the tender process, while construction and other works are in progress at Chintapalli and Anakapalli.

Seven five-bed Integrated NRCs are also being established in tribal areas at Addateegala and Y. Ramavaram in the Polavaram region, and Salur, Palakonda, Badagiri, Kurupam and Chinamerangi in Parvathipuram Manyam district. Addateegala and Y. Ramavaram centres are

expected to be inaugurated shortly. In addition, six new 10-bed NRCs have been sanctioned for 2026-27 at Madanapalle, Chittoor, Rajamahendravaram, Machilipatnam, Hindupur and Tanuku, adding another 60 beds.

The government has allocated Rs 4.42 crore for NRC infrastructure, staff capacity building, ASHA incentives and maintenance during 2026-27. Another Rs 12.22 crore has been sanctioned annually towards human resources.

NRCs provide specialised medical care and nutritional support to children below five years suffering from SAM and associated medical complications. In 2024-25, 5,961 children were admitted and 5,878 recovered and were discharged, recording a recovery rate of 98.60 per cent. In 2025-26, 6,195 children were admitted and 6,168 recovered. From April to August 2026, 2,492 children were admitted and 2,462 recovered, registering a recovery rate of 98.80 per cent.

VCK criticises CM's 'hand gesture' in Assembly

CHENNAI : VCK founder and president Thol Thirumavalavan on Thursday criticised Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C Joseph Vijay over his “body language” in the state Legislative Assembly towards DMK chief M K Stalin, while also demanding the withdrawal of the State Law Minister Nirmal Kumar’s remarks on the MISA era.

He said severe criticism has surfaced over the Chief Minister’s “body language” mocking Stalin during his reply to the debate on the police grant. “Although the Chief Minister’s side has clarified that there was ‘no ill intent’, we, on behalf of the VCK, point out that such body language is neither a dignified approach nor aligned with human values”, Thirumavalavan said in his social media platform on Wednesday.

Stressing that respecting elders is among the highest of human values, the VCK leader said, “therefore, it would be beneficial for a Chief Minister, who holds such a highly dignified and exalted position, to exercise utmost care regarding his body language in the future”.

Referring to DMK’s request that certain portions of the speech be expunged from the House records, Thirumavalavan said, “the MISA related remarks made by the Law Minister, who intervened during that debate, amounted to a “historical error”.

“The repression during the MISA era is well known to the entire nation,” he alleged adding “making a completely false statement regarding the DMK president, who endured that cruel repression, is strongly condemnable”. “We urge the Minister to declare the withdrawal of his remarks,” he added.

BIS seizes 804 gms of non-hallmarked gold jewellery

NEW DELHI : Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) on Thursday said it has seized 804 grams of gold jewellery in Chennai as the articles were not hallmarked and displayed for commercial sales. Mandatory hallmarking of gold jewellery and artefacts was launched in June 2021. Hallmarking provides an official indication of the purity or fineness of precious metal articles.

According to an official statement, the BIS’s Chennai Branch Office “seized 803.99 grams of non-hallmarked gold jewellery during an enforcement search and seizure operation at a jewellery shop in Ambattur, Chennai, on September 1, 2026”.

The action was carried out under Section 28 of the Bureau of Indian Standards Act, 2016, after non-hallmarked gold jewellery was found displayed for commercial sale. “The seized jewellery included 175 mangalsutras (thalis) weighing 671.50 grams, 12 children’s bangles weighing 25.02 grams, 40 earrings weighing 86.14 grams and 10 pendants weighing 21.33 grams,” it added.

The BIS officials found the jewellery in different designs and categories being offered for sale without the required hallmarking. The articles were confiscated for detailed investigation and further legal proceedings.

S D Dayanand, Head of the BIS Chennai Branch Office, said, “BIS regularly undertakes market surveillance and enforcement activities to ensure that products covered under mandatory BIS certification and hallmarked requirements comply with the prescribed standards.”

He mentioned that such enforcement actions prevent the sale of substandard products, check misuse of the BIS Standard Mark and hallmark. Hallmarking, the BIS noted, offers an official guarantee of the purity or fineness of precious metal articles. Under the existing system, hallmarked gold jewellery carries the BIS logo, purity/fineness grading, and a six-digit Hallmark Unique Identification (HUID) number. Consumers can verify the HUID of hallmarked jewellery through the BIS CARE app.

ECI recognises TVK as state party, reserves ‘whistle’ symbol

THE Election Commission of India (ECI) has recognised the Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) as a state party in Tamil Nadu and reserved the “whistle” symbol for it, giving the organisation a permanent electoral identity after its successful Assembly debut.

The recognition follows TVK’s performance in the 2026 Tamil Nadu Assembly election, in which it emerged as the single largest party. Contesting its first election, TVK won 108 of the 234 constituencies and secured 34.92 per cent of the valid votes polled across the state.

The ECI’s decision marks an important organisational milestone for the party, founded and led by actor-turned-politician C. Joseph Vijay. It places TVK among Tamil Nadu’s officially recognised state parties and allows its candidates to contest fu-



ture elections under the same reserved symbol.

The whistle had initially been allotted to TVK as a common symbol in January, ahead of the Assembly election. At that stage, the party was registered but unrecognised and had requested a single symbol for its candidates as it prepared for its maiden electoral contest. Following its strong showing at the polls, the symbol has now been formally reserved for the

party.

Under the Election Symbols (Reservation and Allotment) Order, 1968, a political organisation can obtain recognition as a state party by satisfying any one of several conditions linked to its vote share and the number of seats it wins in Assembly or Lok Sabha elections. One route requires a party to secure at least six per cent of the valid votes polled in the state and win a minimum of two As-

Custodial death of temple guard Court remands 4 police officials, including DSP

MADURAI

IN a significant legal development, a city court on Thursday ordered the judicial remand of four police officials — a DSP among them — in connection with the 2025 custodial death of temple security guard B Ajith Kumar.

The V Additional District and Sessions Court, Madurai, framed a murder charge under Section 103 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita against a former DSP of Manamadurai, a former Thiruppuvanam police Inspector, a former SI and a former head constable, in connection with the custodial death of Kumar, a security guard at the Madapuram Kaliaygman temple in Sivaganga district, and directed that they be sent to prison.

The court ordered their immediate remand after observing that they had appeared before it without securing formal bail petitions. The CBI had opposed their release, telling the court that local police elements were still actively trying to influence the case — including an incident flagged before the court on



Thursday, in which a local police inspector arbitrarily withdrew protection from key eyewitnesses.

The section invoked against the four carries a maximum penalty of life imprisonment and is non-bailable, a source said. The High Court had earlier directed the four to appear before the trial court to execute bonds. However, they appeared before the judge on Thursday without filing a bail petition. As a result, the judge exercised the court’s statutory power and ordered them to be taken directly into judicial custody.

Kumar, 27, reportedly died in June 2025 after being subjected to police brutality during a probe into a missing gold chain of 10 sovereigns.

The incident triggered massive public outrage, prompting the CBI to take up the case. The agency’s investigation uncovered brutal torture of Kumar by local police over the theft allegation, which was later found to be entirely baseless.

An autopsy report confirmed 18 distinct injuries on Kumar’s body. Following the CBI crackdown, 10 police personnel have been named as accused in the custodial murder case. Five constables were arrested and remanded in 2025, and a police driver was subsequently taken into custody, police said. A supplementary chargesheet later named the four officials, who were subsequently suspended.

TVK fields two ex-AIADMK MLAs in October 6 bypolls

CHENNAI

THE ruling TVK in Tamil Nadu on Thursday announced former AIADMK legislators K. Maragatham Kumaravel and P. Sathyabama as its candidates for the October 6 Assembly by-elections in Madurantakam and Dharapuram, respectively.

The nominations confirm that both leaders will seek to return to the Assembly from the constituencies they represented before resigning on May 25 and switching allegiance to the TVK.

Their departure from the AIADMK and resignation as legislators created the two vacancies. Madurantakam and Dharapuram are reserved constituencies. The Election Commission has scheduled polling for October 6, while votes will be counted on October 9.

Maragatham Kumaravel, a former Madurantakam MLA, is now the deputy general secretary of the TVK. Sathyabama, who previously represented Dharapuram, serves as the TVK’s Tiruppur South-East district secretary.

Their selection was widely anticipated after party sources



indicated, soon after their induction, that they would be offered another opportunity to contest.

TVK president and Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay urged party office-bearers and cadres to work together to ensure a decisive victory for both candidates. He said Maragatham Kumaravel and Sathyabama would enter the contest as nominees of the Secular Social Justice Victory Alliance.

The announcement sets the stage for closely watched contests involving the state’s principal political formations. The DMK has named I. Paranthaman for Madurantakam and S. Suganya

for Dharapuram.

The AIADMK, meanwhile, is preparing to reclaim the two seats it lost following the resignations and has approached its alliance partners, including the BJP, for support.

For the TVK, the by-elections will be an important political test after forming the government. By fielding the two defectors, the party has chosen candidates with prior electoral experience, established local networks and familiarity with the constituencies.

The AIADMK is expected to portray the contests as an opportunity to regain its former strongholds, while the



DMK will seek to capitalise on a multi-cornered fight.

Campaigning is likely to intensify once nominations are completed, with alliance strength, local issues and the candidates’ personal influence expected to shape the outcome.

Both constituencies will therefore draw statewide attention as parties test their organisational machinery and attempt to consolidate support among Scheduled Caste voters within them. The results will also offer an early indication of voter sentiment towards the Vijay government and the changing political alignments in Tamil Nadu.

Auto unions announce September 19 stir

CHENNAI

AUTO-RICKSHAW trade unions in Tamil Nadu have announced a protest in Chennai on September 19, intensifying pressure on the Vijay government to revise fares that have remained unchanged for 13 years.

The Federation of Auto-Rickshaw Trade Unions said drivers would assemble near Rajarathinam Stadium in Egmore, demanding an immediate government order on revised meter fares.

Union representatives said nearly five lakh drivers across the state were struggling with higher fuel, maintenance and insurance costs. The decision follows three rounds of consultations held with the Transport Department since the Vijay

government assumed office in May.

At the latest meeting on August 27, unions submitted a fare chart proposing a minimum charge of Rs 60 to Rs 70 for the first 1.5 km and Rs 25 to Rs 30 for every additional kilometre. Passenger representatives who attended the consultations supported the demand, union leaders said.

The federation has now consolidated its demand at Rs 60 for the first 1.5 km and Rs 30 for every subsequent kilometre, along with separate waiting and night charges. It said repeated discussions had produced no firm assurance.

Drivers had expected a decision during the Assembly

debate on the Transport Department’s demand for grants. However, Transport Minister A. Vijay Tamilan Parthiban said that an announcement would be made soon, disappointing the unions.

A government committee had earlier recommended, in 2024, a base fare of Rs 40 and Rs 18 for each additional kilometre. That proposal remained pending. Following the consultations, officials were understood to be considering a higher recommendation of Rs 50 as the base fare and Rs 22 to Rs 25 for every additional kilometre. The State Home (Transport) Department must take the final decision, the unions said. The last revision,



introduced in 2013, fixed the minimum fare at Rs 25 for the first 1.8 km and Rs 12 for each additional kilometre. Unions argue that those rates bear little relation to present operating expenses and have made meter-based services unviable.

Commuters, meanwhile, have complained that airport-based aggregators impose surge pricing, while some driv-

ers demand amounts above displayed estimates.

Transport activists have called for an enforceable fare structure, tighter regulation of aggregators and action on complaints. Officials said the revision would be based on the committee’s recommendations, but the unions maintained that only a time-bound order could avert agitation.

TN to run 5,400 special buses for Vinayaka Chaturthi rush

CHENNAI

TAMIL Nadu’s State Transport Undertakings will operate 5,400 special buses over five days to handle the expected surge in passenger traffic ahead of Vinayaka Chaturthi, auspicious wedding dates and the extended weekend. The additional services will run from Thursday to Monday, connecting Chennai with major towns and cities across Tamil Nadu and neighbouring states.

The transport department has planned the largest share of services from Kilambakkam bus terminus, the principal departure point for south-bound routes. A total of 585 special buses will leave

Kilambakkam on Thursday, followed by 1,255 on Friday, 1,030 on Saturday and 650 on Sunday.

These buses will serve Tiruvannamalai, Tiruchy, Kumbakonam, Madurai, Tirunelveli, Nagercoil, Kaniyakumari, Thoothukudi, Coimbatore, Salem, Erode and Tirupur. Koyambedu will also handle additional services during the holiday period.

The transport corporations will operate 240 special buses from the terminus on Friday and Saturday, besides 105 services on Sunday. They will connect Chennai with Tiruvannamalai, Nagapattinam, Velankanni, Hosur and Bengaluru.

Anti-Indian sentiment in US can derail trade relationship

A social media post by the US Department of Homeland Security has created a furore among Indian immigrants in the North American country. The social media post on platform X had an AI-generated poster featuring ‘Transformers’ character Optimus Prime and a brown man with a written message of “Self-deport or find out”. Just a few days back, the US Department of Labour has suspended Permanent Labour Certification Filings- widely known as PERM- of Cognizant as the US authorities investigate alleged fraud in the immigration programme. PERM is a key route for employers to get employment-based green cards for the foreign workers, whom they bring in to the US for executing project work.

Notably, Cognizant is a Nas-

daq-listed company though it was founded by people of Indian-origin. Many believe that the investigation may widen its ambit to other large Indian IT firms in coming days. These two developments in the US shows that anti-immigration sentiment in the US is at its peak.

Surprisingly, most of the hate speech and social media posts are directed at Indians as a major section of Indian immigrants are successful professionals. The MAGA supporter base of Donald Trump is actively flaring such anti-India sentiment. Since the first day of Trump as the President of the US, immigration from India has been facing huge issues.

It began with humiliating eviction of illegal Indians staying in the US. The memory is still fresh how

people were deported in planes with their hands and legs tied on chains. Then came a wave of measures restricting movement of professionals through H1B visa route. H1B- the most popular temporary work visa- has seen entry fee raised to around \$100,000.

Moreover, procedural delay has crept in. Visa appointments are being cancelled abruptly. Visa application processing is also facing undue delay. Amid such restrictive measures, the visa applications of Indian IT companies have gone down significantly. These measures by the US administration show that Indians are no longer welcome in the US.

For decades, the bright and wealthy in India aspire to work and settle in the US. Given the current measures, it seems the route

is slowly getting closed with active discouragement from the US government. Against this backdrop, it is worth evaluating the impact of such a development. For more than three decades, India and the US’ tech industry has been very closely integrated.

From unhindered flow of people to capital, India & US relationship has been built on mutual interest. The ongoing anti-India sentiment is likely to impact that relationship. When companies are no longer allowed to send professionals to the US, they have to shift much of the work back home as the US doesn't have the required STEM talent.

Moreover, rising people-to-people relationship is responsible for more Indian students opting for higher studies in the US. As restrictions pile up, slowly Indian

students are opting for other locations than the US. Though the diplomatic relationship remains strong between India and the US despite irritants, the emerging dynamics in the immigration front will show up in the policy making at some point of time. And that will not be pleasant.

Currently, the Indian startup ecosystem has close relationship with their counterparts in the US. Many leading fund houses of America have been investing billions in India. If anti-India rhetoric continues, decoupling to some extent is expected. All-in-all, derailment of relationship between India and the US may create a lose-lose situation for both nations. In this perspective, some sense of wisdom should prevail among policymakers on both sides.

‘Purification’ corrodes democratic culture

THIS refers to “Dalits up in arms over purification of road after dapuu protest at Erravalli” (Sept 10). Purification rituals after political rallies revives the old caste practice of untouchability, now reengineered as a weapon of party rivalry. When parties extend this symbolism into rallies by “cleansing” spaces, they are essentially staging caste-like differentiation in political form’. This is not just ritualistic excess; it corrodes democratic culture. Instead of debating ideas, parties are dramatising purity versus pollution, which questions the very notion of equal citizenship.

THE MENTAL HEALTH OF OUR SOCIETY

THERE is a mental health crisis around us that we rarely acknowledge. When we speak of mental health, we usually think of depression, anxiety, addiction, loneliness or other clinically recognised conditions. These are undoubtedly serious concerns and deserve professional attention. But there is another, less visible crisis unfolding in our homes, workplaces, friendships and communities, a deterioration in the emotional health of society itself.

I call them the social diseases of our times. They are not psychiatric diagnoses. They are patterns of behaviour, attitudes and emotional dysfunction that are becoming so widespread that they are beginning to influence the way we relate to one another. They manifest themselves in broken relationships, toxic workplaces, bitter family disputes, fractured friendships, workplace politics and an extraordinary inability to disagree without becoming disagreeable.

The paradox is striking. We have never been more connected, yet we seem increasingly incapable of connecting with one another. As someone who has spent years observing organisations, leadership and human behaviour through the lens of Emotional Intelligence, I believe that six particular social diseases deserve our urgent attention.

1. The disease of insufficient consideration

Perhaps the most fundamental social disease today is our declining ability to consider the feelings, circumstances and dignity of another person. We are becoming increasingly self-referential. What I want, what I feel, what I deserve and what I think mostly takes precedence over what another person may be experiencing.

Consideration is not weakness. It is not submission. It is the simple ability to pause before acting and ask: “How will this affect the other person?” In families, this disease appears when spouses stop considering each other’s emotional needs. In workplaces, it appears when leaders treat employees as resources rather than

people. In society, it appears when inconvenience to oneself becomes more important than the legitimate needs of others.

The tragedy is that consideration costs very little. A little patience, courtesy, listening and sensitivity can prevent enormous emotional damage. Yet our increasingly hurried, competitive and individualistic lifestyles seem to be eroding precisely these qualities.

2. Chronic jealousy and the comparison syndrome

Jealousy has always existed. What has changed is its scale, visibility and frequency. Social media has transformed life into a continuous comparison exercise. Someone else’s holiday, house, career, children, wealth, marriage, social circle or success becomes a benchmark against which we quietly measure our own lives.

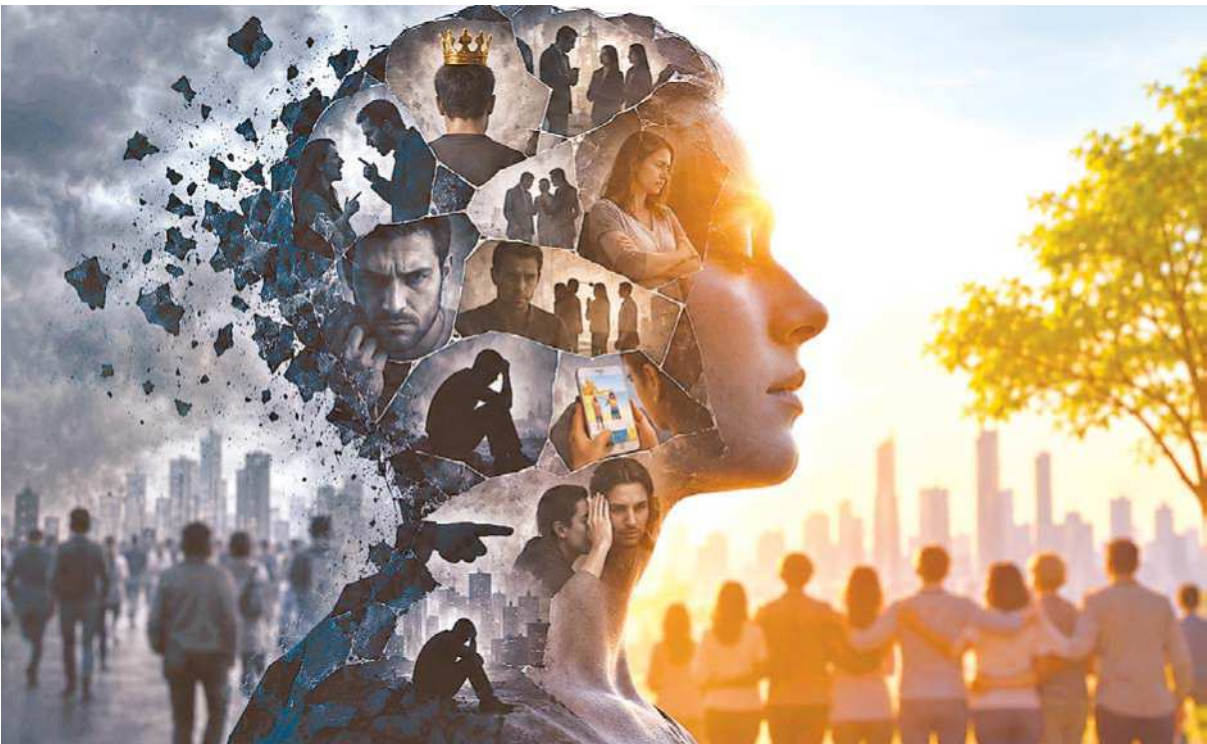
The result is a generation that is increasingly uncomfortable with another person’s success. Healthy competition can inspire us. Chronic jealousy destroys us. It makes us question the motives of successful people, diminish their achievements and sometimes even derive satisfaction from their failures. In organisations, jealousy produces unhealthy politics, withholding of information, sabotage, non-cooperation and resistance to talented colleagues. In families, it can create lifelong resentments between siblings and relatives.

The emotionally intelligent person understands a profound truth: “Another person’s success does not diminish one’s own worth”. We need to move from comparison to self-evaluation, from resentment to genuine appreciation.

3. The trust deficit

Trust is the invisible infrastructure of every healthy relationship. When trust disappears, communication becomes guarded, intentions are questioned, even innocent actions are interpreted suspiciously and relationships become exhausting.

We increasingly live in an environment of suspicion. We doubt what people say. We question motives. We assume hidden agendas. We demand proof where faith and goodwill once existed. The consequences are particularly damaging in families. When trust between spouses deteriorates, every disagreement becomes evidence of betrayal. Financial decisions become sources of suspicion. Friendships become transactional. Even professional relationships suffer when col-



leagues spend more energy protecting themselves than collaborating.

A trust deficit also has an enormous organisational cost. Organisations with low trust require more controls, more approvals, more monitoring and more bureaucracy. Decisions slow down and Innovation suffers. Employees become defensive rather than entrepreneurial. Trust, however, cannot be demanded. It has to be earned through consistency, transparency and integrity.

4. Weaponised communication - the disease of the sharp tongue

Words have always had the power to heal or hurt. Today, however, we seem to be losing our restraint. We speak impulsively, respond instantly and often use words not to communicate but to hurt and caused wounds. The sharp tongue has become a weapon. Sarcasm is mistaken for intelligence and Insults are disguised as honesty. Public humiliation is defined as “telling it like it is”. Arguments quickly become abusive and personal. And once hurtful words are spoken, apologies often arrive too late to repair the damage. Imagine this is happening across all relationships, spouses, colleagues and even between young children and their parents.

Emotional Intelligence demands something very different: the ability to regulate the emotion before expression. Not every thought needs to be spoken. Not every provocation requires a response.

5. Emotional volatility

Another disturbing feature of our times is our declining capacity to regulate emotions. Small disagreements become major confrontations. Frustration quickly becomes anger and a difference of opinion becomes a personal attack.

We increasingly react before we reflect. Emotional volatility is particularly destructive because emotions are contagious. One person’s uncontrolled anger can destabilise an entire family,

team or organisation. A volatile leader creates fear. A volatile parent creates insecurity. A volatile spouse creates an environment in which everyone learns to walk on eggshells.

Emotional regulation does not mean suppressing emotions. It means managing them intelligently.

One of the defining characteristics of emotionally intelligent people is their ability to create a small but enormously important space between what they feel and how they respond. That space is where maturity resides.

6. The disease of entitlement

Perhaps the most corrosive disease of all is entitlement, the belief that we are owed attention, respect, success, money, loyalty, recognition or preferential treatment simply because we expect it. Entitlement quietly destroys gratitude.

It makes people focus on what they have not received rather than what they have. It turns relationships into transactions: What have you done for me? What have you given me? What do I get in return?

In marriages, entitlement can turn partnership into scorekeeping. In families, it can create permanent grievances between generations. In organisations, it produces employees who demand rewards without accepting corresponding responsibility and leaders who expect loyalty without demon-

strating fairness.

A healthy society must rediscover the difference between rights and privileges, expectations and gratitude, entitlement and responsibility. The question cannot always be, “What do I deserve?”, Sometimes it must be, “What do I owe?”

The social cost

These six diseases may appear individually insignificant. Collectively, they are enormously expensive. The cost is visible in rising family conflict, broken marriages, estranged children and parents, workplace toxicity, employee disengagement, declining trust, social polarisation and increasing loneliness.

There is also massive, quantifiable economic cost. Organisations pay for poor emotional intelligence through attrition, conflict, absenteeism, lost productivity, leadership failures and internal politics. Families pay through legal battles, counselling expenses, financial disputes and years of emotional estrangement. Society pays through declining social cohesion and an increasing burden on institutions that are forced to manage problems that could often have been prevented through better human behaviour.

And slowly, something fundamental changes: we begin to normalise dysfunction. That is perhaps the most dangerous consequence of all.

Can We Cure These Social Diseases?

The answer is yes, but there is no medication, app or government programme that can cure them. 5

The cure begins with self-awareness. We must become conscious of our own behaviour before judging the behaviour of others. We must learn to ask ourselves uncomfortable questions:

Am I sufficiently considerate? Do I become jealous of another person’s success? Do people trust me? Do my words heal or hurt? Can I control my emotions when provoked? Am I grateful or perpetually entitled? - These questions belong in our homes, schools and workplaces.

We need to teach Emotional Intelligence as seriously as we teach academic intelligence. Children should learn empathy, listening, conflict resolution, emotional regulation, gratitude and respectful disagreement as fundamental life skills.

Families must create cultures where difficult conversations can take place without humiliation. Couples must learn that winning an argument is often less important than preserving the relationship and parents must model the emotional behaviour they expect from their children.

Organisations, too, must recognise that Emotional Intelligence is not a soft corporate accessory. It is a strategic capability. Leaders who cannot regulate themselves, influenced by rumours, handle disagreement and build trust eventually become liabilities to the organisations they lead.

And perhaps most importantly, we need to rediscover the virtues that modern life is slowly pushing to the margins: kindness, patience, humility, gratitude, restraint, empathy and respect. None of these qualities is old-fashioned.

Chandrababu puts AP on war footing

- 54.9% rainfall deficit, reservoir storage down to 49 per cent; drinking water, fodder get top priority
- 36 irrigation projects to be fast-tracked; new paddy cultivation barred outside Godavari Delta
- Collectors told to prepare lists of insured crops and ensure farmers cultivate the crops

CHIEF Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has directed collectors and officials to prepare for the worsening impact of El Nino, with priority on preventing drinking water and fodder shortages, protecting crops and containing any rise in essential commodity prices.

Addressing the first day of the Collectors' Confer-

ence at the Secretariat on Thursday, Chandrababu said the government must ensure that neither farmers nor consumers bear the burden of the weather crisis. He ordered officials to create awareness among farmers about El Nino, assess future crop demand and promote less water-intensive crops such as pulses, onions and millets, besides encouraging multi-cropping and activating Rythu Bazaars.

He also stressed crop insurance awareness, directing collectors to prepare lists of insured crops and ensure farmers cultivate the crops covered by their policies so that they do not lose insurance benefits in the event of damage.

Water resources special chief secretary Shashi Bhushan Kumar said Andhra Pradesh had received only 206.7 mm rainfall against the normal 457.9 mm between June 1 and September 7, a 54.9 per cent deficit. Reservoir storage stood at 638 TMC, or 49 per cent, against

1,023 TMC during the same period last year.

The CM directed that available water be prioritised for drinking needs of people and livestock, followed by fodder and life-saving irrigation for perennial horticultural crops. New paddy cultivation should be prohibited outside the Godavari Delta, while semi-dry crops should depend on farm ponds and micro-irrigation. Pattiseema has so far diverted 39.5 TMC of Godavari water to the Krishna Delta. Chan-

drababu said the government would take strict action against canal water theft.

The CM set a two-and-half years target for completing 36 priority irrigation projects to create 17 lakh acres of new command area and stabilise 33.4 lakh acres. He said early completion would be incentivised and ordered collectors to personally resolve land acquisition and rehabilitation issues. He also directed departments to prepare plans for uninterrupted drink-

ing water supply through the coming summer, fill tanks wherever possible and transport water from nearby sources to deficit areas. Jaladhara works, including trench excavation, should continue without interruption, while departments should coordinate groundwater recharge and tank-filling measures.

Agriculture special chief secretary B Rajasekhar said El Nino's impact could intensify by February 2027. Kharif cultivation stood at 22.82 lakh hectares, 74 per cent of normal, with a shift towards less water-intensive crops. An additional Rs 90 crore was sanctioned for seed contingency, while crop insurance coverage expanded to 16.92 lakh hectares.

Chandrababu said he would review the El Nino situation every week and undertake field visits, directing ministers, collectors and public representatives to remain active on the ground and ensure that the crisis does not translate into losses for farmers or consumers.

Low-pressure area to bring moderate to heavy rains in north Andhra

A low-pressure area has formed over the north Bay of Bengal and adjoining areas and is likely to bring moderate to heavy rainfall in the North Andhra districts over the next two days, said Prakar Jain, Managing Director of the Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA).

He said strong winds with speeds of 40-50 kmph and gusting up to 60 kmph were likely along the North Coastal Andhra coast. He advised people to remain alert and take necessary precautions. As the sea was likely to remain rough with high waves,

fishermen were advised not to venture into the sea.

On Friday, moderate thundershowers were likely at some places in Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Parvathipuram Manyam and Alluri Sitarama Raju districts.

Light to moderate thundershowers were expected at isolated places in Polavaram, Visakhapatnam, Anakapalli, Kakinada, Konaseema, West Godavari and Krishna districts. The remaining districts were likely to receive scattered light rainfall.

On Saturday, moderate thundershowers are likely at some places in Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Parvathipuram Manyam, Alluri Sita-

rama Raju and Polavaram districts.

Isolated light to moderate thundershowers are expected in Visakhapatnam, Anakapalli, Kakinada, Konaseema, East Godavari and West Godavari districts. Jain said heavy rainfall had already been recorded in parts of Anakapalli district by 5 p.m. on Thursday. Darlapudi received 37 mm of rainfall, while Nanginarapadu and Uderu recorded 34.5 mm each. Paravada received 34.2 mm and Gandhavam recorded 33.5 mm.

The APSDMA advised people in vulnerable areas to remain cautious and follow official weather and disaster-management advisories.

Bengaluru-bound bus catches fire, all 22 aboard safe

ALL 22 people aboard a Bengaluru-bound sleeper bus were safely evacuated after the vehicle caught fire near here in this district on Thursday, police said.

The bus, carrying 19 passengers and three staff members, was travelling from Repalle in Bapatla district to Bengaluru when the incident occurred.

"The Bengaluru-bound private sleeper bus travelling from Repalle in Bapatla district caught fire near Ojili, but all 22 people

on board, 19 passengers and three staff members, were safely evacuated and nobody was injured," an official said.

The bus, operated by a private travel company based in Ongole, had started from Repalle at around 6 pm on Wednesday.

When the bus reached Ojili, the driver noticed smoke and a burning smell coming from the engine at the front of the vehicle, the official said. He immediately alerted everyone and evacuated all the passengers and staff. All 19

passengers and three staff members got down safely and removed their luggage before the bus caught fire. The flames quickly spread through the vehicle, which had been parked on the side of the road. "We reached the spot with a fire engine, managed the traffic and brought the flames under control. Nobody was injured, and only the bus was burnt," he said. The bus was suspected to have caught fire due to a short circuit, he said, adding that officials inspected the spot to assess the incident. (PTI)

Naidu moots land bank portal to unlock unused govt land

Naidu said a comprehensive picture of government land availability would emerge upon completion of the ongoing survey. Land scarcity, he stressed, should not become an obstacle to development. Officials should identify and reserve land requirements for industrial and other projects in advance rather than start searching only after projects are sanctioned.

The Chief Minister asked departments and collectors to prepare calendars with clear deadlines and utilise the Collectors' Conference for achieving measurable outcomes. Collectors, he said, should monitor all departmental development programmes in their districts, resolve inter-departmental issues, and take speedy decisions, instead of merely passing responsibility to others. Citing his own case as an example, Naidu said he plans his own schedule three months ahead, holding SIPB meetings every month, Cabinet meetings every fortnight, and Collectors' Conferences every three months, besides spending four days a month in the field interacting with people. He advised Collectors to similarly plan their schedules and take into account the priorities of the Union government. Referring to the social welfare front,

the Chief Minister directed officials to immediately issue orders extending benefits available to Scheduled Castes to the Budaga Jangam community, pending the decision on their SC status. He also directed officials to link skill-development programmes with industries and complete curriculum, equipment, and other requirements within 90 days. Reviewing housing schemes, Chandrababu called for speedy completion of already sanctioned houses and phased implementation of additional houses. He said Andhra Pradesh could receive sanction for another 1.5 lakh houses shortly. In view of prevailing El Nino conditions, the Chief Minister directed officials to expedite emergency drinking water works across the state. He asked departments to also prepare in advance for the plantation season to achieve the target of 50 per cent green cover, with 20 crore seeds and saplings to be kept ready. Officials were asked to promote less water-intensive varieties, prioritise water conservation, and encourage pre-monsoon dry sowing. The Chief Minister further directed officials to take up with the Union government the matter relating to the establishment of 905 smart kitchens across Andhra Pradesh.

Building owner locks tahsildar office over 2 years' unpaid rent

A building owner locked the Tahsildar office in Palakeedumandal of Suryapet district on Thursday, alleging that the authorities had failed to pay the rent due to him for the past two years.

According to building owner Kasireddy Janardhan Reddy, the government is required to pay a monthly rent of Rs13,800 for the premises. However, he alleged that the rent had not been paid for the past two years. With no resolution despite repeatedly bringing the issue to the notice of officials, he finally locked the Tahsildar office.

Reddy stated two years would be completed on September 19 since the rent payments stopped.

He alleged that officials had assured him that the monthly rent would be paid



regularly, but the payments were not made.

He also claimed that the authorities had agreed to increase the rent by five per cent once every two years, but the promised revision had also not been implemented. Expressing frustration over the delay, the building owner said he had approached several people regarding the pending rent but received no satisfactory response. With no other option left, he said he was compelled to lock the Tahsil-

dar office to draw attention to the issue.

Palakeedumandal of Huzurnagar constituency of Suryapet district was newly formed in Suryapet district in 2016. As the newly established mandal did not have a government building to accommodate its offices, the authorities have been operating various government offices from rented premises. The Tahsildar office has also been functioning from a rented building since then.

International air connectivity from Tirupati gets big push

FLY91 founder, Managing Director and CEO Manoj Chacko said Tirupati was an important addition to the airline's network. He said the new routes were aimed at strengthening connections between regional centres and meeting the travel requirements of local communities. The airline's expansion follows its firm order for 40 ATR 72-600 aircraft from French manufacturer ATR, supporting its plans to widen regional air connectivity across the country. Meanwhile, the inaugural flight was welcomed at Tirupati airport with the customary water cannon salute by the Fire Department of Airports Authority of India. Airport Director D Boominathan and other dignitaries handed over the first boarding pass to a passenger followed by the cake cutting ceremony at Tirupati Airport.

DGCA ORDERS DRUG TEST FOR ALL PILOTS

Last month, Naidu had said that the Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) suggested to DGCA that all pilots should undergo a dope test once a year, against the current regulation that requires 10% of the pilots to undergo random testing annually. According to sources, while the DGCA was already in the process of revising the regulations pertaining to testing of aviation personnel for psychoactive substances, the Air India incident led to calls for more stringent drug testing protocol and stricter disciplinary action

in proven instances of drug abuse. Even as consultations for revising the rules were on, the regulator decided to put all airline pilots through a one-time drug test over the course of nearly 12 months.

An Air India Airbus A320 aircraft — VT-EXO — operating from Phuket to Delhi on August 4 encountered a sudden 300-feet altitude drop, causing injuries to 20 passengers and four cabin crew members, and 17 of the 24 had to be hospitalised. The aircraft had 137 passengers, six cabin crew members, and two pilots on board. In its prelimi-

nary investigation report, Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) flagged a sudden and brief triple hydraulic failure and the 34-year-old pilot-in-command's non-negative drug test report.

The AAIB also issued a recommendation to regulator Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) to take actions deemed fit to prevent abuse of psychoactive substances, although it did not say whether or not the purported use of drugs by the pilot-in-command was directly linked to the incident.

Officials said Andhra Pradesh has 23.85 lakh MSMEs across manufacturing, services and trade. Of 175 proposed MSME parks, 138 have been approved, with 22 operational and 116 under construction.

These parks are expected to attract Rs 2,036 crore and create 31,163 jobs.

Investment conferences will be held in Visakhapatnam, Kakinada, Amaravati, Anantapur and Tirupati, with regional meets planned in October and a partnership summit in November. Naidu also directed officials to notify existing helipads and link them with tourism, besides preparing proposals for night-landing facilities at district headquarters with Central approval. He ordered an action plan for Road Over Bridges and Road under Bridges and called for coordinated progress in development, investment and infrastructure across districts.

India pushes Global South priorities amid trade tensions

As global trade disputes and geopolitical realignments create economic headwinds, India is looking at addressing critical vulnerabilities in food security, energy stability and resilient supply chains, they said. The summit in New Delhi is taking place against the backdrop of a global economy facing the adverse impacts of the Russia-Ukraine war, the West Asia crisis, especially the blockade of the Strait of Hormuz, and the Trump administration's trade and tariff policies.

With just a day left before the summit, it remains unclear whether the member nations of the grouping

have reached a consensus on a joint statement, as differences between Iran and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) over the West Asia crisis persist. The grouping operates under a framework of consensus.

BRICS, originally comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa, expanded in 2024 to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, the United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia, with Indonesia joining in 2025.

Belarus, Bolivia, Kazakhstan, Cuba, Malaysia, Nigeria, Thailand, Uganda, Uzbekistan and Vietnam became BRICS partner countries last year.

BRICS has emerged as

an influential grouping as it brings together 11 major emerging economies of the world, representing around 49.5 per cent of the global population, around 40 per cent of the global GDP and around 26 per cent of global trade.

India's chairship of the grouping is centred on four pillars: resilience, innovation, cooperation and sustainability. In addition to these areas, the leaders will exchange views on strengthening intra-BRICS cooperation on common priorities and share perspectives on global and regional matters of mutual importance, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

Court frames charges against Lalu, family under PMLA act

The court also said that the land transferred at Patna is proceeds of crime. "The proceeds of crime were enjoyed by the Lalu Family," Special Judge Vishal Gogne directed that charges be framed against the accused persons under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act. The court has directed the accused persons to appear before the Rouse Avenue court on October 3 before Special Judge Prashant Kumar. The court has discharged the accused persons, namely: Gaurav Gupta, Nath Mal Kakrania, Rahul Yadav, Vijay Tripathi, Deoki Nandan Tulshyan, Rajiv Kumar Relan, Abhishek Finance Private Limited. While framing the charges, the court said that Lalu Prasad Yadav, the then Railway Minister, fixed a tender of an IRCTC hotel in favour of his favourite company in lieu of a land Parcel. The Land at Patna was described as proceeds of crime by the ED. The court also said that it did not find that the investigation against Lalu Prasad Yadav was motivated by political vendetta.

S-400, BrahMos on table at Modi-Putin meet

India signed a \$5.43 billion (Rs 40,000 crore) deal with Russia in October 2018 for five S-400 Triumf regiments. Four have already been delivered and are operational. Three squadrons are deployed in Punjab, Rajasthan and the Jammu sector against Pakistan, while one is deployed in the north against China.

The S-400 was credited with a 300+ km intercept -- the longest-ever kill in Operation Sindoor in May 2025 -- taking up a Pakistani AEW&C aircraft and helping establish air dominance. The fifth and final squadron was delayed due to the Russia-Ukraine war. It is now assured for delivery by November 2026.

Peskov also said the two countries were jointly produc-

ing BrahMos missiles and that it was time to consider upgrading them. "We are jointly producing the BrahMos missiles, and it is time to think about improving those missiles, adding some additional characteristics, making them more competitive in the market and more effective," he said.

The BrahMos-NG (Next Generation) is a lighter 1.3-tonne missile compared with the 2.9-tonne BrahMos. It is smaller, has a speed of Mach 3.5 and a range of 400 km-plus, and can be carried by Tejas and MiG-29 fighter jets -- allowing six to seven missiles per fighter compared with one on the Su-30MKI at present.

Russia still accounts for 40% of India's arms imports from the 2021-25 period, down from 51%.

IT'S CERTAIN: Xi to visit India for BRICS Summit

"I have no information to provide regarding the question you raised," Guo Jiankun replied to a question on if the Chinese leader will be travelling to India this weekend to attend the BRICS leaders' meeting. The high-stakes visit marks Xi's first visit to India in seven years, following a chill in bilateral relations after the 2020 Galwan Valley border clashes that killed 20 Indians and an unknown number of Chinese soldiers. The last time Xi visited India was in 2019 for an informal summit with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Mamallapuram near Chennai.

Xi had first come to India in September 2014 when it was the first terms of both the leaders in office and had later visited Goa in 2016 to attend the BRICS summit. Bilateral ties between the two nations have improved in recent years, especially since PM Modi visited China last year and as both nations grapple with volatile relationships with the US. New Delhi has since then eased some of the restrictions on Chinese investment that it imposed following the 2020 clashes, focusing on electronics, capital goods, and solar cell sectors.

A saree purchase rarely begins and ends with whether the design is attractive. In our conversations with customers, women often ask practical questions first. Will the fabric feel heavy after a few hours? Is it easy to drape? Does it need special care? Can it be worn again after the wedding? These questions reveal what now shapes the purchase. Design may attract attention, but usefulness often decides what a woman takes home.

This is especially clear among women who want to wear sarees beyond major weddings. They are buying them for office celebrations, family lunches, religious occasions, festive dinners and smaller functions.

A beautiful saree that needs constant adjusting will not serve all these settings. Its weight, fall, softness and breathability matter. Even when choosing silk, customers pay attention to how comfortably they can

The consumer is also better informed. Terms such as "pure silk" or "traditional weave" are no longer enough on their own. Shoppers want clear information about the fabric, weaving style, zari, care requirements and price. When considering a Kanchi pattu or Mysore silk saree, they want to understand what distinguishes

guishes it and why that difference matters. This does not weaken the appeal of heritage. It allows women to appreciate the craft while knowing exactly what they are paying for.

Versatility also enters the decision. Many women consider the blouse, jewellery and future occasions before finalising a saree. They want to know whether it can be styled differently for a family wedding, a festival or a formal event. Versatility does not mean choosing something plain. It means selecting a saree that leaves room for personal styling and does not become limited to a single photograph or occasion.

The way women shop has changed as well. A saree may first catch their attention on Instagram, but the decision depends on accurate colours, close-up visuals and useful product details. Inside a store, customers value someone who understands the occasion, explains the options and respects the stated budget. Good service is not about presenting the largest number of sarees. It is about helping the customer make a choice she will remain satisfied with.

Perhaps the most important shift is that more women are choosing sarees for themselves. Family traditions and recommendations still carry meaning, but the final choice is increasingly personal. One woman may choose a classic silk because it reminds her of her mother. Another may pick an unexpected colour simply because it feels right on her. The saree is not being worn only to meet an expectation. It is being used to express individual taste.

For a saree brand, these changes affect everything from product selection to customer service. Visual appeal still opens the conversation, but comfort, authenticity, rewear value, styling freedom and honest guidance complete the purchase.

The new Indian saree consumer is not moving away from tradition. She simply expects it to fit the way she lives now. When a saree feels right, wears well and is explained honestly, she has a reason to return.

Through such presentations, we hope to inspire the present generation and future generations to remain connected with our traditions, culture and Sanatana Dharma."

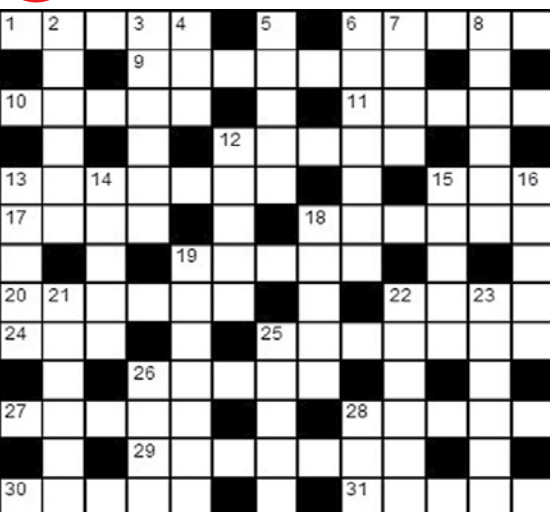

State limits Vande Mataram to first two stanzas at govt events

THE government has ordered that only the first two stanzas of 'Vande Mataram' be sung at most state government programmes, instead of all six stanzas, amid a national debate over the rendition of the patriotic song. The order follows the

state Cabinet's decision on the manner in which the song should be performed at official functions. The government has cited the need to maintain uniformity, dignity and appropriate protocol during various government programmes and ceremonies. According to the order issued by the Department of Personnel and Administrative

Reforms, the first two stanzas of 'Vande Mataram' will be sung at state government events, except programmes attended by the President, Vice-President, Prime Minister or Governor. The government noted that 'Vande Mataram' played an important role during India's freedom movement in fostering nationalism, unity and

patriotic sentiment among people. The order also refers to guidelines issued by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs regarding the official version of the song and its performance at government and public functions. The guidelines distinguish between playing the song and mass singing, depending on the nature of an event.

The Karnataka decision comes amid discussions within political circles over whether the complete version or only selected stanzas should be performed at official functions. Congress leaders at the national level have referred to a 1937 resolution under which the first two stanzas were accepted for public rendition.



Lalbagh spared from proposed tunnel exit ; govt seeks alternative site

THE proposed tunnel road in Bengaluru will no longer have an exit near Lalbagh, with the Karnataka government deciding to look for another location amid concerns over damage to the city's iconic green space.

The earlier proposal to build a tunnel exit close to Lalbagh had faced resistance from residents and environmental activists. They had warned that the construction could consume or damage a considerable portion of the garden area. Following the objections, the government has decided against proceeding with the Lalbagh site. Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar has instructed the Greater Bengaluru Authority to identify another location that can accommodate the proposed tunnel exit.

The change in plan is aimed at ensuring that the infrastruc-

ture project does not come at the expense of Lalbagh's valuable green cover and open spaces. The tunnel road is among the major infrastructure proposals being considered to address Bengaluru's persistent traffic congestion. The project envisages underground connectivity as an alternative to adding more surface-level roads in the already congested city. However, the proposal has also triggered concerns about its impact on existing public spaces and the environment. Lalbagh, with its extensive vegetation and heritage significance, has emerged as one of the most sensitive points in the project. Residents and environmentalists had opposed the proposed exit, arguing that construction in the area could have a lasting impact on the garden. Their protests appear to have prompted the government to reconsider the location.

Shivakumar govt moving in the right direction, says Siddaramaiah

FORMER Chief Minister Siddaramaiah said governments must remain accountable to the people and urged the D K Shivakumar-led government to fulfil all the promises made in the Congress manifesto during the remaining period of its tenure.

Speaking after inaugurating the programme "Drudha Karnataka Sankalpa, Successful Completion of 100 Days" at the Vidhana Soudha Banquet Hall on Wednesday, Siddaramaiah said the completion of 100 days should not be viewed merely as a celebration, but as an opportunity for the government to present its performance before the people and assess whether it was moving in the right direction.

"We are in a democratic system where the people are the masters. What matters is whether the promises made to the people are being implemented. Governments have a responsibility to remain accountable to the people," he said. Siddaramaiah stressed the



need to eliminate social inequality, poverty and unemployment and work towards creating an egalitarian society. He said elected governments had a responsibility to uphold the ideals of the Constitution and ensure social, economic and political empowerment for all sections of society.

Defends guarantee schemes

Siddaramaiah said the Congress government had fulfilled its commitment to implement the five guarantee schemes despite criticism from the Opposition and the BJP-led Union Government. Congress leaders had an-

nounced the five guarantees before coming to power on May 20, 2023, and Opposition parties had claimed that the schemes could not be implemented and would push the State into financial distress, he said.

"Within the first year of coming to power, we implemented all five guarantee schemes. The government spends around ₹52,000 crore every year on these schemes. Despite the criticism, the government has borne the expenditure and ensured that the benefits reach the people," he said. He said the schemes were aimed at supporting poor

people belonging to different communities and reducing inequality. Siddaramaiah urged the government to continue the guarantee schemes despite criticism, stating that such programmes were necessary to address social and economic inequalities.

'Fulfill all manifesto promises'

Siddaramaiah said a government was not required to implement every manifesto promise within the first year and had five years to fulfil its commitments. He recalled that the Congress manifesto in 2013 contained 165

promises, of which more than 158 were implemented during his tenure as Chief Minister.

"If there is a government that keeps its word, it is the Congress government. We not only fulfilled our promises but also introduced several programmes, including Krishi Bhagya, Ksheera Bhagya and the five guarantee schemes," he said.

He urged the D K Shivakumar-led government to use the remaining tenure to fulfil all the promises made to the people. Siddaramaiah said the Congress government was working on several new ideas and programmes and expressed confidence that the government was moving in the right direction.

He congratulated Chief Minister D K Shivakumar and all members of his Cabinet and urged them not to be distracted by criticism from the Opposition. "D K Shivakumar has worked as Deputy Chief Minister and understands the problems of the State. Do not worry about the criticism from the Opposition," he told the Chief Minister.

ED raids on Jarkiholi's premises politically motivated, says Hebbalkar

FORMER Minister and Belagavi Rural MLA Lakshmi Hebbalkar has strongly condemned the Enforcement Directorate (ED) raids on the residences and offices of Public Works Minister Satish Jarkiholi, terming the action "politically motivated."

In a statement, Hebbalkar alleged that the BJP-led union government was misusing central investigative agencies for political purposes and targeting political opponents. "It is not new for the BJP to misuse investigative agencies under its control instead of confronting political opponents through democratic and fair means. The ED raids on the premises of Satish Jarkiholi are also part of the same po-



litically motivated agenda," she alleged.

Hebbalkar accused the BJP of targeting Congress leaders for political gains as the Congress government in Karnataka continued to implement welfare and development programmes. "Unable to tolerate the people-oriented programmes, development works and achievements of our government, the BJP is targeting Congress leaders politically. Using central

agencies such as the ED and CBI against political opponents is not a healthy development for democracy," she said.

She described Jarkiholi as a senior Congress leader who had made significant contributions to the party and the development of Karnataka. "At a time when attempts are being made to put pressure on him through investigative agencies, the Congress party will stand united and face such attempts," Hebbalkar said.

She asserted that the Congress would extend its full support to Jarkiholi and would not be intimidated by what she described as political manoeuvring.

"The entire Congress party stands with Satish Jarkiholi. There is no question of being afraid of such political

conspiracies. Congress leaders and workers will unitedly face such attempts," she said.

Hebbalkar also urged central investigative agencies to maintain their autonomy and function in an impartial manner. "Political differences should not be settled through investigative agencies. In a democracy, Opposition parties and political opponents should be confronted politically," she said.

She further warned that attempts to intimidate or politically weaken Congress leaders would not succeed.

"If the BJP believes that it can frighten or threaten Congress leaders and weaken them politically, it is mistaken. Congress will always stand with truth and justice and will unitedly face this political conspiracy," Hebbalkar said.

Centre withholds Rs 2,186 crore grant to gram panchayats

State to move Supreme Court: Eshwar Khandre

THE Karnataka government has decided to approach the Supreme Court against the Centre for withholding ₹2,186.20 crore due to the state's Gram Panchayats under the recommendations of the 15th Finance Commission.

Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Minister Eshwar B. Khandre held a meeting with Advocate General Shashikiran Shetty and senior officials at his office on Thursday to discuss the legal course of action. Khandre expressed displeasure over the Centre's refusal to release the ₹2,186.20 crore allocated to Karnataka's Gram Panchayats for 2025-26.

The minister said the Centre's decision assumes significance at a time when Karnataka is facing drought-like conditions due to inadequate rainfall. Drinking water shortages have been reported in 710 villages, with 149 villages receiving water through tankers. The government has also hired 561 private borewells to meet the water requirements.

Khandre said farmers were already facing difficulties as seeds sown in several areas had failed to germinate. The meeting discussed the legal grounds on which the Centre's decision to withhold the funds meant for the state's Gram Panchayats could be challenged before the Supreme Court.

Preparations for gram panchayat elections

The state government is also preparing to conduct elections to Gram Panchayats, Taluk Panchayats and Zilla Panchayats whose terms have expired. Khandre said the elections had been delayed as government staff were deployed for Special Intensive Revision (SIR) work. He said the government was now fully prepared to conduct the Gram Panchayat elections and that a preliminary notification would be issued shortly.

During the meeting, Khandre sought details from Advocate General Shashikiran Shetty and Panchayat Raj Department Secretary D. Randeep on the legal aspects involved in conducting the elections.

AHF Junior Asia Cup 2026

Indian women demolish Pak 19-0, storm into semis

MOQI (CHINA): India produced one of the most emphatic victories of the 2026 Women's Junior Asia Cup, dismantling Pakistan 19-0 in their quarterfinal on Thursday to move within two wins of a third successive continental title.

The defending champions needed only seven minutes to break the deadlock, with Puja Sahoo finding the net. Roshni Aind doubled the advantage two minutes later, and what followed was a relentless Indian assault that left Pakistan struggling to contain the pace and frequency of attacks.

India added four more goals in the next five minutes. Tanushree Dinesh Kadu and Sukhveer Kaur struck in the 11th and 13th minutes respectively, with Sanika Chandrakant Mane also scoring in the 13th minute. Madhu Sidar and Geeta Yadav then extended the advantage before Mane returned to score her second in the 23rd minute. Tanuja Toppo and Pooja Malik completed India's first-half scoring, while Purnima Yadav's 33rd-minute goal ensured the team went into the interval with a staggering



10-0 lead. There was no let-up after the restart. Madhu Sidar scored again in the 39th minute before Supriya opened her account a minute later. Malik then took centre stage, scoring in the 49th and 51st minutes to complete her hat-trick. Krishna Sharma and Binima Dhan added further goals as India continued to pile on the pressure. Supriya struck again in the 54th minute, while Roshni capped the extraordinary performance with her second goal in the final minute of the match.

The 19-goal haul came after India had already demonstrated their strength during the group stage, finishing top after victories over Japan, Malaysia and South Korea.

India will now await the winner of the South Korea-Malay-

sia quarterfinal for their semi-final clash. The result leaves the reigning champions just two victories away from a hat-trick of Junior Women's Asia Cup crowns, having lifted the trophy in 2023 and 2024.

For Pakistan, meanwhile, the quarterfinal turned into a one-sided contest almost from the outset, with India's sustained attacking pressure producing goals across all four quarters.

SC to hear plea against UP legislators' perks

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Thursday sought responses from the Uttar Pradesh government and others on a plea challenging the validity of certain provisions of a 1980 Act which provide for pension and other facilities to sitting and former MLAs and MLCs of the state.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta agreed to hear the plea which challenged a verdict of the Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court in May this year. The high court had dismissed the plea challenging the constitutional validity of certain provisions of the Uttar Pradesh State Legislature (Members' Emoluments and Pension) Act, 1980.

The high court had noted that apparently these provisions confer upon sitting and former MLAs and MLCs a range of salary, allowances and other facilities, and further extend pension, family pension, free travel, medical facilities and other amenities to their spouse, family members and companion.

The top court issued notice on the petition challenging the high court verdict and posted it for hearing after four weeks. The petitioner 'Lok Prahari' had moved the high court contending that the state legislature has, in effect, made itself the "judge in its own cause" and showered benefits upon itself and its former members in a manner that is "manifestly arbitrary" and contrary to the basic constitutional idea that a public office is meant for public service and not for personal gain. "The core grievance of the writ petitioner is that all these provisions travel far beyond the limited power conferred by Article 195 of the Constitution of India, which speaks only of 'salary and allowances' to 'members' and makes no mention of pension, post-retirement benefits, facilities to family/companion or 'other facilities,'" the high court had noted. Article 195 of the Constitution deals with salaries and allowances of members of the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council of a state.

The high court had observed that the challenge mounted by the petitioner was essentially rooted in a policy disagreement rather than any demonstrable Constitutional infirmity.

Suicide of MPSC aspirant

It's a murder by system: Dipke

DHARASHIV: Cockroach Janata Party (CJP) founder Abhijeet Dipke on Thursday termed the suicide of MPSC aspirant Prathamesh Deshmukh as a "murder done by the system", and said the government should ensure that incidents like this do not happen again.

He also said that people were demanding reservation as the government has completely failed in providing quality education and jobs to the youth.

Deshmukh (28), who was preparing for the Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) examinations allegedly died by suicide in Pune with a note left behind by him mentioning that he had a debt of around Rs 2.5 lakh. He was a native of Paranda in Dharashiv, and was staying in a rented accommodation in Navi Peth area while preparing for competitive exams.

Dipke on Thursday visited Khasapuri village in Dharashiv and met Deshmukh's grieving family members.

Talking to reporters later, Dipke said Deshmukh went to Pune with a dream to get a job and take his family out



of poverty. "He borrowed money from friends to meet his expenses. But due to paper leaks and delayed results, pressure mounted on students. This (Deshmukh's suicide) is system's fault and it is a murder done by the system," he alleged.

Deshmukh took the extreme step as he was fed up with the system, unemployment and financial condition of youth in rural areas, the CJP convenor said.

"Prathamesh stayed in Pune and used to have a meal only once a day due to his financial condition. According to his mother, Prathamesh used to say that he would come home in a government car, but unfortunately he was brought here in an ambulance yesterday. His father has already passed away,"

Dipke said.

The MPSC aspirants from the rural areas face a challenge of meeting their expenses in a city like Pune, he added.

"He (Deshmukh) had borrowed Rs 2 lakh to Rs 2.5 lakh from his friends...A youth had to end his life for this much amount. This is the condition of our youth in rural areas because there is no employment," he said.

"Prathamesh was preparing for MPSC exams and we all know what is happening in the MPSC. Exams are not conducted properly, the results are improper and paper leaks also take place. How will the youth from rural areas survive in a city like Pune? How will they pay the money required for library, food, rent and coaching? This

is a question that haunts the youth from rural areas," he said.

"Prathamesh left the village with a dream to become an officer, then how can he return without cracking the exams? For this, he did everything that he could. He stayed there (in Pune) for four years by curtailing his expenses. There are thousands of youths like him," he said.

Talking about the quota issue, Dipke claimed that since people have lost faith in the government they were asking for a constitutional remedy.

"The government cannot give good facilities. If they get good facilities, good schools and education and opportunities, why would anyone ask for reservation? People are asking for reservation because the government has completely failed in giving quality education and providing jobs. People have lost faith in the government so they are seeking constitutional remedies," he said.

Dipke also said the CJP earlier only supported the agitation by the MPSC aspirants, but now it will also get involved in the agitation.

T H I R U V A N A N - THAPURAM: Keralam Minister K Muralaheedharan on Thursday said organ trading must be strictly prevented, but stressed that appeal committees should take practical decisions to protect patients' lives when transplantation applications are rejected.

In a Facebook post, the state Health minister said legal experts on the appeal committees should pay particular attention to the issue while examining applications for organ transplantation.

He was speaking after inaugurating 'Smriti Vandhanam 2026', organised by the Kerala State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organisation to remember deceased organ donors and honour their family members.

The minister honoured the families of 39 deceased donors who donated organs between August 2025 and August 2026.

"Organ trading must be strictly prevented. At the same time, when appeal committees reject applications, legal experts should ensure that the patient's life



is not put at risk and that practical decisions are taken to save the patient's life," he said.

Muralaheedharan described the families of organ donors as an unparalleled example to society, saying they had come forward to help save other lives despite the immense grief caused by the loss of their loved ones.

"The pain of losing a loved one, especially a child, is unbearable. That families come forward to make such a sacrifice for another life even in such moments of intense grief is a noble act that must not go unrecognised by society," the minister added.

'Chhatron Ki Goonj' in Indore on Sept 19

NEW DELHI: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Thursday announced that his fifth edition of the Chhatron ki Goonj initiative will be held in Madhya Pradesh's Indore on September 19 and asserted that it is essential to hear the voice of every student in the country to change the system.

Gandhi has held four Chhatron ki Goonj events in Kota, Dehradun, Prayagraj and Pune. The last one in

Pune on August 22 was for girl students.

In a post in Hindi on X, Gandhi said, "My dear students, youth and India's Gen Z, the entire country is watching with you as today a broken education system has extinguished the flame of your hopes and pushed your future into darkness."

"Through Chhatron ki Goonj, I am meeting you in different cities to understand your challenges. As part of

this campaign, on September 19, I will once again be among you in Indore," the leader of opposition (LoP) in the Lok Sabha said.

But to change this system, it is essential to hear the voice of every student in the country, their pain and their opinion, he said.

Jailed Hindu leader gets parole for mother's funeral

DHAKA: Bangladesh authorities on Thursday granted five-hour parole to jailed Hindu rights leader Chinmoy Krishna Das to attend his mother's funeral, local media reported.

The Hindu monk was arrested in November 2024 on sedition charges for allegedly disrespecting the national flag, which sparked protests and communal tensions.

Chattogram District Deputy Commissioner (DC) Mohammad Zahidul Islam Mia ordered the Hindu



leader's release on Thursday afternoon following an application from his family, The Daily Star newspaper reported.

Chinmoy's mother, Sandhya Rani Dhar, 70, was undergoing treatment at a hos-

pital in Hathazari and died early morning on Thursday.

"Following an application by his brother over the death of his mother, we have passed an order to release Chinmoy Krishna from jail on parole for five hours in accordance with the law," the newspaper quoted DC Zahidul Islam Mia as saying.

Swatantra Gauranga Das Brahmachari, vice-president of ISKCON's Prabartak Sri Krishna Temple, confirmed the decision, bdnews24.com news portal reported.

Brent crosses \$105 on Iran war, Saudi output slump

PROLONGED CONFLICT RAISES FRESH FEARS OF ENERGY-DRIVEN INFLATION

NEW DELHI

BRENT crude oil prices climbed above \$105 a barrel on Thursday, reaching their highest level since May 25, as renewed fighting between the US and Iran raised concerns over prolonged disruptions to global energy supplies. Strong Chinese buying and a sharp decline in Saudi Arabia's oil output added further momentum to the rally.

Brent crude futures were up 2.63 per cent at \$104 a barrel at 5:55 pm IST, extending a rally that pushed the global benchmark above the \$100 mark in the previous session for the first time since July. The latest surge has renewed fears that a prolonged conflict in the Middle East could fuel energy-driven inflation, with natural gas and diesel prices also rising sharply. The conflict has intensified over the past week after



a period of relative calm, with little indication of an immediate de-escalation. A senior Iranian official said Tehran has no intention of backing down in the face of a US naval blockade and would escalate attacks if Washington continues striking Iranian territory.

US President Donald Trump has also indicated that the conflict could continue until after the November midterm elections, while warning that significant relief in gasoline prices may not come before

then. The comments have reinforced expectations that the conflict, now in its seventh month, could continue to exert pressure on energy markets.

Brent prices have risen about 30 per cent from lows recorded in early August after efforts to secure a permanent agreement between the US and Iran to halt attacks failed to materialise. Fighting resumed later in August, adding to concerns over the security of crude supplies from the Gulf region.

Rupee sinks deeper as oil shock returns

MUMBAI: The rupee depreciated 38 paise to close at 95.46 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday, as Brent crude breached the USD 102 threshold, mounting concerns over the country's import cost trajectory.

Forex traders said the currency is currently facing opposing forces, with downside pressure driven by a resumption of foreign portfolio outflows, following positive flows in July and August and crude oil trading above USD 102 per barrel. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened at 95.15 against the US dollar, then lost ground to close at 95.46 (provisional) against the



American currency, registering a loss of 38 paise from its previous close. On Wednesday, the rupee slumped 34 paise to close at 95.08 against the American currency.

"The rupee has depreciated back towards 95.45, and it is important to understand that this is an oil-driven move rather than a dollar move, since the dollar itself is at multi-month lows," said Anindya Banerjee, Head of Commodity and Currency Research, Kotak Securities.

Talent shortage, not funding, biggest hurdle for defence startups: Apollyon

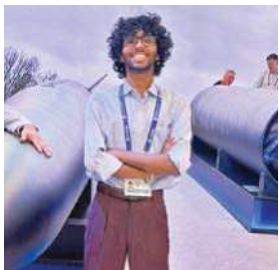
Hyderabad startup says specialised skills are harder to find than capital

INDIA'S rapidly expanding defence tech ecosystem may be attracting more capital and institutional support, but finding people capable of building highly specialised systems is emerging as a bigger challenge for young companies, according to Hyderabad-based defence startup Apollyon Dynamics.

"For us, capital has not been as big a challenge as hiring specialised talent," Apollyon Co-Founder Jayant Khatri said. "Building groundbreaking technology requires people with very specific skills, and finding that talent, especially for the defence space, is difficult because there is still a significant skill gap," he said.

The observation comes as Apollyon, founded in May 2025 by Khatri and Sourya Choudhary while they were completing their degrees at BITS Pilani Hyderabad, has moved rapidly from student

built prototypes to systems supporting the Indian Army. The startup says it secured its first deployment in Jammu within seven months of incorporation and its systems now support the Army at eight stations, including Chandimandir, Ranchi, Secunderabad and Arunachal Pradesh.

Its portfolio has also expanded from FPV drones and field support systems to more complex platforms, including the Ahuti electric interceptor and the Nightshade family of jet powered uncrewed aircraft.

That technological pro-

gression, however, has made specialised manpower increasingly critical. "Our biggest competitive edge is our team of young, hungry and ambitious builders who are willing to solve hard problems," Khatri said. But building such a workforce is not straightforward. Training engineers to work on highly specialised defence and aerospace systems takes considerable time, while the pool of people with experience across areas such as high performance propulsion, autonomous systems, embedded electronics and advanced airframes remains limited, he pointed out. "Training people to work on highly specialised systems also takes time, so building and retaining that team has been one of our biggest challenges, but also one of the most important things we have invested in early on," he said.

Khatri is currently in Poland attending MSPO, the International Defence Industry Exhibition in Kielce, one

of Europe's major defence industry events. The exhibition brings together defence companies, armed forces and technology providers from across the world, giving Indian startups an opportunity to engage with global players and study emerging technologies and potential partnerships.

For Apollyon, the international exposure comes as it looks to build capabilities beyond individual products and develop a larger technology and engineering base.

As funding and military demand improve, the ability to find, train and retain specialised engineering talent could determine how quickly startups move from promising prototypes to deployable systems.

For young companies working across drones, autonomous systems, propulsion and advanced aerospace platforms, access to specialised manpower could increasingly become as important as access to capital.

GCCs fuel Hyderabad's next realty wave, says FICCI

City hosts 500-plus centres, with residential sales rising 12%

The conference also saw the release of the knowledge report "Hyderabad – The Rise of a Global Capability Powerhouse," which examines the city's expanding role

as a destination for GCCs, technology-led investment and cross-sector economic growth.

Speaking at the event, SP Reddy, Chairman, Terminus Group, said: "Hyderabad recorded 5.2 million sqft of commercial space absorption during the first half of 2026, with GCCs accounting for an estimated 40-45 per cent of the market. The momentum in the commercial sector has also supported residential demand, with sales rising 12 per cent year-on-year to about 23,700 units."

Govt cracks down on fake discounts and search manipulation

NEW DELHI

THE government has amended the Consumer Protection (E-Commerce) Rules, 2020, to tighten norms on price transparency, sponsored listings, search result manipulation and dark patterns, the Department of Consumer Affairs said on Thursday.

The Consumer Protection (E-Commerce) (Amendment) Rules, 2026, will come into force from January 1, 2027. Under the new rules, e-commerce entities must disclose both the reduced price and "prior price" whenever a discount is announced. The prior price will be the lowest price at which the product was offered during the 30 days preceding the discount.

Platforms will be barred from manipulating search results in ways that mislead



consumers or affect the relevance of results. Sponsored listings must carry clear and prominent disclosures.

E-commerce entities will also have to comply with the Guidelines for Prevention and Regulation of Dark Patterns, 2023, conduct an annual self-audit and display a certificate of compliance.

They must become partners in the National Consumer Helpline's convergence process. The NCH received 17,71,622 grievances in 2025, with 5,11,196, or about 29 per cent, related to e-commerce. Every entity must provide complainants a copy of complaints recorded by its grievance officer.

New-age economy poised to hit \$300 bn by FY31

NEW DELHI

INDIA'S new-age economy is projected to triple to USD 300 billion in revenue by financial year 2030-31, closely approaching the scale of the country's IT services sector, according to a report by Redseer Strategy Consultants.

A new-age economy is driven by AI, knowledge capital, and digital innovation. The combined revenue of domestic new-age companies is estimated to rise from USD 33 billion in FY22 to around USD 100 billion in FY26, before growing at 25 per cent annually to touch the USD 300-billion mark by FY31, the report noted.

According to Redseer, consumption-led sectors comprising consumer goods, retail, and leisure will remain the cornerstone of this expansion, growing at 25 per cent annually to reach USD 150 billion by FY31 and accounting for nearly half of the



overall market. Meanwhile, emerging technology sectors such as technology, media, and telecom (TMT), artificial intelligence (AI), and advanced manufacturing are projected to grow at 26 per cent annually.

On operational performance, the report highlighted that the collective profit pool turned positive in FY25, staging a turnaround to USD 1.4 billion. However, profitability remains heavily concentrated. "BFSI alone is 140 per cent of the FY25 pool; take it out and every other sector put together is still loss-making," the report stated, adding that a USD 300-billion top line by FY31 implies a total profit pool of USD 5-10 billion (2 to 3 per cent margin), compared

to 12-18 per cent for listed FMCG firms and 20-25 per cent for IT services. The report also pointed out that the time required for consumer goods brands to achieve scale has significantly compressed. Owing to the rapid expansion of direct-to-consumer (D2C) channels and quick commerce, the average time taken to reach Rs 100 crore in revenue fell from 6.8 years for brands in 2016 to 3.4 years for the 2020 cohort. Similarly, the time to hit Rs 500 crore halved from 7.9 years to 4 years. Redseer expects the number of new-age consumer brands with revenues above Rs 100 crore to surge from roughly 90 in FY22 and 230 in FY26 to approximately 500 by FY31. However, scaling beyond the "Rs 500-crore wall" remains a key hurdle due to the requirement of building deep offline distribution networks, modern trade capabilities, and working capital infrastructure.

Equity MF inflows jump 19% to ₹29,329 crore

NEW DELHI

EQUITY mutual fund schemes attracted Rs 29,329 crore in August, their highest net inflow in four months, as investors continued to favour mid- and small-cap funds despite market volatility.

According to data released by the Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) on Thursday, equity inflows rose nearly 19 per cent from Rs 24,697 crore in July.

Retail participation through systematic investment plans (SIPs) also remained strong, with monthly contributions touching a record Rs 32,297 crore in August, compared with Rs 31,961 crore in July and Rs 28,265 crore in August 2025. Cumulative SIP collections in the first five months of the current financial year stood at around Rs 1.6 lakh crore.

The overall mutual fund industry, however, saw net inflows fall sharply to Rs 41,353 crore in August from Rs 2.36 lakh crore in July,



mainly due to a reversal in debt-oriented schemes.

Debt schemes recorded a net outflow of Rs 8,127 crore in August against an inflow of Rs 1.88 lakh crore in July.

Assets under management of the mutual fund industry rose 1.5 per cent to about Rs 87.08 lakh crore at the end of August from Rs 85.76 lakh crore in July. Small-cap funds attracted the highest equity inflows at Rs 7,973 crore, followed by mid-cap funds at Rs 6,989 crore and flexi-cap funds at Rs 5,059 crore. Large-cap funds, however, saw a net outflow of Rs 1,147 crore. "Since the market bottomed in March, mid- and small-caps have led the rally, while large caps have remained laggards," said Santhosh Joseph, CEO, Gernimate Investor Services.
